INDY BITS

ABOUT YESTERDAY: Outfielder Micah Pries accounted for all the Columbus Clippers runs with his two-homer day as they knocked off the Indianapolis Indians 4-3 on Wednesday afternoon at Victory Field. Bubba Chandler worked around traffic in the first and second inning before Pries cashed in a pair of baserunners with his one-out blast in the third. A combination of Randy Labaut, Hunter Stratton, Kyle Nicolas and Carson Fulmer pitched the final 6.1 frames for Indy, allowing one run on four hits and striking out nine. Alike Williams provided the first run for the Indians with a solo shot off starter Ryan Webb. Pries responded with his second homer of the day. Indy's rally came to an end in the 9th inning with the game-tying run stranded at second base.

PAIR O' PIRATES: First baseman Spencer Horwitz and right-handed pitcher Dauri Moreta had their rehab assignments transferred to Indianapolis on Tuesday. Horwitz was placed on the 10-day injured list on March 27, retroactive to March 24, after undergoing right wrist surgery on Feb. 12. Moreta was placed on the 60-day injured list on Feb. 16 after undergoing Tommy John surgery and being sidelined for the entire 2024 season. Nearly 14 months after his last professional appearance, the right-hander began a rehab assignment with High-A Bradenton on April 29 and tossed 2.0 scoreless innings in two games. Horwitz went 0-for-4 yesterday. On Tuesday, he went 2-for-4 with one double and one run. Moreta tossed a scoreless sixth inning on Tuesday with one walk, striking out the side.

BUBBA ON THE BUMP: Bubba Chandler took his first loss in 14 career starts with the Indians yesterday, matching a season-low 2.2 innings with season highs in hits (five), runs (three) and walks (four) with five strikeouts. In those 14 starts, Chandler is 6-1 with a 2.00 ERA (15er/67.1ip) and 95 strikeouts. Chandler has thrown 17 pitches at 100.0 mph or higher this season, including four of those in yesterday's performance, with his fastball topping out at 101.5 on April 13 at Louisville. He is one of just seven starting pitchers in MiLB to hit triple-digits this season, with his 11 pitches thrown at least 100.3 MPH marking the fastest pitches thrown by a starting pitcher in High-A or above.

BAEWATCH: Ji Hwan Bae extended his on-base streak to 18 games and hitting streak to nine games on Tuesday, going 1-for-5 with two runs and one stolen base. It is the longest on-base streak by an Indian this season and is tied for the sixth longest active streak in the International League. His nine-game hitting streak is tied for the third longest active streak in the league. He is hitting .290 (21-for-74) with six doubles, five RBI, eight walks, 19 runs and six stolen bases in this span. Since making his season debut with Indy on April 8, Bae's 22 runs scored rank second in the International League behind Lehigh Valley's Otto Kemp (24r). In addition to his hitting streak, Bae has recorded a knock in 12 of his past 13 and 15 of the 18 games in his active on-base streak. He has scored one-plus run in 13 of the 18 games and one-plus walk in seven of those games. Bae scored a career-high tying four runs on April 17 vs. Toledo (3x, MR: 9/11/22 at OMA). He tallied a stolen base in four straight games from April 17-22, marking his first time stringing four straight games with a steal since July 8-14, 2021, with Altoona. The four consecutive games with a steal are tied for the longest streak by an International League player this season.

EXIT MUSIC (FOR A BASEBALL): Nick Yorke continued his strong run at the plate, going 1-for-5 with a stolen base in yesterday's contest. Across his last 15 games, Yorke is hitting .310 (18-for-58) with two home runs, seven RBI, five walks, six runs and four stolen bases. He has a hit in six straight contests and multiple hits in three of those. He launched his third home run of the season in the seventh inning on Friday night, going 2-for-5 with a home run, two RBI, two runs and two stolen bases. It marked his first time homering in back-to-back games since June 8 and 9, 2024, with Worcester. Additionally, he posted back-to-back multi-hit games and multi-RBI games for the first time this season. He swiped two-plus bags in that game for the first time since September 13, 2023, with Portland vs. Hartford.

ALIKA'S HEATING UP: Alike Williams launched his first home run of the season yesterday, going 1-for-3 with a solo shot in the fifth inning to put the Indians on the board. It was Williams' first Triple-A home run in 60 games since he put the Indians ahead with an eighth-inning homer on July 21, 2023, at the Iowa Cubs. He is riding a five-game hitting streak and has one-plus knock in seven of his past eight games. In those games, he is hitting .375 (9-for-24) with five RBI, four runs, three walks and one stolen base. He has scored a run in four straight.

MOLTEN MALCOM: Malcom Núñez continued his hot stretch at the plate, going 2-for-3 with one run and one walk yesterday. In his last 13 games, he is hitting .390 (16-for-41) with three doubles, three RBI, four walks and five runs. Yesterday marked his ninth multi-hit game of the campaign and second in his last three games.

TODAY'S MATCHUP: The Indianapolis Indians continue this week's six-game series against the Columbus Clippers today at 11:05 AM. With an Indians loss, the Clippers can tie the series at Victory Field since 1988 with a 130-130 record. Right-hander Braxton Ashcraft is set to make his team-leading eighth start of the season today, last tossing 6.0 shutout innings on May 2 at Omaha. It marked a career-high three-decision winning streak. He is set to make his first career start against the Clippers. Taking the mound for Columbus is left-hander Doug Nikhazy. In three career games (two starts) against Indy, the southpaw is 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA (1er/15.0ip), seven hits, seven walks and 16 strikeouts.

ON THIS DATE IN 1950: Indianapolis starting pitcher Bill Pierro took a no-hitter into the eighth inning until center fielder Archie Wilson broke up the bid with a two-out single for the Kansas City Blues. That was the only hit allowed by Pierro in his 9.0-inning complete-game effort that featured nine strikeouts.

TONIGHT'S PITCHER

Braxton Ashcraft: The right-hander is Pittsburgh's No. 7 prospect according to MLB Pipeline and No. 4 according to *Baseball America*.

Opening Day Starter: Ashcraft made his second career Opening Day start on March 28 at St. Paul, last doing so on June 14, 2019, with Class-A short season West Virginia.

Last Outing: Ashcraft earned his third win of the season, tossing 6.0 shutout innings with two hits, one walk and a season-high tying six strikeouts. He is riding a career-best three-decision winning streak.

Against the Clippers: Ashcraft is set to make his first career start opposite the Clippers.

Prospectus: Ashcraft entered the 2025 season rated as Pittsburgh's No. 6 prospect according to MLB Pipeline and No. 4 according to *Baseball America*. Since being drafted by the Pirates in 2018, No. 4 is his highest ranking according to *BA*, elevated from No. 10 last season.

Miscellaneous: Ashcraft was drafted by Pittsburgh in the second round (51st overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of Robinson High School (Waco, Texas). He had his contract first selected by Pittsburgh on Nov. 14, 2023.
