ABOUT SUNDAY: The St. Paul Saints won Sunday's rubber match to conclude the rain-shortened seven-game series at CHS Field. The Saints jumped on the Indianapolis Indians early, scoring a run in each of the first two frames and staving off a comeback in the later innings to secure a 5-3 victory. The Saints loaded the bases early off Carson Fullmer twice, as each of their first three batters reached safely in the first and second innings. Carson McCusker continued his scorching series and cashed in two runs in the first inning with an RBI double, bringing his total to nine RBI for the series and providing St. Paul with a lead it did not relinquish. Fulmer worked around the bases-loaded jam in the second, only allowing one run on a sacrifice fly from Royce Lewis. Nick Yorke cut the deficit to one run, 3-2, in the fifth inning with a two-run single. St. Paul added an insurance run in the seventh inning, which proved necessary as pinch hitter Nick Solak connected with his team-leading fifth home run of the season in the eighth to once again pull the Indians within one. The Saints responded with a run of their own in the eighth to cap the scoring and brought in Cody Funderburk picked up the save in the final

SOLAK ECLIPSE: Nick Solak continued his scorching run this season, pinch hitting for Darick Hall in the eighth inning on Sunday to blast his fifth home run of the season. It marked his first knock as a pinch hitter in his minor league career and first since a pinch-hit single off Rick Porcello on Sept. 25, 2019 with Texas vs. Boston. Solak ranks among International League leaders in batting average (.394, 26-for-66, 2nd), OPS (1.083, 3rd), SLG (.652, 4th) and OBP (.431, 9th). He has reached base safely in 17 of his 18 games on the campaign and has one-plus hit in 16 of those, including a team best 13-game hitting streak from April 3-23. Solak hit .400 (20-for-50) with two doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, 11 runs, three stolen bases and a 1.056 OPS in this span. He struck out just seven times across 55 plate appearances during the hitting streak.

BAEWATCH: Ji Hwan Bae extended his on-base streak to 12 games going 2-for-5 with one double and one run on Sunday. The on-base streak is the Indians longest active on-base streak and is the second-longest by an Indy player this season, trailing Nick Solak's 13-game hitting streak. He is hitting .292 (14-for-48) with three doubles, three RBI, eight walks, 13 runs and five stolen bases in this soan. He tallied a stolen base in four straight games during this run from April 17-22, marking his first time stringing four straight games with a steal since July 8-14, 2021, with Altoona. He picked up three RBI in Game 1 on Friday, driving in three-plus runs for the first time since Sept. 22, 2024 at St. Paul. He has recorded one-plus hit in six of his past seven games and nine of the 12 games in this span.

GLASS HALF FUL: Carson Fulmer earned his second loss as he turned in the Indians first quality start of the season on Sunday, tossing 6.0 innings with three runs, eight hits, three walks and two strikeouts. It marked his first quality start since Sept. 10, 2023, with Salt Lake vs. Tacoma, in which he threw 6.0 innings of one-run ball (unearned). Fulmer has gone 5.0-plus innings and has allowed three runs or less in four of his five starts on the campaign.

JACK'S BACK: Jack Suwinski is off to a hot start since being optioned to Indianapolis, going 4-for-10 with one double, one home run, two RBI, three walks, two runs and one stolen base in three games. In the fourth inning of Game 1 on Friday, Suwinski launched a solo home run out of the stadium off major league rehabber Michael Tonkin. Suwinski crushed the 3-2 fastball 110.3 mph and 413 feet. He has reached base safely two-plus times in each of his three contests on the campaign.

YEAN SHORTS: Eddy Yean tossed 1.2 scoreless frames in Friday's Game 1 victory, marking five straight scoreless outings. He has thrown 7.0 innings with six hits, two walks and five strikeouts in this span. This, opposed to allowing four runs, five hits and five walks with just one strikeout in his first 2.1 innings this season. It is his longest scoreless outing streak since six consecutive from July 17-Sept. 4, 2024 with Altoona.

COMEBACK KIDS: Indianapolis earned its eighth comeback win of the season and improved to 7-1 in one-run games on Saturday. The squad is 5-0 in extra innings and has recorded four walk-off wins, all of which ended in extra frames. Indy's four walk-offs in April tied a Victory Field high for most walk-offs in the month.

HOMETOWN HOOSIER: Matt Gorski was selected by Pittsburgh and made his MLB debut Thursday night, going 1-for-4 with a home run in his first major league plate appearance. He became the first Pirate to homer in his MLB debut since Ke'Bryan Hayes in 2020 and the first Pirate to homer in his first career plate appearance since Starling Marte in 2012. Gorski clobbered the ball 115.2 mph and 434 feet. With that exit velocity, he tied Jake Burger's blast on July 17, 2021 with Chicago (AL) for the hardest-hit first career homer in the Statcast era (2015).

TODAY'S MATCHUP: The Indianapolis Indians begin a six-game series against the Omaha Storm Chasers today at 12:05 PM. The Indians lost last year's season series, 3-10, going 1-5 as the home team and 2-5 as the away team. Taking the mound for the Indians is right-hander Thomas Harrington. He is set to make his fifth start of the season after taking his first loss in Game 1 of April 23rd's doubleheader at St. Paul, tossing a season-high 4.0 innings with six hits, five runs, one walk and four strikeouts. He is set to make his first career start against Omaha. Opposite Harrington is Storm Chasers right-hander Luinder Avila. Avila allowed three runs over 3.0 innings in his last start on April 23 at Toledo. He is set to make his first career start against Indianapolis.

ON THIS DATE IN 2012: Three Indians combined on a no-hitter in Durham for the third no-no in the Victory Field era and first since Ian Snell spun a 9.0-inning no-hitter on May 15, 2005 vs. Norfolk. Left-hander Justin Wilson got the nod and threw 7.1 innings, yielding two walks with nine strikeouts. Jose Diaz then recorded the final two outs in the eighth inning before Doug Slaten slammed the door with a 1-2-3 ninth to give Indy a 2-0 victory. The no-hitter was just the fourth combined effort of 13 no-hitters in franchise history at the time and first since Pedro Martinez, Felix Rodriguez and Scott Service held Louisville hitless in the second game of a doubleheader on May 25, 1997.
