HIGHLIGHTS BOMBS AWAY: After four more home runs

on Tuesday, Somerset now has 173 home runs on the season through 114 games. The Patriots are two home runs away from tying their franchise record mark of 175 home runs, which was set in 119 games in 2021, their first year as the Yankees' Double-A affiliate. Including today's game, the Patriots have 23 games left this season to break the record. Somerset has homered in each of its last 14 games entering today, dating back to 8/7. The Patriots' 173 are tied for 3rd in MiLB. **MOVING FOUR-WARD:** The Somerset Patriots enter today having hit four home runs in back-to-back games, most recently in Tuesday's 10-6 win (Dunham, Bastidas, Wells, Wagaman). The Patriots have now homered 4+ times in a game on nine occasions this season. Bastidas and Wells have homered in back-to-back games.

THERE HE GOES... After begininng the last series in Bowie by going 3-for-19 (.158 BA) in five games at the plate, for the first time in his career Anthony Volpe has now collected three hits (including one triple each) in back-to-back games entering today, going a combined 6-for-9 with 5 RBI and 3 R. Volpe entered this stretch with only three 3+ hit games out of his first 101 this season. **SAY CHEESE:** With his 16th HR of the season on Tuesday, Elijah Dunham extended his season-long on-base streak to 19 games, which is one shy of the longest by any Patriot this season (Chaparro, 20). Dating back to July 12, Dunham has been on base in 26 of his last 27 games, posting a .293/.426/.535 slash line over this stretch (.961 OPS) with 6 HR, 17 RBI, 22 R and 26 BB.

Began the 2022 season with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, starting in seven games and going 0-3 with a 10.38 ERA, before leaving his last start on 5/26 vs. JAX with an injury.
García made his big-league debut in Game 2 of a doubleheader on 8/30/20 against the New York Mets (6.0 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 0 ER, 0 BB, 6 K). He became just the 10th Yankee since 1935 and the first since 1992 to throw at least 6.0 IP and not allow an earned run in his MLB debut. García went on to become just the second pitcher in Yankees history with at least 6 K and no more than 2 BB in each of his first four big league appearances (Tanaka, 2014). He did this while being the youngest pitcher (21 year, 103 days) to start a game for the Yankees since Phil Hughes (21 years, 95 days in 2007), and the second-youngest player to start a game in the majors in 2020 (Luis Patiño, SD; 20 years, 329 days). The right-hander capped off the 2020 season by starting Game 2 of the ALDS against Tampa Bay, and became the youngest pitcher (21 years, 140 days) ever to start a postseason game for the Yankees (previous: Whitey Ford, 1950 World Series Game 4; 21 years, 351 days).
In 2021, García was named Triple-A East Pitcher of the Week for 5/10-16/21 (1-0, 10.0 IP, 5.0 H, 1 R, 0 ER, 2 BB, 16 K).

- In 2019, he pitched in the 2019 SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field in Cleveland, and was promoted to Triple-A for the first time after the game.

Personal

- García is an artist and he showcases work on Instagram account: "@drawings_deivi83". Watches the same 5-minute clip of his idol Pedro Martinez from the 1999 All-Star Game before each of his starts. Credits his father for a lot of his success, he was the first one to teach him a curveball and made countless sacrifices for him to attend tryouts. His mother was a doctor who gave up her career to focus on raising her children. Grew up wanting to play shortstop, began pitching when he went to tryouts as a 15-year-old. Younger brother, Andres García, is a prospect in the Toronto Blue Jays organization. He most recently played for the DSL Blue Jays in 2019.

DAN FIORITO \star MANAGER

Born and raised in Yonkers, NY, Dan Fiorito enters his sixth season with the Yankees organization and his first as Somerset's manager. Fiorito is also the Yankees' Roving Upper Level IF/OF Instructor. He served as the manager of High-A Hudson Valley in 2021, after making his managerial debut in 2019 with the GCL Yankees East. Fiorito also had been slated to manage the Yankees' former short-season Single-A affiliate, Staten Island in 2020,

before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He served as the defensive coach at the Yankees' former Single-A Charleston affiliate in 2018, after making his professional coaching debut as defensive coach with the Yankees' former Rookie-level Pulaski affiliate in 2017.

His playing career began when he was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent in 2012. Over four seasons as an infielder in the Yankees system, he batted .240 (264-for-1102) with 107 runs, 52 doubles, six triples, seven home runs and 98 RBI in 322 career minor league games. Fiorito played three years at Manhattanville College (Purchase, NY) and is a 2008 graduate of Fordham Prep (Bronx, NY).



GERARDO CASADIEGO ★ PITCHING COACH

Gerardo Casadiego will begin his first season in Somerset and 10th in the Yankees organization. He held the same position in Hudson Valley last season, where the Renegade staff ranked second in the High-A East division in strikeouts (1,308, sixth in MiLB) and third in ERA (4.12). The Venezuela native has also previously served as the pitching coach for former Rookie-level Pulaski (2017-2019), DSL Yankees 1 (2014-2015) and DSL Yankees 2 (2016).

JAKE HIRST ★ HITTING COACH

Jacob Hirst will serve as hitting coach in his first season with Somerset and fourth with the Yankees organization. He was the hitting coach for Hudson Valley in 2021, when the Renegades' batters ranked second among High-A East clubs in triples (33) and OBP (.341), third in doubles (217) and fourth in home runs (156), batting average (.255), slugging percentage (.446) and OPS (.787). The Iowa native served the same role with the GCL Yankees West (2019-2020).





AARON BOSSI ★ DEFENSIVE COACH

Aaron Bossi begins his first season with Somerset after making his coaching debut in the same role with Hudson Valley in 2021. His prior experience for the organization was assisting rehabbing players at the minor league complex from 2017-2019. The St. Louis, MO native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.





Travis was Volpe's coach when he was 12-years-old, playing for the Diamond Jacks Super 12U team.

- Born and raised in Watchung, NJ, which is the eastern-most point of Somerset county, Volpe grew up a Yankees fan, Derek Jeter was his favorite player growing up and his favorite memory growing up was watching the 2009 Yankees World Series team, when he was eightyears-old. He chooses to wear #7 because his grandfather's (also named Anthony Volpe) favorite player is Mickey Mantle. Anthony's family, including parents Michael and Isabelle, are in attendance for every home game at TD Bank Ballpark. Volpe has lived at home with his family for the duration of this season and is hosting fellow teammates Austin Wells, Blake Perkins and Max Burt.
