Saturday: RubberDucks 11, SeaWolves 5: Bo Naylor had his first career multi-homer game, with a sixth-inning grand slam and seventh-inning two-run homer, and tied a career high with 6 RBIs. **Juan Hillman** (6.2 IP, 5 ER) became the first eight-game winner in the Double-A Northeast. In their Double-A debuts, **Brayan Rocchio** tripled, singled and walked twice, while **Bryan Lavastida** hit a three-run homer, tying career highs with three hits and four RBIs. Akron hit four homers and has 14 in the first five games of the series.

Leading the Southwest: Since June 1, the RubberDucks have exclusively played Southwest Division opponents, and that will continue through Aug. 8 – a stretch of 10 consecutive series. Akron is 31-21 in that span (27-19 against winning clubs), including 19-7 in July, to open a two-game lead in the Division race. Winning four of five in Erie, Akron has five consecutive series wins – one against each divisional opponent (Bowie, Altoona, Harrisburg, Richmond, Erie).

“He gets on base”: In 33 starts as the leadoff batter since June 19, **Will Benson** has seven multi-hit games and is 31-for-121 (.256) with 24 walks, eight home runs, including two leading off games (he has 12 total this season, second in the Indians system), a .383 on-base percentage and .554 slugging percentage. Before June 19, Benson had 27 walks (tied for second in the league) and a .386 on-base percentage (eighth), but a .196 average (19-for-97). Overall, he leads Cleveland’s full-season system in walks (51, third in the league) and is second (to **Richie Palacios**) in OBP (.384, eighth in the league). His 54 runs lead the organization (3rd in AA-NE). His five triples are tied for the organizational lead (T-2nd in AA-NE).

Ducks win series over Richmond: After losing a 5-1 lead in the series-opening 9-5 defeat, the RubberDucks won the next five in a row over the Flying Squirrels. **Steven Kwan** went 7-for-17, and **Richie Palacios** went 6-for-18, and Palacios, **Chris Roller**, and **Daniel Schneemann** each had four RBIs in the series. Akron has won four straight series and is now 8-4 in series overall (though 0-3 against Erie, 8-1 against all others).

Home cooking: The RubberDucks won their first six home games and are 24-11 at Canal Park. In 2019, the RubberDucks were 30-40 at home – their first losing record at Canal Park since 2014 (32-39).

First-rounders: In **Bo Naylor** (No. 29 overall in 2018 draft) and **Will Benson** (No. 14 overall in 2016), the RubberDucks feature two Indians first-round picks for the first time since 2016, when **Clint Frazier** (2013) and **Bradley Zimmer** (2014) teamed up in the outfield during the club’s last Eastern League championship season.

RubberDucks visit SeaWolves: Akron is playing the last of four scheduled series this season with the Erie SeaWolves, who won four of six games at UPMC Park May 11-16, three of five games at Canal Park June 1-6 and four of seven at Canal Park June 22-27. In 2019, Erie won 15 of 19 meetings, including nine of 12 at UPMC Park.

Tough competition: The RubberDucks are just percentage points behind Portland (47-27, .635) for the best record in the Double-A Northeast. Akron (47-28, .627) has played 52 of its 75 games against teams with winning records (29-23 in such games). Only Harrisburg (60), Erie (53), Hartford (53), and Binghamton (52) have played more games in the league against winning teams. By comparison, the Sea Dogs, who will not play Akron in the regular season, have played only six of their 73 games against a winning team (2-4 vs. Somerset).

Off the IL: **Steven Kwan** suffered a right hamstring strain in the third game of the season, after he had begun 3-for-8 with a double and two RBIs. Activated on June 25, Kwan went 0-for-4 in his first two games off the IL, but now has hits in 19 of 22 games (30-for-90, .333) with four doubles, three triples, three home runs and 15 RBIs.

Naylor’s All-Star Futures Game selection: **Bo Naylor** was the lone Indians representative on the American League team at the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game in Denver on July 11, and caught the final three innings on defense. **Adley Rutschman** (BAL) caught the first three innings, and **Tyler Soderstrom** (OAK) was the other AL catcher. The MLB Pipeline #11 catcher leads Double-A Northeast catchers with 41 assists and 15 runners caught stealing (35 attempts) while behind the plate. Naylor hit just .138 (13-for-94) with one home run and five RBIs through his first 26 Double-A games. But in 23 games since June 19, Naylor is 21-for-85 (.247) with five doubles, five home runs, 21 RBIs, and a .798 OPS.

Limited experience: Among the 28 active RubberDucks, only four had played as high as Double-A before this season. All of those appeared for Akron in 2019. Infielder **Andruw Monasterio** (70 games) is the only remaining position player from 2019. The others are three left-handers – Ohio State alumnus **Tanner Tully**, the 2019 Akron innings leader (129.1), **Adam Scott** (4-6, 3.94 ERA in 14 Akron starts in 2019), **Ben Krauth** (1-3, 4.66 ERA in 56 relief IP in 2019).

Morris began with a first-inning lead for his third straight road start, and he held Erie scoreless through three innings, extending his streak of 16 shutout innings to begin his Double-A career. That ended in the fourth, when he yielded a walk and RBI double by Kerry Carpenter. Right-hander Dakody Clemmer got the final out of the inning and worked 2 1/3 innings, allowing one hit and striking out two batters to hold the 4-1 lead, eventually earning the win. Left-hander Jake Miednik (0.1 IP), right-hander Juan Mota (1 IP) and left-hander Ben Krauth (1.2 IP) combined to finish the game.

Season Highlights:

- Began with the Indians major league club in spring training, but suffered a right lat strain in February.
- Began the season on the injured list...made one rehab appearance with ACL Indians on July 1 before joining Akron on July 5.

2020

- Entered the season ranked the No. 27 prospect in the Indians organization by MLB.com.
- Participated in the fall instructional league.

2019

- Made his pro regular season debut with 10 appearances for Lake County (A), before joining Lynchburg (A-Adv) on June 20.
- Finished the season with 11 starts for the Hillcats in the Carolina League...Was on the injured list July 8-21 with a lower back strain.
- Finished with 111 strikeouts in 89 innings (11.22 K/9 IP).

2018

- Rated No. 23 best prospect in the SEC for 2018 MLB Draft by D1Baseball.
- Held out of minor league action after the 2018 draft and helping South Carolina to the NCAA Super Regional.
- Worked with Indians player development staff to revamp his pitching motion.

Personal/Amateur

- Graduated from Reservoir High School in Fulton, MD. Went 8-1 with 0.99 ERA and 88 strikeouts as a junior in 2014, pitched complete game two-hit shutout to win 2014 Maryland 3A state championship, and was the 2014 Gatorade Maryland Baseball Player of the Year. Only pitched 12 innings his senior season (2-0, 0.00 ERA, 26 strikeouts) before having Tommy John surgery.
- Drafted out of high school in 2015 by the Baltimore Orioles (32nd round) but did not sign. He had been ranked the top high school prospect in the state of Maryland by Perfect Game and the No. 70 high school prospect in the nation by *Baseball America*.
- After a redshirt 2016 season to recover from Tommy John surgery, he pitched only the 2017 and 2018 (freshman and sophomore) seasons for South Carolina. Led the 2018 team with nine wins (tied for sixth in SEC) and had a 3.46 ERA and 87 strikeouts in 83.1 innings across 16 starts.

2021 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (Second Season) – Odor, 53, became the 18th manager in club history when he led the club in 2019. The RubberDucks posted a 61-79 record, good for fifth in the Eastern League Western Division following a 34-35 first half record. Odor has twelve seasons of managerial experience where he has compiled a career record of 422-442 (.488).

When Odor was Akron's hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2021 season is Odor's 34th in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (21st as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. The 2019 season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League (1999-2000), the Burlington Indians (2001-2004), the Mahoning Valley Scrappers (2005-2006), Gulf Coast League Indians (2007-2008). In 2009, Odor began serving as hitting coach for the Kinston Indians (2009-2010), Double-A Akron Aeros (2011-2012), High-A Carolina Mudcats (2013), Double-A Akron RubberDucks (2014), and Triple-A Columbus Clippers (2015-2017).

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#35 Owen Dew, Pitching Coach (1st Season) — Owen Dew, 32, makes his first visit to Akron after serving as the pitching coach for the Lake County Captains in the Class-A Midwest league in 2019. Dew began his baseball journey as a right-handed pitcher for Seminole State College of Florida (2008-2009), before moving to the University of Central Florida in 2010, when he was drafted in the 21st round of the 2010 amateur draft by the Cleveland Indians. That same year, Dew advanced through Mahoning Valley with a strong 2.64 ERA in nine starts for the Scrappers. At Class-A Lake County, Dew was converted to a relief pitcher where he appeared in 15 games over the 2010 and 2011 seasons. In Dew's final season as a player, the right hander appeared in 34 games, accruing 70 innings and posted a 3.86 ERA with 41 strikeouts.

Since his playing career, Dew served as an assistant coach at Seminole State College of Florida while also assisting the Cleveland Indians as an associate scout from 2014-2017. Dew was then appointed as a full-time minor league pitching coach within the organization, making stops with the Mahoning Valley (2017), Arizona League Indians 2 (2018), and Lake County Captains (2019). The 2019 Lake County Captains pitching staff posted a team ERA of 3.73 over 1191 innings, good for eighth in the Midwest League.

#16 Junior Betances, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Betances, 47, hits Akron for the first time in his 21-year coaching career with the Cleveland Indians organization. After posting a .289 batting average over 165 games in 1998-1999 with the Akron Aeros, Betances joined the coaching ranks in various roles for the Cleveland Indians Dominican Summer League team from 2000-2010. Betances then served as Arizona League Indians coach from 2010-2015, and moved to Lake County in 2017 as the Bench coach for Manager Larry Day. The native of La Vega, Dominican Republic, Betances has developed a wealth of experience in various player development roles within the Indians organization.

#28 Mike Mergenthaler, Bench Coach (First Season) — Mergenthaler, 32, moves up the Indians farm system to Akron in 2021, following his 2019 season serving as the Lynchburg Hillcats bench coach for Manager Jim Pankovits. In 2018 and 2019, Mergenthaler worked as a hitting coach for the Cleveland Indians' and Milwaukee Brewers' joint Dominican Super League team. The Thiells, NY, native was drafted as a player in the 32nd round of the 2011 amateur draft by the San Francisco Giants, playing in their system for parts of 2011 and 2012.

Jacob Legan, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Legan heads to Akron for the first time in his six-year career with the Cleveland Indians. Legan previously served as the Lynchburg Hillcats' athletic trainer in 2019.

Scott Nealon, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Second Season, not consecutive) — Nealon enters his eighth season in the Cleveland Indians organization, returning to the same position he held in 2016 for the RubberDucks Eastern League Championship Series. Nealon was the Triple-A Columbus strength and conditioning coach the last three seasons (2017-2019), including the Clippers' 2019 Governor's Cup championship season. Previously, Nealon served as strength and conditioning coach for the Carolina Mudcats (2013-2014), Lynchburg Hillcats (2015), before he made his way to Double-A Akron. Nealon earned his master's degree in exercise science from Baldwin Wallace University in Berea, Ohio.

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World**." Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
