THINKIN' 'BOUT SUNDAY: The River Bandits lost their first ever series at ABC Supply Stadium, falling to the Beloit Sky Carp 4-3 in the finale. after falling behind in the first inning 2-0, tied the game in the eighth on Diego Hernandez's RBI double, but Ynmanol Marinez's solo home run off of Patrick Halligan in the bottom half proved to be the difference ... Peyton Wilson led the offense with a pair of hits including a double, while Tyler Tolbert hit his third home run of the season ... Charlie Neuweiler worked a 4.0-inning start, allowing two earned runs ... Chandler Champlain, Parker Harm, and Harrison Beethe combined for 3.0-scoreless innings out of the bullpen with five strikeouts.

FLIP THAT CALENDAR: After batting .269 as a team with a .810 OPS in June, the Bandits hit just .221 with a .659 OPS in July and led the Midwest League in strikeouts (242) ... on the mound, Quad Cities' 5.34 team ERA was the worst mark in the Midwest League, with Bandits' hurlers also striking out the fewest batters in the league (182).

THAT'S THE DIEGO WE KNOW: After starting out the month of July hitting just .154 (8-for-52), Diego Hernandez has once again found his stroke at the plate, batting .375 (15-for-40) with a .969 OPS since the All-Star break ... owns a seven-game hitting streak ... is tied for eighth in the Midwest League in hitting (.281).

EL HOMBRE IN JULY: Juan Carlos Nerget dominated the month of July, slashing .309/.366/.481 ... reached base in 20-of-22 games and tied for third in the Midwest League lead in doubles (8) while driving in 15 RBIs.

JUST GIVE HIM A KALICH: Right-hander Kasey Kalich has been elite in the second half, having now pitched 12.1 innings without allowing an earned run (10 appearances) ... as Brooks Conrad's go-to late-inning arm, Kalich has collected four saves in five opportunities and his holding opponents to a .132 batting average, while posting nine strikeouts and a 1.05 WHIP.

PROSPECTING: The River Bandits 2022 roster features five prospects in MLB Pipeline's Royals' top 30: Beck Way (12), Peyton Wilson (13), Luca Tresh (24), Diego Hernandez (29), and Chandler Champlain (30).

Q.C. CONNECTIONS: River Bandits' bench coach, Eddie Rodriguez makes his return to Modern

Woodmen Park after serving as the manager of the 1988 and 1989 Quad City Angels ... infielder Cam Williams' father Reggie, played four seasons with the California/Anaheim Angels and the Los Angeles Dodgers and spent the 1989 season in the Midwest League with the Clinton Giants (A) prior to winning a Midwest League title with the Quad Cities Angels (A) in 1990.

NEW SHERIFF IN TOWN: With Chris Widger, Baseball America's 2021 Minor League Manager of the Year, now at the helm of the Royals' Double-A affiliate in NW Arkansas (AA), 2021 Columbia Fireflies (A) manager Brooks Conrad takes over as the 42nd manager in Quad Cities baseball history ... led the Lexington Legends to a South Atlantic League Title in 2019 and was honored with the Dick Howser Award, which is given annually to one Royals player development employee for outstanding contributions to the organization ... coaching career follows a playing career in which he played parts of six seasons in the Majors with Oakland (2008), Atlanta (2009-11), Milwaukee (2012), Tampa Bay (2012), and San Diego (2014). He was selected in the eighth round of the 2001 Draft by Houston, where he played seven seasons in the minors.

A TEAM TO REMEMBER: The River Bandits' 2021 championship squad featured four High-A Central postseason all-stars in Michael Massey, Vinnie Pasquantino, Logan Porter, and Anthony Veneziano ... Quad Cities also collected seven High-A Central Player of the Week awards and one Player/Pitcher of the Month award with Massey earning the honors for July ... on June 18, Zach Haake and Dante Biasi combined for the 12th no-hitter in Quad Cities Baseball history, blanking Wisconsin in a 9-0 victory.


