Major League Baseball today announced finalists for the 2025 Hank Aaron Award, an honor that recognizes the most outstanding regular season offensive performer in each League. At this year's All-Star Game, MLB celebrated the 51st anniversary of Hank Aaron's historic 715th record-breaking home run with a special in-game presentation. This year marks the 26th anniversary of the Hank Aaron Award's introduction, which was established to honor the momentous milestone.

The Hank Aaron Award winners will be announced live from The Chelsea at The Cosmopolitan of Las Vegas on Thursday, November 13 during a special presentation at the MLB Awards presented by MGM Rewards. Former Hank Aaron Award winners Shohei Ohtani (2023-24), Aaron Judge (2022, 2024), Vladimir Guerrero Jr. (2021) and Christian Yelich (2018-19) are among this year's finalists.
