Sparky Lyle



SPARKY LYLE

MANAGER EMERITUS

Yankees World Series champion and Cy Young award winner Sparky Lyle was the first employee ever hired by the late Somerset Patriots founding chairman emerits Steve Kalafer. Since that point, Sparky has become synonymous with the Patriots. His reach has stretched from being the team's mascot's namesake to a 15-year run as the most successful manager in the history of the Atlantic League. But his story starts well before his time in Somerset

Lyle was a three-sport athlete growing up in Reynoldsville, Pennsylvania, a borough 92 miles Northeast of Pittsburgh with a population less than 3,600 people at the time. Despite his success in football and basketball, it was when he began playing American Legion Baseball during his junior year of high school that

people started to take notice.

In one state tournament game alone, the southpaw pitched in 14 of 17 innings and struck out 31 batters. He caught the eye of the Baltimore Orioles, who signed him as an amateur free agent in 1964. Two years later, he was selected by the Boston Red Sox in the first-year draft.

During his time in the minors, Lyle was introduced to one of the greatest hitters in the history of the game, Ted Williams, whose advice changed his life forever.

After hours that night perfecting the grip and movement, Lyle had added his signature pitch that became as much his trademark as his handle-bar mustache was later in life. He made his Major League Baseball debut on July 4, 1967 and remained with Boston until the 1971 season.

In what many believe to be one of the worst trades in baseball history, Lyle was sent to the Yankees for Danny Cater prior to the 1972 season. Lyle's impact was immediate as he set a then American League record for saves with 35 in year one.

Through the next few years in the Bronx, Lyle established himself as one of the best pitchers in the game, cemented by the 1977 Cy Young Award, the first won by a reliever in American League history. His 13-5 record, 2.17 ERA, 26 saves and 68 strikeouts over 137 innings pitched in 72 games helped chart the path to the Yankees first of back-to-back World Series titles.

The 1978 season would be Lyle's final one with the Yankees, but despite contributing to the team's on-field success, that year would forever be tied to his best-selling book, *The Bronx Zoo*, with author Peter Golenbock. The memoir documents the 1978 Yankees season and all the turmoil around the team. Released in



1979, the book spent 29 weeks on the *New York Times* Best Sellers list.

By the time Lyle concluded his 16-year major league career, the two-time champion and three-time All-Star had 99 wins and 238 saves.

Lyle continued his standout success once he transitioned into his role as manager of the Somerset Patriots. After a rough first year at the helm without playing any home games, Lyle’s squad rebounded with strong showings in the first two years of the Patriots shiny new home ballpark.

It wasn’t until 2001 that the Patriots not only won their first postseason game, but earned their first Atlantic League championship.

Fast forward 15 years later, Lyle established himself as the most successful manager in the history of the league. Over his tenure, Lyle led Somerset to a 1,025-912 record, 23 postseason wins, 12 half championships, eight division titles, five league championships and three manager of the year awards.

Lyle’s final season as manager was in 2012 before he transitioned into the role of manager emeritus; one he continues to hold with the team entering the 2022 season.



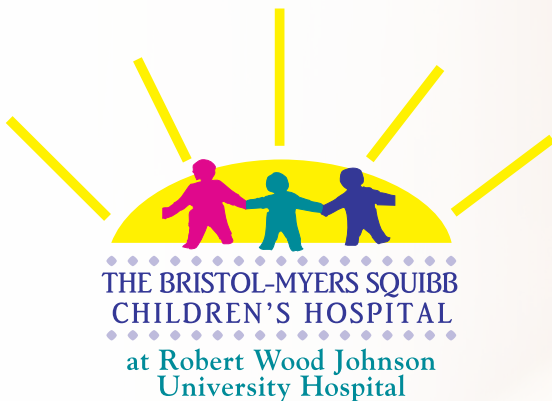

Dan Fiorito was named the fourth manager in Somerset Patriots history on March 24, 2022.

Born and raised in Yonkers, NY, Dan Fiorito enters his sixth season with the Yankees organization and his first as Somerset's manager. Fiorito is also the Yankees' Roving Upper Level IF/OF Instructor. He served as the manager of High-A Hudson Valley in 2021, after making his managerial debut in 2019 with the GCL Yankees East.

Fiorito also had been slated to manage the Yankees' former short-season Single-A affiliate, Staten Island in 2020, before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He served as the defensive coach at the Yankees' former Low-A Charleston affiliate in 2018, after making his professional coaching debut as a defensive coach with the Yankees' former Rookie-level Pulaski affiliate in 2017.

His playing career began when he was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent in 2012. Over four seasons as an infielder in the Yankees system, he batted .240 (264-for-1102) with 107 runs, 52 doubles, six triples, seven home runs and 98 RBI in 322 career minor league games.

Fiorito played three years at Manhattanville College in Purchase, NY, where he was named to the 2012 ABCA All-America Third Team, making him the first male two-time All-American in the school's history. He is a 2008 graduate of Fordham Prep in the Bronx.

Gerardo Casadiego will begin his first season in Somerset and his 10th in the Yankees organization. He served as pitching coach for High-A Hudson Valley in 2021, where Renegades' pitchers ranked second in the High-A East division in strikeouts (1,308 - sixth in the minors) and third in ERA (4.12). The Venezuela native also served as pitching coach for the Yankees' former Rookie-level Pulaski affiliate from 2017-19 and was assigned to serve in the same role in 2020 before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Casadiego's 2017 Pulaski pitching staff led the Appalachian League with 654K and a 10.21 K/9.0IP ratio. He served as the pitching coach for the DSL Yankees 1 (2014-15) and the DSL Yankees 2 (2016). In 2016, the DSL 2 squad led the 42-team league with a 8.65 K/9.0IP ratio (568K, 590.2IP). He made his professional coaching debut in 2014, leading the DSL 1 staff to a league-high 632K.

Casadiego played 10 minor league seasons in the Expos, Yankees, Rockies and Orioles organizations (1999-2004, '06-09). He went 30-42 with 33 saves and a 4.15 ERA in 297 games (30 starts). As a player in the Yankees organization, he was a 2006 FSL Mid-Season All-Star with Single-A Tampa.

He was the hitting coach for High-A Hudson Valley in 2021, when Renegades batters ranked second among High-A East clubs in triples (33) and OBP (.341), third in doubles (217) and fourth in home runs (156), batting average (.255), slugging percentage (.446) and OPS (.787). He served in the same role with the GCL Yankees West (2019-20) and he served as an assistant coach at Augustana College (Ill.) for two seasons (2017-18).

Hirst played four seasons (2013-17) at Central College (Iowa), where he graduated with a B.A. in exercise science. He earned his master's in exercise physiology from St. Ambrose University (Iowa).

Aaron Bossi begins his first season with Somerset in 2022, after making his professional coaching debut in 2021, serving as defensive coach for High-A Hudson Valley. He had been expected to serve as the defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre in 2020 before the season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He spent three years (2017-19) assisting rehabbing players at the minor league complex.

As a player, Bossi played catcher/infielder and was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 6/24/16. He played one season with the GCL Yankees East, hitting .333 (19-for-57) in 22 games in 2016. Collegiately, Bossi played four seasons (2013-16) at Marshall University (W. 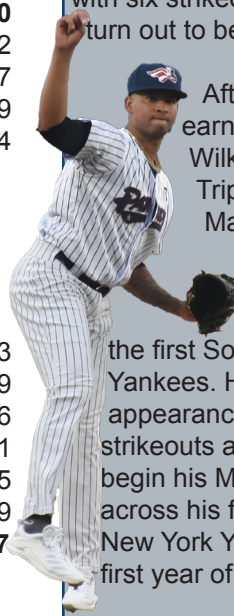
THE ORIGINAL PINSTRIPED PROSPECT

In Somerset's inaugural year as the New York Yankees' Double-A affiliate, RHP Luis Gil cemented his spot in team history as the organization's original "pinstriped prospect."

Marking the inception of the next era of baseball in Somerset, Gil was the first Yankee-affiliated player to be assigned to the Patriots. He started on Opening Day of the 2021 season, which was the Patriots' first game in affiliated baseball. On that day, Gil pitched 3.2 scoreless innings with six strikeouts, signaling the beginning of what would turn out to be a historic season for him.

After seven strong starts in Somerset, Gil earned a promotion to Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. Upon finding success in 13 Triple-A appearances, he was called up to the Major Leagues.

Gil made his Major League debut for the Yankees on August 3, 2021, becoming the first Somerset Patriots pitcher to debut for the Yankees. He earned the win in his first big league appearance by pitching six scoreless innings with six strikeouts against the Baltimore Orioles. Gil went on to begin his MLB career with 18.2 scoreless innings across his first four starts. This scoreless streak set a New York Yankees club record, fittingly ringing in the first year of the Yankees and Patriots partnership.



HALL OF FAME ACCOLADES

On January 18, 2017, outfielder Tim Raines became the first (and currently only) former member of the Somerset Patriots to be inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame. He entered with 86 percent of the vote alongside Jeff Bagwell and Ivan Rodriguez. Raines, who had a 23-year Major League Baseball career, played for the Patriots during the 2000 season while attempting to make the United States Olympic Baseball Team. Somerset was Raines' first time playing baseball after being diagnosed with lupus in the summer of 1999.

Raines hit .346 (9-for-26) over seven games with the Patriots with two RBI, three doubles and five runs scored. Additionally, He played 17 innings in the longest game in team history on August 16th, 2000 that went six hours and 14 minutes.

HOME RUN KING

Seven years after signing on as an international free agent with the New York Yankees, Dermis Garcia showed off his skills as a power hitter, setting a Patriots single-season record by slamming 31 homeruns during the 2021 season.

Among the balls that landed over fence for Garcia was a grand slam and a franchise-record breaking home run in the final game of the season that set the record for total home runs as a team in a season.

Between May 14 and May 22, Garcia hit six home runs in eight games, batting .364 and adding 14 RBI in that span. With his historic season, Garcia was named a Double-A Northeast All-Star.

NO-HIT HISTORY

The 2021 Somerset Patriots will go down as one of the most historic teams in franchise history, as they set a total of 12 team franchise records and two individual franchise records in their first season as an affiliate of the New York Yankees. Additionally, on August 8, a trio of Patriot pitchers combined to throw the first no-hitter in franchise history. Yankee rehab starter Luis Severino started the game with four perfect innings and New Jersey natives Shawn Semple and Ron Marinaccio finished the job with five shutout innings. In total, this no-hit effort included 11 strikeouts and just one baserunner allowed en route to holding the Bowie Baysox hitless on the night.

In their first year as a Yankees affiliate, the Patriots pitching led the Double-A Northeast with just 801 hits and 443 runs allowed, which were both franchise records. In total, the Patriots broke seven team pitching records in 2021, in addition to throwing the team's first no-hitter.

BALLPARK RENOVATIONS

As the Double-A affiliate of the New York Yankees, the Somerset Patriots are currently undergoing ballpark renovations that were set in motion to meet specifications put forth by Major League Baseball. TD Bank Ballpark is currently in “Phase 2” of these renovations, after construction on “Phase 1” began prior to the 2021 season.

Included in these renovation plans were new buildings and expansions on player facilities, and upgrades to the playing surface and game presentation setup that have enhanced the in-house experience for fans.

TD Bank Ballpark is now outfitted with a brand-new multi-camera broadcast/in-game entertainment system to enhance the fan experience. This new broadcast system provides an upgraded visual experience that includes instant replay.

The old home clubhouse was renovated to allow for better flow for players and coaches. The old gym inside the clubhouse has been relocated to a brand new 3,100 square foot fitness facility located where the maintenance yard previously rested. A dedicated dining and kitchenette area nearby the clubhouse was also installed per MLB specifications, along with renovated coaching and players spaces.

The 3,100 square foot gym is in a new building constructed to include approximately 1,000 square feet of storage and maintenance space for field equipment and materials. This is one

of two new buildings that have been constructed on site. The other is an approximately 4,300 square foot multipurpose indoor space that features two new, retractable batting tunnels allowing for year-round training. It stands parallel to the first base gate, extending slightly into the red lot.

Inside the ballpark, the location of the current batting cage has been transformed into new rooms for various use. This includes: a new, dedicated female staff locker room, New York Yankees video room, umpire’s locker room, a roving instructors locker room, a new grounds crew office and additional storage space.

Other cosmetic changes that were completed prior to the 2021 season include: a renovated home bullpen that will be moved off the playing surface and into a portion of the existing lawn seating area with cover for the players, new safety padding all around the interior walls and outfield walls of the ballpark, and brand-new ballpark lighting as a first step to make TD Bank Ballpark both more energy efficient and upgrade the playing surface for the team. The home and visiting dugouts were also refinished with new benches, racks, and flooring.

Phase 2 of ballpark renovations will continue in the fall of 2022. These will likely include, but not limited to: visitor clubhouse upgrades, a relocation of the team’s executive office, and possible further scoreboard upgrades.

REQUESTING CREDENTIALS: All credential requests must be submitted online through the team's website at milb.com/somerset/team/press-box. The Somerset Patriots require at least 24 hours in advance of the desired game date. Late requests and/or day-of requests will be accepted if available, but the team cannot guarantee acceptance. Media already credentialed through Major League Baseball, the New York Yankees, or any other MLB club will still need to apply through the Somerset Patriots for a credential to TD Bank Ballpark. No other credentials will be accepted. All credential-related questions should be sent to the Vice President of Communications & Media Relations, Marc Russinoff, at mrussinoff@somersetpatriots.com.

CREDENTIAL PICK-UP / ENTRY: Once approved by the Somerset Patriots, credentialed media will be emailed with instructions for pick-up and further media guidelines. When at the ballpark, media should enter through the main gate and display their credential at all times. If arriving before gates are open, media should check in at the ticket office next to the main gate.

NEGATIVE TESTING / VACCINATION CARD: The Somerset Patriots are not requiring media to present a negative COVID-19 test nor a CDC-provided vaccination card.

LIABILITY WAIVER: Credentialed media will be required to sign a Release of Liability media waiver prior to working an event at TD Bank Ballpark. This waiver is available on the team's website or via email and acknowledges the COVID-19 risks associated with working an in-person sporting event. Entry to the facility will be denied in the absence of this signed waiver.

PARKING: It is advised that media park in the RED LOT (to the right of the ballpark) and let parking attendants know they are working media. There will be no charge.

MEDIA DINING: The Somerset Patriots will provide food options for working media during each game. Select nights will feature sponsored catering. On all other nights, meals from the TD Bank Ballpark concessions will be made available, free of charge, for credentialed media.

DAILY SCHEDULE / FACILITY HOURS: Daily schedules, game times and facility hours are all subject to change. The press box will typically be open for media beginning 2.5 hours before first pitch and remain open for 60 minutes following the last out.

PRESS MATERIALS: The Somerset Patriots will print and provide daily game notes, rosters, stat packs and lineup scorecards. The team will not print it's Media Guide in bulk, but can print upon request. All game notes and press releases, along with the team's Media Guide, are available digitally at milb.com/somerset/team/press-box.

ACCESS AREAS: Media will receive guidelines as to accessible areas available pregame, during games and postgame. Credentialed media will be able to use the Somerset Patriots' press box throughout the game.
