TODAY'S GAME: With a series win already secured, the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes (Single-A, Los Angeles Angels) can win five out of six games in a series for the first time this season in their Sunday finale against the Fresno Grizzlies (Single-A, Colorado Rockies) on Saturday night at Morongo Field. Last night, the Quakes received five scoreless innings from their bullpen before Marlon Quintero produced a walk-off sacrifice fly in the bottom of the 10th inning in a 4-3 victory. Today, LHP Derek Clark heads to the hill for Rancho Cucamonga opposite RHP Marcos Herrera for Fresno in his second start of the week.

ABOUT THE GRIZZLIES: The Fresno Grizzlies, founded in 1998, play their 27th season of operation and 6th in the California League in 2026. Originally founded as a Triple-A ballclub the Grizzlies joined the California League following MLB's restructuring of the Minor Leagues in 2021. Cesar Galvez returns for his second season managing the club and fourth overall after serving as their Bench Coach in 2023 and 2024. The 2015 Pacific Coast League and overall Triple-A champions have not yet won a California League championship, but they have won a North Division title in 2021 as well as a first half title in 2022 and second half titles in 2022 and 2025. The team has been affiliated with the Colorado Rockies since 2021 after holding previous affiliations with the San Francisco Giants (1998-2014), Houston Astros (2015-2018), and Washington Nationals (2019-2020).

LEAVING LAKE ELSINORE: Last week, although the Quakes struggled at times offensively at Diamond Stadium of Lake Elsinore, the bats broke out in their two victories against the Lake Elsinore Storm (Single-A, San Diego Padres). In their 7-4 win on May 14th, Lucas Ramirez and Jonny McGill both went yard while Hayden Alvarez reached four times to lead the lineup. Three days later, in their series finale on May 17th, nearly everybody in the order made a contribution. Six different players logged multiple knocks, led by Marlon Quintero's three, Kendrey Maduro launched two home runs, McGill reached base five times, and Quintero also drove in five runs. However, Rancho Cucamonga could not get much going at the plate in their four losses. They were held to three runs or fewer in each of those defeats, including two shutouts. The one consistency throughout the series for the Quakes was their pitching, as they received multiple strong efforts from their starters. Headlined by Derek Clark's six-inning quality start in the finale, Ubaldo Soto, Alton Davis, and Trey Gregory-Alford each lasted at least five innings and allowed three earned runs or fewer. On the 14th, the bullpen shouldered the load, twirling 5.1 scoreless innings in their first win of the six-game set.

APRIL SHOWERS BRING MAY . . . WALKS?: As the calendar flipped to May, the Quakes significantly improved their plate discipline, which has led to immediate results. After finishing tied for last in the California League in walks in April (75), they have surpassed that total and then some. As a team, Rancho Cucamonga has drawn 103 walks, third place in the league over that span. Over the final three games of their series against the Ontario Tower Buzzers (Single-A, Los Angeles Dodgers), the lineup drew 23 free passes, including back-to-back games with eight to close it out. They followed that up with 10 walks in their series finale versus the Storm on May 17th, establishing a new single-game high in 2026. That momentum continued into the series opener against the Grizzlies as they walked eight times, helping them to an 11-8 victory. Jonny McGill currently tops the ball club in walks, as his 35 place him second in the league.

SWINGS THAT MAKE THE GROUND QUAKE: In their series opener last Tuesday, the Quakes slugged five home runs, setting a new high mark this season. Additionally, after not recording back-to-back home runs over their first 39 games, they did so twice in one game, doing damage against a pair of Fresno arms. Lucas Ramirez, Kendrey Maduro, and Jonny McGill went back-to-back-to-back in the first inning, and three frames later, McGill and Ryland Zaborowski combined to crank consecutive big flies. Heading into the start of the six-game set, Rancho Cucamonga ranked seventh in the California League in that category. Since their power surge, they now sit on 38 dingers in 2026, moving them into a tie for fifth. Kendrey Maduro currently leads the team in round-trippers with seven, recording three over his last three games, recording his second multi-home run game of the season on May 17th in Lake Elsinore in the process.

THE ORGANIZATIONAL STAPLE: As a result of Tuesday's win, Quakes manager Dave Stapleton reached a personal milestone, recording the 500th win of his career. Having managed in the Angels organization since 2014, Stapleton has spent each of the last five seasons in the California League, four of which with the Inland Empire 66ers (2022-25), guiding them to last year's California League Championship Series before moving to Rancho Cucamonga following their affiliation change. He has also spent significant time at the Rookie level, managing four years for the Orem Owlz (2014-2016, 2018) in the Pioneer League, two years with the AZL Angels (2017, 2019), and one year for the ACL Angels (2021), serving as their inaugural skipper.

22 Dave Stapleton



Dave Stapleton was named the manager of the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes on January 26, 2026 and will lead the team in their first season back in the Los Angeles Angels organization.

This season marks Stapleton's fifth in the California League, previously managing the Inland Empire 66ers over the last four. Over that span, he led the then Angels Single-A affiliate to the playoffs three times, leading them to the California League Championship series in 2025.
