Friday: RubberDucks 8-5, Curve 3-6: José Tena's first career grand slam led an 8-3 Game 1 win, and Jhonkensy Noel's two-run homer sparked a comeback from a 5-1 deficit in Game 2, but Altoona scored an eighth-inning run and held on for a 6-5 victory and twin bill split.

Valera and Noel selected for All-Star Futures Game: RubberDucks outfielders George Valera and Jhonkensy Noel were named on Wednesday as representatives of the Cleveland Guardians in the July 16 SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles. The game is 7 p.m. ET on the Saturday prior to the 2022 MLB All-Star Game. Both were selected for the first time and signed in July 2017 out of San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic.

Rocchio rolling: Brayan Rocchio had a nine-game hitting streak (17-38, 4 doubles, 5 homers, 13 RBI) snapped in Game 2 Friday, but he has hits in 16 of his last 18 games. Since June 12, he is third in the Eastern League in slugging (.645) and OPS (1.057), while going 27-for-76 (.355) with seven doubles, five home runs, 16 RBI and 16 runs.

Homers galore: The RubberDucks have hit 16 home runs in nine second-half games. Jhonkensy Noel has six Double-A homers, and his 25 home runs this season are tied for most in the minor leagues. Brayan Rocchio has four home runs in his last seven games. Micah Pries homered in each of the first three second-half games in Erie and has nine homers in his last 24 games to become the team leader (and second in the Guardians organization). Akron hit 35 home runs as a team in June after hitting 34 combined in April and May.

Strikeout leaders: RubberDucks pitchers have struck out 847 batters, the most of any team in Double-A and sixth in all of baseball. Akron's starting staff has 474 strikeouts, the most in minor league baseball. Three current or former RubberDucks rank in the top 10 in the Eastern League in strikeouts: Logan Allen (104, second), Hunter Gaddis (93, third), Joey Cantillo (83, T-7th). Akron has allowed a league-low 68 home runs and recorded the second-most saves (23).

Offense improving: Through May 15, the RubberDucks had the lowest batting average (.213), OBP (.301) and slugging (.323), and fewest home runs (18) in the Eastern League. But in 45 games since May 17, beginning a series in Binghamton, Akron is 25-20 and first in walks (190), second in doubles (98), runs (250), OBP (.341), SLG (.441) and OPS (.782), fourth in batting average (.249), hits (374) and stolen bases (50), and fifth in homers (57) and triples (10), with the second-fewest strikeouts (390). Akron is tied for the league high with 43 games decided by one or two runs. It is 24-19 in those games (12-13 in one-run games and 12-6 in two-run games) and 18-16 in games decided by 3+ runs. Akron is 6-6 in extra innings.

RubberDucks host Curve: Akron is playing its second of four series with Altoona this season, with series at PNG Field Aug. 2-7 and Aug. 30-Sept. 4. Akron won four of six games in the first half. In 2021, the RubberDucks were 13-11 against the Curve, including 8-5 at Canal Park. According to MLB.com, top prospects in this series include:

Pries named back-to-back Player of the Week: Micah Pries was the Eastern League Player of the Week for June 20-26 and June 28-July 3. His 14-game hitting streak June 21-July 8 is Akron's longest this season and the third-longest in the Eastern League this season. Pries homered in four straight games June 26-30, tying the league's longest streak this season. In six games against Harrisburg, Pries was 9-for-22 with two doubles, a triple, two home runs, 10 RBI, a stolen base and seven runs scored. In five games in Erie, Pries was 10-for-20 with two doubles, three home runs, six RBI, six walks, three stolen bases and six runs scored. Three RubberDucks have also won three Pitcher of the Week awards – Daniel Espino April 18-24, Hunter Gaddis May 16-22, and Logan Allen June 13-19.

RubberDucks win Eastern League June Pitcher & Player of the Month: RubberDucks Logan Allen (promoted to Columbus June 29) and Micah Pries were named Eastern League Pitcher and Player of the Month, respectively. In four starts, Allen went 3-0 with a 1.75 ERA, 39 strikeouts and a .107 opponents' average. He pitched 6+ innings in each start, never allowed more than three hits, and he struck out a career-high 11 batters in each of his last two starts. Pries hit .312 with a .394 on-base percentage and led the league in RBI (25), slugging (.688) and total bases (64). He was second in home runs (nine), third in OPS (1.082), fourth in runs scored (19) and sixth in hits (29).

Valera heating up: Since May 17, George Valera leads the Eastern League with 53 hits, 42 RBI, and 37 runs. He is also second to Micah Pries for most total bases (100), fifth in batting average (.310), sixth in extra-base hits (23), seventh in OPS (.970), and eighth slugging (.585). Overall, his 57 runs lead the league, he is fourth in RBI (51), fifth in walks (44) and tied for sixth in hits (75). Among Guardians full-season minor leaguers, he is second in hits and runs, tied for second in RBI (50), third in total bases (133), tied for third in homers (13), and fourth in extra-base hits (30) and slugging (.494).

- Entered season ranked as No. 11 prospect (No. 4 pitching prospect) in Cleveland system according to MLB.com.
- On the injured list May 8-June 3 with a right shoulder strain.

- Entered the season as Cleveland's No. 16 overall prospect according to MLB.com.
- Made his pro debut with 18 starts for High-A Lake County.
- Was on the injured list July 20-Aug. 5 with elbow soreness.

Amateur

- Named to 2020 Preseason All-American lists by Baseball America and Perfect Game, and named to the Golden Spikes Award preseason watch list.
- Posted a 2.86 ERA over three seasons at Auburn...Became the third Auburn player to be named a two-time All-American, joining Gregg Olson (1987-88) and Casey Mize (2017-18).
- As a sophomore in 2019, he helped Auburn reach the College World Series. He had 101 strikeouts (79.2 IP), joining Casey Mize (2017-18) as the only Auburn pitchers since 2000 to strike out 100 batters. He matched Auburn's single-game record of 15 strikeouts, joining five others, including Casey Mize (2018) and Tim Hudson (1997), Auburn's volunteer pitching coach since 2020.
- As a freshman in 2018, he was named a Freshman All-American by *Baseball America*, Collegiate Baseball, D1 Baseball and Perfect Game/Rawlings. He was second to Casey Mize on the Auburn staff in innings (86.2), strikeouts (77) and wins (7) while posting a 3.01 ERA.
- Played for the USA Baseball 2018 Collegiate National Team that featured 2019 No. 1 overall pick Adley Rutschman and 2020 No. 1 overall pick Spencer Torkelson.
- Named Alabama's Mr. Baseball and Gatorade Player of the Year in 2017 and rated by Perfect Game as the No. 4 player in Alabama and No. 33 in the country. As a high school senior, he went he 10-1, 0.88 ERA, 116 K in 64 IP and hit .467, 16 HR, 46 RBI
- Five-year letterwinner at Decatur High School and a member of the 2016 USA Baseball 17U national team... Drafted by the Yankees in the 37th round in 2017 but did not sign.

Personal

- In 2020 Burns began "The 32 Foundation," a charity to raise money for families who need help paying for medical bills at the Children's Hospital of Alabama. According to [Mandy Bell \(MLB.com, March 2022\)](#), it was largely inspired by Hayden Qualls, a young cancer survivor who was a fifth grader when Burns met him in 2018. Burns met Hayden and his dad, Bryan, on a visit to the Children's Hospital of Alabama, where Auburn players make regular visits to patients. Diagnosed with leukemia at age 8, Hayden Qualls beat cancer four times and has been in remission for three years and is finishing his freshman year of high school. Burns keeps in regular communication with Hayden Qualls and his family.
- His father, Mike, played in the Houston Astros organization from 1991-93 as a catcher, first baseman and third baseman. Signed as a nondrafted free agent, Mike later [coached at Decatur High School \(before Tanner played there\) and at Calhoun Community College](#) (Brian Stultz, MiLB.com, June 2020), before leaving college baseball to follow Tanner's career at Auburn.
- From a family of Alabama fans, he originally committed to Alabama, until head coach Mitch Gaspard resigned. Butch Thompson, formerly at Mississippi State, then recruited him to Auburn.

Scouting Report (MLB.com, Preseason 2022)

"Burns usually works at 92-95 mph and touches 97 with some run on his four-seam fastball, and his ability to spot it on either side of the plate may be more impressive than its velocity (which fluctuated after his stint on the injured list) or life. His best secondary pitch is his plus slider/cutter, which arrives in the upper-80s and helped him to have more success against lefties than righties in High-A. He also throws a 78-82 mph downer curveball that has gotten more consistent in pro ball and has some feel for a low-80s changeup with some sink.

With the ability to throw four pitches for strikes and advanced command of his fastball, Burns has a high floor as well as the upside of a mid-rotation starter. The biggest concern is his durability because he's small for a starter, had shoulder issues in 2019 before his elbow flared up last year and his stuff has declined at the end of his last two full seasons. If he can stay healthy, his biggest backers believe he could be similar to fellow former Southeastern Conference standout Sonny Gray."

2022 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (Third Season) – Odor, 54, is in his 35th season with the Cleveland organization as a player, coach and manager. The 2022 season will be Odor's third as RubberDucks manager (tying him with Joel Skinner, Dave Wallace and Brad Komminsk for most seasons as Akron's manager). In 2021, Odor was named Double-A Northeast Manager of the Year after leading Akron to the Double-A Northeast championship and a 73-46 record. He also guided the RubberDucks to a 61-79 record in 2019. Odor entered 2022 with a career record of 534-513 as a manager.

Odor was the first member of the Guardians organization to be a member of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and RubberDucks. He was an infielder for Canton-Akron for parts of the 1991, 1993 and 1994 seasons. Odor served as the Aeros hitting coach in 2012 and served as the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014.

A native of Maracaibo, Venezuela, Odor was a 32nd round selection by Cleveland in the 1988 draft out of the University of New Orleans. The former shortstop played in the minor leagues for Cleveland from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. The 2019 season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League (1999-2000), the Burlington Indians (2001-2004), the Mahoning Valley Scrappers (2005-2006), and Gulf Coast League Indians (2007-2008). In 2009, Odor began serving as hitting coach for the Kinston Indians (2009-2010), Double-A Akron Aeros (2011-2012), High-A Carolina Mudcats (2013), Double-A Akron RubberDucks (2014), and Triple-A Columbus Clippers (2015-2017).

Odor resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of major league infielder Rougned Odor.

#35 Owen Dew, Pitching Coach (Second Season) — Owen Dew, 33, is in his sixth season in the Cleveland organization and second as RubberDucks pitching coach. In 2021, Dew led the Akron pitching staff to a 3.78 ERA (second best in the Double-A Northeast) and a franchise record 1,190 strikeouts. Prior to coming to Akron, Dew was the pitching coach for the Mahoning Valley Scrappers in 2017, AZL Indians in 2018 and Lake County in 2019.

Dew was a 21st round selection by Cleveland in 2010 out of the University of Central Florida. He spent parts of three seasons in the Cleveland organization, logging 58 appearances and 152.1 innings. Dew began his baseball journey as a right-handed pitcher for Seminole State College of Florida (2008-2009), before moving to the University of Central Florida in 2010. That same year, Dew advanced through Mahoning Valley with a strong 2.64 ERA in nine starts for the Scrappers. At Class-A Lake County, Dew was converted to a relief pitcher where he appeared in 15 games over the 2010 and 2011 seasons. In Dew's final season as a player, the right hander appeared in 34 games, accruing 70 innings and posted a 3.86 ERA with 41 strikeouts.

Since his playing career, Dew served as an assistant coach at Seminole State College of Florida while also assisting the Cleveland Indians as an associate scout from 2014-2017.

#16 Junior Betances, Hitting Coach (Second Season) — Betances, 49, is in his 25th season with the Guardians organization as a player, coach or executive and second as the hitting coach for the RubberDucks. In 2021, Betances guided the RubberDucks hitters to a .254 average (third best in the Double-A Northeast) with 116 home runs and 577 RBI (second best in the Double-A Northeast).

Betances came to the organization via the 1996 Rule 5 draft after spending six seasons in the Brewers organization. He batted .289 over 165 games in 1998 and 1999 for the Akron Aeros. Betances joined the coaching ranks in various roles for Cleveland's Dominican Summer League team from 2000-2010. Betances then served as Arizona League Indians coach from 2010-2015, and moved to Lake County in 2017 as the Bench coach for Manager Larry Day.

#28 Mike Mergenthaler, Assistant Hitting Coach (Second Season) — Mergenthaler, 33, is in his sixth year with the Cleveland organization and second season with Akron. Mergenthaler spent 2021 as the bench coach for the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Mergenthaler was the bench coach with Lynchburg in 2019. In 2018 and 2019, Mergenthaler worked as a hitting coach for the Cleveland and Milwaukee joint Dominican Summer League team. The Thiells, New York, native was drafted as a player in the 32nd round of the 2011 amateur draft by the San Francisco Giants, playing in their system for parts of 2011 and 2012.

#27 Juan De La Cruz, Bench Coach (Second Season, not consecutive) – De La Cruz, 28, is in his fourth season with the Cleveland organization and second season with Akron, where he was the bench coach in 2019. De La Cruz spent 2021 as the bench coach for Low-A Lynchburg. De La Cruz was signed by Cleveland in 2009 and played eight seasons in the organization. He appeared in 12 games for the RubberDucks in 2017.

Jacob Legan, Athletic Trainer (Second Season) — Legan is in his ninth season in the Cleveland organization and second season in Akron. Prior to coming to Akron, Legan served as the athletic trainer for Lynchburg in 2019. He earned his bachelor's degree in Athletic Training from East Carolina and his master's degree in Exercise Physiology from the University of Akron.

Tyler Grisdale, Strength and Conditioning Coach (First Season) – Grisdale is in his first season with the Guardians organization. Grisdale spent two years in the Miami Marlins organization and four years in the Colorado Rockies organization, including as the Physical Performance Coach for the Spokane Indians (Colorado's High-A affiliate) in 2021.

The franchise began as the **Canton-Akron Indians** in 1989, and then moved to **Canal Park** in Akron as the **Aeros** in 1997, later becoming the **RubberDucks** before the 2014 season.
