Aviators vs. Aces: The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, will face intrastate rival, the Reno Aces, Triple-A affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks, this afternoon in the finale of the six-game series in Pacific Coast League action at Greater Nevada Field (9,154)...Las Vegas is 2-3 on the season-long 12-game road trip...after a PCL off day on Monday, May 23, the Aviators will then travel to the Pacific Northwest for a six-game series against the Tacoma Rainiers, Triple-A affiliate of the Seattle Mariners, from Tuesday-Sunday, May 24-29...Las Vegas will then open a nine-game homestand on May 31.

Reno defeats Las Vegas 5-4 in 10 innings in game five of the series: The Aces defeated the Aviators 5-4 in 10 inning yesterday in game five of the six-game series before a crowd of 7,605 at Greater Nevada Field.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 9 hits and broke the 2-2 tie with two runs in the seventh inning. The key hits were an RBI double by center fielder **Billy McKinney** (1-for-4, walk, run scored) and an RBI single by shortstop **Vimael Machin** (1-for-4, walk). First baseman **Dermis Garcia** was 1-for-4, walk, double, 2 RBI and designated hitter **Austin Allen** was 1-for-3, two walks, run scored.

Reno offense: The Aces recorded 9 hits and scored one run in the 10th inning for the victory on a fielding error. Designated hitter **Seth Beer** was 2-for-3, walk, HBP, double, two-run home run in the third inning. Third baseman **Buddy Kennedy** was 2-for-4, walk, run scored and center fielder **Dominic Fletcher** was 2-for-5, two runs scored.

Las Vegas starting pitching: Right-hander **Adrián Martínez** pitched 5.1 innings in the no decision. He allowed 4 hits, 2 runs, walked 2 and struck out 2 on 85 pitches (58 strikes).

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 7 hits and hit three straight home runs in the sixth inning by first baseman **Matt Davidson** (1-for-3, walk, two runs scored), designated hitter **Dermis Garcia** (1-for-4) and center fielder **Billy McKinney** (3-for-3, walk, 3 RBI, two runs scored).

Reno offense: The Aces recorded 9 hits and scored four runs each in the first, fifth and eighth innings. Reno defeats Las Vegas 12-4 for second straight victory in series (Wednesday, May 18): The Aces defeated the Aviators 12-4 in game two of the six-game series before a crowd of 2,895 at Greater Nevada Field.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 7 hits and built a 4-1 lead after 1 ½ innings. Third baseman **Matt Davidson** (3-for-4, double) hit a three-run home run in the first inning. Right fielder **Drew Jackson** was 2-for-4, walk, stolen base, run scored.

Reno offense: The Aces recorded 14 hits and rallied from a 4-1 deficit and scored seven runs in the sixth inning. The key hit was a grand slam by designated hitter **Drew Ellis** (1-for-4). Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 10 hits and rallied from a 3-2 deficit with two runs in the sixth inning on a two-run RBI single by left fielder **Dalton Kelly** (2-for-4, triple, 3 RBI, run scored). Second baseman **Christian Lopes** was 2-for-3, walk, double, stolen base, run scored and first baseman **Dermis Garcia** was 2-for-4, double, stolen base, two runs scored.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 8 hits and built a 3-0 lead after a half-inning. Catcher **Austin Allen** was 3-for-4, double, walk, two-run homer in the third inning, 3 RBI. AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS – Las Vegas is 2-3 on the season-long 12-game road trip...the six-game series in Northern Nevada against intrastate rival, the Reno Aces, Triple-A affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks, will conclude this afternoon...Las Vegas and Reno will play each other a total of 30 times this season...the Aviators will then travel to the Pacific Northwest and face the Tacoma Rainiers, Triple-A affiliate of the Seattle Mariners, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, May 24-29...the '22 season will feature six-games series, with a few exceptions, from Tuesday-Sunday and off days on Monday (with three road exceptions, July 4, August 15, September 26)...the 2022 season will also feature 150 games (75-home; 75-away).

SILVER STATE DIAMOND CHALLENGE: In 2009, Las Vegas and Reno developed the **Silver State Diamond Challenge** and the “**Silver Plate Trophy**” to add to the excitement to the rivalry for the two PCL teams that represent the state of Nevada...Reno defeated Las Vegas, 3-games-to-1, in the 2015 PCL Conference Championship Series.
The 2022 campaign will mark the 13th season of the S.S.D.C.

39 SEASONS IN THE SILVER STATE – The Aviators are playing in their 40th Triple-A professional baseball season (calendar season) in the Silver State and member of the Pacific Coast League...the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being the longest enduring franchise in the history of professional sports in the state of Nevada...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8).

PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE: The PCL returns in 2021 (118 years, 1903-2020, 2022 -) and will consist of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **West Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **East Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Dodgers, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys.

LAS VEGAS TO HOST INAUGURAL TRIPLE-A CHAMPIONSHIP WEEKEND:

New postseason format includes three, winner-take-all games to crown the 2022 champions

May 3, 2022 — Minor League Baseball™ (MiLB™) announced the Las Vegas Aviators will host the inaugural Triple-A Triple Championship Weekend Sept. 30–Oct. 2, 2022, at Las Vegas Ballpark...the three-game series will begin with the division winners of the Triple-A Pacific Coast League squaring off for the league championship on Sept. 30 at 7:05 p.m. PST/10:05 p.m. ET...on Saturday, Oct. 1, the International League division winners will meet to determine the International League champion at 6:05 p.m. PT/9:05 p.m. ET...the two league champions will then meet on Oct. 2 at 4:05 p.m. PT/7:05 p.m. ET to determine the overall Triple-A National Champion.

“This new playoff system to determine an overall champion will create an exciting finish to the Triple-A season,” said **Morgan Sword**, Major League Baseball’s Executive Vice President, Baseball Operations. “We appreciate the Las Vegas Aviators hosting this inaugural event and we look forward to an exciting weekend of championship-caliber baseball at one of MiLB’s premier ballparks.”

Las Vegas Ballpark was slated to host the 2020 Triple-A National Championship Game, and the Aviators jumped at the opportunity to stage the showcase event in 2022.

“We’re very excited to host the Triple-A Triple Championship weekend as Las Vegas Ballpark was built to host events like this,” said Aviators President & Chief Operations Officer **Don Logan**. “It will be great to bring our Triple-A brethren together and crown a champion in this new and exciting format.”

Since the Triple-A National Championship Game’s inception in 2006, the Pacific Coast League has won nine of the 15 winner-take-all games against the International League, with the Sacramento River Cats defeating the Columbus Clippers 4-0 in the most recent Championship Game in 2019. The Durham Bulls had the overall best record among the 30 Triple-A teams in 2021, but a traditional postseason was not scheduled due to ongoing COVID-19 restrictions...the National Championship team will receive a cash prize to be split among their players.



2021 SEASON – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 65-61 (.516) and finished in third place in Triple-A West, Western Division. The Tacoma Rainiers captured the regular season championship with the best record in the 10-team Triple-A West with a mark of 78-52 (.600). The Durham Bulls, Triple-A affiliate off the Tampa Bay Rays, captured the best overall record in Triple-A baseball with a mark of 86-44 (.662).

2019 SEASON – The Aviators compiled the second-best record in the 16-team Pacific Coast League at 83-57 (.593)...Round Rock Express had the best record in the PCL at 84-56 (.600)...Las Vegas tied a franchise record for most road wins in a season with 44 (2002 team was 44-28, .611)...Las Vegas clinched its first PCL Playoff berth since the 2014 season (Triple-A affiliate of the New York Mets)...Las Vegas lost to Sacramento, 3-games-to-2, in the League Championship Series...the River Cats captured the PCL and the Triple-A championships...Las Vegas recorded 250 home runs, breaking the previous mark of 184 (2001, 2004).

LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590)); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580)); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563))...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY: The Howard Hughes Corporation® (NYSE: HHC) announced on October 10, 2017 its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on Friday, February 23, 2018 before a crowd of several hundred people!

The 8,196-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark provides a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall.

Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site is landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites.

The grand opening took place on Tuesday, April 9, 2019 before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION: The Howard Hughes Corporation®, owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of the Pacific Coast League, and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on December 8, 2018 the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Oakland Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51s) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

AVIATORS LOGO DESIGN AND CONCEPT:

The color inspiration: the Las Vegas Sunset; the mountain range featured in the Aviators' sunglasses resemble the mountain range found in the Summerlin logo!

Team colors are navy, orange, tangerine, gold, yellow, gray.

Nevada's High-Flying Aviators (from UNLV News) - Nevada has a rich history in Aviation; with 500 miles between the state's two largest cities (Reno and Las Vegas), aviation was ideal for Nevada.

Langer is in his 22nd season broadcasting baseball to the Las Vegas Valley and 35th year overall in the business...over his career, Langer has received numerous awards, including being named 1993 Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues....in 1995 and 2016, he broadcast the Triple-A All-Star game; in 1999, he was named the New Mexico Sportscaster of the Year; and in 2002, he was named Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by Minor League News.com...Langer also is a 11-time recipient (seven consecutive years from 2007-13) of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2021), which is presented by the National Sports Media Association (NSMA)...Langer's inaugural season in Las Vegas was in 2000, the final year the franchise was known as the Stars...prior to arriving in Las Vegas, Langer called Pacific Coast League games for the Albuquerque Dukes (1996-99) and Phoenix Firebirds (1992-95)...began his broadcasting career with Single-A Springfield Cardinals in 1987 and 1989, sandwiched around a year in Vero Beach (1988)...moved up the ranks to Double-A, calling games for the Midland Angels in 1990 and '91 before advancing to Triple-A Phoenix...he realized his longtime goal of broadcasting Major League baseball when he worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons, followed by nine games for the Baltimore Orioles in 2006...has also broadcast selected spring training games for the Los Angeles Dodgers (2006-08), Toronto Blue Jays (2009-10) and Chicago White Sox (2012-20)...in 2021, Langer also completed his 10th season as the radio play-by-play voice for the UNLV football team on the UNLV Sports Properties/ Learfield Network.

Blum Productions, also produced Las Vegas Triple-A professional baseball games broadcast on radio and television for several seasons.

Aviators Manager Fran Riordan: He was named the 25th manager (November 8, 2018) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983 - present, 39 calendar seasons). **Career Summary:** He has recorded 21 seasons overall in professional baseball and has been a member of the Oakland Athletics organization for the past seven seasons (2015-21).

Riordan has compiled an overall managerial record over 21 seasons (**current**) of 1,111-1,062 (.511).

2021: Riordan guided the Aviators to an overall record of 65-61 (.516) in Triple-A West (Western Division) and finished in third place.

2020: With the Minor League Baseball season canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Riordan worked with the Athletics' 60-man player pool at the team's alternate training site located in San Jose, California.
