INDY BITS

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: Behind 6.0 scoreless frames from starter Braxton Ashcraft, the Indianapolis Indians blanked the Omaha Storm Chasers, 6-0, with just two hits allowed on Friday night at Werner Park. Ashcraft fired in 47 of his 77 pitches for strikes en route to six strikeouts, his first quality start and first scoreless outing of the season to jumpstart Indy's first 9.0-inning shutout of the season. Ryder Ryan and Isaac Mattson closed out the game with 3.0 hitless frames combined. It was also Indianapolis' second shutout of the road trip after silencing St. Paul in 7.0 innings in a doubleheader opener on April 25. Alike Williams kicked off the scoring in the top of the third inning when a ground ball up the middle bounced off the second base bag into center field. A three-run fifth inning against starter Thomas Hatch then padded the score for the Indians with a Nick Yorke single and two-baggers from Nick Solak and Jack Suwinski. Following a sacrifice fly by Williams, Yorke launched his third homer of the season to straightaway center field to extend the lead, 6-0.

HONE THE 'CRAFT: Braxton Ashcraft extended his winning streak to three games and has posted a win in back-to-back starts, tossing a season-high 6.0 shutout innings with two hits, one walk and a season-high tying six strikeouts. His three-decision outing is his longest with Indianapolis and he recorded wins in back-to-back starts for the first time since June 6-13, 2024, between Altoona and Indianapolis. It marked his second quality start with Indy with his first coming in his Indians debut on June 13, 2024 at Jacksonville. Last night was Ashcraft's first scoreless start of 6.0-plus innings since tossing 7.0 shutout frames on May 14, 2024, with Altoona at Akron.

SOLAK ECLIPSE: Nick Solak continued his scorching run this season, going 1-for-3 with one double, one RBI, two walks and one run in last night's contest. Solak ranks among International League leaders in batting average (.385, 30-for-78, 2nd), OPS (1.071, 3rd), SLG (.628, 5th) and OBP (.443, 6th). He extended his hitting streak to six games, hitting .389 (7-for-18) with two doubles, one home run, four RBI, three walks and four runs in this span. He has reached base safely in 21 of his 22 games on the campaign and has one-plus hit in 20 of those, including a team best 13-game hitting streak from April 3-23. Solak hit .400 (20-for-50) with two doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, 11 runs, three stolen bases and a 1.056 OPS in this span. He struck out just seven times across 55 plate appearances during the hitting streak. His .394 average and 1.070 OPS through April were the highest for an Indians hitter through April (min. 75 PA) since Gregory Polanco hit .400 with a 1.089 OPS through the month in 2014. He tallied a pinch-hit single in the ninth inning on Wednesday after relieving DJ Stewart. With a pinch-hit homer on Sunday in the eighth inning at St. Paul, these marked his first two knocks as a pinch hitter in his minor league career and the latest two since a pinch-hit single off Rick Porcello on Sept. 25, 2019, with Texas vs. Boston.

EXIT MUSIC (FOR A BASEBALL): Nick Yorke launched his third home run of the season in the seventh inning last night, going 2-for-5 with a home run, two RBI, two runs and two stolen bases. It marked his first time homering in back-to-back games since June 8 and 9, 2024, with Worcester. Additionally, he posted back-to-back multi-hit games and multi-RBI games for the first time this season. He swiped two-plus bags for the first time since September 13, 2023, with Portland vs. Hartford. Yorke has reached base safely three-plus times in two of his last six games, two-plus times in four of those and one-plus in five. He swatted his second home run of the season in the first inning on Thursday, going 3-for-5 with two RBI and one run. It marked his second three-hit game of the campaign, last doing so on April 22 at St. Paul.

JACK'S BACK: Jack Suwinski is off to a hot start since being optioned to Indianapolis, going 1-for-5 with one double and one RBI. He has a hit in all six games since his debut, batting .333 (8-for-24) with two doubles, two home runs, five RBI, three walks, five runs and one stolen base. He reached base safely two-plus times in each of his first four games.

YEAN SHORTS: Eddy Yean tossed 1.1 scoreless innings on Tuesday, escaping a bases-loaded jam in the eighth inning after walking three consecutive batters with one out. He extended his scoreless outing streak to six games, surpassing David Bednar's five straight scoreless outings for the longest run by an Indian this season. In this span, he has thrown 8.1 innings with six hits, five walks and five strikeouts. This, opposed to allowing four runs, five hits and five walks with just one strikeout in his first 2.1 innings this season. It is his longest scoreless outing streak since six consecutive from July 17-Sept. 4, 2024, with Altoona.

BAEWATCH: Ji Hwan Bae extended his on-base streak to 15 games on Thursday, going 1-for-4 with a run. It is the longest on-base streak by an Indian this season and is tied for the sixth longest active streak in the International League. He is hitting .295 (18-for-61) with five doubles, five RBI, eight walks, 16 runs and five stolen bases in this span. Since making his season debut with Indy on April 8, he is tied for the IL lead in runs scored during this span with 19. He has one-plus hit in six straight contests, nine of his past 10 and 12 of the 15 games in his active on-base streak. He has scored one-plus run in 11 of the 15 games, including four straight, and one-plus walk in seven of those games. Bae scored a career-high tying four runs on April 17 vs. Toledo (3x, MR: 9/11/22 at OMA). He tallied a stolen base in four straight games from April 17-22, marking his first time stringing four straight games with a steal since July 8-14, 2021, with Altoona. The four consecutive games with a steal are tied for the longest streak by an International League player this season. He picked up three RBI in Game 1 on April 25, driving in three-plus runs for the first time since Sept. 22, 2024, at St. Paul.

TONIGHT'S MATCHUP: The Indianapolis Indians continue this week's six-game series at Werner Park against the Omaha Storm Chasers at 7:35 PM tonight. With a win, the Indians can capture their second series win of the season and can even the series history between the two clubs since 1988, to a 113-113 draw. Right-hander Carson Fulmer is set to make his sixth start of the season, last tossing the Indians first quality start of the season on Sunday at St. Paul, tossing 6.0 innings with three runs, a season-high eight hits, three walks and two strikeouts. In two career games against the Storm Chasers, Fulmer has allowed one run across 2.0 innings with three strikeouts. Opposite Fulmer is Storm Chasers right-hander Anthony Simonelli. Simonelli is set to make his second appearance of the series, earning the win on Wednesday with 2.0 shutout frames. It marked his first career appearance against Indy.

ON THIS DATE IN 1963: In his International League MVP season, shortstop Don Buford was a triple away from the cycle after hitting two singles, a double and home run in an 11-6 win over the Atlanta Crackers at old Victory Field. He went on to hit .336 with 41 doubles, 114 runs and 42 stolen bases that season.

TONIGHT'S PITCHER

Carson Fulmer: Right-hander Carson Fulmer was signed by Pittsburgh as a minor league free agent on December 12, 2024. He has appeared in 114 major league games across stints with the White Sox, Tigers, Orioles, Reds and Angels since his debut in 2016. He made one appearance in the minors last year with Triple-A Salt Lake, allowing one run over 3.0 innings.

Last Outing: Fulmer tossed the Indians first quality start of the season on Sunday at St. Paul, tossing 6.0 innings with three runs, a season-high eight hits, three walks and two strikeouts.

Against the Storm Chasers: In two career games against the Storm Chasers, Fulmer has allowed one run across 2.0 innings with three strikeouts.

Major League Pedigree: Fulmer spent most of 2024 with Los Angeles (AL), appearing in 37 games (eight starts) with the club. He posted an 0-5 record and 4.15 ERA (40er/86.2ip) with 81 hits, 40 walks and 81 strikeouts.

Miscellaneous: Selected eighth overall by Chicago (AL) in the first round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft out of Vanderbilt University (Nashville, Tenn.). As a junior at Vanderbilt in 2015, Fulmer won the National Pitcher of the Year Award after going 14-2 with a 1.83 ERA (26er/127.2ip) with 167 strikeouts.
