**TODAY'S GAME:** The Rancho Cucamonga Quakes (Single-A, Los Angeles Angels) go for their third straight win over the Visalia Rawhide (Single-A, Arizona Diamondbacks) in game four of their six-game series at Morongo Field. Yesterday, Dylan Jordan turned in a quality start, and the offense scored all of their runs in the first four innings on the way to a 6-2 victory. Tonight, LHP Alton Davis earns the starting assignment for Rancho Cucamonga opposite RHP Daury Vasquez for Visalia.

**ABOUT THE RIVERDOGS:** The Visalia Rawhide, founded in 1946, play their 79th season of operation in the California League. Originally known as the Visalia Cubs, they have gone by the Rawhide since 2009. Dee Garner is at the helm for his fourth season as the club's manager, his 15th season as a MiLB manager and 11th in the Diamondbacks organization. The Rawhide have won three California League titles, most recently in 2019, the league's final year at the High-A level. As part of the league's restructuring this past offseason, Visalia returned to the North Division, their first season there since 2019. The team has been affiliated with the Diamondbacks since 2007 after holding previous affiliations with the Chicago Cubs (1946-1952), Cincinnati Reds (1957-1959), Kansas City Athletics (1960-1961), Chicago White Sox (1962), New York Mets (1968-1975), Minnesota Twins (1977-1992), Colorado Rockies (1993-1994, 2003-2004), Oakland Athletics (1997-2002), and Tampa Bay Devil Rays (2005-2006) while also spending two seasons being co-operated in 1995 and 1996.

**IM-PORT-ANT OUTPUTS:** Last week, the Quakes received many outstanding performances from their pitching staff, helping them rack up three straight wins from Thursday to Saturday in their split versus the Stockton Ports (Single-A, Athletics). Dylan Jordan and Trey Gregory-Alford both turned in scoreless starts of at least five innings, helping Rancho Cucamonga take shutout bids into the ninth inning in both games. In Jordan's win on Thursday, he struck out a career-high 10 batters, becoming the first Angels minor leaguer to fan double-digit batters for the Quakes this season. Alton Davis' best start of the year so far sandwiched the two top prospects as he delivered five one-run frames alongside a season-high seven strikeouts in a 3-1 victory on Friday. However, the bats overshadowed the arms in their victories. Two days after the Quakes plated five runs in their first three trips to the plate in their Thursday win, they posted single-game highs in hits (22), extra-base hits (10), doubles (8), and hits with runners in scoring position (13) in their 16-1 Saturday victory. Kevyn Castillo and Kendrey Maduro each notched four knocks in that contest, becoming the first Rancho Cucamonga batters to post such stat lines in 2026.

**MAY-HEM ON THE HILL:** Throughout May, the Quakes put together a slew of dominant performances on the mound, finishing the month as the California League's top staff. In addition to posting the lowest ERA (4.22), Rancho Cucamonga also recorded the most strikeouts (291), surrendered the fewest earned runs (112) and home runs (15), and registered the third-lowest batting average against (.258). On top of that, they recorded their first-ever shutout victory over the Ontario Tower Buzzers (Single-A, Los Angeles Dodgers), blanking them 6-0 on May 8th. Furthermore, the bullpen stepped up on multiple occasions during the series against the Fresno Grizzlies (Single-A, Colorado Rockies), powering a series win. Jose Atencio and Nicolò Pinazzi teamed up for six scoreless frames in a 6-3 victory on May 21st while Pinazzi, Fulton Lockhart, and Jakob Guardado combined for a similar effort in a 4-3 extra-inning win on May 23rd. Individually, two starters, MLB rehabber Grayson Rodriguez and Dylan Jordan, logged double-digit strikeout outings of 11 and 10 respectively, and both Trey Gregory-Alford and Derek Clark recorded two quality starts.

**THE FIRST HALF HOMESTRETCH:** With just 12 games remaining in the first half of the 2026 California League season, the Quakes find themselves in the hunt for a South Division championship and automatic playoff berth. Currently, they sit in second place in the division, one game behind the Lake Elsinore Storm (Single-A, San Diego Padres) for the top spot. Due to their series loss the last time they traveled to Diamond Stadium of Lake Elsinore, Rancho Cucamonga would lose the head-to-head tiebreaker, having lost five of their 12 matchups. To end the half, the Quakes do not have to leave the Inland Empire. Following their series versus the Rawhide, they go on the road to face the Inland Empire 66ers (Single-A, Seattle Mariners) and Tower Buzzers. Meanwhile the Storm are currently on the road in Fresno, and they close out the half on the road against the San Jose Giants (Single-A, San Francisco Giants).

**THE ORGANIZATIONAL STAPLE:** On May 19th, Quakes manager Dave Stapleton won his 500th game in his managerial career. Having managed in the Angels organization since 2014, Stapleton has spent each of the last five seasons in the California League, four of which with the Inland Empire 66ers (2022-2025), guiding them to last year's California League Championship Series. He has also managed at the Rookie Level, spending four seasons with the Orem Owlz (2014-2016, 2018), AZL Angels (2017, 2019) and ACL Angels (2021).

Raywilly Gomez heads to Rancho Cucamonga for his eighth season in the Los Angeles Angels organization and second in the California League.

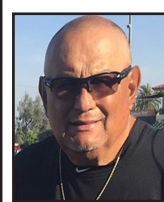
