

LAST GAME: The Timber Rattlers walked off the TinCaps, 4-3. A back-and-forth game saw San Diego Padres Affiliates Wisconsin take an early 2-0 lead, then Fort Wayne scored all of its runs in the fifth as Lucas Dunn was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded and Nerwilian Cedeño knocked a 2-run double. But the Rattlers equalized in the eighth and Gregory Barrios won it in the ninth. Triple-A: El Paso Chihuahuas (El Paso, TX) BREW CREW: The TinCaps drove up from Fort Wayne Monday. They broke up the 355-mile drive with a stop at American Family Field to see the Brewers beat the Cubs. The experience was extra meaningful for outfielder Kai Murphy, whose dad (Pat) is Milwaukee's Double-A: San Antonio Missions manager. It was also fitting that Robert Gasser, who pitched for the TinCaps in 2022 before (San Antonio, TX) being traded to the Brewers, threw 6+ scoreless innings... Milwaukee's roster this season has also included the following former TinCaps: Jake Bauers (2014); Owen Miller (2018); Colin Rea (2012-13); and Joe Ross (2012-13)... Speaking of local ties, right-handed reliever High-A: Fort Wayne TinCaps Cole Paplham (MLB.com's No. 17 Padres prospect) grew up in nearby Denmark. (Fort Wayne, IN) HOT CAPS: The TinCaps have won 9 of their last 12 games... During a 7-game winning streak from May 15-22 (the team's longest since 2015), Fort Wayne hit .279 with an .839 OPS. The TinCaps scored 58 runs in that span (8+/G), the most in the Midwest League and 3rd among MiLB's 120 full-season teams. 'Caps pitchers posted a 2.95 ERA in that stretch... During the winning streak, the TinCaps left just 34 runners on base, 2<sup>nd</sup> fewest among the 120. 'CAPS IN THE COMMUNITY: On Friday, TinCaps players and staff volunteered with The Rescue Mission, a local non-profit organization that provides restorative care to those experiencing (Peoria, AZ) a homelessness crisis. One group served lunch and helped with other chores at the Life House building downtown, while others assisted at Charis House, a shelter for women and children, and yet another group offered aid at Treasure House, a thrift store.

RALLY CAPS: The TinCaps have overcome a deficit in 14 of their 21 wins.

CLOSE CALLS: The 'Caps have played 8 extra-inning games, 3rd most in MiLB behind only Beloit and Triple-A Columbus (9)... The TinCaps have played 16 one-run games (tied with Lansing for most in MWL) and 8 two-run games... Fort Wayne has 3 walk-off wins... Until May 18, the 'Caps hadn't won a game by more than 3 runs.

KEEPING IT IN THE YARD: Offensively, the TinCaps have hit 10 homers over their last 11 games. Meanwhile, Fort Wayne's pitchers have allowed the 2<sup>nd</sup> fewest homers per 9 innings in the MWL this season (0.7, just 30 in 46 games).

DEFENSE: Kai Murphy leads the MWL in outfield assists (5)... As a team, the TinCaps are 2<sup>nd</sup> in OA (11)... Their catchers are 2<sup>nd</sup> in the MWL in caught stealing % at 28% (the league average is 22%). Individually, Anthony Vilar and Ethan Salas rank 5th in CS (9)... As a team, the TinCaps rank 2<sup>nd</sup> in fielding % behind only the Rattlers.

ETHAN SALAS: 8-game hitting streak - tied for longest active in MWL - ended Tuesday. Was 11-for-29 (.379 avg) with 4 doubles, a homer, 8 RBIs, 9 runs, 5 walks, and only 4 strikeouts.

KAI MURPHY: 12 doubles. 3rd in MWL.

HOMER BUSH JR: 24 stolen bases, most in MWL.

DEVIN ORTIZ: 12-game on-base streak.

FORT WAYNE FAITHFUL: Parkview Field hosted sellout crowds May 17-19, including May 18's season-high turnout of 8,402. That was the largest for a May game in the franchise's history. It was also the largest crowd at Parkview Field for a non-July 4<sup>th</sup> date since 2018. The weekend marked the first time the TinCaps sold out 3 consecutive games since 2018, and was the highest attendance for a Friday-Sunday stretch since 2015... The TinCaps sold out 2 more games last week as well.

### More News, Notes & Season Storylines

**SLAM FACTOIDS:** Fort Wayne hit a grand slam in 3 consecutive games (May 18-21) for the first time in franchise history. (Research credit: **Dylan Sinn** from *The Journal Gazette*.) The MLB record for consecutive games with a slam is 4 (Padres, 2020).

MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS NIGHT: Two weeks ago MiLB and RADical Hope announced a new partnership aimed at addressing the mental health crisis across the United States by empowering young adults with skills and resources so they're equipped to cope *before* they reach a crisis point. As part of Mental Health Awareness Month, the TinCaps are one of select teams offering a free workshop at Parkview Field where RADial Hope is sharing mental health resources, skills, and exercises for building resiliency, as well as discussion-based activities to further the conversation on mental health... In partnership with Parkview Sports Medicine as well, the TinCaps invited local middle school, high school, college, and club team captains and coaches for a wellness training on Saturday. Participants also received a free ticket and food voucher for that night's game... Additionally, the following non-profits have kiosks on the concourse: Fort Wayne's chapter of the National Alliance on Mental Illness; Remedy Live; Samaritan Dog; Sunny PATHH; and Great Kids Make Great Communities.

**BASEBALL HISTORY:** On May 4, 1871, the Fort Wayne Kekiongas played the Cleveland Forest Citys in the first ever professional baseball league game. The game, played at present-day Camp Allen Park just outside of Downtown Fort Wayne, marked the start of the National Association, which later became the National League. Fort Wayne won, 2-0, led by starting pitcher **Bobby Mathews**... On May 6, 1927, the Yankees played an exhibition game against the Lincoln Lifers semi-pro team at League Park in Fort Wayne (where Headwaters Park is now downtown). New York was in between traveling from Washington D.C. to Chicago. The exhibition was tied, 3-3, through 9 innings until **Babe Ruth** hit a 2-run homer in the 10<sup>th</sup> to lead the Yankees to a 5-3 win in front of a crowd of more than 3,000... **Tony Gwynn** was born May 9, 1960. Gwynn and the Padres twice visited Fort Wayne for exhibition games (May 13, 1999 and April 27, 2001).

**BACK AT PARKVIEW FIELD**: While the TinCaps were on the road earlier this month, the Parkview Sports Medicine Baseball Classic concluded with the 3<sup>rd</sup> night of high school baseball doubleheaders. **Kylar Decker**, a TinCaps Grounds Crew intern, threw a 3-hit shutout for Leo over Columbia City, while **Grant Peters**, also a member of the Grounds Crew's gameday staff, tossed a 2-hit shutout for Carroll over Homestead... Last week New Haven beat Woodlan and Northrop took on North Side... Tuesday saw matchups between Wayne and South Side, and Snider versus Blackhawk Christian.

**PROSPECTS:** Catcher **Ethan Salas** isn't just the top-rated Padres prospect, he's also the top catching prospect in baseball, according to MLB.com. They also rank Salas as the No. 6 overall prospect. Starting pitcher **Dylan Lesko** is the top righty in San Diego's system and MLB.com's 9<sup>th</sup> best RHP across the sport. Meanwhile, *Baseball America* included outfielder **Tyler Robertson** and first baseman **Griffin Doersching** on their pre-season "top 40." *BA* also highlighted reliever **David Morgan** on a list of prospects who impressed during spring training and ranked him as San Diego's 23<sup>rd</sup> best prospect... *Baseball America* has ranked Fort Wayne's roster as 1 of the 10 most talented in all of MiLB.

WEATHER WOES: 3 of the first 7 home dates at Parkview Field were rained out... April also featured another game delayed more than 70 minutes by rain.

**CONSECUTIVE POSTPONEMENTS:** Before April 10-11, Fort Wayne hadn't had consecutive home games postponed since May 30-31, 2006. That was at Memorial Stadium. Parkview Field opened in 2009. **Ethan Salas** was born June 1, 2006.

FUN FACT: The first game in Fort Wayne's franchise history was April 10, 1993 on the road against the Waterloo Diamonds (then a Padres affiliate). Waterloo's starting second baseman was Homer Bush Sr., who went on to be a MWL All-Star... The current voice of the Dragons, Tom Nichols, was on the radio call for the Wizards then.

**PREMEIR PLAY: Lucas Dunn's** 10<sup>th</sup>-inning diving catch and outfield assist from left field on Opening Day at Great Lakes was 1 of 5 finalists for MiLB's Premier Play of the Week that week.

AROUND BASEBALL: MLB.com's No. 1 ranked prospect, Jackson Holliday, made his debut with the Orioles last month. His uncle, Josh, is the head coach at Oklahoma State, where TinCaps first baseman Griffin Doersching played as a grad student in 2022. At the time, former MLB All-Star Matt Holliday was a volunteer assistant coach, and Jackson, as a high schooler, was often around.

ATTENDANCE CONTEXT: Parkview Field's Opening Day crowd of 4,422 was the largest Opening Day gathering here since 2017 (when Opening Day fell on a Saturday). The TinCaps had the largest crowd of the night in the MWL.

260 TO THE SHOW: Since Fort Wayne's franchise was founded in 1993, the club has had 223 alumni go on to reach the big leagues, including more than 40 in MLB so far this year. The list features All-Stars like Fernando Tatis Jr. (2017), Trea Turner (2014), Max Fried (2013-14), David Bednar (2016-17), Ty France, and Miles Mikolas (2010), plus rookies Jackson Merrill and Graham Pauley (2023).

WHAT'S NEW AT PARKVIEW FIELD: During the off-season, as part of a \$1.2 million project to comply with MLB specifications, Parkview Field's playing surfaced was replaced. Additionally, the front steps of the ballpark were improved, as was the flooring of the PSM Treetops, while other areas of the yard were freshly painted... New concessions options include popcorn in a batting helmet, elote, and Bloody Marys.

15<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY: This season marks a decade and a half of TinCaps baseball at Parkview Field. During the year, the team is celebrating with special edition jerseys for select home games, among other promotions.


