**MAKING A SPLASH: OF Drew Waters** has reached base in every game that he has played for the Storm Chasers, holding a 13-game on-base streak with Omaha. When paired with his time before being traded from the Braves' organization, he is tied for the sixth longest active on-base streak in the International League. His longest streak before getting traded was seven games in mid-May. During his 14-game streak, Waters has reached base successfully 28 times. Waters is a switch hitter, holding a .315 batting average and .431 on-base percentage during his streak. He has hit leadoff in all 13 games that he has played for Omaha, going yard twice to pair with three doubles and a triple. Waters is now the No 8 rated prospect in the Royals' organization, according to MLB.com, and is the top-ranked prospect that is currently with Triple-A Omaha.

**STRENGTH FROM THE PEN:** The Chasers' bullpen holds the third best ERA in the International League at 3.70, behind Nashville (3.38) and Jacksonville (3.45). **LHP Sam Freeman** has a 0.96 ERA, leading the active roster out of the bullpen. Freeman has played in 26 games for Omaha, going 28.0 innings with a 3-0 record. **RHP Andrés Núñez** holds a 1.86 ERA in 32 games, with a 5-1 record. Núñez hasn't allowed an earned run since May 19, spanning 22 games. The 22-game no-earned-runs streak is the longest in the International League this season, with Nashville's Trevor Kelley the only other player to pitch in 20 or more games without allowing an earned run. Núñez has gone 26.1 innings since last allowing a run, longest on the team this season.

**BATTING RUNS IN: OF Nate Eaton** is riding a streak that had only been matched by one other Storm Chaser this season and hadn't been hit in a month-and-a-half. Eaton has recorded an RBI in four consecutive games, with **INF Vinnie Pasquantino** the only other player to do that for the Storm Chasers this season. Pasquantino hit the mark three times for Omaha before getting called up to The Show. Eaton is hitting .314 in 46 games at the Triple-A level with a .932 OPS. He has nine homers with Omaha and has swiped nine bases (9-for-13).

**SATURDAY SUNSHINE:** This season, Omaha is 5-3 on Saturdays on the road, one of only two days that the Chasers hold a winning record away from Werner Park. With a win today, the Chasers would guarantee with at least a series split, and keep the possibility of winning a series outright alive. Omaha has a 0-3-4 series record on the road this season.

**FOR OMAHA: RHP Daniel Mengden** takes the ball to make his 15th start and 17th overall appearance for the Storm Chasers. Mengden last threw in a game on Tuesday, going one inning of scoreless relief, allowing no hits but walking a pair with one strikeout. In his last start, Mengden went 5.0 innings and allowed five earned runs on eight hits with no walks and one strikeout on July 17 at Rochester. The Texas A&M product has played in four games for the Royals this season, all in relief, earning a 2.08 ERA with six strikeouts and no walks in 4.1 innings of work. During the month of July, Mengden has a record of 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA in three starts and one relief outing. He has struck out 13 this month while walking six, looking to finish July with an even 1-1 record. His ERA had dropped in each of the last two months, going from 9.69 in April to 4.73 in May and 2.77 in June. Mengden was signed by the Royals as a free agent in March of this year, after spending a year in the KBO and bouncing around The Bigs before that.

**FOR SYRACUSE: RHP Connor Grey** looks to make his 18th start and 19th overall appearance for the S-Mets. In his last start, Grey went 3.0 innings and allowed one earned run on three hits with one walk and one strikeout against Worcester. Only July 16, he had his shortest start of the season, giving up five earned runs on seven hits in just 0.1 innings of work. Grey has thrown two quality starts this season, in consecutive games in May. Each time he went 6.0 innings and allowed no runs. In one game he struck out seven batters and in the other he fanned just two. Grey's lone relief appearance was a 5.2-inning outing in which he didn't allow an earned run en route to the win. Grey allows a .317 batting average against as a starter and a .333 batting average at home this season, with a 1.92 WHIP inside NBT Bank Stadium.
