ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The Wisconsin Timber Rattlers beat the South Bend Cubs 7-2 on Wednesday afternoon at Neuroscience Group Field at Fox Cities Stadium. Wisconsin scored twice in the bottom of the first inning on RBI singles by Je'Von Ward and Joe Gray Jr. They took a 3-0 lead on a solo homer by Kekai Rios in the second inning. South Bend scored single runs in the fourth and seventh innings to get close. Thomas Dillard hit a grand slam in the bottom of the seventh to put the game out of reach.

SLAMTOWN, POPULATION: 4 – Dillard's grand slam was the fourth of the season hit by a Timber Rattler. It was their second slam against the South Bend Cubs in 2021.

MAKING HAY: Hayden Cantrelle went 3-for-5 on Wednesday. He is currently on a seven-game hitting streak (11-for-26, .423). Cantrelle is on his longest hitting streak of the season and has raised his average from .164 to .198 during the streak.

A FAMILIAR REFRAIN: South Bend starting pitcher Ryan Jensen lasted just 2/3 of an inning against the Timber Rattlers and took the loss on Wednesday. He also went only 2/3 of an inning as the starting pitcher and took the loss against the Timber Rattlers on June 13 in South Bend.

DILLY DILLY! Dillard's slam was his twelfth home run of the season and it gave him 57 RBI on the season. He is second in the High-A Central League in RBI and tied for seventh in RBI in all Minor League Baseball.

PHASE OF THE MOON: Carlos Luna went six innings, allowed one run on two hits, and struck out nine for the win. Luna is 3-1 with a 1.79 ERA and 48 strikeouts in 40-1/3 innings pitched with Wisconsin this season. He also has two quality starts this season. In two appearances against South Bend, Luna allowed two runs – one earned – on two hits over eleven innings with a win and a save.

ABOUT SOUTH BEND: The South Bend Cubs started as the South Bend White Sox when the Midwest League added them as an expansion team in 1988. They changed their name to the Silver Hawks for the 1994 season and became an affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks in 1997. South Bend became an affiliate of the Chicago Cubs. South Bend won Midwest League pennants in 1989, 1993, 2005, and 2019. Notable alumni for the South Bend franchise include Justin Upton, Gleyber Torres, Ian Happ, and Carlos Gonzalez. Terry Francona was the manager of the South Bend White Sox in 1982.

ABOUT THE CUBS: The Chicago Cubs had several different Midwest League affiliates before settling in South Bend in 2015. They were affiliated with Quad Cities from 1979 through 1984, Peoria from 1985 through 1994 and again from 2005 through 2012, Rockford from 1995 through 1998, Lansing from 1999 through 2004, Kane County in 2013 and 2014.

PROSPECTING IN THE SERIES: [MLB Pipeline](#) puts six Rattlers on their list of Brewers Top 30 Prospects: Carlos Rodríguez (#14), Hayden Cantrelle (#16), Nick Kahle (#20), Thomas Dillard (#22), Dylan File (#26), and David Hamilton (#27). [MLB Pipeline](#) has three current South Bend players on their list of Chicago Cubs prospects: Ryan Jensen (#8) and Burl Carraway (#17), and Bryce Ball (#29). Cole Roederer (#12) is on the injured list.

2005 MWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES:

GAME 1 (9/13 @SB): [Silver Hawks 6, Wisconsin 4](#)

Mark Reynolds and Emilio Bonifacio homered in the second inning to break a 1-1 tie and Kellen Raab scattered nine hits over five innings while allowing three runs – two earned – for the win.

GAME 2 (9/14 @SB): [Silver Hawks 4, Wisconsin 1](#)

South Bend broke a 1-1 tie with three runs in the bottom of the eighth inning. Orlando Mercado drove in the tie-breaking run.

GAME 3 (9/15 @WIS): [Wisconsin 1, South Bend 0](#)

Robert Rohrbaugh pitched eight scoreless innings and Chris Colton drew a bases-loaded walk in the bottom of the eighth to drive in the only run of the game.

GAME 4 (9/16 @WIS): [Wisconsin 11, South Bend 6](#)

Mike Wilson homered, drove in three runs, and scored three runs to lead Wisconsin and force Game Five.

GAME 5 (9/17 @WIS): [South Bend 4, Wisconsin 0](#) Cesar Nicolas hit a two-run homer in the top of the seventh to break a scoreless tie. The Rattlers had five hits.

WISCONSIN STARTING PITCHER:

RHP DYLAN FILE: Selected by the Brewers in the 21st round of the 2017 draft out of Dixie State University in St. George, Utah.

STARTING IN MONTANA: File was 1-2 in twelve games – seven starts – for Helena in the Pioneer League after being drafted by the Brewers. He walked thirteen and struck out 37 over 47 innings during his first pro season.

FORWARD TO WISCONSIN: File was 8-10 with a 3.96 ERA in 25 starts with Wisconsin in 2018. He had 114 strikeouts in 136-1/3 innings pitched. File was a Mid-season All-Star and finished fifth in the Midwest League in innings pitched that season.

THAT'S A GREAT SEASON: File was 15-6 in 26 starts between Carolina (High-A) and Biloxi (Double-A) in 2019. He walked 22 and struck out 136 over 147 innings pitched at the two stops in the Brewers system. File was 6-4 and was named a Mid-season All-Star in the Carolina League. He went 9-2 with a 2.79 ERA after his bump to the Southern League.

PRETTY GOOD POSTSEASON, TOO: File was 1-0 in two playoff starts for Biloxi during the Southern League playoffs in 2019. He allowed one earned run, walked one, and struck out 15 in 14-1/3 innings during the Shuckers playoff run.

WHAT DID YOU DO IN 2020? File was invited to participate in Milwaukee's Alternate Training Site Camp last year.

SO...THIS IS FORTY: File was placed on Milwaukee's 40-Man Roster on November 20, 2020. He is currently on the 60-Day IL as he rehabs from a surgery on February 4, 2021 to repair a stress fracture in his right elbow.

LAST START: File had a no decision [at Peoria on July 17](#). He allowed a run on two hits with two walks and three strikeouts over 2-1/3 innings pitched.

VS. SOUTH BEND: File beat South Bend [at Four Winds Field on July 14, 2018](#) when he allowed one run on four hits with two walks and five strikeouts over eight innings.

SOUTH BEND STARTING PITCHER:

RHP MATTEO BOCCHI: The Cubs signed Bocchi as a non-drafted free agent out of the University of Texas on June 13, 2019.

ITALIAN SPECIAL: Bocchi is a native of Parma, Italy. He was a member of the first native Italian team to qualify for the Little League World Series in Williamsport, Pennsylvania. Bocchi was also the first Italian-born person to play baseball for the University of Texas.

THE COLLEGE BEFORE COLLEGE: Bocchi pitched two seasons (2016 & 2017) at Odessa College and was 9-5 in eighteen games – thirteen starts.

LONGHORN: Bocchi spent two seasons at Texas. He was 6-3 with three saves and an ERA of 2.78 over 38 appearances – six starts there. He was teammates with Timber Rattlers infielder David Hamilton in 2018 and 2019 at Texas.

THREE STOPS: Bocchi pitched for the AZL Cubs-2, the Eugene Emeralds, and the Iowa Cubs during the 2019 season. He was 2-2 with a save and a 2.97 ERA in sixteen relief appearances that season.

THIS SEASON: Bocchi has made twelve appearances – five starts – for the Cubs and three relief appearances for the Tennessee Smokes, the Double-A South affiliate of the Chicago Cubs.

LAST START: Bocchi had a no decision against [Cedar Rapids at home on July 16](#). He allowed one run on three hits with three walks and eight strikeouts over four innings in the game.

VS. WISCONSIN: Bocchi has never faced the Timber Rattlers prior to this evening. This is also his first appearance against an affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers.
