**Aviators vs. River Cats:** The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, will face the Sacramento River Cats, Triple-A affiliate of the San Francisco Giants, tonight in the finale of the three-game series in Pacific Coast League action at Sutter Health Park (14,014)...Las Vegas is 5-4 on the 10-game road trip (4-3 vs. Tacoma; 1-1 vs. Sacramento)...following an off day tomorrow, the two teams will conclude the home-and-home six-game series at Las Vegas Ballpark from Friday-Sunday, August 19-21...Las Vegas will then host the Sugar Land Space Cowboys in a six-game series from Aug. 23-28.

**Las Vegas defeats Sacramento 12-1 in game two of the series:** The Aviators defeated the River Cats 12-1 last night in game two of the home-and-home six-game series before a crowd of 2,813 at Sutter Health Park.

**Las Vegas offense:** The Aviators recorded 12 hits and built a 6-0 lead after 4 ½ innings. Right fielder **Billy McKinney** was 1-for-3, three walks, three-run home run, three runs scored. Catcher **Beau Taylor** was 2-for-5, two doubles, walk, RBI, run scored; third baseman **Matt Davidson** was 2-for-5, walk, double, two-run home run, two runs scored; first baseman **Dalton Kelly** was 2-for-5, RBI, run scored; shortstop **Kevin Smith** was 1-for-3, stolen base, walk, double, SF, RBI, two runs scored and DH **Dermis Garcia** (1-for-5) hit a three-run home run in the fifth inning.

**Sacramento offense:** The River Cats recorded 6 hits and scored their lone run in the sixth inning on an RBI single by catcher **Jhonny Pereda** (1-for-3, walk). Third baseman **David Villar** was 2-for-5, double.

**Las Vegas starting pitching:** Left-hander **Hogan Harris** pitched 4.0 shutout innings in his Triple-A debut. He allowed 2 hits, walked 4 and struck out 7 on 79 pitches (47 strikes).

**Las Vegas defeats Tacoma 5-4 in game four of the series (Friday, August 12):** The Aviators defeated the Rainiers 5-4 in game four of the seven-game series before a crowd of 6,338 at Cheney Stadium.

**Las Vegas offense:** The Aviators recorded 11 hits and rallied for five runs in the seventh inning, highlighted by a three-run home run by left fielder **Dermis Garcia** (1-for-5). First baseman **Dalton Kelly** was 2-for-3, walk, run scored; catcher **Shea Langeliers** was 2-for-5, RBI, run scored; second baseman **Sheldon Neuse** was 2-for-5, run scored and center fielder **Cristian Pache** was 2-for-4.

**Tacoma offense:** The Rainiers recorded 9 hits and rallied for three runs in the seventh inning on a three-run home run by designated hitter **Abraham Torro** (1-for-4). Right fielder **Jarred Kelenic** was 2-for-5, RBI and center fielder **Forrest Wall** was 1-for-2, HBP, walk, stolen base, run scored.

**Las Vegas sweeps Tacoma in double-header (Saturday, August 13):** The Aviators swept the double-header against Tacoma by the scores of 9-4 and 5-3 in games five and six of the seven-game series and the 10-game road trip before a crowd of 6,749 at Cheney Stadium.

**Las Vegas offense:** The Aviators recorded 14 runs and 19 hits in the double-header. Left fielder **Billy McKinney** was 2-for-2, with 2 HR, 4 RBI, HBP, three runs scored in GM#1-DH. Third baseman **David MacKinnon** was 2-for-3, walk, double, run scored in GM#2-DH.

**Tacoma offense:** The Rainiers recorded 7 runs and 13 hits in the double-header. Outfielder **Forrest Wall** was 3-for-7, solo home run, two runs scored in the DH.

**Tacoma defeats Las Vegas 9-1 in series finale (Sunday, August 14):** The Rainiers defeated the Aviators 9-1 in the finale of the seven-game series before a crowd of 6,326 at Cheney Stadium.

**Las Vegas offense:** The Aviators recorded 7 hits and scored their lone run in the fifth inning on a home run by center fielder **Cristian Pache** (1-for-3). Third baseman **David MacKinnon** was 2-for-4; right fielder **Luis Barrera** was 1-for-3, double and first baseman **Matt Davidson** was 1-for-3.

**Tacoma offense:** The Rainiers recorded 11 hits and built a 5-0 lead after four innings. Second baseman **Drew Ellis** was 2-for-4, two home runs, 3 RBI. Third baseman **Jonathan Villar** was 2-for-5, double, run scored; catcher **Josh Morgan** was 2-for-4, with a solo home run in the third inning and left fielder **Derek Hill** was 1-for-1, three walks, two stolen bases, double, RBI, two runs scored.

**Sacramento defeats Las Vegas 4-2 in series opener (Monday, August 15):** The River Cats defeated the Aviators 4-2 last night in the opener of the home-and-home six-game series before a crowd of 2,583 at Sutter Health Park.

**Las Vegas offense:** The Aviators recorded six hits and scored solo runs in the first and ninth innings. Right fielder **Luis Barrera** was 2-for-3, walk, double, run scored. Third baseman **Sheldon Neuse** was 2-for-4, double; catcher **Beau Taylor** was 1-for-4, double, RBI and designated hitter **Matt Davidson** was 1-for-4, RBI.

**Sacramento offense:** The River Cats recorded 6 hits and broke the 1-1 tie with a solo run in the sixth inning on an RBI double by catcher **Andrew Knapp** (2-for-4, two doubles, 2 RBI). Center fielder **Bryce Johnson** was 1-for-3, stolen base, RBI, run scored and third baseman **David Villar** was 1-for-3, walk.

**AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS –** Las Vegas is 5-4 on the 10-game road trip (4-3 vs. Tacoma; 1-1 vs. Sacramento)...the three-game series against the Sacramento River Cats, Triple-A affiliate of the San Francisco Giants, will conclude this evening...Las Vegas and Sacramento will play each other 27 times during the regular season...**37** games are remaining on the 2022 regular season (21-home; 16-away)...Oklahoma City Dodgers have the best record in the 10-team PCL at 64-48 (.571)...Las Vegas and Sacramento will have an off day on Thursday, August 18...the two teams will then conclude the six-game home-and-home series at Las Vegas Ballpark from Friday-Sunday, August 19-21...following an off day on Monday, August 22, the Aviators will continue the nine-game homestand and host the Sugar Land Space Cowboys, Triple-A affiliate of the Houston Astros, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, August 23-28...the '22 season will feature six-games series, with a few exceptions, from Tuesday-Sunday and off days on Monday (with three road exceptions, *July 4, August 15, September 26*)...the 2022 season will also feature 150 games (75-home; 75-away).

**40 SEASONS IN THE SILVER STATE –** The Aviators are playing in their 40<sup>th</sup> Triple-A professional baseball season (calendar season) in the Silver State and member of the Pacific Coast League...the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being the longest enduring franchise in the history of professional sports in the state of Nevada...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8).

**PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE:** The PCL returns in 2022 (118 years, 1903-2020, 2022 -) and consists of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **West Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **East Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Dodgers, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys. The 10-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A West.

**INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE:** The IL consists of two divisions for a total of 20 teams. **East Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Norfolk Tides, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **West Division:** Columbus Clippers, Gwinnett Stripers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. The 20-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A East.

### **LAS VEGAS TO HOST INAUGURAL TRIPLE-A CHAMPIONSHIP WEEKEND:**

*New postseason format includes three, winner-take-all games to crown the 2022 champions*

**May 3, 2022** — Minor League Baseball™ (MiLB™) announced the Las Vegas Aviators will host the inaugural Triple-A Triple Championship Weekend Sept. 30–Oct. 2, 2022, at Las Vegas Ballpark...the three-game series will begin with the division winners of the Triple-A Pacific Coast League squaring off for the league championship on Sept. 30 at 7:05 p.m. PST/10:05 p.m. ET...on Saturday, Oct. 1, the International League division winners will meet to determine the International League champion at 6:05 p.m. PT/9:05 p.m. ET...the two league champions will then meet on Oct. 2 at 4:05 p.m. PT/7:05 p.m. ET to determine the overall Triple-A National Champion.

“This new playoff system to determine an overall champion will create an exciting finish to the Triple-A season,” said **Morgan Sword**, Major League Baseball’s Executive Vice President, Baseball Operations. “We appreciate the Las Vegas Aviators hosting this inaugural event and we look forward to an exciting weekend of championship-caliber baseball at one of MiLB’s premier ballparks.”

Las Vegas Ballpark was slated to host the 2020 Triple-A National Championship Game, and the Aviators jumped at the opportunity to stage the showcase event in 2022.

“We’re very excited to host the Triple-A Triple Championship weekend as Las Vegas Ballpark was built to host events like this,” said Aviators President & Chief Operations Officer **Don Logan**. “It will be great to bring our Triple-A brethren together and crown a champion in this new and exciting format.”

Since the Triple-A National Championship Game’s inception in 2006, the Pacific Coast League has won nine of the 15 winner-take-all games against the International League, with the Sacramento River Cats defeating the Columbus Clippers 4-0 in the most recent Championship Game in 2019. The Durham Bulls had the overall best record among the 30 Triple-A teams in 2021, but a traditional postseason was not scheduled due to ongoing COVID-19 restrictions...the National Championship team will receive a cash prize to be split among their players.



**2021 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 65-61 (.516) and finished in third place in Triple-A West, Western Division. The Tacoma Rainiers captured the regular season championship with the best record in the 10-team Triple-A West with a mark of 78-52 (.600). The Durham Bulls, Triple-A affiliate off the Tampa Bay Rays, captured the best overall record in Triple-A baseball with a mark of 86-44 (.662).

**2019 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled the second-best record in the 16-team Pacific Coast League at 83-57 (.593)...Round Rock Express had the best record in the PCL at 84-56 (.600)...Las Vegas tied a franchise record for most road wins in a season with 44 (2002 team was 44-28, .611)...Las Vegas clinched its first PCL Playoff berth since the 2014 season (Triple-A affiliate of the New York Mets)...Las Vegas lost to Sacramento, 3-games-to-2, in the League Championship Series...the River Cats captured the PCL and the Triple-A championships...Las Vegas recorded 250 home runs, breaking the previous mark of 184 (2001, 2004).

**LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS** – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590)); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580)); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563))...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

**LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY:** The Howard Hughes Corporation® (NYSE: HHC) announced on October 10, 2017 its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on Friday, February 23, 2018 before a crowd of several hundred people!

The 8,196-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark provides a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall.

Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site is landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites.

The grand opening took place on Tuesday, April 9, 2019 before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

**LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION:** The Howard Hughes Corporation®, owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of the Pacific Coast League, and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on December 8, 2018 the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Oakland Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51s) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.
