**Aviators vs. Isotopes:** The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Athletics and '25 PCL Champions, will host the Albuquerque Isotopes, Triple-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies, tonight in the opener of a six-game homestand in Pacific Coast League action at Las Vegas Ballpark (8,196)...Las Vegas was 4-2 on the just completed six-game road trip in Reno...the series against Albuquerque will conclude on Sunday, May 24...following the PCL off day on Monday, May 25, the Aviators will then embark on a Pacific Northwest road trip against the Tacoma Rainiers, Triple-A affiliate of the Seattle Mariners, from Tues.-Sun., May 26-31.

**Las Vegas defeats Reno 7-1 in series finale (Sunday, May 17):** The Aviators defeated the Aces, 7-1, in the finale of the Northern Nevada six-game road trip before a crowd of 4,476 at Great Nevada Field.

**Las Vegas Offense:** The Aviators recorded 14 hits and stranded 10 runners on base. Las Vegas, leading 1-0, scored six runs in the fifth inning. Four players recorded multiple-hit games: Center fielder **Brayan Buelvas** was 3-for-4, RBI, run scored. Designated hitter **Chad Wallach** was 2-for-5, double, RBI, run scored; first baseman **Joey Meneses** was 2-for-5, RBI, run scored and third baseman **Tommy White** was 2-for-5, run scored.

**Reno Offense:** The Aces recorded 6 hits and stranded eight runners on base. Second baseman **Luis Urias** was 2-for-3, two doubles, walk, run scored. Shortstop **Anderdson Rojas** was 2-for-4.

**Aviators Starting Pitcher:** Right-hander **Joey Estes** recorded the victory with a season-high 6.1 shutout innings. He allowed 3 hits, walked 2 and struck out 6 on 99 pitches (70 strikes).

**Aviators Bullpen:** Left-hander **Matt Krook** pitched 0.2 scoreless and allowed 1 hit and struck out 1. Right-hander **Luis Morales** pitched 2.0 innings and allowed 2 hits, 1 run, walked 1 and struck out 4.

**AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS** – Las Vegas opens a six-game homestand tonight against the Albuquerque Isotopes, Triple-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies...the Aviators were 4-2 on the just completed six-game road trip in Reno...the series against the Isotopes will conclude on Sunday, May 24...Albuquerque and Las Vegas will play each other a total of 12 times in '26...following the homestand, the Aviators will then embark to the Pacific Northwest and face the Tacoma Rainiers, Triple-A affiliate of the Seattle Mariners, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, May 26-31...*the first-half of the '26 campaign will conclude on Sunday, June 21 vs. Round Rock*...the 2026 season will feature six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday and off days on Mondays...the '26 campaign will now feature 148 games (75-home; 73-away)...150-game campaign has been scheduled for the fifth consecutive season (2022 – present).

**2026 PCL PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Right-hander **Mason Barnett** from April 20-26...defeated Salt Lake on April 25 at Las Vegas Ballpark...5.0 shutout innings, one hit, walked two, seven strikeouts on 72 pitches (44 strikes).

**2026 PCL PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Outfielder **Henry Bolte** from May 4-10...appeared in six games against St. Paul and batted .556 (15-for-27) with four doubles, one triple, five home runs and 9 RBI, including a franchise record 12 consecutive hits (May 7-8-9) and tied the PCL record.

**43<sup>rd</sup> SEASON IN THE SILVER STATE (1983-2026)** – The Aviators are playing in their 43<sup>rd</sup> season (44<sup>th</sup> calendar season) in the Silver State as a proud member of the Pacific Coast League...**the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being Nevada's longest enduring professional sports franchise**...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8)...catcher **Bruce Bochy** has the distinction of hitting the first Triple-A home run in Cashman Field history for the Las Vegas Stars on April 10, 1983.

**PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE:** The PCL is in its 123<sup>rd</sup> season (1903-2020, 2022 -) and consists of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **West Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **East Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Comets, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys. The 10-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A West and returned as the PCL in 2022!

**INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE:** The IL consists of two divisions for a total of 20 teams. **East Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Norfolk Tides, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **West Division:** Columbus Clippers, Gwinnett Stripers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. The 20-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A East and returned as the IL in 2022.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY IN 2026:** The Aviators, for the second straight season, will play opponents from the IL. Las Vegas will host the St. Paul Saints, Triple-A affiliate of the Minnesota Twins, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, May 5-10 at Las Vegas Ballpark. Las Vegas will then travel to Omaha, Nebraska to face the Omaha Storm Chasers, Triple-A affiliate of the Kansas City Royals, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, June 9-14.

**2025 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 83-67 (.553) and finished in second place in the PCL West Division. Las Vegas won the first half with a 49-26 record (.653) and Tacoma won the second half. The Aviators then defeated the Rainiers, 2-games-to-0, in the LCS at Las Vegas Ballpark to capture its third PCL championship in franchise history (1986, 1988, 2025). Las Vegas then lost to the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp (International League champions), Triple-A affiliate of the Miami Marlins, 8-7, in the **Triple-A National Championship Game** on September 27 before the sellout crowd of 10,129 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**2024 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 74-75 (.497) and finished in fourth place in the PCL West Division. The Tacoma Rainiers captured the West Division with an overall record of 82-68 (.547). Sugar Land Space

Cowboys recorded the best record in the 30-team Triple-A (93-56, .624) and defeated the Reno Aces, 2-games-to-0, to capture the PCL Championship. Sugar Land then defeated the Omaha Storm Chasers, Triple-A affiliate of the Kansas City Royals, 13-6, in the **Triple-A National Championship** game on September 28 before a crowd of 8,007 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS** – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a seven six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **83** (83-67, .553 in 2025); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563)...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

**LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY:** Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH) then-owner announced on **October 10, 2017** its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on **Friday, February 23, 2018** before a crowd of several hundred people! The 8,196-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark provides a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall. Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site is landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites. The grand opening took place on **Tuesday, April 9, 2019** before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

**LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION HISTORY:** Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH), then-owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of the Pacific Coast League, and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on **December 8, 2018** the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51<sup>st</sup>) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

#### **AVIATORS LOGO DESIGN AND CONCEPT:**

The color inspiration: the Las Vegas Sunset; the mountain range featured in the Aviators' sunglasses resemble the mountain range found in the Summerlin logo!

#### **SOUTHERN NEVADA AVIATION HISTORY:**

**Nevada's High-Flying Aviators (from UNLV News)** - Nevada has a rich history in Aviation; with 500 miles between the state's two largest cities (Reno and Las Vegas), aviation was ideal for Nevada.

**Aviation History in Las Vegas (from Harry Reid Airport)** - Aviation grew exponentially throughout the 1900s, bringing more and more travelers to our city.

Nellis Air Force Base (in Las Vegas) is "Home of the Fighter Pilot" and home to the United States Air Force Warfare Center - the largest and most demanding advanced air combat training mission in the world. Crews do not come to learn how to fly, but instead how to be the **best combat aviators in the world**.

## **SEAPORT ENTERTAINMENT GROUP COMPLETES SEPARATION FROM HOWARD HUGHES HOLDINGS**

**NEW YORK, NY (AUGUST 1, 2024) – Seaport Entertainment Group Inc.** (NYSE American: SEG) (the “Seaport Entertainment Group” or “Company”), a newly formed company positioned at the intersection of entertainment and real estate, announced that it has completed its previously announced separation (the “Separation”) from its predecessor **Howard Hughes Holdings Inc.** (NYSE: HHH) (“Howard Hughes”) and is now an independent, standalone publicly traded company. The Company began its common stock trading (August 1) on the NYSE American LLC under the ticker symbol SEG.

Seaport Entertainment Group’s portfolio is anchored by the historic Seaport neighborhood in Lower Manhattan, which includes 478,000 square feet of primarily retail, restaurant and entertainment offerings, the 3,500-person concert venue on The Rooftop at Pier 17, a mixed-use development site at 250 Water Street, and the Tin Building by Jean-Georges, an immersive culinary marketplace. The Company’s portfolio also includes **Las Vegas Ballpark in downtown Summerlin, NV; the Las Vegas Aviators, the Triple-A Minor League Baseball Affiliate of the Athletics;** a 25% ownership interest in Jean-Georges Restaurants; and an interest in and to 80% of the air rights above the Fashion Show mall in Las Vegas.

**Aviators on Radio in 2026:** Russ Langer will broadcast the 148 games on **Raider Nation Radio 920 AM** (selected games on **Fox Sports 1340 AM** and **98.9 FM**) on [www.aviatorslv.com](http://www.aviatorslv.com). Langer is in his 26<sup>th</sup> season broadcasting baseball to the Las Vegas Valley and 39<sup>th</sup> year overall in the business...over his career, Langer has received numerous awards, including being named 1993 Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues...in 1995 and 2016, he broadcast the Triple-A All-Star game; in 1999, he was named the New Mexico Sportscaster of the Year; and in 2002, he was named Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by Minor League News.com...Langer also is a 12-time recipient (13 overall and seven consecutive years from 2007-13) of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2021, 2023), which is presented by the National Sports Media Association (NSMA)...Langer's inaugural season in Las Vegas was in 2000, the final year the franchise was known as the Stars... prior to arriving in Las Vegas, Langer called Pacific Coast League games for the Albuquerque Dukes (1996-99) and Phoenix Firebirds (1992-95)...began his broadcasting career with Single-A Springfield Cardinals in 1987 and 1989, sandwiched around a year in Vero Beach (1988)...moved up the ranks to Double-A, calling games for the Midland Angels in 1990 and '91 before advancing to Triple-A Phoenix...he realized his longtime

goal of broadcasting Major League baseball when he worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons, followed by nine games for the Baltimore Orioles in 2006...has also broadcast selected spring training games for the Los Angeles Dodgers (2006-08), Toronto Blue Jays (2009-10) and Chicago White Sox (2012-20)...in 2023, he broadcast his 3,000th game for Triple-A Las Vegas and completed his 12th season as the radio play-by-play voice for the UNLV football team on the UNLV Sports Properties/Learfield Network (2012-23)...was named the radio play-by-play broadcaster for the New Mexico State University men's basketball team for the 2025-26 season.

**Matt Neverett** will also serve as the play-by-play voice for home games and selected road games...in his seventh season as specialist, marketing & game entertainment with the Aviators, and his sixth in the broadcast booth...named **2024 Nevada Sportscaster of the Year**, which is presented by the National Sports Media Association (NSMA) and marked the first time that he received this award...he returned to his birthplace of Las Vegas in 2020 after spending two years with the Bradenton Marauders, Single-A Affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates, as the play-by-play broadcaster and media relations director...after graduating from Appalachian State University in Boone, N.C. in 2017, he spent one season with the Birmingham Barons, Double-A Affiliate of the Chicago White Sox, as a media relations manager and pre/post-game host...prior to 2024, he also broadcast selected UNLV Runnin' Rebel basketball games, UNLV baseball and UNLV football on SSEN...on July 10, 2024, he was named the radio play-by-play broadcaster for UNLV football for the '24 season...on October 1, 2024, he was then named the radio play-by-play broadcaster for UNLV Runnin' Rebels basketball for the 2024-25 season on UNLV Sports Properties/ Learfield Network...his father, Tim, is a former play-by-play voice of the Las Vegas 51s and current play-by-play voice of the Los Angeles Dodgers.

#### **ROBERT J. BLUM BROADCAST BOOTH AT LAS VEGAS BALLPARK:**

The "Aviators Home Radio Booth" was renamed the "**Robert J. Blum Broadcast Booth**" prior to the 2013 season at Cashman Field (and currently at Las Vegas Ballpark) to honor the then-51s Special Assistant to the General Manager... "The Blummer" passed away on July 22, 2012 at the age of 91...also served as the play-by-play voice for Stars/51s baseball in selected seasons from 1985-2005 & 2008-10...his company, Robert J. Blum Productions, also produced Las Vegas Triple-A professional baseball games broadcast on radio and television for several seasons.

#### **Aviators Manager Fran Riordan - \*\*2019 & 2023 & 2025 PCL Manager of the Year\*\***

He was named the 25<sup>th</sup> manager (November 8, 2018) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983-2019, 2021-24, 42 seasons). **Career Summary (current):** He has recorded 26 seasons (entering 2026) overall in professional baseball and has been a member of the Athletics organization for 11 seasons (2015-25).

Riordan has compiled an overall managerial regular season record (**current**) over 25 seasons of 1,415-1,358 (.510). He enters the '26 season ranked eighth among active leaders in minor league managerial wins.

**Triple-A Las Vegas:** He has a seven-year record (**current**) of 474-433 (.523) and is Las Vegas' all-time leader in managerial wins: 2. **Jerry Royster**, 1996-98; 2005-06 (323-387, .455); 3. **Wally Backman**, 2013-16 (309-267, .536).

**2025:** Named Pacific Coast League Manager of the Year for the third time in six seasons and guided Las Vegas to its third PCL championship in franchise history (1986, 1988, 2025)...the Aviators defeated Tacoma, 2-games-to-0, in the LCS...Las Vegas, 83-67 (.553) overall in the regular season and winners of the PCL first half, then lost to Triple-A Jacksonville, 8-7, in the Triple-A National Championship Game at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**2024:** The Aviators compiled an overall record of 74-75 (.497) and finished in fourth place in the PCL West Division.

**2023:** Named Pacific Coast League Manager of the Year for the second time in four seasons. The Aviators compiled an overall record of 75-74 (.508) and finished in third place in the West Division.

**2022:** The Aviators compiled an overall record of 71-79 (.473) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division.

**2021:** Riordan guided the Aviators to an overall record of 65-61 (.516) and finished in third place in the Triple-A West (Western Division).

**2020:** With the Minor League Baseball season canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Riordan worked with the Athletics' 60-man player pool at the team's alternate training site located in San Jose, California.

**2019:** Named Pacific Coast League Manager of the Year and led Triple-A Las Vegas to the second-best record in the 16-team PCL (83-57, .593) and a Pacific Southern Division Championship...Las Vegas returned to the playoffs for the first time since 2014 and lost to Sacramento, 3-games-to-2, in the conference championship series...the Aviators' record marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

**2018:** Made his Triple-A debut as manager with the Nashville Sounds of the Pacific Coast League and compiled an overall record of 72-68 (.514) and finished in second place in the American Southern Division behind the PCL and Triple-A National Champion, the Memphis Redbirds...Nashville compiled a PCL-best 15-game winning streak from July 29 – August 14.

**2017:** Compiled a record of 67-71 (.486) with Double-A Midland and his squad captured the Texas League Championship...the prior two seasons, he was the skipper of Single-A Beloit of the Midwest League (2015-16)...before joining the Oakland organization, Riordan spent four seasons as manager of the Florence Freedom of the Frontier League (2011-14)...led the team to two playoff berths and ranks second all-time in Frontier League wins with 625...was a 2014 Frontier League Hall of Fame inductee...prior to his time with Florence, he managed the Northern League's Lake County Fielders (2010) and Kalamazoo Kings for six seasons (2004-09), leading the Kings to the 2005 Frontier League title...was named the 2008 Frontier League Manager of the Year. He also served as player-manager in the Frontier League from 2000-02, leading the Richmond Roosters to back-to-back-league championships in 2001 and 2002.
