CIRCLE CITY ROUNDUP

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The Indianapolis Indians overcame an early deficit with a five-run fourth inning to take down the Toledo Mud Hens, 5-4, and secure their fourth-straight six-game series win on Saturday night at Victory Field. Trailing 2-0 in the bottom of the fifth, the Indians stormed back with their huge inning. Indy loaded the bases with two walks and a single and scratched across their first run when Shawn Ross was hit by a pitch. Tsung-Che Cheng and Ronny Simon then drew back-to-back walks to put the Indians ahead, 3-2. Billy Cook eventually capped the frame with a two-run single to give Indy its fifth run, which proved to be all they would need for the victory. All Indians' runs in the inning were tagged to Alex Lange, who left with the bases loaded after allowing two Indians' runs. Trei Cruz led off the second inning for Toledo with a walk and came around to score on a Brian Serven double to open the game's scoring. The Mud Hens tacked on another run with a Hao-Yu Lee solo shot in the top of the fourth, extending Toledo's lead to 2-0 before Indy's offensive explosion in the bottom half. Rehabber Kerry Carpenter managed to pull the Mud Hens within one with a two-run, opposite-field home run in the sixth, which capped both team's scoring. Hunter Barco started the game for Indy but was pulled after tossing 55 pitches across 2.0 innings of work. Five Indians pitchers combined for the final seven frames. Randy Labaut earned the win with 2.0 innings of one-run relief and Eddy Yean twirled a scoreless ninth for the save.

CARDIAC KIDS: The Indians picked up their 26th comeback win last night and improved to 22-8 in one-run games. The Indians have compiled their most comeback wins to this point in the season since 2014, when they had 27 comebacks through July 26. Additionally, 22 wins are their most in one-run games through July 26 since at least 2015. When Indy is trailing or tied this season, they lead International league clubs with a .279 batting average.

STATION TO STATION: The Indians scored five runs on seven hits last night despite not recording an extra-base hit. It is the first time since June 1, 2021, vs. Columbus, that the Indians scored five or more runs on seven or fewer hits, none of which went for extra bases. The Indians have won four games with no extra-base hits this season, which is tied with Rochester for the second most among Triple-A teams this season.

WINDIANAPOLIS: With last night's win, the Indians improved to 42-13 on the season at Victory Field and continue to pace full-season minor league teams in home wins and winning percentage (.750, 42-14). The Indians' home win total matches or surpasses their full-season total in 22 of 27 full seasons in the Victory Field era (since 1996). They have won 14 of their last 17 games played at home since June 27 and 32 of their last 40 since May 11. Their home winning percentage is the highest for a Triple-A team to this point in the season since at least 2005 and is on pace to surpass San Antonio (49-21, .700) for the highest home winning percentage by a Triple-A team in a full season in that span. They have not lost more than three consecutive games this season, joining Durham as the only Triple-A clubs to have not done so on the campaign. The Indians have not completed a season without losing three or more games in a row since 2006, when they dropped three straight games seven times that season, compared to two instances for the 2025 Indians.

LET BILLY COOK: Billy Cook's two-run single capped last night's win and marked Cook's career-high sixth straight game with an RBI since July 20 at Nashville. During his streak, which matches Llover Peguero for the longest on the team this season, Cook ranks among Triple-A hitters in RBI (1st, 11), hits (T-2nd, 10), home runs (3rd, 4), total bases (3rd, 22), slugging percentage (.846) and OPS (.913). Additionally, he ran off a streak of three games with a home run in this span and has recorded three multi-hit games. In July, Cook has slugged seven homers, which is the most for an Indians' hitter in July since Danny Ortiz hit eight in 2017. Additionally, it is the most home runs in any calendar month for an Indian since May 2024, when Matt Gorski cranked nine home runs.

HE GETS ON (BAE)SE: Ji Hwan Bae went 1-for-2 to extend his on-base streak to eight games since July 18 at Nashville. On the campaign, he has reached base safely in 40 of 45 games and in 17 of his last 19 since June 28. Since returning from the 7-day injured list on June 27, he has a .926 OPS and ranks among International League hitters in triples (1st, 4), stolen bases (T-1st, 12), on-base percentage (.446), walks (T-7th, 14), runs scored (T-9th, 26) and batting average (.347, 26-for-74). Additionally, Bae has not made an error this season, converting on all 86 chances between the three outfield positions.

YEAN SHORTS: Eddy Yean picked up the save and tallied his ninth-straight scoreless appearance since June 27 in last night's win, matching his own nine-game streak from April 11-May 11 for the longest on the team this season. It is the first time the Indians have had two streaks of nine-or-more scoreless appearances in a single season since 2019, when Montana DuRapel tallied an 11 and 10-game streak. Yean is the only Triple-A pitcher (min. 10.0ip) across his streak with no runs allowed and the only pitcher to hold a 0.00 ERA. During this span, Yean has gone 2-0, picked up two saves and allowed just four hits, good for a .125 batting average against (4-for-32) that is the fifth lowest among Triple-A pitchers. He has not allowed an earned run in 14 of 16 appearances (one start) since June 5, earning a 0.81 ERA (2er/22.1ip) that leads Triple-A pitchers in that span (min. 20.0ip).

BUCCO BORUCKI: LHP Ryan Borucki had his rehab assignment transferred from Low-A Bradenton to Indianapolis on Friday last week. He made one rehab appearance with Bradenton on July 8, tossing a scoreless inning with one strikeout before being transferred to Indianapolis. Borucki has made 81 appearances with Pittsburgh since signing as a minor league free agent on May 9, 2023. In those appearances, he is 5-3 with a 4.09 ERA (35er/77.0ip) and a 1.04 WHIP. In 2023, the southpaw set the record for the lowest WHIP (.074) of any Pirates pitcher with at least 40.0 innings pitched in a season. With the Pirates in 2025, he held left-handed hitters to the lowest batting average (.087, 4-for-46) of any major league pitcher (min. 40 AB against lefties), before hitting the 15-day IL on June 21 with low back inflammation. In 25 appearances with Indy, he has logged a 2.52 ERA (7er/25.0ip) with 33 strikeouts. 21 of his appearances have been scoreless, including four of the five on his current rehab stint.

TODAY'S MATCHUP: The Indianapolis Indians and Toledo Mud Hens conclude their six-game set with a matinee from Victory Field at 1:05 PM. The Indians have the fourth-most wins in day games (19) and are tied for the sixth-most wins on Sunday (10) of any Triple-A team this season. Additionally, they are looking to win their fifth-straight series finale since June 29 vs. Omaha. Thomas Harrington, Pittsburgh's No. 5 prospect according to MLB Pipeline, will toe the rubber for the Indians for his 18th start of the season. In four July starts, Harrington is 3-0 with a 2.75 ERA (6er/19.2ip), 16 strikeouts and a 1.17 WHIP. In five starts against Toledo, Harrington has a 1-1 record with a 3.86 ERA (11er/25.2ip) with 22 strikeouts and a 1.09 WHIP. Harrington will be opposed by RHP Wilkel Hernandez, who faced the Indians on Tuesday and took the loss after allowing three runs in 4.1 innings. In three appearances against Indy, all of which were this season, Hernandez is 0-2 with a 4.30 ERA (7er/14.2ip), 14 strikeouts and a 1.02 WHIP.

ON THIS DATE IN 2018: With Indy playing as the visitor in the second game of a doubleheader against Buffalo at Victory Field, Casey Sadler improved to 6-5 on the season with a complete game. He surrendered one run in the second and two in the third, but Indianapolis' offense backed him with six runs in the final two innings to combine for a comeback win. Six Indians drove in a run, and Christopher Bostick led the team with a game-high three hits. Austin Meadows was one of three Indy players with two hits apiece, both of his coming as doubles.

TONIGHT'S PITCHER

Thomas Harrington: The Campbell University alum is currently the Pirates No. 5 prospect according to MLB Pipeline.

Major League Debut: Harrington had his contract first selected by Pittsburgh on April 1, 2025 and debuted with a 4.0 inning start the same night at Tampa Bay. Picked up his first career save in his next appearance on April 7 vs. St. Louis.

Last Outing: Harrington earned his seventh win of the season in Game 1 of this series vs. Toledo on July 22, allowing four hits, one run, two walks and striking out seven in 5.2 innings of work.

Quality in Quantity: Harrington strung together three straight quality starts from June 3-14, and pitched to a 2-1 record with a 2.50 ERA (5er/18.0ip), 18 strikeouts and a 1.00 WHIP in that stretch. He is the first Indians pitcher to record three straight quality starts since Cam Alldred did so from June 16-29, 2023.

Against the Mud Hens: Harrington has faced Toledo more than any other Triple-A opponent, with five starts against the Mud Hens since Aug. 4, 2024. Harrington is 1-1 against Toledo with a 3.86 ERA (11er/25.2ip), 22 strikeouts and a 1.09 WHIP in those five starts.

Miscellaneous: Harrington was selected by Pittsburgh in the first round (36th overall) of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft.
