INDY BITS

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The Indianapolis Indians scored three runs in the first inning of both games to secure a doubleheader sweep over the St. Paul Saints on Thursday night at Victory Field. Jack Suwinski hit a three-run home run in the first inning of Game 1 in a 6-2 win and Llover Peguero slammed a first-inning, two-run shot in Game 2's 5-0 shutout victory. In Game 1, the Indians went up, 3-0, on Suwinski's eighth homer of the campaign. After Ronny Simon led off the game with a double, Joey Bart walked and Nick Solak grounded out. Suwinski then deposited Andrew Morris cutter beyond the lawn in right field. Hunter Barco earned his first Triple-A win, tossing 5.0 innings of one-run ball. Yohan Ramirez (S, 4) collected the final six outs for his fourth save of the season.

GAME 2: In Game 2, the Indians again posted a trio of runs in the first inning. Simon led off the game with a single and stole second base on a strikeout by Bart. After Nick Yorke followed with a punchout for the second out, Billy Cook drove Simon home with an RBI single for a 1-0 advantage. Peguero launched his third home run of the season down the left field line for a 3-0 lead. A fourth run came to the plate in the second inning. Aika Williams led off with a single and took two bases on Cheng's groundout to second base, standing at third with one out. Simon then walked. After Simon stole his second base of the game, catcher Diego Cartaya made a throwing error to score Williams. Cook drove home Indy's fifth run of the game in the sixth inning, chopping a grounder over third base to tally Yorke. Drake Fellows tossed 4.0 scoreless frames, allowing just one walk with six strikeouts. Dauri Moreta followed in relief with a shutout sixth frame and Eddy Yean blanked the Saints over the final 2.0 innings to conclude the night.

VICTORS VALIANT: The Indians 24-9 record at Victory Field this season is their highest win total at the venue through June 12 since starting the 2013 season 27-10 at home. Their .727 winning percentage at Victory Field this season is the second-best mark in the minors of teams with at least 20 home games played, only trailing Single-A Brooklyn's 24-6 (.800) home record. Since April 16, the Indians are 22-5 at Victory Field, posting a +39 run differential in this span (133-94). Their 22 home wins in this span are the by any minor league team.

SIMON SAYS: Ronny Simon continued his impressive start with the Indians, going 2-for-5 in yesterday's doubleheader with one double, one RBI, two walks, two runs and two stolen bases. In his six games with the Indians to date, he is slashing .261/.346/.781 (6-for-26). In 21 Triple-A games between Jacksonville and Indy this season, he owns a .905 OPS. Game 2 marked his first multi-steal game since Aug. 20, 2024, with Durham at Syracuse.

SOMEONE COOKED HERE: After a 0-for-3 performance in Game 1, Billy Cook rebounded to go 2-for-3 with two RBI and a run scored in Game 2 last night. He has reached base safely two-plus times in nine of his last 10 games. Seven of those 10 games feature multi-hit performances and he is hitting .500 (18-for-36) with four doubles, five RBI, six walks, six runs, three stolen bases and a 1.182 OPS in this span. Cook has hit safely in 15 of his last 17 games with an official at-bat dating back to May 23 at Toledo. In that span, he is hitting .400 (26-for-65) with five doubles, seven RBI, nine walks, nine runs, four stolen bases and a .950 OPS.

JACK ATTACK: Jack Suwinski kicked off the doubleheader with a first-inning, three-run homer in Game 1 to deliver the game-winning hit out of the gate. Since making his season debut on April 25 (1) at St. Paul, he leads the team in home runs (8), total bases (63), RBI (32) and runs (24).

BUCCO BART: Pirates catcher Joey Bart reached base safely three times in Game 1 yesterday, going 1-for-2 with two RBI and two walks. He went 0-for-3 in Game 2. He joined the Indianapolis Indians on a major league rehab assignment on Wednesday, going 1-for-2 with a hit by pitch as the designated hitter. Bart was plunked on the first pitch he saw and singled to center field in the third inning of his season debut. Bart was placed on the 7-day injured list on May 28, sustaining a concussion after being hit in the mask on a backswing on May 27 at Arizona. In 44 games with Pittsburgh this season, the backstop is hitting .240 (35-for-146) with five doubles, one triple, one home run, 11 RBI, 21 walks and one stolen base. He led MLB primary catchers in April (min. 65 PA) in batting average (.310, 18-for-58) and ranked fifth in OPS (.877). He appeared in six games for the Indians last season on a rehab assignment, batting .353 (6-for-17) with one double, four RBI, three walks and two runs.

DAZZLING DAURI: The Indians roster features another major league rehabber, right-hander Dauri Moreta. Moreta was placed on the 60-day injured list on Feb. 16 after undergoing Tommy John surgery and being sidelined for the entire 2024 season. Nearly 14 months after his last professional appearance, the right-hander began a rehab assignment with High-A Bradenton on April 29 and tossed 2.0 scoreless innings in two games. He has since pitched to a 3.55 ERA (5er/12.2ip) with Indy, allowing eight hits while striking out 18 across his 15 appearances dating back to May 6.

TONIGHT'S MATCHUP: The Indianapolis Indians continue this week's seven-game series at 7:05 PM tonight. RHP Kyle Nicolas is set to make his first start since Sept. 16, 2023, with Indy at Omaha. He opened in that game, tossing a scoreless first inning. Nicolas allowed three earned runs in 1.0 innings on Opening Day at St. Paul on March 28. In six career games against the Saints, Nicolas has a 4.50 ERA (3er/6.0ip) with 11 strikeouts. The first five of those were scoreless appearances. Opposite Nicolas is RHP Trent Baker who is set to make his Triple-A debut. Minnesota purchased his contract in the Triple-A phase of the 2024 Rule 5 Draft on Dec. 11, 2024, and began the season with the Double-A Wichita Wind Surge. In 11 starts with the club prior to his promotion, he went 2-2 with a 2.86 ERA (16er/50.1ip), 51 strikeouts and a .211 opponent average (40-for-190).

DOMINATE THE SAINTS: The Indians are 16-2 against the Saints at Victory Field since April 15, 2023. With a win tonight, Indy seeks its third straight home series victory over St. Paul.

ON THIS DATE IN 1998: After losing Game 1 of a doubleheader vs. Ottawa, 2-1, starting pitcher Rodney Bolton tossed a 7.0-inning complete game shutout to win the nightcap, 3-0. Bolton improved to 6-5 on the season with the win as he surrendered hits runs, two walks and struck out five. The Indians were backed by an RBI single in the first off the bat of Mike Frank and a two-run homer by Mark Johnson in the fourth inning.
