**WELCOME ABOARD: OF Drew Waters** recorded his sixth multi-hit game for Omaha last night, reaching the mark in just 17 games since being traded. Waters hit the fourth leadoff home run for the Chasers this season, as well as getting three-of-the-four hits required to hit for the cycle, coming up a triple short. Waters is hitting .338 with Omaha, raising his overall batting average more than 20 points from .246 with Gwinnett to .270 now. He has also moved into the Royals top prospect list, sitting at No. 8, and the highest rated prospect that is currently with Triple-A Omaha. Waters has also stolen nine bases (9-for-9) since the trade after stealing just five (5-for-6) in 49 games with the Braves' Triple-A affiliate.

**RUNNING WILD:** The Storm Chasers steal bases at a better rate than any other team in the International League. Omaha swiped four bases yesterday without getting caught, moving their stolen base percentage to .856. Memphis is in second place with a .849 percentage. Omaha is now tied with Scranton/Wilkes-Barre for the second most stolen bases in the league at 119, both just eight bases behind Buffalo. **OF Brewer Hicklen** stole his 21st base yesterday, now tied for the eighth most in the International League. **OF Dairon Blanco** is sitting in fourth place with 24 steals this season, with both trailing Scranton/Wilkes-Barre's Estevan Flores.

**BOUNCE BACK:** Omaha has lost three consecutive games, looking to bounce back today and prevent a four-game skid, something the Chasers have done twice this season. This week is just the third time that the Storm Chasers have dropped back-to-back games to start a series at home, and the first time that St. Paul has outright led Omaha in a series this year. The Chasers hold an 8-6 season series record over the Saints through the first 14 meetings this season. Omaha is hitting .262 while holding a 4.91 ERA against St. Paul this season.

**STORM WATCH: OF Brewer Hicklen** is looking to become the first player for Omaha in the modern franchise era to hit 20 home runs and 20 doubles while stealing 20 bases in a single season. Hicklen has 17 doubles, 18 homers, and 21 stolen bases this season. His home runs put him in a four-way tie for ninth most in the league while his slugging percentage of .510 is the ninth highest in the International League. **INF Bobby Witt Jr.** hit the 20-20-20-mark last season between Double-A and Triple-A.

**HEATING CLAY: INF Clay Dungan** launched his eighth home run of the season last night, now having a long ball in seven games with the Storm Chasers. In games that Dungan hits a home run, the Storm Chasers are 5-2 (.714) and Dungan is hitting .517. In games that Dungan does not send one over the outfield fence, he hits just .199 in 80 games. Dungan has produced a multi-home run game, sending a pair deep on June 26 against Columbus.

**FOR OMAHA: RHP Jackson Kowar** toes the rubber for his 13th start for the Storm Chasers. Kowar's last game at the Triple-A level was back on June 21, when he got tagged with the loss. He went 5.0 innings and allowed just one run on two hits with eight strikeouts. After that start, Kowar was recalled to The Show, pitching in seven games out of the bullpen for the Royals, earning a 9.77 ERA in 15.2 innings of work. Kowar averaged seven strikeouts in each of his last five starts, fanning a season-high nine batters on May 25 at Louisville. Opponents are hitting .301 against Kowar at the Triple-A level, but he has allowed just 23 walks in 55.1 innings of work with 62 strikeouts. Kowar won three consecutive games in May, allowing just two runs in 16.0 innings across the three games, one of which was against St. Paul on May 19.

**FOR ST. PAUL: RHP Jordan Balazovic** heads to the mound to make his 13th start and 14th overall appearance for the Saints, still looking for his first win of the season. In his last start, Balazovic allowed three earned runs on five hits in 2.2 innings of work against Iowa. Today is set to be the third time this season that Balazovic will face off against the Storm Chasers, taking the loss in each of the previous two. Balazovic's longest outing of the season came at Werner Park when he went 4.0 innings on May 19 and allowed six runs. Balazovic has allowed Omaha to hit .481 with four home runs this season.

### KOWAR NOTES

- Began 2022 season with Kansas City, allowing seven runs on 11 hits in 3.1 innings in relief appearance on April 10 vs. Cleveland, a game the Royals eventually lost, 17-3
- Has made 10 career MLB appearances (eight starts), recording an 0-6 record with a 12.03 ERA in 33.2 innings with 33 strikeouts and 21 walks
- Named Triple-A East Pitcher of the Year in 2021 in addition to earning Triple-A Postseason All-Star honors as the top right-handed pitcher in the league, Paul Splittorff Pitcher of the Year in the Kansas City Royals organization, and Omaha Pitcher of the Year
- Led Triple-A East with 115 strikeouts at the time of his promotion to Kansas City on Sept. 1, 2021
- Led Triple-A East pitchers with a minimum of 80.0 innings in strikeout percentage (34.0%), while ranking sixth in batting average against (.220) and eighth in ERA (3.46) among that subset
- Made Triple-A debut as Omaha's Opening Day starter on May 4, 2021, vs. St. Paul, tying a career high with nine strikeouts across 5.1 shutout innings
- Finished May with a 1.01 ERA in 26.2 innings across five starts to earn Triple-A East Pitcher of the Month honors
- Lowered ERA to league-leading 0.85 following 5.0 innings of shutout ball on June 2, 2021, vs. Iowa
- Called up by Kansas City for Major League debut on June 7, 2021, at Los Angeles-AL, allowing four runs on three hits in 0.2 innings with two walks and zero strikeouts
- Optioned to Omaha on June 23, 2021, and made 11 more appearances (10 starts) for the Storm Chasers, posting a 5.14 ERA in 49.0 innings with 74 strikeouts and 24 walks in that span before returning to Kansas City on Sept. 1, 2021
- Spent the 2020 season at the Royals' Alternate Training Site in Kansas City, Kan. after being a non-roster invite to Royals' Spring Training
- Made 13 starts for High-A Wilmington and Double-A Northwest Arkansas in first full professional season in 2019
- Won 2018 South Atlantic League title with Low-A Lexington, tossing 5.0 shutout innings in Game 2 of the SAL Championship Series on 9/11 @ LWD
- Drafted with the 33rd overall pick in the 2018 MLB Draft, one pick before LHP Daniel Lynch
- Was teammates and roommates with fellow 2018 first round pick RHP Brady Singer at the University of Florida
- Played on three College World Series teams with the Gators, recording the final outs of the 2017 College World Series final to deliver the Gators' first baseball title
- Struck out 13 in 6.2 innings in final collegiate start against Texas in the 2018 College World Series
- Was originally drafted by Detroit in the 40th round of the 2015 MLB Draft but did not sign
