#### INDY BITS

**COLD LIKE MINNESOTA:** The Indianapolis Indians were held to just six baserunners as they dropped the 2025 season opener to the St. Paul Saints on Friday night at CHS Field, 11-0. The Saints tallied 11 runs on 18 hits behind three-hit, two-RBI performances from Emmanuel Rodriguez and Jair Camargo. Eight of nine St. Paul batters recorded multi-hit games, with Jefferson Morales' two-run triple in a three-run eighth inning, adding his second and third RBI on the night. Braxton Ashcraft took the bump for the Indians, surrendering three runs through 3.1 innings with a career-high four walks and five strikeouts. Saints starter David Festa stunned, logging 5.0 shutout innings with no walks and four strikeouts. Saturday and Sunday's games were both postponed due to inclement weather. Those games will be made up as part of two doubleheaders at CHS Field on Wednesday, April 23 and Friday, April 25 at 6 PM ET.

**ONLY UP FROM HERE:** Friday's 11-run loss was Indy's largest margin of defeat on Opening Day since losing to Toledo at Victory Field, 16-5, in 2009. The Indians have been shut out in the season opener three times since 1997 – in 2016 at Columbus, 2015 vs. Columbus and 2008 at Pawtucket. It was their fourth straight loss on Opening Day since 2022 and their ninth loss in 14 Opening Day contests on the road in the Victory Field era. Friday was also just the second time the two teams have faced off on Opening Day, with the last season lidlifter coming on April 18, 1940, at Perry Stadium at 1501 West 16th St. in Indianapolis. In that contest, the Indians trailed 2-0 in the top of the first before scoring three unanswered runs to take a 3-2 victory.

**GONE HUNTING:** Hunter Stratton took the bump for the Indians in relief Friday night and pitched around three consecutive singles – aided by a dart thrown home by left fielder Matt Gorski to nab Austin Martin trying to score – to record a scoreless seventh frame. Stratton's 2024 campaign was halted at the end of August when he suffered a rupture of his left patella tendon (knee) and underwent a surgery expected to sideline him for seven to 10 months. Stratton was re-signed by Pittsburgh as a minor league free agent in December and tossed a scoreless inning with two strikeouts in one spring training game. The right-hander has appeared in 116 games (three starts) with the Indians across the last five seasons, going 6-12 with a 4.50 ERA (74er/148.0ip) and 186 strikeouts.

**THE CHEF RETURNS:** Pittsburgh Pirates No. 12 prospect (*Baseball America*) Billy Cook roped a ninth-inning double Friday night for the Indians fourth base knock and lone extra-base hit. Cook spent most of the 2024 season in Triple-A, split between Triple-A Norfolk and Indianapolis after being traded to Pittsburgh from Baltimore at the deadline. In 100 total games, he hit .278 (102-for-367) with 61 runs, 22 doubles, three triples, 16 home runs, 64 RBI and a .862 OPS. Cook also showed off in the field on Friday, beginning a relay that caught Ryan Fitzgerald trying to score at home in the fourth inning.

**ABOUT LAST SEASON:** Behind third-year manager Miguel Perez, the Indianapolis Indians finished with a 77-70 record in 2024 for the sixth-best record in the 20-team International League and their first winning record since 2018. It was a tale of two halves as the Indians posted a 33-40 record in the first half and a 44-30 record in the second half, finishing third in the IL second-half standings, 4.0 games behind the first-place Columbus Clippers after making a playoff run late into August. The full-season winning record was their 10th in 19 seasons as the Pittsburgh Pirates' Triple-A affiliate dating back to 2005. The Indians went 45-31 at Victory Field, marking their best home record since posting a 44-27 mark in 2017 and the highest home win total since 48 victories in 2012. Since moving to the ballpark at the corner of West and Maryland in 1996, the Indians have finished with a winning record in 21 of 28 campaigns.

**NOTHING AVERAGE ABOUT IT:** The Indians finished the 2024 season with a .271 team batting average (1,336-for-4,933) to lead the 20-team International League for the first time since 2018. On the bump, Indy's pitching staff racked up a franchise-high 1,348 strikeouts. It was the fourth time in the past six seasons that a new franchise record in strikeouts was set.

**MARCH MADNESS:** The Indians 123rd season in franchise history kicked off Friday night in St. Paul, with the 29th campaign in Victory Field history beginning tonight. Friday night's March 28 Opening Day marked the earliest in franchise history. The past three seasons have each featured the team's earliest start dates, playing on March 29 in 2024 and March 31 in 2023. Those games marked the first regular season March games in the Indians illustrious history.

**YOUNG BUCS:** Six prospects ranked among the Pirates top 30 according to MLB Pipeline are slated to begin the season in Triple-A, led by right-hander Bubba Chandler as the organization's No. 1 (MLB's No. 15) overall farmhand. It marks the second consecutive year that the Pirates top prospect will begin the season with the Indians, following right-hander and 2024 MLB Rookie of the Year Paul Skenes. Other prospects on the 2025 Opening Day roster include utilityman Nick Yorke (No. 5), Opening Day starter and right-hander Braxton Ashcraft (No. 6), right-hander Mike Burrows (No. 15), infielder Tsung-Che Cheng (No. 17) and outfielder Billy Cook (No. 18). Last season, the Indians featured six of the Pirates top 30 prospects (according to *Baseball America*).

**OPENING NIGHT PREVIEW:** The Indians and Iowa Cubs begin a six-game series tonight at Victory Field with first pitch scheduled for 6:35 PM ET. Last season, the Indians finished with a 13-5 record against the Cubs, posting a 4-2 record at home and 9-3 mark at Iowa. The road victories were highlighted by a six-game sweep of the Cubs from July 23-28, marking the Indians first-ever sweep (4+ games) against the Iowa dating back to 1988 and the team's first-ever six-game sweep under Minor League Baseball's weekly schedule format that began in 2021. The Indians seek their eighth consecutive victory opposite Iowa dating back to June 23, 2024. It is the Indians longest winning streak against the I-Cubs since the two teams resumed play opposite each other in 2021. Leading the Indians on the mound is right-hander Mike Burrows, who last faced Iowa in his 2024 Indians debut on July 25, allowing one run over 4.0 innings with five strikeouts. Countering for the Cubs is RHP Chris Flexen who is throwing against the Indians for the first time since July 23, 2019, at Syracuse.

**BE LIKE MIKE:** Mike Burrows takes the bump tonight for his first start of the 2025 season. The right-hander, who is rated as Pittsburgh's No. 13 prospect by *Baseball America*, made 10 appearances (nine starts) for the Indians in 2024 after returning from rehabbing Tommy John surgery. In those games, he went 1-1 with a 4.06 ERA (17er/37.2ip) and 45 strikeouts. He also earned the win in his MLB debut on Sept. 28 at New York (AL), allowing two runs in 3.1 innings from the bullpen.

TONIGHT'S PITCHER

**Mike Burrows:** Right-hander Mike Burrows is set to make his first start of the 2024 season today at 3:07 PM ET at CHS Field in St. Paul, Minn.

**Against the Saints:** Burrows has made three starts against the Saints in his career, going 1-0 with a 6.30 ERA (7er/10.0ip) and 17 strikeouts. In his last start in St. Paul on Sept. 22, the Indians 2024 season finale, he fanned a career-high tying 10 batters to earn his first Triple-A win of the season.

**September Callup:** Following his 10-strikeout performance in the Indians 2024 season finale, Burrows was recalled by Pittsburgh for his major league debut on Sept. 28 at New York (AL). He earned the win out of the bullpen, allowing two runs (one earned) over 3.1 innings. He struck out Oswaldo Cabrera swinging as his second batter faced for his first MLB punchout.

**Prospectus:** Burrows is currently rated as Pittsburgh's No. 13 prospect by *Baseball America* and No. 15 by MLB Pipeline.

**Miscellaneous:** Selected by Pittsburgh in the 11th round (324th overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of Waterford (Conn.) High School... Had his contract first selected by Pittsburgh on Nov. 15, 2022.
