Saturday: RubberDucks 8, Baysox 6: Daniel Espino struck out the first 11 batters of the game and had a career-high 14 strikeouts – matching the most by any affiliated minor league pitcher in 2022 – to earn his first Double-A victory when Akron rallied for an 8-6 win, snapping a four-game losing streak in Bowie. Espino came within one of the affiliated minor league record for consecutive strikeouts. No Akron pitcher since the start of 2005 had struck out 14.

Reigning Champions: The Akron RubberDucks finished a league-best 73-46 in the regular season in 2021, and they swept the Bowie Baysox in three games for the sixth league title for the franchise in Northeast Ohio, adding to Eastern League titles in 2003, 2005, 2009, 2012 and 2016. Akron was five outs from being eliminated on the last day of the 2021 regular season, but a four-run eighth inning at home against Somerset earned a 5-4 win and berth in the Championship Series. After winning the first two games in Bowie, the RubberDucks rallied from a 5-0 deficit in Game 3, capped by **Bo Naylor's** walk-off single to win the Double-A Northeast Championship at Canal Park.

Returning cast: The RubberDucks' roster of 28 players includes 18 players who were with Akron when it clinched the league title on Sept. 24, 2021. Overall, 20 of the 28 appeared in a regular season or postseason game for Akron in 2021. On the field staff, the RubberDucks return 2021 Double-A Northeast Manager of the Year **Rouglas Odor**, pitching coach **Owen Dew**, hitting coach **Junior Betances**, assistant hitting coach (2021 bench coach) **Mike Mergenthaler**, and athletic trainer **Jacob Legan**. New bench coach **Juan De La Cruz** had the same role with the club in 2019.

Double-A Northeast dominance: In 2021, the RubberDucks had a .500 or better record against every club they faced. Erie (12-12) and Somerset (6-6) were the only clubs without losing records against Akron. The RubberDucks played 60 of their 119 games against winnings teams, going 34-26 in those games.

Newcomers: The new additions to the roster include pitchers **Tanner Burns**, **Daniel Espino**, **Hunter Gaddis**, **Nick Gallagher**, **Kevin Kelly**, and **Jerson Ramirez**, and outfielder **Julian Escobedo**. Three players only joined Akron last year for the playoffs – left-hander **Tim Herrin**, infielder **José Tena**, and outfielder **Micah Pries** – after finishing the regular season with High-A Lake County.

Canal Park 25th anniversary season: The RubberDucks in 2022 celebrate the 25th anniversary of the 1997 opening of Canal Park. In the offseason, the RubberDucks finished a complete renovation of the luxury suites and partnered with the City of Akron to replace the entire original seating bowl.

RubberDucks visit Baysox: Akron is playing the first of four scheduled series with Bowie this season, including two series at each team's ballpark. In 2021, the RubberDucks were 8-4 against Bowie in the regular season, including 4-2 at Prince George's Stadium, before sweeping the Baysox, 3-0, in the Double-A Northeast Championship Series. According to MLB.com, top prospects in this series include:

Season format: The 138-game Eastern League season features two halves, with 69 games scheduled for each. The first half ends June 26, and the second half begins June 28. The half winners in each division will play a best-of-three divisional playoff, with those winners meeting in a best-of-three championship series. The schedule has 22 six-game series and a pair of three-game series (Opening Weekend and the weekend after a four-day July break coinciding with the MLB All-Star Game). While Akron opens in Erie, the SeaWolves will visit Canal Park for the other three-game series July 22-24. The RubberDucks will play every team in the league except Portland, and only play single series with Northeast Division opponents Reading, Binghamton, New Hampshire, Somerset and Hartford.

Pitching preview: The RubberDucks rotation features three of the Guardians' top four pitching prospects (according to MLB.com) in right-hander **Daniel Espino** (top pitching prospect, 2019 first round from Georgia Premier Academy), left-hander **Logan T. Allen** (No. 3 pitching prospect, 2020 second round for Florida International), and right-hander **Tanner Burns** (No. 4 pitching prospect, 2020 first round from Auburn). Espino and Burns are making their Double-A debuts.

Guardians 40-man roster: Three current RubberDucks were placed on Cleveland's 40-man roster in November 2021. All three were on the championship-winning roster in September, including infielders **Brayan Rocchio** and **José Tena**, and outfielder **George Valera**.

Top backstop: In 2021, **Bo Naylor** led Double-A Northeast catchers with 629.1 innings (73 games) behind the plate (75.1 more than any other), 766 total chances, 707 putouts and 54 assists. His 21 runners caught stealing (68 attempts) were second. Naylor hit just .138 (13-for-94), 1 HR, 5 RBI through his first 26 Double-A games. But in the final 61 games of the season, he went 46-for-219 (.210) with 10 doubles, nine homers, 39 RBIs, and a .674 OPS.

- Enters season ranked as No. 11 prospect (No. 4 pitching prospect) in Cleveland system according to MLB.com.

- Entered the season as Cleveland's No. 16 overall prospect according to MLB.com.
- Made his pro debut with 18 starts for High-A Lake County.
- Was on the injured list July 20-Aug. 5 with elbow soreness.

Amateur

- Named to 2020 Preseason All-American lists by Baseball America and Perfect Game, and named to the Golden Spikes Award preseason watch list.
- Posted a 2.86 ERA over three seasons at Auburn...Became the third Auburn player to be named a two-time All-American, joining Gregg Olson (1987-88) and Casey Mize (2017-18).
- As a sophomore in 2019, he helped Auburn reach the College World Series. He had 101 strikeouts (79.2 IP), joining Casey Mize (2017-18) as the only Auburn pitchers since 2000 to strike out 100 batters. He matched Auburn's single-game record of 15 strikeouts, joining five others, including Casey Mize (2018) and Tim Hudson (1997), Auburn's volunteer pitching coach since 2020.
- As a freshman in 2018, he was named a Freshman All-American by *Baseball America*, Collegiate Baseball, D1 Baseball and Perfect Game/Rawlings. He was second to Casey Mize on the Auburn staff in innings (86.2), strikeouts (77) and wins (7) while posting a 3.01 ERA.
- Played for the USA Baseball 2018 Collegiate National Team that featured 2019 No. 1 overall pick Adley Rutschman and 2020 No. 1 overall pick Spencer Torkelson.
- Named Alabama's Mr. Baseball and Gatorade Player of the Year in 2017 and rated by Perfect Game as the No. 4 player in Alabama and No. 33 in the country. As a high school senior, he went he 10-1, 0.88 ERA, 116 K in 64 IP and hit .467, 16 HR, 46 RBI
- Five-year letterwinner at Decatur High School and a member of the 2016 USA Baseball 17U national team... Drafted by the Yankees in the 37th round in 2017 but did not sign.

Personal

- In 2020 Burns began "The 32 Foundation," a charity to raise money for families who need help paying for medical bills at the Children's Hospital of Alabama. According to [Mandy Bell \(MLB.com, March 2022\)](#), it was largely inspired by Hayden Qualls, a young cancer survivor who was a fifth grader when Burns met him in 2018. Burns met Hayden and his dad, Bryan, on a visit to the Children's Hospital of Alabama, where Auburn players make regular visits to patients. Diagnosed with leukemia at age 8, Hayden Qualls beat cancer four times and has been in remission for three years and is finishing his freshman year of high school. Burns keeps in regular communication with Hayden Qualls and his family.
- His father, Mike, played in the Houston Astros organization from 1991-93 as a catcher, first baseman and third baseman. Signed as a nondrafted free agent, Mike later [coached at Decatur High School \(before Tanner played there\) and at Calhoun Community College](#) (Brian Stultz, MiLB.com, June 2020), before leaving college baseball to follow Tanner's career at Auburn.
- From a family of Alabama fans, he originally committed to Alabama, until head coach Mitch Gaspard resigned. Butch Thompson, formerly at Mississippi State, then recruited him to Auburn.

Scouting Report (MLB.com, Preseason 2022)

"Burns usually works at 92-95 mph and touches 97 with some run on his four-seam fastball, and his ability to spot it on either side of the plate may be more impressive than its velocity (which fluctuated after his stint on the injured list) or life. His best secondary pitch is his plus slider/cutter, which arrives in the upper-80s and helped him to have more success against lefties than righties in High-A. He also throws a 78-82 mph downer curveball that has gotten more consistent in pro ball and has some feel for a low-80s changeup with some sink.

With the ability to throw four pitches for strikes and advanced command of his fastball, Burns has a high floor as well as the upside of a mid-rotation starter. The biggest concern is his durability because he's small for a starter, had shoulder issues in 2019 before his elbow flared up last year and his stuff has declined at the end of his last two full seasons. If he can stay healthy, his biggest backers believe he could be similar to fellow former Southeastern Conference standout Sonny Gray."

2022 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (Third Season) – Odor, 54, is in his 35th season with the Cleveland organization as a player, coach and manager. The 2022 season will be Odor's third as RubberDucks manager (tying him with Joel Skinner, Dave Wallace and Brad Komminsk for most seasons as Akron's manager). In 2021, Odor was named Double-A Northeast Manager of the Year after leading Akron to the Double-A Northeast championship and a 73-46 record. He also guided the RubberDucks to a 61-79 record in 2019. Odor has a career record of 534-513 as a manager.

Odor was the first member of the Guardians organization to be a member of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and RubberDucks. He was an infielder for Canton-Akron for parts of the 1991, 1993 and 1994 seasons. Odor served as the Aeros hitting coach in 2012 and served as the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014.

A native of Maracaibo, Venezuela, Odor was a 32nd round selection by Cleveland in the 1988 draft out of the University of New Orleans. The former shortstop played in the minor leagues for Cleveland from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. The 2019 season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League (1999-2000), the Burlington Indians (2001-2004), the Mahoning Valley Scrappers (2005-2006), and Gulf Coast League Indians (2007-2008). In 2009, Odor began serving as hitting coach for the Kinston Indians (2009-2010), Double-A Akron Aeros (2011-2012), High-A Carolina Mudcats (2013), Double-A Akron RubberDucks (2014), and Triple-A Columbus Clippers (2015-2017).

Odor resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#35 Owen Dew, Pitching Coach (Second Season) — Owen Dew, 33, enters his sixth season in the Cleveland organization and second as RubberDucks pitching coach. In 2021, Dew led the Akron pitching staff to a 3.78 ERA (second best in the Double-A Northeast) and a franchise record 1,190 strikeouts. Prior to coming to Akron, Dew was the pitching coach for the Mahoning Valley Scrappers in 2017, AZL Indians in 2018 and Lake County in 2019.

Dew was a 21st round selection by Cleveland in 2010 out of the University of Central Florida. He spent parts of three seasons in the Cleveland organization, logging 58 appearances and 152.1 innings. Dew began his baseball journey as a right-handed pitcher for Seminole State College of Florida (2008-2009), before moving to the University of Central Florida in 2010. That same year, Dew advanced through Mahoning Valley with a strong 2.64 ERA in nine starts for the Scrappers. At Class-A Lake County, Dew was converted to a relief pitcher where he appeared in 15 games over the 2010 and 2011 seasons. In Dew's final season as a player, the right hander appeared in 34 games, accruing 70 innings and posted a 3.86 ERA with 41 strikeouts.

Since his playing career, Dew served as an assistant coach at Seminole State College of Florida while also assisting the Cleveland Indians as an associate scout from 2014-2017.

#16 Junior Betances, Hitting Coach (Second Season) — Betances, 48, enters his 25th season with the Guardians organization as a player, coach or executive and second as the hitting coach for the RubberDucks. In 2021, Betances guided the RubberDucks hitters to a .254 average (third best in the Double-A Northeast) with 116 home runs and 577 RBI (second best in the Double-A Northeast).

Betances came to the organization via the 1996 Rule 5 draft after spending six seasons in the Brewers organization. He batted .289 over 165 games in 1998 and 1999 for the Akron Aeros. Betances joined the coaching ranks in various roles for Cleveland's Dominican Summer League team from 2000-2010. Betances then served as Arizona League Indians coach from 2010-2015, and moved to Lake County in 2017 as the Bench coach for Manager Larry Day.

#28 Mike Mergenthaler, Assistant Hitting Coach (Second Season) — Mergenthaler, 33, enters his sixth year with the Cleveland organization and second season with Akron. Mergenthaler spent 2021 as the bench coach for the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Mergenthaler was the bench coach with Lynchburg in 2019. In 2018 and 2019, Mergenthaler worked as a hitting coach for the Cleveland and Milwaukee joint Dominican Summer League team. The Thiells, New York, native was drafted as a player in the 32nd round of the 2011 amateur draft by the San Francisco Giants, playing in their system for parts of 2011 and 2012.

#27 Juan De La Cruz, Bench Coach (Second Season, not consecutive) – De La Cruz, 28, enters his fourth season with the Cleveland organization and second season with Akron, where he was the bench coach in 2019. De La Cruz spent 2021 as the bench coach for Low-A Lynchburg. De La Cruz was signed by Cleveland in 2009 and played eight seasons in the organization. He appeared in 12 games for the RubberDucks in 2017.

Jacob Legan, Athletic Trainer (Second Season) — Legan enters his ninth season in the Cleveland organization and second season in Akron. Prior to coming to Akron, Legan served as the athletic trainer for Lynchburg in 2019. He earned his bachelor's degree in Athletic Training from East Carolina and his master's degree in Exercise Physiology from the University of Akron.

Tyler Grisdale, Strength and Conditioning Coach (First Season) – Grisdale enters his first season with the Guardians organization. Grisdale spent two years in the Miami Marlins organization and four years in the Colorado Rockies organization, including as the Physical Performance Coach for the Spokane Indians (Colorado's High-A affiliate) in 2021.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World.**" Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.

• 2021 Highlights

Akron Baseball: A Winning Tradition

This is the 33rd season of Double-A baseball in Northeast Ohio, and the 25th in downtown Akron. The franchise began as the **Canton-Akron Indians** in 1989, and then moved to **Canal Park** in Akron as the **Aeros** in 1997, later becoming the **RubberDucks** before the 2014 season. The club has made the Eastern League playoffs 18 times overall, and 12 of the last 19 seasons. The team has captured **six league titles**—2003, 2005, 2009, 2012, 2016 and 2021.
