Wednesday: Patriots 6, RubberDucks 5: The Patriots took a 5-1 lead with a five-run fourth inning, but the RubberDucks rallied to tie the game, 5-5, on **George Valera's** two-run homer in the sixth inning. The Patriots broke the tie with Dermis Garcia's seventh-inning RBI single and held on for a 6-5 win. **Peyton Battenfield** gave up the five early runs in his shortest start of the season (3.2 IP). **Joey Cantillo** gave up the deciding run in his two innings of relief.

Brayan Rocchio named Player of the Week: Brayan Rocchio was named the Double-A Northeast MiLB Player of the Week for Sept. 6-12. Rocchio hit safely in all six games in Richmond (10-for-27, 2 doubles, 2 triples, 3 RBI, 5 runs). Rocchio is batting .292 with six home runs, 12 doubles, four triples and 30 RBI in 40 games since being promoted to Akron on July 30. Since his Double-A debut July 31, Rocchio leads the league in hits (48), total bases (86), runs (30) and RBI (30), and is tied for the league lead in extra-base hits (22) and triples (four). Between High-A Lake County and Double-A Akron, the 20-year-old has scored 75 runs, leading Cleveland's minor league system. He also ranks second in hits (116), extra-base hits (45), and total bases (196), to **Oscar González**, who was promoted from Akron July 6. Rocchio's 15 total home runs are tied for sixth, his 63 RBI are third, and his 20 stolen bases are second in the system.

New-look RubberDucks: Since July 30, four lineup regulars have joined Akron from High-A Lake County – infielders **Brayan Rocchio** and **Victor Nova** and outfielders **Will Brennan** and **George Valera**. Rocchio had a nine-game hitting streak Aug. 10-19 and four homers in six games Aug. 12-17. Nova is hitting .254 with a .342 on-base percentage in 19 games. Brennan is hitting .292, 2 HR, 20 RBI in 36 games, and his 28 doubles overall rank second in the system. Since his Double-A debut Aug. 4, Brennan is tied for the league lead in runs (27) and tied for third in hits (40). Valera is hitting .286, 3 HR, 18 RBI in 19 games. Overall, Valera is second in the system in walks (65), tied for second in homers (19) and fourth in RBI (61). Valera (#2), Rocchio (#7) and Brennan (#29) are all Top-30 Indians prospects (MLB.com).

Playoff race: Akron has the best record in the Double-A Northeast with four games to play. Bowie is a half game back and would play Akron in a best-of-five championship if the season ended today. Somerset is one game back. Portland is 4.5 back. **Akron's magic number (combination of Akron wins and losses by the third-place club needed) to clinch a playoff berth is four.**

Home cooking: The RubberDucks won their first six home games and are 36-20 at Canal Park. In 2019, the RubberDucks were 30-40 at home – their first losing record at Canal Park since 2014 (32-39).

RubberDucks host Patriots: Akron is playing the last of two scheduled series this season with Somerset, which replaced Trenton this season as the Yankees affiliate. The teams split a series at TD Bank Ballpark in Bridgewater, New Jersey, Aug. 24-29. In 2019, the RubberDucks were 4-8 against Trenton, including 2-4 in Akron. **Akron needs to win three of the six games to finish ahead of Somerset, while the Patriots can jump the RubberDucks by winning four of six.** According to MLB.com, top prospects in this series include:

Ducks split series in Richmond: In their last regular season road series of the year, Akron split six games with the Flying Squirrels. Akron won Tuesday, 5-1. Richmond won Wednesday, 3-1. Akron rallied from a 5-2 deficit for an 11-7 win Thursday. Richmond hit four multi-run homers in a 15-5 victory Friday. Akron took Saturday's game, 5-1. The Flying Squirrels won the finale, 10-4, and ended up outscoring Akron, 37-31, in the series. Akron had only two starting pitchers work at least five innings in the series (both 5.1 IP, Peyton Battenfield Wednesday and Thomas Ponticelli Saturday). The RubberDucks have won at least three games in 13 consecutive series since June 15 (8-2-3 in those series, with the only two losses being 4-3 in two seven-game homestands).

Tough competition: Akron has played 56 of its 115 games against teams .500 or better (32-24 in those games). By comparison, Somerset has played 56 such games, Bowie has played 60, and Portland has played 12 against a winning team.

Top backstop: **Bo Naylor** leads Double-A Northeast catchers with 611.1 innings (71 games) behind the plate (90.1 more than any other), 742 total chances, 687 putouts, 51 assists and 19 runners caught stealing (64 attempts) while behind the plate. Naylor hit just .138 (13-for-94), 1 HR, 5 RBI through 26 Double-A games. But in 57 games since June 19, Naylor is 44-for-204 (.216) with nine doubles, nine homers, 38 RBIs, and a .695 OPS. He has reached base on a hit or walk in 22 of his last 29 games, with hits in 15 of those games.

Limited experience: Among 28 active RubberDucks, one played as high as Double-A before this season. Left-hander **Ben Krauth** was 1-3 with a 4.66 ERA in 56 relief innings for the 2019 RubberDucks.

First Double-A Start

Season Highlights

- Made five starts for Low-A Lynchburg. At the time of his promotion to High-A Lake County, Curry was leading the Low-A East League in ERA (1.07), FIP (1.94), WHIP (0.63), K-BB% (36.2%), batting average against (.135) and BABIP (.220). He was second in K% (40.4%) and LOB% (83.3%).
- Made 13 starts with High-A Lake County before a promotion to Akron on Sept. 13.

2020: Spent part of the spring and early summer living and training with 2021 RubberDucks outfielder Will Benson in Atlanta. Curry and Benson have known each other since they were seven years old. The two were part of a group of Atlanta-area professional and college ballplayers who trained and played pick-up games together after the Spring Training shutdown. The group included 2020 American League Rookie of the Year Kyle Lewis and his Mariners outfield teammate Taylor Trammell, as well as Atlanta's No. 14 prospect Trey Harris. The Atlanta training sessions began with a small group playing on a field behind a local church. As more players joined, they started playing full-fledged pick-up games and moved to LakePoint, where each player chipped in \$10 for field usage fees so the group could make use of the complex's eight major league-sized turf fields.

College:

- Was Georgia Tech's Friday night starter each of his three seasons and became the first Yellow Jacket in the modern era (1973-present) to win three straight Opening Day starts.
- Since 2002, Curry ranks third at Georgia Tech in strikeouts looking (84) and fourth in total strikeouts (241).
- Was a Third-Team All-ACC selection as a junior in 2019.
- Went 3-for-6 as a true freshman and started a game as designated hitter.

High School:

- Attended Mays High School in Atlanta, where he holds Mays school records for wins (32) and home runs (25). Mays was also the football team's quarterback for two years.
- Threw five no-hitters during his high school career.
- Was rated as the No. 27 shortstop recruit in the country by Perfect Game, and was a 2016 Perfect Game/Rawlings Third-Team All-American and a 2016 Perfect Game Southeast All-Region First Team selection. Curry was also a 2015 Perfect Game underclass First-Team All-American and 2014 underclass high honorable mention All-American.

2021 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (Second Season) – Odor, 53, became the 18th manager in club history when he led the club in 2019. The RubberDucks posted a 61-79 record, good for fifth in the Eastern League Western Division following a 34-35 first half record. Odor has twelve seasons of managerial experience where he has compiled a career record of 422-442 (.488). When Odor was Akron's hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2021 season is Odor's 34th in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (21st as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. The 2019 season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League (1999-2000), the Burlington Indians (2001-2004), the Mahoning Valley Scrappers (2005-2006), Gulf Coast League Indians (2007-2008). In 2009, Odor began serving as hitting coach for the Kinston Indians (2009-2010), Double-A Akron Aeros (2011-2012), High-A Carolina Mudcats (2013), Double-A Akron RubberDucks (2014), and Triple-A Columbus Clippers (2015-2017).

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#35 Owen Dew, Pitching Coach (1st Season) — Owen Dew, 32, makes his first visit to Akron after serving as the pitching coach for the Lake County Captains in the Class-A Midwest league in 2019. Dew began his baseball journey as a right-handed pitcher for Seminole State College of Florida (2008-2009), before moving to the University of Central Florida in 2010, when he was drafted in the 21st round of the 2010 amateur draft by the Cleveland Indians. That same year, Dew advanced through Mahoning Valley with a strong 2.64 ERA in nine starts for the Scrappers. At Class-A Lake County, Dew was converted to a relief pitcher where he appeared in 15 games over the 2010 and 2011 seasons. In Dew's final season as a player, the right hander appeared in 34 games, accruing 70 innings and posted a 3.86 ERA with 41 strikeouts.

Since his playing career, Dew served as an assistant coach at Seminole State College of Florida while also assisting the Cleveland Indians as an associate scout from 2014-2017. Dew was then appointed as a full-time minor league pitching coach within the organization, making stops with the Mahoning Valley (2017), Arizona League Indians 2 (2018), and Lake County Captains (2019). The 2019 Lake County Captains pitching staff posted a team ERA of 3.73 over 1191 innings, good for eighth in the Midwest League.

#16 Junior Betances, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Betances, 47, hits Akron for the first time in his 21-year coaching career with the Cleveland Indians organization. After posting a .289 batting average over 165 games in 1998-1999 with the Akron Aeros, Betances joined the coaching ranks in various roles for the Cleveland Indians Dominican Summer League team from 2000-2010. Betances then served as Arizona League Indians coach from 2010-2015, and moved to Lake County in 2017 as the Bench coach for Manager Larry Day. The native of La Vega, Dominican Republic, Betances has developed a wealth of experience in various player development roles within the Indians organization.

#28 Mike Mergenthaler, Bench Coach (First Season) — Mergenthaler, 32, moves up the Indians farm system to Akron in 2021, following his 2019 season serving as the Lynchburg Hillcats bench coach for Manager Jim Pankovits. In 2018 and 2019, Mergenthaler worked as a hitting coach for the Cleveland Indians' and Milwaukee Brewers' joint Dominican Super League team. The Thiells, NY, native was drafted as a player in the 32nd round of the 2011 amateur draft by the San Francisco Giants, playing in their system for parts of 2011 and 2012.

Jacob Legan, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Legan heads to Akron for the first time in his six-year career with the Cleveland Indians. Legan previously served as the Lynchburg Hillcats' athletic trainer in 2019.

Scott Nealon, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Second Season, not consecutive) — Nealon enters his eighth season in the Cleveland Indians organization, returning to the same position he held in 2016 for the RubberDucks Eastern League Championship season. Nealon was the Triple-A Columbus strength and conditioning coach the last three seasons (2017-2019), including the Clippers' 2019 Governor's Cup championship season. Previously, Nealon served as strength and conditioning coach for the Carolina Mudcats (2013-2014), Lynchburg Hillcats (2015), before he made his way to Double-A Akron. Nealon earned his master's degree in exercise science from Baldwin Wallace University in Berea, Ohio.
