**TODAY'S GAME:** The Rancho Cucamonga Quakes (Single-A, Los Angeles Angels) go for the series win over the Inland Empire 66ers (Single-A, Seattle Mariners) in the Sunday afternoon series finale at Morongo Field. Yesterday, the Quakes erased a three-run deficit in the third and a one-run deficit in the 10th to secure their second extra-inning walk-off win of the series, 11-10. Today, RHP Ryan Johnson starts for Rancho Cucamonga on an MLB rehab assignment against RHP Jackson Steensma for Inland Empire.

**ABOUT THE 66ERS:** The Inland Empire 66ers, founded in 1987, play their 39th season of operation in 2026. Originally founded as the San Bernardino Spirit, the team began play at Fiscalini Field, the current home of Cal State San Bernardino Baseball, before moving to their current ballpark, San Manuel Stadium, in 1996. Luis Caballero begins his first season as manager after serving in the same capacity for the AZL Mariners from 2022-24. Throughout their history, the 66ers have won six California League titles, but they have not secured a championship since 2013. They defeated the Quakes in last year's South Division Championship Series before falling to the San Jose Giants (Single-A, San Francisco Giants) in the California League Championship Series. The 2026 season opens Inland Empire's third stint in the Seattle Mariners organization (1987-1994, 2001-2006, 2026-pres.), and they have also been previously affiliated with the Los Angeles Dodgers (1995-2000, 2007-2010) and Los Angeles Angels (2011-2025).

**SCRATCH AND CLAW:** Punctuated by a Sunday doubleheader sweep, the Quakes earned their first road series win of the series over the Fresno Grizzlies (Single-A, Colorado Rockies) at Chukchansi Park. Both squads traded wins over the first four games, but as Saturday's matchup got suspended due to rain less than two innings in, they made it up the following day, and the Quakes outplayed their North Division opponent over 14 frames on the final day. Throughout the series, Quakes starters stepped up to hold the powerful Fresno offense in check. Talon Haley, Ubaldo Soto, Alton Davis, and Dylan Jordan each recorded five strikeouts in their starts with Soto fanning nine batters in five innings. However, the best outing of the series came from the bullpen. Derek Clark twirled 6.1 innings in the continuation of the suspended game, allowing just one run on five hits, striking out five Grizzlies en route to his first professional win.

**APRIL COME SHE WILL:** At the end of their first month back in the Los Angeles Angels organization, the Quakes have emerged as the team to beat in the California League South Division. They finished April by winning four of their last five games, including two shutouts and a doubleheader sweep in Fresno to remain tied for first in the division with the Lake Elsinore Storm (Single-A, San Diego Padres). After opening the season on a four-game winning streak, they reached as high as four games above .500 on four separate occasions, which is where they finished the month. Additionally, they remained either tied for first or in the top spot in the South Division outright throughout April, becoming the only team in the California League to hold at least a share of the division lead each day during the campaign's first month.

**SWINGS THAT MAKE THE GROUND SHAKE:** Since the end of their series against the Lake Elsinore Storm (Single-A, San Diego Padres), the Quakes have generated a power surge. After not slugging a single long ball through their first seven games, Kendrey Maduro delivered the first two, cranking two solo shots in their 5-0 victory on April 11th. Since then, they went deep in 11 consecutive games from April 14th to April 25th, including a season-high three in their series finale with the San Jose Giants (Single-A, San Francisco Giants) on the 19th. On Thursday, Anyelo Marquez broke a five-way tie and took over the team lead in round-trippers with three thanks to his two-run shot in the series opener in Fresno on the 21st, and he currently leads the team with six blasts. The Quakes now have 17 home runs in 2026, 5th in the California League, all of which either solo or two-run shots.

**WE MISS YOU, GARRET:** On April 16th, Los Angeles Angels Hall of Famer Garret Anderson passed away at the age of 53. A 17-year big leaguer, Anderson spent the first 15 years of his career as an Angel from 1994-2008 before finishing his career with the Atlanta Braves in 2009 and Los Angeles Dodgers in 2010. In his time at Angel Stadium, he made three All-Star Games, secured two Silver Slugger Awards in 2002 and 2003, won both the Home Run Derby and All-Star Game Most Valuable Player Award in 2003, and helped lead the Angels to a World Series title in 2002. Additionally, he made two rehab assignments with the Quakes in 2004 and 2008. Anderson holds many Angels franchise records including hits (2,368), doubles (489), grand slams (8), and RBI (1,292). Last Sunday, Mike Trout broke Anderson's franchise record for extra-base hits (797) which had stood for over 17 seasons. He is succeeded by his wife Teresa, daughters Brianne and Bailey, and son Garret "Trey" III.

## 22 Dave Stapleton



Dave Stapleton was named the manager of the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes on January 26, 2026 and will lead the team in their first season back in the Los Angeles Angels organization.
