ABOUT LAST NIGHT: Ronny Simon and Nick Yorke's homers combined for all the Indianapolis Indians runs, and Indy's bullpen held the Louisville Bats scoreless for the final four frames in Wednesday night's 3-2 victory at Louisville Slugger Field. Simon opened the game for Indianapolis with his third lead-off home run of the season for Indy in just 21 games. Nick Yorke added some much-needed insurance for Indianapolis in the fourth inning with a towering two-run home run. Louisville threatened with a bases-loaded jam in the second but were not able to muster anything more than five hits off Thomas Harrington until the fifth inning. With two outs in the frame, the Bats scratched across two runs with a string of three singles and a walk but could not rally any further. Cam Sanders, Kyle Nicolas, Dauri Moreta and Tanner Rainey held Louisville to two baserunners and no runs across the final four innings to secure the victory. Adam Plutko surrendered both home runs and took the loss for Louisville despite turning in 6.0 innings of work.

START IT, SIMON: Ronny Simon led off the game with a home run, his third leadoff blast in just 21 games with Indy, finishing 2-for-4 with a walk and a stolen base. His three leadoff homers tie the single-season team record in the Victory Field era (since 1996), matching Ji Hwan Bae (2024), Brian Bixler (2009) and Damien Jackson (1998). He is already tied for the third-most leadoff blasts by an Indian in this era, with Bae holding the all-time record at five.

BECAUSE THEY GET ON-BASE: Ronny Simon (2-for-4, HR, BB, SB) and Nick Solak (1-for-4) each extended their on-base streaks to 18 games yesterday, which are tied for the seventh-longest active on-base runs in the International League. These streaks trail only Ji Hwan Bae's 20-game stretch from April 13-May 21 for the longest by an Indian this season. Simon is hitting .292 (21-for-72) in this span with four doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, 13 walks, 13 runs, nine stolen bases and an .872 OPS. Solak is hitting .343 (23-for-67) with three doubles, two home runs, 11 RBI, nine walks, 12 runs, one stolen base and a .908 OPS in his stretch. Simon has hit safely in seven of his last eight games and in 15 of the 18 overall. Solak has hit safely in 16 of 18, with a team-high tying 14 game hitting streak from June 12 (1)-27.

YORKE GOES YARD: Nick Yorke (1-for-3, HR, 2 RBI, BB) homered in back-to-back games for the second time this season and first since May 1-2. He has four straight multi-RBI performances, marking the longest such run of his professional career. He extended his hitting streak to five games, the longest active run on the team, and on-base streak to eight. In those eight games, he is hitting .333 (10-for-30) with one triple, two home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, three runs, two stolen bases and a 1.044 OPS. Since hitting .212 (14-for-66) in 18 games through April to begin the season, Yorke is hitting .306 (55-for-180) with an .806 OPS in 47 games since May 1. Yorke posted a season-high 4 RBI on Tuesday night, finishing 2-for-4 with one triple, one home run and one run. It was his most runs driven in since July 2, 2024, with Worcester at Syracuse. His 18 multi-hit contests this season are tied with Nick Solak for the team lead.

SOMEONE COOKED HERE: Billy Cook continued his scorching run at the plate last night, going 1-for-3 with a double and a walk Since entering play on May 23 with a .198 AVG (25-for-126) in 39 games, Cook is hitting .358 (39-for-109) with a .921 OPS in his last 31 games. Since May 23 (min. 30G), his batting average is the second best in the International League and fourth best in Triple-A overall. In June, he led qualified Triple-A hitters with a .389 batting average (28-for-72) and ranked third with a .470 on-base percentage.

HARRI STYLES: Thomas Harrington earned his fourth win of the season last night, tossing 5.0 innings of two-run ball on eight hits, one walk and four strikeouts. He has thrown 5.0 innings or more in 10 of his 14 starts this season and in six straight dating back to June 3. It is his longest stretch of 5.0-plus innings since ending the 2024 season on a six-game run with Indianapolis from Aug. 17-Sept. 18.

HOLDY'S HERE: RHP Colin Holderman had his major league rehab assignment transferred from Single-A Bradenton to Indianapolis on Tuesday and appeared in the series opener, allowing two earned runs across 0.2 innings with three hits and one strikeout. Holderman is one of seven rehabbers assigned to Indy on eight separate stints, joining infielder Jared Triolo, first baseman Spencer Horwitz, right-handed pitcher Dauri Moreta, catcher/first baseman Endy Rodriguez, infielder Nick Gonzales and catcher Joey Bart. He was placed on the 15-day injured list on May 20 with right thumb inflammation after going 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA in 14 games with Pittsburgh. He made one rehab appearance with Bradenton on June 26. He has appeared in 136 games for Pittsburgh since 2022, going 4-10 with a 4.40 ERA (65er/133.0ip), 126 hits, 63 walks and 131 strikeouts. He collected two career saves with the Pirates, both coming during the 2023 season. The reliever has made 14 appearances (one start) with Indianapolis since joining the Pirates organization in 2022, logging a 6.23 ERA (9er/13.0ip) and 16 strikeouts. Two of those appearances came earlier this season, during a prior rehab assignment after he was placed on the 15-day injured list on April 6 with a right-knee sprain.

TODAY'S MATCHUP: The Indianapolis Indians continue this week's split six-game series against the Louisville Bats tonight at 7:05 PM. Tonight concludes the series' portion of games at Louisville, with the remaining three games played this weekend, Friday through Sunday, at Victory Field. RHP Sean Sullivan is set to open an Indy bullpen game, making his fifth appearance and third start of the campaign. Sullivan last tossed 3.0 shutout innings as the opener on June 26 vs. Omaha, allowing one hit and one walk while striking out five. Tonight marks his first career game against the Bats. Opposite Sullivan is RHP Jose Franco who is set to make his second career appearance in Triple-A. He made his Triple-A debut on June 28 (1) at St. Paul, tossing 6.0 innings of three-run ball (2er) on six hits, one walk, one hit batter with two strikeouts.

ON THIS DATE IN 1997: The Indians launched seven home runs as a team in a 16-11 win at Nashville's Greer Stadium, a Victory Field era record that wasn't matched until July 6, 2017, at Columbus. Brian Hunter finished with a double and two home runs as part of a 5-for-6 performance. Hunter went on to lead the team with 142 hits, 36 doubles and 85 RBI, and he led the American Association with 249 total bases. He finished the season with 21 home runs, just one shy of the team leader, Aaron Boone.
