TODAY'S GAME: The Rancho Cucamonga Quakes (Single-A, Los Angeles Angels) close out their series against the San Jose Giants (Single-A, San Francisco Giants) at Excite Ballpark. Last night, Hayden Alvarez and Kevyn Castillo both went deep, but the Giants left the yard four times in a 14-6 Fourth of July victory. In today's Sunday evening contest, LHP Alton Davis toes the slab for Rancho Cucamonga opposite RHP Keaton Winn for San Jose on a Major League rehab assignment.

ABOUT THE GIANTS: The San Jose Giants, founded in 1962, play their 64th season of operation and 62nd in the California League in 2026. Originally founded as the San Jose Bees, the team has also been known as the Missions and Expos before becoming the Giants in 1988. Ydwin Villegas is back for his third season managing the club and fourth overall after serving as their Fundamentals Coach in 2023. The defending league champions have won 11 overall Minor League titles including 10 in the California League. The team has been affiliated with the Giants since 1988 after holding previous affiliations with the Angels (1962-1969), Kansas City Royals (1970-1974), Cleveland Indians (1975-1976), Oakland Athletics (1977), Seattle Mariners (1978-1980), and Montreal Expos (1982) while also playing independently from 1983-1987.

WINS ARE ALWAYS IN STOCK: Last week, the Quakes locked in at the dish to propel a series victory over the Ports. In three of their four victories, Rancho Cucamonga scored at least nine runs, breaking into double figures twice with 15 runs on Friday and a season-high 17 in their Sunday finale. Gabriel Davalillo and Kendrey Maduro were the main threats, both recording at least seven hits and two home runs to power the offense. While Davalillo closed out the series by going 3-for-5, driving in five runs, and logging his first Single-A multi-home run game, Maduro nearly one-upped him, collecting six RBI, including his 14th long ball of the year. As a team, their series ended with a bang, setting another new season-high in extra-base hits (12) and tying their season-high in hits (22). All nine hitters in the lineup recorded at least one hit, and seven of the nine picked up multiple knocks. Kevyn Castillo established a new individual season-high by lacing three doubles, and John Wimmer launched a grand slam as the centerpiece of a 4-for-4 performance alongside five RBI. Over the last two weeks, the team has found its groove. Dating back to their series at ONT Field versus the Ontario Tower Buzzers (Single-A, Los Angeles Dodgers), Rancho Cucamonga has plated 10 or more runs in five of their last 12 games, going 7-5 over that stretch.

WARM WEATHER, WARMER BATS: Throughout the month of June, the Quakes heated up at the plate, becoming one of the California League's most productive offenses. In addition to leading the circuit in home runs (34) and on-base percentage (.365) while also tying for first in batting average (.275) and RBI (159), Rancho Cucamonga finished second in runs (167), hits (238), slugging percentage (.471), and on-base plus slugging (.836). Furthermore, they scored at least 10 runs in six games including all three of their wins against the Tower Buzzers. Individually, Hayden Alvarez had a June to remember. He finished the month atop the league's stolen base charts (17), likewise placing second in runs (24), tying for second in triples (3), third in hits (32), and ninth in batting average (.330). Kevyn Castillo himself finished first in walks (20) and tied for second in home runs (6), and at the same time, Kendrey Maduro registered the second-most RBI (25), two ahead of teammate Ryland Zaborowski (23), and doubles (10), alongside his 31 hits, 23 runs, and .659 slugging percentage, 1.055 on-base plus slugging, and .341 batting average, all top 10 totals.

THE FIRST HALF RECAP: On Thursday, June 18th, the first half of the 2026 California League season officially came to a close. The Lake Elsinore Storm (Single-A, San Diego Padres) clinched the top spot in the South Division as well as an automatic playoff berth with a record of 39-27. Rancho Cucamonga did not finish far behind, securing second place at 36-30. In the North Division, the Giants booked their playoff place as First Half champions, tying Lake Elsinore's 39-27 record. To make the playoffs, the Quakes must win the Second Half South Division title, where they will battle the Tower Buzzers and Inland Empire 66ers (Single-A, Seattle Mariners). Meanwhile, the Stockton Ports (Single-A, Athletics), Fresno Grizzlies (Single-A, Colorado Rockies), and Visalia Rawhide (Single-A, Arizona Diamondbacks) will duke it out for the North's final playoff spot.

THE ORGANIZATIONAL STAPLE: On May 19th, Quakes manager Dave Stapleton won his 500th game in his managerial career. Having managed in the Angels organization since 2014, Stapleton has spent each of the last five seasons in the California League, four of which with the Inland Empire 66ers (2022-2025), guiding them to last year's California League Championship Series. He has also managed at the Rookie Level, spending four seasons with the Orem Owlz (2014-2016, 2018) in the then-affiliated Pioneer League before heading to Arizona to lead the AZL Angels (2017, 2019) and ACL Angels (2021).

Dave Stapleton was named the manager of the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes on January 26, 2026 and will lead the team in their first season back in the Los Angeles Angels organization.

This year marks Stapleton's fifth in the California League, previously managing the Inland Empire 66ers over the last four. Over that span, he led the then-Angels Single-A affiliate to the playoffs three times, including a trip to the California League Championship Series in 2025.

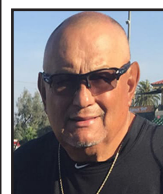
Raywilly Gomez heads to Rancho Cucamonga for his eighth season in the Los Angeles Angels organization and second in the California League.

He took his first on-field role as the bullpen coach of the AZL Angels in 2009, spending two seasons in Arizona before returning to California to serve on the Inland Empire 66ers coaching staff. From 2011-2025, he fulfilled multiple roles for the then-Angels Single-A affiliate including bullpen coach and first base coach.

In addition to his professional baseball experience, Hernandez also coached high school baseball in the Inland Empire for 26 years. Dessens' first season with the Angels was also his first time coaching in full-season baseball. Upon joining the organization, he joined the Inland Empire 66ers as their pitching coach, holding that role from 2023-2025.

The previous 10 years, Dessens served as a pitching coach at the Rookie Level in the Cincinnati Reds organization. After serving as the assistant pitching coach for the AZL Reds in his debut season (2013), he was promoted to pitching coach, a role he held from 2014-2019.
