Aviators vs. Express: The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, will host the Round Rock Express, Triple-A affiliate of the Texas Rangers, tonight in game two of the three-game series in Pacific Coast League action at Las Vegas Ballpark (8,196)...the Express leads the series, 1-0...the home-and-home six-game series will conclude tomorrow evening...the Aviators will then embark on a six-game road to Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, to face the Dodgers, Triple-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers, from Monday-Saturday, July 4-9...Las Vegas will then have consecutive off days on Sun.-Mon., July 10-11.

Round Rock defeats Las Vegas 5-3 in series opener: The Express defeated the Aviators 5-3 last night in the opener of the three-game series before a **Top Gun Night** crowd of 6,571 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 11 hits and stranded 10 runners on base. Right fielder **Luis Barrera** was 3-for-5, two runs scored, solo home run in the fifth inning. Catcher Shea **Langeliers** was 3-for-5, double, triple, 2 RBI; third baseman **Christian Lopes** was 2-for-5, double and first baseman **Dermis Garcia** was 1-for-3, two walks.

Round Rock offense: The Express recorded 10 hits and built a 5-1 lead after 4 ½ innings. Center fielder **Ezequiel Duran** was 3-for-3, HBP, two-run home run in the fifth inning. First baseman **Elier Hernandez** was 3-for-4, two doubles, RBI, two runs scored and shortstop **Ryan Dorow** was 2-for-4, double, run scored.

Las Vegas starting pitching: Left-hander **Jared Koenig** suffered the loss. He pitched 6.0 innings and allowed 10 hits, 5 runs, walked 1 and struck out 2 on 74 pitches (51 strikes).

Game Recaps:

Las Vegas defeats Albuquerque 9-8 in homestand finale (Sunday, June 26): The Aviators defeated the Isotopes 9-8 in the finale of the six-game series before a crowd of 5,720 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 11 hits and rallied from an 8-0 deficit for the victory. It marked the largest comeback deficit since June 20, 2019 against Sacramento (L.V. trailed by nine runs, 10-1 and won 11-10 at Las Vegas Ballpark). Center fielder **Skye Bolt**, ML rehab (3-for-4, walk, 2 RBI, run scored) delivered an RBI single to break the 8-8 tie in the eighth inning. Catcher **Austin Allen** was 3-for-4, two doubles, RBI, run scored and left fielder **Luis Barrera** was 2-for-4, double, triple, 2 RBI, two runs scored.

Albuquerque offense: The Isotopes recorded 13 hits and scored four runs each in the second and fourth innings to lead 8-0. Shortstop **LJ Hatch** was 3-for-4, HR, 2 RBI and third baseman **Coco Montes** was 2-for-5, double, 2 RBI.

Las Vegas starting pitching: Right-hander **Jack Cushing** pitched 3.1 innings in the no decision. He allowed 10 hits, 8 runs, walked 1 and struck out 1 on 75 pitches (50 strikes).

Las Vegas defeats Round Rock 6-1 in series opener (Tuesday, June 28): The Aviators defeated the Express 6-1 in the opener of the home-and-home six-game series before a crowd of 4,314 at Dell Diamond.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 9 hits and scored four runs in the seventh inning to increase the lead to 6-1. Left fielder **Christian Lopes** was 2-for-4, double, 2 RBI. Third baseman **Vimael Machín** was 2-for-4, walk; first baseman **Dermis Garcia** (SF) and designated hitter **Matt Davidson** (HBP) were each 1-for-4, RBI, run scored and catcher **Shea Langeliers** was 1-for-3, two walks.

Round Rock offense: The Express recorded 6 hits and stranded seven runners on base. Round Rock scored their lone run in the fourth inning on an RBI double by second baseman **Diosbel Arias** (2-for-4). Right fielder **Elier Hernandez** was 1-for-4, triple.

Las Vegas starting pitching: Left-hander **Zach Logue** recorded his third victory with 6.2 solid innings. He allowed 5 hits, 1 run, walked 3 and struck out a season-high 8 batters on 104 pitches (70 strikes).

Round Rock defeats Las Vegas 10-1 to even the series (Wednesday, June 29): The Express defeated the Aviators 10-1 in game two of the home-and-home six-game series before a crowd of 5,062 at Dell Diamond.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 4 hits and stranded six runners on base. Las Vegas scored its lone run in the sixth inning on a home run by left fielder **Skye Bolt** (1-for-2, HBP, stolen base). Second baseman **Christian Lopes** was 1-for-3, walk, double and third baseman **Matt Davidson** was 1-for-4, double.

Round Rock offense: The Express recorded 14 hits and scored five runs in the first inning and four runs in the third to build a 9-0 lead. Left fielder **Steele Walker** was 3-for-4, solo home run, three runs scored. Right fielder **Josh Sale** was 2-for-4, three-run home run in the third inning and third baseman **Andy Ibáñez** was 2-for-4, two-run home run in the first inning, two runs scored.

Round Rock defeats Las Vegas 3-0 in series finale (Thursday, June 30): The Express defeated the Aviators 3-0 in the finale of the three-game series before a crowd of 5,022 at Dell Diamond.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 1 hit and were shutout for the second time this season. Las Vegas' lone hit was a lead-off single in the sixth inning to left field by shortstop **Drew Jackson** (1-for-3). Left fielder **Billy McKinney** was 0-for-2, walk, stolen base and catcher **Shea Langeliers** was 0-for-2, HBP, stolen base.

Round Rock offense: The Express recorded 5 hits and scored solo runs in the fourth, fifth and sixth innings. Center fielder **Bubba Thompson** was 2-for-4, stolen base, solo home run in the fourth inning. Shortstop **Ezequiel Duran** was 1-for-4 with a solo home run in the sixth inning and left fielder **Nick Solak** was 1-for-3, double, run scored.

AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS – Las Vegas dropped the series opener, 5-3, last night...the six-game home-and-home series against the Round Rock Express, Triple-A affiliate of the Texas Rangers, will conclude tomorrow evening...Las Vegas and Round Rock will play each other a total of 12 times during the regular season...Oklahoma City Dodgers have the best record in the 10-team PCL at 47-29 (.618)...the Aviators have the second-best record at 42-33 (.560)...the Aviators will embark on a six-game road trip to Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, to face the Dodgers, Triple-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers, from Monday-Saturday, July 4-9...Las Vegas will then have consecutive off days from Sunday-Monday, July 10-11...the '22 season will feature six-games series, with a few exceptions, from Tuesday-Sunday and off days on Monday (with three road exceptions, July 4, August 15, September 26)...the 2022 season will also feature 150 games (75-home; 75-away).

39 SEASONS IN THE SILVER STATE – The Aviators are playing in their 40th Triple-A professional baseball season (calendar season) in the Silver State and member of the Pacific Coast League...the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being the longest enduring franchise in the history of professional sports in the state of Nevada...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8).

PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE: The PCL returns in 2021 (118 years, 1903-2020, 2022 -) and will consist of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **West Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **East Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Dodgers, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys.

LAS VEGAS TO HOST INAUGURAL TRIPLE-A CHAMPIONSHIP WEEKEND:

New postseason format includes three, winner-take-all games to crown the 2022 champions

May 3, 2022 — Minor League Baseball™ (MiLB™) announced the Las Vegas Aviators will host the inaugural Triple-A Triple Championship Weekend Sept. 30–Oct. 2, 2022, at Las Vegas Ballpark...the three-game series will begin with the division winners of the Triple-A Pacific Coast League squaring off for the league championship on Sept. 30 at 7:05 p.m. PST/10:05 p.m. ET...on Saturday, Oct. 1, the International League division winners will meet to determine the International League champion at 6:05 p.m. PT/9:05 p.m. ET...the two league champions will then meet on Oct. 2 at 4:05 p.m. PT/7:05 p.m. ET to determine the overall Triple-A National Champion.

“This new playoff system to determine an overall champion will create an exciting finish to the Triple-A season,” said **Morgan Sword**, Major League Baseball’s Executive Vice President, Baseball Operations. “We appreciate the Las Vegas Aviators hosting this inaugural event and we look forward to an exciting weekend of championship-caliber baseball at one of MiLB’s premier ballparks.”

Las Vegas Ballpark was slated to host the 2020 Triple-A National Championship Game, and the Aviators jumped at the opportunity to stage the showcase event in 2022.

“We’re very excited to host the Triple-A Triple Championship weekend as Las Vegas Ballpark was built to host events like this,” said Aviators President & Chief Operations Officer **Don Logan**. “It will be great to bring our Triple-A brethren together and crown a champion in this new and exciting format.”

Since the Triple-A National Championship Game’s inception in 2006, the Pacific Coast League has won nine of the 15 winner-take-all games against the International League, with the Sacramento River Cats defeating the Columbus Clippers 4-0 in the most recent Championship Game in 2019. The Durham Bulls had the overall best record among the 30 Triple-A teams in 2021, but a traditional postseason was not scheduled due to ongoing COVID-19 restrictions...the National Championship team will receive a cash prize to be split among their players.



2021 SEASON – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 65-61 (.516) and finished in third place in Triple-A West, Western Division. The Tacoma Rainiers captured the regular season championship with the best record in the 10-team Triple-A West with a mark of 78-52 (.600). The Durham Bulls, Triple-A affiliate off the Tampa Bay Rays, captured the best overall record in Triple-A baseball with a mark of 86-44 (.662).

2019 SEASON – The Aviators compiled the second-best record in the 16-team Pacific Coast League at 83-57 (.593)...Round Rock Express had the best record in the PCL at 84-56 (.600)...Las Vegas tied a franchise record for most road wins in a season with 44 (2002 team was 44-28, .611)...Las Vegas clinched its first PCL Playoff berth since the 2014 season (Triple-A affiliate of the New York Mets)...Las Vegas lost to Sacramento, 3-games-to-2, in the League Championship Series...the River Cats captured the PCL and the Triple-A championships...Las Vegas recorded 250 home runs, breaking the previous mark of 184 (2001, 2004).

LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590)); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580)); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563))...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY: The Howard Hughes Corporation® (NYSE: HHC) announced on October 10, 2017 its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on Friday, February 23, 2018 before a crowd of several hundred people!

The 8,196-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark provides a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall.

Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site is landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites.

The grand opening took place on Tuesday, April 9, 2019 before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION: The Howard Hughes Corporation®, owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of the Pacific Coast League, and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on December 8, 2018 the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Oakland Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51s) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

AVIATORS LOGO DESIGN AND CONCEPT:

The color inspiration: the Las Vegas Sunset; the mountain range featured in the Aviators' sunglasses resemble the mountain range found in the Summerlin logo!

Team colors are navy, orange, tangerine, gold, yellow, gray.

Nevada's High-Flying Aviators (from UNLV News) - Nevada has a rich history in Aviation; with 500 miles between the state's two largest cities (Reno and Las Vegas), aviation was ideal for Nevada.

Aviation History in Las Vegas (from McCarran Airport) - Aviation grew exponentially throughout the 1900s, bringing more and more travelers to our city.

Aviators Manager Fran Riordan: He was named the 25th manager (November 8, 2018) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983 - present, 39 calendar seasons). **Career Summary:** He has recorded 21 seasons overall in professional baseball and has been a member of the Oakland Athletics organization for the past seven seasons (2015-21).

Riordan has compiled an overall managerial record over 21 seasons (**current**) of 1,131-1,076 (.512).

2021: Riordan guided the Aviators to an overall record of 65-61 (.516) in Triple-A West (Western Division) and finished in third place.
