THINKIN' 'BOUT LAST WEEK: Quad Cities secured its second-straight series win (sixth overall), taking four-out-of-six games from the Peoria Chiefs at Modern Woodmen Park ... Sunday's 8-6 victory marked the River Bandits' ninth of a 12-game homestand after claiming five-out-of-six games from the Cedar Rapids Kernels the week prior.

OFFENSIVE ERUPTION: Over their last 14 games, the River Bandits have blasted 59 extra-base hits, tied for the fifth-most in Minor League Baseball ... Quad Cities leads all full-season minor league clubs with a .319 team batting average while ranking second in team OPS (.918) and runs scored (114, 8.14 per game).

GETTIN' FIGGY WITH IT: Launching his team-leading 17th home run of the season Friday, Derlin Figueroa enters Sunday tied for third in the league in long balls ... in addition to homers, "Figgy" ranks top five in the Midwest League in extra base hits (T-2nd, 36), total bases (4th, 141), RBI (T-4th, 57), doubles (T-4th, 19), and slugging percentage (5th, .540).

THE TABLE-SETTERS: Since July 1, Asbel Gonzalez and Angel Acosta have combined for 34 hits, the most of any duo in High-A and are hitting a collective .414 (34-for-82).

RED-HOT RAMON: Over his last 23 games, Quad Cities' catcher and Royals' No. 7 prospect Ramon Ramirez ranks top 10 in the Midwest League in all triple-slash stats (.349/.441/.616) and paces the league with 11 doubles ... over Quad Cities' six-game set against Peoria, Ramirez totaled 13 RBI, tied for the most in Minor League Baseball, and became the first High-A player and just the 10th in Minor League Baseball this season to reach 70 RBI ... Ramirez joins Callan Moss (70, 2024), Juan Carlos Negret (2023, 70), and Michael Massey (87, 2021) as the only River Bandits to reach the 70-RBI milestone since Quad Cities became a Royals affiliate in 2021.

WALKING INTO THE BOOKS: Working a pair of walks Thursday, Royals' No. 3 prospect Blake Mitchell ranks eighth in Quad Cities' history with 124 in his 130 career games as a River Bandit ... the 21-year-old is just two away from tying Gary Jones (126, 1983), who ranks seventh ... Royals' catcher Carter Jensen owns the fourth-most in club history, having totaled 149 for the Bandits over the 2023-24 seasons ... Kenneth Grant tops the list (198, 1985-86, '88).

TAKE IT TO THE MAX: Tossing 2.2-scoreless innings, including a season-high five strikeouts Saturday, Max Martin has not allowed a run over his last 14.1 innings (8 games), the longest stretch in the Midwest League this season ... during the stretch, the right-hander owns a 0.70

WHIP and a .146 opponent batting average.

HISTORIC HOMERING: With six under his belt this season, Trevor Werner now owns 24 home runs over his River Bandits career ... the mark ties Peter Gongola, David Chorley, and Brian Harper for the 10th-most in franchise history (since 1960) ... Sam Ashford and Joseph Henderson are tied for ninth with 25 apiece.

TRIPLE THREAT: Nolan Sailors leads High-A and is tied for second among all minor league hitters with nine triples ... George Kopacz owns Quad Cities' single-season triples record, racking up 14 with the 1960 Quad City Braves ... Tyler Tolbert was the last Quad Cities player to post a double-digit total, collecting 10 in 2022.

PROSPECTING THE RIVER: The River Bandits' roster features seven of the Royals' top 30 prospects (MLB Pipeline): **Kendry Chourio** (1), **David Shields** (3), **Blake Mitchell** (4), **Ramon Ramirez** (7), **Asbel Gonzalez** (15), **Blake Wolters** (22), and **Josh Hansell** (26).

A CENTURY AND COUNTING: The 2026 season marks the 103rd year of professional baseball in Davenport, dating back to the 1897 Davenport Brown Stockings of the Northwestern League ... since then, Davenport-based franchises have been part of nine different leagues, affiliated with 12 different Major League clubs, and sported 18 different monikers.

THE ROYAL FAMILY: 2026 marks the River Bandits' sixth season as an affiliate of the Kansas City Royals ... since joining the Royals organization, 20 River Bandits have made their Major League debuts with Kansas City: **Angel Zerpa** ('21), **Michael Massey** ('21), **Vinnie Pasquantino** ('21), **Nate Eaton** ('21), **Maikel Garcia** ('21), **John McMillon** ('23), **Nick Loftin** ('21), **Logan Porter** ('21), **Anthony Veneziano** ('21), **Will Klein** ('21), **Walter Pennington** ('22), **Tyler Gentry** ('21/'22), **Tyler Tolbert** ('21/'22), **Noah Cameron** ('22/'23), **John Rave** ('21), **Jac Caglianone** ('24), **Luinder Avila** ('23), **Carter Jensen** ('23/'24), **Eric Cerantola** ('22/'23), and **Beck Way** ('22).

MANAGER JESUS AZUAJE

Azuaje enters his 12th season—fourth managerial—in the Royals’ organization and takes the reins in Davenport for the second-straight season after managing the Columbia Fireflies (Single-A) in 2024 and the ACL Royals (Rookie) in 2023. He spent the previous eight seasons serving as hitting coach in Burlington (2015-2016), Lexington (2017-2020), and Columbia (2021-2022). Prior to joining the Royals, Azuaje spent six seasons as a manager and coach in the Seattle Mariners organization, including a stint in the Midwest League as hitting coach for Clinton (Single-A) in 2009, and as Latin America Field Coordinator for the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2014.
