### LAST ACTION: [The Wisconsin Timber Rattlers beat the Beloit Snappers 16-6 at Pohlman Field on Sunday afternoon.](#)

Garrett Mitchell had four hits, including two homers, and drove in six runs. Hayden Cantrelle hit two homers and drove in five runs. David Hamilton had four hits. The Timber Rattlers collected 18 hits, including ten for extra bases, on Sunday. The team set new single-game highs in both runs scored, homers, doubles, and hits.

**MITCHELL REPORT (FINAL):** Garrett Mitchell was named the High-A Central League Player of the Week for his performance during the Beloit series. He was 12-for-28 (.48) with twelve runs scored over the six-game set at Pohlman Field. His second home run on Sunday was a grand slam.

**YOU SAY GOODBYE:** The Milwaukee Brewers announced that Mitchell has been promoted to Biloxi, their affiliate in the Double-A South, after Sunday's game.

**I SAY HELLO:** The Brewers also announced that outfielder Joe Gray Jr. had been promoted from Carolina, their Low-A East affiliate, to the Timber Rattlers after Sunday's game. Gray had twelve homers and 53 RBI with Carolina. Gray's RBI total is tops in all classifications of Minor League Baseball in 2021.

**HOME RUNS AT POHLMAN FIELD:** Wisconsin hit thirteen home runs in the series at Beloit. Beloit hit seven home runs in the series, but were homerless on Sunday.

**SNAPPING THE STREAK:** Wisconsin pitchers had allowed at least one home run in ten straight games heading into Sunday's game.

**SPLITSVILLE:** The Timber Rattlers went 3-3 in the series at Beloit. In their first nine series of the 2021 season, Wisconsin has won three, lost three, and split three.

**ABOUT QUAD CITIES:** The River Bandits are the High-A Central League affiliate of the Kansas City Royals. The current version of Davenport Professional Baseball club started in 1960 as the Midwest League affiliate of the Milwaukee Braves. Quad Cities has affiliated with several MLB teams over the years: The California Angels (1962-1978 and 1985-1992), the Chicago Cubs (1979-1984), the Houston Astros (1993-1998 and 2013-2019), the Minnesota Twins (1999-2004), and the St. Louis Cardinals (2005-2012). The team became the Quad City River Bandits in 1992. They changed their name to the Swing of the Quad Cities from 2004 through 2007 before changing to Quad Cities River Bandits in 2008. Quad Cities won Midwest League pennants in 1968, 1971, 1979, 1990, 2011, 2013, and 2017. Notable alumni of Quad Cities: Carlos Correa, Joe Mauer, Josh Hader, Lance Lynn, Carlos Martinez, Billy Wagner, Shawn Dunston, Justin Morneau, and Brett Phillips. Modern Woodmen Park, which opened as Municipal Stadium on May 26, 1931. The stadium was renamed as John O'Donnell Stadium in 1971. The stadium was remodeled after the 2003 season and was renamed Modern Woodmen Park for the 2007.

**ABOUT THE ROYALS:** The Kansas City Royals return to what used of to be the Midwest League after leaving Kane County at the end of the 2012 season. They had previously been in the Midwest League with Waterloo from 1969-1976. Other Midwest League teams the Royals had as an affiliate: Appleton (1987-1992), Rockford (1993-94), Springfield (1995), Lansing (1996-1998), Burlington (2001-2010), and Kane County (2011-2012). The Royals had worked with Lexington in the South Atlantic League as the Low-A affiliate from 2013-2019. Wilmington had been the High-A affiliate of the Royals from 2007-2019.

## WISCONSIN STARTING PITCHER:

**RHP REESE OLSON:** Selected by Milwaukee in the 13<sup>th</sup> round of the 2018 draft out of North Hall High School in Gainesville, Georgia.

**NOT GOING TO GET TECHNICAL:** Olson signed with the Brewers over a scholarship to Georgia Tech.

**MY OLD SCHOOL:** Olson was a junior when North Hall High School won the Georgia State 3A Baseball Championship in 2017. The Bulldogs made the state playoffs again in 2018.

**DESERT DEBUT:** Olson went 0-2 with a 5.23 ERA in four games – two starts – for the AZL Brewers in 2018. He walked four and struck out six in 10-1/3 innings pitched.

**FIRST PRO WIN:** Olson came on in relief at Lansing on May 1 after the April 30 game had been suspended at Cooley Law School Stadium. He pitched five innings and picked up the win for his first professional victory.

**2019:** Olson was 4-7 with a 4.66ERA in 27 games – 14 starts – with Wisconsin in 2019. Olson walked 47 and struck out 84 in 94-2/3 innings.

**LAST START:** Olson had a no decision [at Beloit on July 1](#). He allowed an unearned run on two hits and two walks with five strikeouts over 5-2/3 innings. The Rattlers were up 2-1 when Olson left the game, but the Snappers rallied for a 5-4 win in eleven innings.

**VS. QUAD CITIES (2021):** Olson lost to the [River Bandits at Modern Woodmen Park on June 18](#). He allowed five runs on four hits with four walks and four strikeouts over five innings. Jake Means hit a grand slam in the first inning for the River Bandits and the Wisconsin offense was held to no hits in the game.

## WISCONSIN STARTING PITCHER (GAME 2):

**RHP VICTOR CASTAÑEDA:** The Brewers signed Castañeda as a Minor League Free Agent off the reserve list of Toros de Tijuana from the Mexican League on July 4, 2017.

**TORO! TORO!** Castañeda was 3-1 with a 3.00 ERA over nine games – four starts – for Tijuana in 2017 as an 18-year-old.

**FROM MEXICO TO MONTANA:** Castañeda was 2-6 with a 5.13 ERA in fourteen games – eight starts for Helena in the Pioneer League in 2018. He walked fifteen and struck out 40 in 47-1/3 innings pitched last season.

**WELCOME TO WISCONSIN:** Castañeda was assigned to the Rattlers on May 20, 2019. He was 4-2 with six saves in 32 appearance – one start – with Wisconsin. Castañeda walked 14 and struck out 53 in 44 innings pitched during the 2019 season with the Rattlers.

**THE SEASON WAS NOT OVER:** Castañeda was assigned to the Glendale Desert Dogs for the 2019 Arizona Fall League by the Brewers at the end of the Wisconsin season. He was 3-1 with a 1.99 ERA, six walks, and 29 strikeouts over 22-2/3 innings pitched in six games – five starts – for the Desert Dogs. Castañeda was named the AFL Pitcher of the Week on September 25, 2019.

**AWARD WINNING:** Castañeda was named the High-A Central League Pitcher of the Week on May 31 for his performance [at Cedar Rapids on May 28](#). He allowed two hits, walked one, and struck out eight over 6-2/3 scoreless innings in the game.

**LAST START:** Castañeda had a no decision [at Beloit on June 30](#). He allowed a run on three hits with three walks and three strikeouts. Castañeda left the game with a 4-1 lead, but the Snappers beat Wisconsin 8-7 in ten innings.

**VS. QUAD CITIES (2021):** Castañeda has not faced the River Bandits this season. This is the first time he will pitch against an affiliate of the Kansas City Royals.

## QUAD CITIES STARTING PITCHER (GAME 1):

**LHP ANTHONY VENEZIANO:** The Kansas City Royals selected Veneziano out of Coastal Carolina with their tenth-round pick of the 2019 draft.

**HAVE YOU BEEN TO THE COAST?** Veneziano was 14-6 with a 5.09ERA and 187 strikeouts over 176-2/3 innings pitched in his three seasons at Coastal Carolina.

**JUNIOR:** Veneziano appeared in 21 games – 14 starts – in his final season with the Chanticleers. He was 5-3 with a 4.73 ERA, 85 strikeouts and 30 walks in 78 innings pitched.

**WHAT'S A CHUKAR** Veneziano started his pro career with the Idaho Falls Chukars in the Pioneer League after signing with the Royals. He was 3-4 with a 5.59 ERA, 13 walks, and 44 strikeouts over 46-2/3 innings in 13 games – eleven starts.

**2019 POSTSEASON:** Veneziano made two appearances – one start – during the Chukars 2019 playoff run to the Pioneer League Championship. He was the starting pitcher in Game Three of Semifinals against Billings at home and allowed one run on three hits in two innings. He was the winning pitcher in Game Two of the Finals at Ogden as the reliever as he went four scoreless, hitless innings. Veneziano struck out seven and walked one in six innings during the 2019 playoffs.

**LAST START:** Veneziano had a no decision against [Cedar Rapids at home on July 1](#). He allowed one run on two hits with two walks and eight strikeouts over four innings. Quad Cities won the game 12-3.

**VS. WISCONSIN:** Veneziano beat the Timber Rattlers [at Modern Woodmen Park on June 19](#). He allowed two runs on seven hits with three walks and eight strikeouts over five innings. The River Bandits won the game 6-2.

## QUAD CITIES STARTING PITCHER (GAME 2):

**LHP AJ BLOCK:** The Royals signed Block as a non-drafted free agent on June 23, 2020 out of Washington State University.

**NOT A TIGER:** Block was originally drafted by the Detroit Tigers in the 17<sup>th</sup> round of the 2019 draft. Block elected to go back to Washington State for his senior season.

**COUGAR:** Block was 2-1 with a 3.25 ERA in four starts in his final season at Washington State. He struck out 34 in 27-2/3 innings pitched before the shutdown. In four seasons at Washington State, Block was 3-16 with a 5.48ERA over 55 appearances – 30 starts. He walked 66 and struck out 178 in 175-2/3 innings pitched for the Cougars.

**SUNNY TEAMMATES:** Block was teammate of Timber Rattlers pitcher Scotty Sunitsch in 2017 and 2018.

**COLUMBIA:** Block began his professional career with the Columbia Fireflies in the Low-A East League in 2020. He was 1-1 with a 2.63 ERA in seven games – three starts and 37 strikeouts over 24 innings pitched.

**UP THE RIVER:** Block joined the River Bandits on May 25. He is 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA in three games – one start – with Quad Cities. He has walked five and struck out eleven over eight innings with the River Bandits.

**LAST START:** Block beat Cedar Rapids [at home on July 2](#). He allowed a run on three hits with no walks and seven strikeouts over 5-1/3 innings.

**VS. WISCONSIN:** Block had a no decision against the [Timber Rattlers at Modern Woodmen Park on June 15](#). He gave up three runs on two hits and three walks over four innings. Block had seven strikeouts in the game.
