Friday: RubberDucks 5, Baysox 1 (12 innings): Josh Rolette hit a go-ahead three-run home run – his first of the season – in the 12th inning, and left-hander **Francisco Pérez** pitched four scoreless innings to finish the longest game (innings) for Akron this season. The series is 2-2, with Akron outscoring Bowie, 11-8, in four games.

Returner shining: In his second season with Akron (81 games in 2019), **Alex Call** is among the offensive leaders in the Double-A Northeast with a .333 average (fifth), .408 OBP (fourth), .537 SLG (ninth), .945 OPS (fifth), 41 hits (tied for sixth), 11 doubles (eighth), 29 runs (tied for third), and 11 stolen bases (second).

Oscar on offense: Outfielder **Oscar González** hit .188 with one home run and nine RBI in his first 29 career Double-A games for the RubberDucks in 2019. In 2021, he is leading the club with eight home runs (tied for sixth in the Double-A Northeast), including four go-ahead homers, 26 RBI (tied for seventh), and 69 total bases (tied for ninth).

Back after two years off: **Richie Palacios** missed the 2019 season due to surgery on a torn right labrum and the 2020 season because of the pandemic. In his first regular season since 2018, Palacios is fifth in the league with a .400 on-base percentage, sixth with 14 doubles, and tied for sixth with 28 runs.

Finding his stride: **Tyler Freeman** had his first career five-hit game May 15 and reached base in his first 21 games this season, including a pair of team-best nine-game hitting streaks. He is tied for ninth in the league in hits (40) and eighth in batting average (.305).

Altoona takes series over Akron: In a series with four one-run games, a two-run game, and a three-run game, the Curve outscored the RubberDucks, 35-32, while winning four of six. The first three games saw both teams take and lose leads. Altoona won Tuesday and Wednesday on eighth-inning go-ahead home runs by Jonah Davis and Rodolfo Castro, respectively. Akron stole eight bases Wednesday – most since May 3, 2007 – and was 16-for-17 in steal attempts in the series. Akron won, 7-5, Friday, with **Oscar González** hitting a go-ahead home run, and 4-3 in Saturday's Game 1. The Curve won, 3-2, in Saturday's Game 2, and 3-0 Sunday.

Home cooking: The RubberDucks won their first six home games and are 12-4 at Canal Park. In 2019, the RubberDucks were 30-40 at home – their first losing record at Canal Park since 2014 (32-39).

Alternate site 2021: Four RubberDucks were at the Indians' alternate site in Columbus in April 2021: pitcher **Nick Mikolajchak**, catchers **Bo Naylor** and **Mike Rivera**, and infielder **Andruw Monasterio**.

RubberDucks visit Baysox: Having lost its first three intradivisional series, Akron is playing the first of two scheduled series this season with the Bowie Baysox, with six games at Prince George's Stadium this week and six at Canal Park June 29-July 4. In 2019, the RubberDucks won 13 of 21 meetings, including 7 of 11 in Bowie. According to MLB.com, top prospects in this series include:

"He gets on base": Akron has three active players among Double-A Northeast leaders in on-base percentage: **Alex Call** (.408, 4th), **Richie Palacios** (.400, 5th) and **Will Benson** (.386, 8th), who has 27 walks (tied for second). Akron is third in the league in team OBP (.340) and fourth in average (.250), with the second fewest strikeouts (328). Akron's 36 stolen bases (18 this road trip) are third most.

A winning start: The last unbeaten team in Double-A in 2021, Akron started the season 6-0 for the first time since the franchise moved from Canton to Akron before the 1997 season. The six-game winning streak was the club's longest since May 2-8, 2018 (seven straight).

First-rounders: In Naylor (No. 29 overall in 2018 draft) and Benson (No. 14 overall in 2016), the RubberDucks feature two Indians first-round picks for the first time since 2016, when **Clint Frazier** (2013) and **Bradley Zimmer** (2014) teamed up in the outfield during the club's last Eastern League championship season.

Who played in 2020? With the 2020 minor league season canceled, **Tyler Freeman** and **Bo Naylor** participated in the alternate site for Cleveland. **Joey Cantillo** was acquired in Cleveland's trade of **Mike Clevinger** to San Diego on Aug. 31 and was at the alternate site for the Padres and Indians. **Will Benson** played for Team Texas in the independent Constellation Energy League in Sugar Land, Texas.

Limited experience: Among the 27 RubberDucks entering Opening Day, only six had played as high as Double-A in their careers. All of those appeared for Akron in 2019. **Alex Call** (81 games) and **Oscar González** (29) are returning outfielders. 2019 RubberDuck **Andruw Monasterio** is the only returning infielder, although **Trenton Brooks**, a 2019 RubberDucks outfielder, will play first base. Ohio State alumnus **Tanner Tully**, the 2019 Akron innings leader (129.1) will be the most experienced member of a pitching staff that otherwise has a total of 10 Double-A innings, all by left-hander **Eli Lingos** when he made a start and relief appearance for Akron in 2019.

Royalty allowed just one unearned run on two hits in six innings, but Altoona right-hander Jeff Passantino and three Curve relievers combined for a 3-0 shutout. In the first inning, Oneil Cruz hit a leadoff single to center field, went to third base on Royalty's errant pickoff throw and scored on Rodolfo Castro's sacrifice fly. After allowing the leadoff single in the first inning, Royalty retired the next 12 batters in a row. He worked around a hit and walk in the fifth inning with the help of a fly ball double play, as the Curve sent two runners in motion on a pitch. Left-hander Skylar Arias pitched a scoreless seventh inning. Right-hander Kyle Marman began the eighth inning and allowed the last two Altoona runs in the 3-0 loss.

2019 Highlights:

- His 24 starts were third most in the Midwest League, even though he missed two weeks on the Injured List in May...June was his best month, when he posted a 2.88 ERA.
- Set a Captains single-season record with 21 hit-batsmen. His 100 strikeouts led the 2019 Captains, who set a club single-season record with 1,207 strikeouts as a staff.
- Pitched two complete games (Captains season record is three), though neither outing lasted longer than six innings. On June 13, Royalty pitched all 5.1 innings of a rain-shortened contest against Great Lakes and earned the victory. On August 5, he pitched game two of a doubleheader at Dayton and went the full six innings in a 1-0 loss.

2018: One of six UNC-Wilmington players to be selected in the 2018 MLB Draft, tying a Seahawks program record. Also in his draft class were C Ryan Jeffers (Twins – 2nd), RHP Austin Warren (Angels – 6th), RHP Clark Cota (A's – 10th), RHP Austin Easter (Blue Jays – 31st) and 1B Mason Berne (Braves – 33rd).

College Highlights:

- 2018 CAA All-Tournament Team, 2017 **2017 CAA Pitcher of the Year**, 1st-Team All-CAA, NCCSIA 1st-Team All-State, ABCA 1st-Team All-East Region, 2016 Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American, CAA All-Rookie Team
- In the 2017 CAA tournament, Royalty pitched a complete game to beat Northeastern en route to a CAA All-Tournament Team nod. The Seahawks won the CAA title.

CONTROL: Royalty walked just five batters over 22.2 innings in his pro debut season (1.99 BB/9). During his collegiate career, the right-hander walked 74 in 262.2 innings (2.53 BB/9).

BASEBALL LINEAGE: Royalty's father, Doug Royalty, pitched for San Diego State University and was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 18th Round of the 1987 MLB Draft. He pitched two years in the minor leagues with Short-Season Auburn (1987) and Low-A Asheville (1988), posting a 15-15 record with a 3.45 ERA. Doug showed similar control to his future son with just 45 walks over 234.2 career innings (1.7 BB/9).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Royalty's mom, Pam, and step-father, Rob Lease, were known for taking road trips up and down the east coast with their dogs, Bear and Roscoe, to watch Alex's home and road games at UNCW. On one occasion in 2018, Rob drove with the two dogs from Raleigh, NC to Phoenix, AZ to watch Alex play Arizona State. The journey spanned over 6,000 miles, round trip (Pam and other family flew to Colorado for skiing and then drove down to Arizona). 2021 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (Second Season) – Odor, 53, became the 18th manager in club history when he led the club in 2019. The RubberDucks posted a 61-79 record, good for fifth in the Eastern League Western Division following a 34-35 first half record. Odor has twelve seasons of managerial experience where he has compiled a career record of 422-442 (.488).

When Odor was Akron's hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2021 season is Odor's 34th in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (21st as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. The 2019 season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League (1999-2000), the Burlington Indians (2001-2004), the Mahoning Valley Scrappers (2005-2006), Gulf Coast League Indians (2007-2008). In 2009, Odor began serving as hitting coach for the Kinston Indians (2009-2010), Double-A Akron Aeros (2011-2012), High-A Carolina Mudcats (2013), Double-A Akron RubberDucks (2014), and Triple-A Columbus Clippers (2015-2017).

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#35 Owen Dew, Pitching Coach (1st Season) — Owen Dew, 32, makes his first visit to Akron after serving as the pitching coach for the Lake County Captains in the Class-A Midwest league in 2019. Dew began his baseball journey as a right-handed pitcher for Seminole State College of Florida (2008-2009), before moving to the University of Central Florida in 2010, when he was drafted in the 21st round of the 2010 amateur draft by the Cleveland Indians. That same year, Dew advanced through Mahoning Valley with a strong 2.64 ERA in nine starts for the Scrappers. At Class-A Lake County, Dew was converted to a relief pitcher where he appeared in 15 games over the 2010 and 2011 seasons. In Dew's final season as a player, the right hander appeared in 34 games, accruing 70 innings and posted a 3.86 ERA with 41 strikeouts.

Since his playing career, Dew served as an assistant coach at Seminole State College of Florida while also assisting the Cleveland Indians as an associate scout from 2014-2017. Dew was then appointed as a full-time minor league pitching coach within the organization, making stops with the Mahoning Valley (2017), Arizona League Indians 2 (2018), and Lake County Captains (2019). The 2019 Lake County Captains pitching staff posted a team ERA of 3.73 over 1191 innings, good for eighth in the Midwest League.

#16 Junior Betances, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Betances, 47, hits Akron for the first time in his 21-year coaching career with the Cleveland Indians organization. After posting a .289 batting average over 165 games in 1998-1999 with the Akron Aeros, Betances joined the coaching ranks in various roles for the Cleveland Indians Dominican Summer League team from 2000-2010. Betances then served as Arizona League Indians coach from 2010-2015, and moved to Lake County in 2017 as the Bench coach for Manager Larry Day. The native of La Vega, Dominican Republic, Betances has developed a wealth of experience in various player development roles within the Indians organization.

#28 Mike Mergenthaler, Bench Coach (First Season) — Mergenthaler, 32, moves up the Indians farm system to Akron in 2021, following his 2019 season serving as the Lynchburg Hillcats bench coach for Manager Jim Pankovits. In 2018 and 2019, Mergenthaler worked as a hitting coach for the Cleveland Indians' and Milwaukee Brewers' joint Dominican Super League team. The Thiells, NY, native was drafted as a player in the 32nd round of the 2011 amateur draft by the San Francisco Giants, playing in their system for parts of 2011 and 2012.

Jacob Legan, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Legan heads to Akron for the first time in his six-year career with the Cleveland Indians. Legan previously served as the Lynchburg Hillcats' athletic trainer in 2019.

Scott Nealon, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Second Season, not consecutive) — Nealon enters his eighth season in the Cleveland Indians organization, returning to the same position he held in 2016 for the RubberDucks Eastern League Championship Series. Nealon was the Triple-A Columbus strength and conditioning coach the last three seasons (2017-2019), including the Clippers' 2019 Governor's Cup championship season. Previously, Nealon served as strength and conditioning coach for the Carolina Mudcats (2013-2014), Lynchburg Hillcats (2015), before he made his way to Double-A Akron. Nealon earned his master's degree in exercise science from Baldwin Wallace University in Berea, Ohio.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World**." Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
