- Awarded his first career Pitcher of the Week honors on 7/10/22 with Somerset, after earning the win on Thursday, 7/6 vs. Bowie, when he got through a career-high 7.0 IP, allowing no runs on three hits and five strikeouts to earn his 4th win as a Patriot and 6th total of the season.

- Began his rookie season in 2022 by pitching to a 3.60 ERA with 42 strikeouts in 35 IP over eight starts in High-A Hudson Valley, before being promoted to Somerset on 5/29.

- Did not pitch in 2021 season after being drafted--instead worked with the Yankees strength and conditioning department to gain 15 lbs. of muscle, also worked to add a slider and two-seam fastball to his repertoire.

- Attended Southeastern Louisiana University, where he was named to the 2021 Southland All-Conference Team his senior year, going 7-2 with a 2.57 ERA and 95 strikeouts in 91 innings over 14 starts. Warren led the Southeastern staff in wins (7), innings pitched (91.0), strikeouts (95) and opponent batting average (.214). He ranked third, second, fourth and fifth in the conference in those same categories, respectively, while also finishing fourth in ERA (2.57).

- Attending the same college as 12-year MLB veteran LHP Wade Miley, Warren finished his Southeastern Louisiana career with a 13-10 career record, four saves and a 3.90 ERA. He allowed only 178 hits in 205.0 career innings pitched, striking out 193 batters.

- No. 4 ranked RHP in Mississippi class of 2017 by Perfect Game, was state champion at Jackson Prep as a senior, when he went 7-0 with a 1.39 ERA.

- Began this season ranked by Baseball America as Yankees No. 27 prospect, before jumping to No. 8 in the publications's mid-season rankings. After being unranked on MLB Pipeline's list of top 30 Yankees prospects, Warren was ranked No. 25 in their first mid-season update. In MLB Pipeline's August update, Warren jumped to their No. 8 ranked Yankees prospect.



DAN FIORITO \star MANAGER

Born and raised in Yonkers, NY, Dan Fiorito enters his sixth season with the Yankees organization and his first as Somerset's manager. Fiorito is also the Yankees' Roving Upper Level IF/OF Instructor. He served as the manager of High-A Hudson Valley in 2021, after making his managerial debut in 2019 with the GCL Yankees East. Fiorito also had been slated to manage the Yankees' former short-season Single-A affiliate, Staten Island in 2020,

before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He served as the defensive coach at the Yankees' former Single-A Charleston affiliate in 2018, after making his professional coaching debut as defensive coach with the Yankees' former Rookie-level Pulaski affiliate in 2017.

His playing career began when he was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent in 2012. Over four seasons as an infielder in the Yankees system, he batted .240 (264-for-1102) with 107 runs, 52 doubles, six triples, seven home runs and 98 RBI in 322 career minor league games. Fiorito played three years at Manhattanville College (Purchase, NY) and is a 2008 graduate of Fordham Prep (Bronx, NY).



GERARDO CASADIEGO ★ PITCHING COACH

Gerardo Casadiego will begin his first season in Somerset and 10th in the Yankees organization. He held the same position in Hudson Valley last season, where the Renegade staff ranked second in the High-A East division in strikeouts (1,308, sixth in MiLB) and third in ERA (4.12). The Venezuela native has also previously served as the pitching coach for former Rookie-level Pulaski (2017-2019), DSL Yankees 1 (2014-2015) and DSL Yankees 2 (2016).

JAKE HIRST ★ HITTING COACH

Jacob Hirst will serve as hitting coach in his first season with Somerset and fourth with the Yankees organization. He was the hitting coach for Hudson Valley in 2021, when the Renegades' batters ranked second among High-A East clubs in triples (33) and OBP (.341), third in doubles (217) and fourth in home runs (156), batting average (.255), slugging percentage (.446) and OPS (.787). The Iowa native served the same role with the GCL Yankees West (2019-2020).





AARON BOSSI ★ DEFENSIVE COACH

Aaron Bossi begins his first season with Somerset after making his coaching debut in the same role with Hudson Valley in 2021. His prior experience for the organization was assisting rehabbing players at the minor league complex from 2017-2019. The St. Louis, MO native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.

- Coleman began this season in High-A Hudson Valley, having not allowed a run in his first 18 innings of the 2022 season. He posted 0.47 ERA in 19.1 IP with opponents hitting .115 off him before a promotion to Somerset on 5/17/22.

- After being signed as an undrafted free agent in 2020, when the MLB Draft was shortened to five rounds, Coleman spent his pro debut season in 2021 with Single-A Tampa, posting a 6.11 ERA with 49 strikeouts in 35.1 IP.

- Collegiately, Coleman pitched three seasons out of the bullpen at the University of Kentucky, where he posted a 4.19 ERA with 81 strikeouts over 53.2 innings pitched, a strikeout rate of 13.58 per nine innings, which was the highest rate for any UK pitcher with at least 50 innings pitched since 1979. - This season, on the final day before the All-Star break, Rosario hit for the cycle on 7/17 @POR in his former 2021 home ballpark, Hadlock Field. Against Somerset, he was 2-for-18 (.125). Rosario was ranked by Baseball America as the "Best Defensive Outfielder" in the Red Sox system.

- Rosario spent the first three seasons (2017-19) of his career with the Padres organization, after signing as an international free agent on 7/2/16 for \$1.85 million. He was traded by the Padres to the Red Sox on 8/30/20 in a package for Mitch Moreland. Rosario was ranked by Baseball America as the "Best Athlete" in Padres farm system in both 2018 and 2019. His favorite MLB player of all-time is Carlos Gomez.

- Spending all of his third pro season to this point with the Somerset Patriots in his home county, Volpe hit his first Double-A home run on Easter Sunday (4/17 vs. ERI), which was a grand slam. On Volpe's 21st birthday this season (4/28 vs. POR), he collected 4 RBI including a bases loaded triple. He also hit a home run on Mother's Day (5/8 vs. NH), in front of his mom, Isabelle. Most notably, Volpe hit his 10th homer of the season on the final day of the first half. In a situation where the winner of the game would win the first half of the season and punch its ticket to the playoffs. Volpe drew a bases loaded HBP to give the Patriots their first lead of the game (1-0 in the 7th inning). After the game went to extras tied at 4-4. Volpe led off the 10th inning with a walkoff two-run home run to give Somerset a 6-5 victory vs. Hartford to clinch the Somerset Patriots' first playoff berth since becoming the Yankees' Double-A affiliate. On 7/16, Volpe represented both the Yankees and Patriots at Dodger Stadium as one of the Yankees' three representatives at the MLB All-Star Futures Game (he went 0-for-2). Volpe was joined on the American League team by former high school teammate, RHP Jack Leiter and 2022 Patriots teammate, LHP Ken Waldichuk. - The 2021 season was Volpe's second professional season and his first at the full-season level. He worked his way up from Single-A Tampa (54 games) to High-A Hudson Valley (55 games), totaling 109 games and combining to slash .294/.423/.604 with 113 R, 86 RBI, 33 SB and 27 HR. He led all minor leaguers in runs (113), ranked second in OPS (1.027) and third in extra-base hits (68). Volpe led all Yankees minor leaguers in 2021 in OPS (1.027), OBP (.423), SLG (.604), R (113), BB (78), XBH (68) and 2B (35). Ranked second in RBI (86) and third in HR (27) and H (121). - In his pro debut season (2019), mononucleosis limited him to 34 games, hitting .215 for Rookie-level Pulaski.

- Volpe was drafted by the Yankees with the 30th overall pick (first round) of the 2019 MLB Draft out of high school, when he signed for \$2,740,000 after attending the Delbarton School in Morristown, NJ (16 miles from TD Bank Ballpark). Prior to being drafted, Volpe had committed to play college baseball at Vanderbilt with his former Delbarton School teammate. Jack Leiter, who went on to be the 2021 No. 2 overall pick in the draft by the Texas Rangers.

- One of Anthony's long-time baseball mentors is Somerset Patriots legend Travis Anderson (from the Atlantic League era), who hit a Championship Series-clinching walk-off home run in the bottom of the ninth inning of a tie game to win the 2008 APBL Championship Series. Travis was Volpe's coach when he was 12-years-old, playing for the Diamond Jacks Super 12U team.

- Born and raised in Watchung, NJ, which is the eastern-most point of Somerset county, Volpe grew up a Yankees fan, Derek Jeter was his favorite player growing up and his favorite memory growing up was watching the 2009 Yankees World Series team, when he was eightyears-old. He chooses to wear #7 because his grandfather's (also named Anthony Volpe) favorite player is Mickey Mantle. Anthony's family, including parents Michael and Isabelle, are in attendance for every home game at TD Bank Ballpark. Volpe has lived at home with his family for the duration of this season and is hosting fellow teammates Austin Wells, Blake Perkins and Max Burt.
