## INDY BITS

**ABOUT SUNDAY:** A three-run sixth inning broke a 6-6 tie to give the Indianapolis Indians their fifth straight win over the Toledo Mud Hens at Victory Field on Sunday afternoon, 10-6. With the go-ahead run on base in the sixth inning, three straight run-scoring hits from Matt Gorski, Darick Hall and Liover Peguero sealed the win for the Indians. Nick Solak plated an insurance run in the seventh while Hunter Stratton, Tanner Rainey and Peter Strzelecki closed out the win with 3.0 shutout innings and four strikeouts. The Indians stormed out of the gate with a five-run first inning, knocking out Mud Hens starter Matt Manning after recording just two outs. Following a leadoff walk to Ji-Hwan Bae, Solak gave Indy a 2-0 lead with a towering home run into deep left field. A bases-loaded passed ball scored Gorski for a 3-0 lead before Abraham Gutierrez plated the inning's fourth and fifth runs with a two-run single. The final three runs of the frame all came with two outs. Toledo rallied in the fourth inning, scoring five unanswered runs off Indians starter Braxton Ashcraft to tie the game. Indianapolis regained the lead in the bottom of the fifth on a sacrifice fly by Billy Cook that scored Peguero, who tripled to lead off the inning.

**SOLAK ECLIPSE:** Nick Solak extended his International League-leading hitting streak to 12 games on Sunday, reaching base four times in the win. Solak went 3-for-4 with a home run, three RBI, one walk and two runs. It was his first game of the season reaching base four times and he has reached safely three-plus times in a game for the fourth time. Solak has a hit in all of his games this season, batting .391 (18-for-46) with two doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, 10 runs, three stolen bases and a 1.061 OPS. He has struck out just seven times on the campaign and only thrice in his past 35 plate appearances. On Wednesday, he posted his first multi-steal game since taking two bags June 18, 2022, with Round Rock vs. Sugar Land. In last week's six-game series vs. Toledo, Solak hit .526 (10-for-19) with one double, one home run, seven RBI, three walks, three stolen bases and five runs against just two strikeouts.

**GLITZY GORSKI:** Matt Gorski erupted in last week's series vs. Toledo, hitting .360 (9-for-25) with three doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, one walk and seven runs. He is currently riding a four-game hitting streak, four-game RBI streak and four-game run streak. His four-game RBI streak is tied for second best in the International League behind Nashville Daz Cameron's five-game run. After a two-hit performance on Sunday, Gorski tallied three straight multi-hit efforts for the first time since Sept. 9-12, 2023. He has posted a hit in six of his past seven games and has one-plus hit in 13 of his 17 games on the campaign. He has driven in one-plus run in six of his last seven games and 11 of 17 overall. In 11 games at Victory Field this season, Gorski is hitting .372 AVG (16-for-43) with a 1.104 OPS. Gorski delivered the win on Friday with a walk-off double, going 2-for-4 with two RBI and one run. He tallied 10 total bases in Saturday's contest, marking the most in a single game by an Indian this season. He went 3-for-4 with one double, two home runs, three RBI and three runs. It was his sixth multi-homer game of his career and first since May 21, 2024, at Iowa. It was the first multi-homer game by an Indy player since Liover Peguero left the yard twice on Aug. 23, 2024, at Columbus.

**DAR DEVIL:** Darick Hall extended his on-base streak to nine games on Sunday, going 1-for-5 with one RBI. He is hitting .303 (10-for-33) in those nine games with two doubles, three RBI, five walks and just five strikeouts in this span. This, on the heels of going hitless (0-for-12) and striking out one-plus times in each of his first four games. From Game two on April 12 through April 13 at Louisville, he posted back-to-back multi-hit games for the first time since July 24 and 25, 2024, with Lehigh Valley at Rochester.

**HOLDY ON REHAB:** Pirates right-hander Colin Holderman began a rehab assignment with Indianapolis on Saturday, tossing a scoreless seventh inning en route to the Indians fourth straight win. Holderman was placed on the 15-day injured list on April 6 with a right knee strain. In 12 career games with Indianapolis, he is 0-0 with a 4.63 ERA (Ger/11.2ip) with eight hits, four walks, two hit batters and 14 strikeouts. Opponents are hitting just .195 (8-for-41) in this span. He began the season on Pittsburgh's Opening Day roster, going 0-0 with a 9.64 ERA (5er/4.2ip), four walks and six strikeouts in five games. He has appeared in 127 games for Pittsburgh since 2022, going 4-9 with a 4.04 ERA (55er/122.2ip), 112 hits, 56 walks and 126 strikeouts.

**COMEBACK KIDS:** After overcoming another deficit on Saturday night, the Indians earned their seventh comeback win of the season. Four of the team's seven home wins this season came via extra-inning walk-off plate appearances. The Indians walked off for the fourth time in April on Friday, tying a Victory Field high for most walk-off wins in the month. The squad improved to 5-0 in extra innings on the campaign that night, with one road win in 10 innings on April 13 at Louisville. Indy also improved to 6-1 in one-run games this season on Friday. With Sunday's win, the squad earned five straight wins at Victory Field for the first time since Sept. 1-13, 2024.

**TODAY'S MATCHUP:** The Indians and Saints begin an eight-game series in St. Paul after two of the three games in the season's opening series were postponed due to inclement weather. The series will feature two seven-inning doubleheaders on Wednesday and Friday. Today's series opener is scheduled for 12:07 PM with Indianapolis right-hander Carson Fulmer on the mound. He did not factor into the decision on Wednesday vs. Toledo, tossing a season high 5.2 shutout innings with three hits, two walks and three strikeouts. It marked the first two walks he has issued on the campaign. Fulmer has made three consecutive starts of 5.0-plus innings since a six-game string from May 25-June 21, 2018, with Charlotte. He is set to make his first career start against St. Paul. In two career appearances against the club, he is 0-0 with 2.0 scoreless innings, one hit, one walk and three strikeouts. Starting for St. Paul is right-hander Zebby Matthews. Matthews will make his fourth start of the season after allowing just three runs in 15.0 innings (1.80 ERA). He is set to make his first career appearance against Indianapolis.

**ON THIS DATE IN 1955:** The Indians outthit Denver 21-14 on their way to a 16-9 win in Colorado. Joe "Rabbit" Caffie went 4-for-5 with a triple, three RBI, three runs scored and a stolen base, Bill Glynn finished 4-for-5 with two home runs and a double, and Rudy Regalado had a game-high five hits for Indy.

TONIGHT'S PITCHER

**Carson Fulmer:** Right-hander Carson Fulmer was signed by Pittsburgh as a minor league free agent on December 12, 2024. He has appeared in 114 major league games across stints with the White Sox, Tigers, Orioles, Reds and Angels since his debut in 2016. He made one appearance in the minors last year with Triple-A Salt Lake, allowing one run over 3.0 innings.

**Last Outing:** Fulmer did not factor into the decision on Wednesday vs. Toledo, tossing a season high 5.2 shutout innings with three hits, two walks and three strikeouts. It marked the first two walks issued by Fulmer on the campaign.

**Against the Saints:** Fulmer is set to make his first career start against St. Paul. In two career appearances against the club, he is 0-0 with 2.0 scoreless innings, one hit, one walk and three strikeouts.

**Major League Pedigree:** Fulmer spent most of 2024 with Los Angeles-AL, appearing in 37 games (eight starts) with the club. He posted an 0-5 record and 4.15 ERA (40er/86.2ip) with 81 hits, 40 walks and 81 strikeouts.

**Miscellaneous:** Selected eighth overall by Chicago-AL in the first round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft out of Vanderbilt University (Nashville, Tenn.). As a junior at Vanderbilt in 2015, Fulmer won the National Pitcher of the Year Award after going 14-2 with a 1.83 ERA (26er/127.2ip) with 167 strikeouts.
