DÉJÀ VU: The Storm Chasers tied a modern franchise record with eight stolen bases in last night's walk-off loss. The other time that Omaha had eight steals in a single game was earlier this month on July 1 at St. Paul, also a game that the Chasers fell in walk-off fashion. Both games were games that Omaha gave up an early lead to lose in dramatic fashion. In both situations, Omaha had more hits than their opponents, exactly 8-7 both times. Against St. Paul, the Chasers bounced back and took the next game, looking to repeat that again tonight. Last night was the second consecutive game against Syracuse that the team with more hits lost the game.

GREEN LIGHT: Three different Chasers each stole a pair of bases yesterday: **OF Drew Waters**, **OF Nate Eaton**, and **OF Dairon Blanco**. **OF Brewer Hicklen** and **INF Clay Dungan** each added a single stolen base, while Eaton was caught once. Omaha swiped six bags on Wednesday, giving the Storm Chasers 14 stolen bases over the last two days, more than twice as many as any other International League team in that span. Blanco's two stolen bases brings his season total to 24, tying him with Oswald Peraza of Scranton/Wilkes-Barre for the third most in the International League. Hicklen is tied for ninth with 20 steals this season. Waters has now stolen nine bases for Omaha in just 12 games, after stealing only five in 49 games with Gwinnett before getting traded. Omaha steals bases at a higher rate than any other team in the International League, avoiding getting caught 87.1 percent of the time. Memphis steals successfully 85.4 percent of the time, second in the league. The Chasers have stolen 115 bases and are now just three stolen bases behind Buffalo for most stolen bases in the International League.

RELENTLESS RELIEVERS: Omaha relievers rank among the best in Triple-A, holding the third best ERA in the International League at 3.71. Nashville and Jacksonville are the two teams with better reliever ERAs, at 3.40 and 3.48 respectively. The Storm Chasers bullpen concedes just 3.89 walks per nine innings pitched, the fifth lowest in the league. **RHP Andrés Núñez** holds the longest streak of games in the International League without allowing an earned run this season at 22 games and counting. His 26.1-inning scoreless streak is the longest on the team this season by far, with no other Chaser relievers surpassing the 17-inning scoreless mark. **RHP Colten Brewer** had a 17-game streak of not allowing an earned run snapped on July 6, the fifth longest in the league this season.

WELCOME ABOARD: **OF Drew Waters** continues to impress since being traded from the Braves' organization on July 11. Waters is hitting .319 with Omaha in 12 games, reaching base in each of his first dozen games since the trade. He reached base in his last game with Gwinnett, bringing his overall on-base streak to 13 games, tied for eighth longest active streak in the International League. His 14 stolen bases are tied for 21st in the league, going 9-for-9 on stolen base attempts with Omaha.

FOR OMAHA: **LHP Marcelo Martinez** gets the nod for his 11th start and 17th overall appearance for the Storm Chasers this season. His last appearance came on July 22 against Iowa, throwing 4.0 innings of relief to earn the win, allowing no runs on just one hit. In his last start, Martinez threw 4.0 innings and allowed one run on four hits and four walks with three strikeouts. On the road this season, the 25-year-old drops his ERA to 4.97 in five starts and two relief appearances. His batting average against jumps a little from .228 at home to .245 on the road. Fridays are his best day of the week, holding a 1-0 record with a .095 ERA in 19.0 innings across five appearances (two starts).

FOR SYRACUSE: **LHP Nate Fisher** heads to the mound to make his ninth start and 10th overall appearance for the S-Mets this season. In his last start, he went 4.1 innings, allowing three earned runs on six hits with no walks and five strikeouts. Fisher's last outing was a 2.0-inning relief appearance, allowing a run with two strikeouts and no walks. Fisher started the season with Double-A Birmingham before making the jump to Triple-A Syracuse on May 31. Fisher held a record of 0-1 with a 3.77 ERA the with Rumble Ponies before joining the S-Mets. The 26-year-old's longest outings of the season came in consecutive games, throwing 5.0 innings on June 28 and July 3, both at home against Lehigh Valley. When playing inside NBT Bank Stadium, Fisher holds a 1.56 ERA that jumps to 5.87 away from home.
