SEAN-CORE PERFORMANCE: Patriots starter Sean Boyle was named the Eastern League's July Pitcher of the Month, after he went 3-0 with a 0.82 ERA over five starts. Boyle becomes the third Patriots pitcher to be named an MiLB Pitcher of the Month, joining RHP Janson Junk (May 2021) and RHP Hayden Wesneski (September 2021). Boyle's 33 IP were the most of any minor leaguer during July. He allowed only three runs and three walks, compared to 35 strikeouts, with batters hitting .182 off him. Boyle enters today on a streak of nine straight quality starts, which is the longest such streak of any minor league pitcher since 2019.

BACK WHERE IT ALL STARTED: Boyle's nine-game quality start streak immediately followed the most difficult stretch of his career, which took place in Binghamton. Across the three starts prior to this quality start streak (the last two of which were in Binghamton), Boyle allowed 21 R (19 ER) over 13.1 IP, equaling an ERA of 12.83. In Boyle's first start vs. Binghamton (5/30), he allowed a career-high 10 runs. In his last start vs. the Rumble Ponies on 6/5 (Boyle's last non-quality start), he gave up three home runs in the first three innings of the game, before proceeding to retire the final 7 batters he faced to earn his 2nd win of the season. Since that point in his last game vs. Binghamton, Boyle has had nine straight quality starts with a 1.73 ERA, 0.87 WHIP and .192 BAA with 55 K compared to 12 BB in 57.1 IP.

STRANGER THINGS: For the first time this season, the Patriots have lost four games in a row, losing only their second series all season. The Patriots lost only 4 games over the last 14 games of July. Somerset has allowed double digit runs in 3/4 games this week, after only allowing double digit runs in 4/95 games to start this season. The Patriots' 41 runs allowed this series have already skyrocketed past their most in a series this season (33 @POR 7/12-17). Of the 41 runs allowed this week, 10 errors have made it so that less than half of them are earned runs (20). For reference, Binghamton has only allowed 19 earned runs this week, but has won all four games in this series. Despite allowing 10.25 runs per game this week, Somerset's staff ERA over this span is 5.14. After allowing only one 7-run inning in the season's first 97 games, the Patriots have allowed a 7-run inning in back-to-back games. The five home runs that the Patriots allowed in Thursday's suspended game are their most since becoming the Yankees' Double-A affiliate. On Friday, the Patriots lost only their fourth game when hitting 3+ home runs (now 18-4).

STOP AND SMELL THE ROSIE: Since the start of the second half, Jeisson Rosario has reached base in 18/21 games played, slashing .351/.489/.514 (1.003 OPS) with 13 RBI, 11 R and a near equal amount of walks (20) to strikeouts (19).

- Boyle was named the Eastern League's July Pitcher of the Month, when he went 3-0 with a 0.82 ERA over five starts, where he allowed only three earned runs over 33 IP, which were the most IP of any minor leaguer during July of 2022. He earned Eastern League Pitcher of the Week honors on 7/19/22, after he tied career-high marks on 7/16 @POR with seven shutout innings and nine strikeouts, allowing only three hits. It was Boyle's second career POW honors, and came one week after he started two games vs. Bowie and gave up only one run over 13 combined innings.

- In two consecutive starts this season (5/4 vs. NH and 5/12 @ALT), Boyle struck out a career-high nine batters. On 5/4, he struck out the final eight that he faced. In two separate consecutive starts (5/25 @POR and 5/30 @BNG), Boyle allowed a career-high tying 8 hits, along with a career-high 10 runs (8 earned) on 5/30 vs. Binghamton.

- Pitched for all four Yankees full-season affiliates in 2021. Partook in two no-hitters for two different teams last season, both in the second game of a double-header and both in his first start at each respective level: Hudson Valley 7/10/21: in his High-A debut, Boyle started a combined no-hitter with five hitless innings.

Scranton/Wilkes-Barre 8/19/21: in his Triple-A debut and his first start above High-A, Boyle pitched a seven-inning individual no-hitter. On 7/11/21, Boyle was named the Triple-A East Pitcher of the Week. Yankees Minor League affiliates pitched five no-hitters in 2021 and Boyle was a part of two of them.

- Began 2019 season in Rookie-level Pulaski (11g, 28.2 IP, 32 K, 5 BB, 1.88 ERA), before earning promotion to Short-Season Staten Island and pitching in five games.

- Collegiately, played (2015-16) at Suffolk County Community College and posted the 8th-best ERA (1.64) in the nation at the NJCAA Division III level and was ranked the No. 21 prospect in the state of New York by Baseball America. Transferred to Dallas Baptist University for his junior and senior seasons (2017-18), where he posted a 3.60 ERA over 21 appearances his senior year.

- Long Island native played high school (Newfield High School) and JUCO ball (Suffolk County CC) in Long Island, college summer ball in Albany. During the Covid layoff, Boyle and his father, Wayne, co-authored a book titled "Applied Technology in Pitching: Metrics, Development and Strategies."

COACHING STAFF



DAN FIORITO



MANAGER

Born and raised in Yonkers, NY, Dan Fiorito enters his sixth season with the Yankees organization and his first as Somerset's manager. Fiorito is also the Yankees' Roving Upper Level IF/OF Instructor. He served as the manager of High-A Hudson Valley in 2021, after making his managerial debut in 2019 with the GCL Yankees East. Fiorito also had been slated to manage the Yankees' former short-season Single-A affiliate, Staten Island in 2020, before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He served as the defensive coach at the Yankees' former Single-A Charleston affiliate in 2018, after making his professional coaching debut as defensive coach with the Yankees' former Rookie-level Pulaski affiliate in 2017.

His playing career began when he was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent in 2012. Over four seasons as an infielder in the Yankees system, he batted .240 (264-for-1102) with 107 runs, 52 doubles, six triples, seven home runs and 98 RBI in 322 career minor league games. Fiorito played three years at Manhattanville College (Purchase, NY) and is a 2008 graduate of Fordham Prep (Bronx, NY).



GERARDO CASADIEGO



PITCHING COACH

Gerardo Casadiego will begin his first season in Somerset and 10th in the Yankees organization. He held the same position in Hudson Valley last season, where the Renegades staff ranked second in the High-A East division in strikeouts (1,308, sixth in MiLB) and third in ERA (4.12). The Venezuela native has also previously served as the pitching coach for former Rookie-level Pulaski (2017-2019), DSL Yankees 1 (2014-2015) and DSL Yankees 2 (2016).

JAKE HIRST



HITTING COACH

Jacob Hirst will serve as hitting coach in his first season with Somerset and fourth with the Yankees organization. He was the hitting coach for Hudson Valley in 2021, when the Renegades' batters ranked second among High-A East clubs in triples (33) and OBP (.341), third in doubles (217) and fourth in home runs (156), batting average (.255), slugging percentage (.446) and OPS (.787). The Iowa native served the same role with the GCL Yankees West (2019-2020).



AARON BOSSI



DEFENSIVE COACH

Aaron Bossi begins his first season with Somerset after making his coaching debut in the same role with Hudson Valley in 2021. His prior experience for the organization was assisting rehabbing players at the minor league complex from 2017-2019. The St. Louis, MO native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.

- Coleman began this season in High-A Hudson Valley, having not allowed a run in his first 18 innings of the 2022 season. He posted 0.47 ERA in 19.1 IP with opponents hitting .115 off him before a promotion to Somerset on 5/17/22.
- After being signed as an undrafted free agent in 2020, when the MLB Draft was shortened to five rounds, Coleman spent his pro debut season in 2021 with Single-A Tampa, posting a 6.11 ERA with 49 strikeouts in 35.1 IP.
- Collegiately, Coleman pitched three seasons out of the bullpen at the University of Kentucky, where he posted a 4.19 ERA with 81 strikeouts over 53.2 innings pitched, a strikeout rate of 13.58 per nine innings, which was the highest rate for any UK pitcher with at least 50 innings pitched since 1979. He finished with a 5-5 record and five saves to go along with a .211 opponent batting average, including .172 by left-handed hitters.
- After being drafted in the 33rd round of the 2019 MLB Draft by the Tampa Bay Rays, Coleman opted to return to school for the 2020-shortened college baseball season, when he pitched to a 3.14 ERA over six games and 13 of the 17 outs he recorded were strikeouts.
- During his junior year at Kentucky in 2019, Coleman pitched to a 5.14 ERA over 23 appearances and led the Wildcats with five saves.
- After redshirting his freshman year at Kentucky in 2017, Coleman pitched in 20 games out of the bullpen in 2018, when he went 3-0 with a 3.15 ERA and opponents hit a team-low .183 against him. In between his sophomore and junior seasons in 2018, Coleman pitched for the Brewster Whitecaps of the Cape Cod League, appearing in nine games with one save and leading the Cape with a 0.90 ERA in 10 innings of work.
- Coleman was a middle infielder throughout his youth until he decided to try pitching as a senior at Lexington Catholic High School, when he went 4-1 with a 0.95 ERA in 45 innings. Prefers to wear #34 for David Ortiz, models his game off of Jose Fernandez.

- Spending all of his third pro season to this point with the Somerset Patriots in his home county, Volpe hit his first Double-A home run on Easter Sunday (4/17 vs. ERI), which was a grand slam. Volpe was joined on the American League team by former high school teammate, RHP Jack Leiter and 2022 Patriots teammate, LHP Ken Waldichuk.

- The 2021 season was Volpe's second professional season and his first at the full-season level. He worked his way up from Single-A Tampa (54 games) to High-A Hudson Valley (55 games), totaling 109 games and combining to slash .294/.423/.604 with 113 R, 86 RBI, 33 SB and 27 HR. He led all minor leaguers in runs (113), ranked second in OPS (1.027) and third in extra-base hits (68). Volpe led all Yankees minor leaguers in 2021 in OPS (1.027), OBP (.423), SLG (.604), R (113), BB (78), XBH (68) and 2B (35). Ranked second in RBI (86) and third in HR (27) and H (121).

Travis was Volpe's coach when he was 12-years-old, playing for the Diamond Jacks Super 12U team.

- Born and raised in Watchung, NJ, which is the eastern-most point of Somerset county, Volpe grew up a Yankees fan, Derek Jeter was his favorite player growing up and his favorite memory growing up was watching the 2009 Yankees World Series team, when he was eight-years-old. After an injury that landed him on the IL in May, Wells returned to playing with Single-A Tampa from 6/25-7/4, spending eight games with the Tarpons and hitting .231 with a .950 OPS and two home runs. In total, prior to joining the Patriots on 7/6, Wells had played in 37 games, hitting .304/.425/.568/.993 with 8 HR, 22 RBI and 26 R. Defensively, Wells caught 17/49 attempted base stealers (34.7%) to begin this year, committing no errors in 283 total chances.

- Following the 2021 MiLB season, Wells played for the Surprise Saguaros of the Arizona Fall League alongside fellow Patriots, Elijah Dunham, Andres Chaparro and Tanner Myatt. Playing in 18 games during the fall, Wells ranked 6th in the AFL with a 1.034 OPS, adding 2 HR and 14 R. His 18 RBI were tied for the most of any catcher in the AFL. For his efforts, he was named an AFL Rising Star.

- In Wells' pro debut season during 2021, he combined to hit .264/.390/.476 in 103 games with OPS of .886, 16 HR, 76 RBI and 82 R between Single-A Tampa (65 games) and High-A Hudson Valley (38 games), where he was promoted to on 8/3.

- Collegiately, Wells spent two seasons with the University of Arizona Wildcats, playing in 71 games and hitting .357 with a 1.036 OPS with 7 HR, 74 RBI and 85 R. Among his honors while at Arizona, Wells was first named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year in 2019, when he was also a Freshman All-American honoree per Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America, NCBWA and Rawlings. In 2020, Wells was a Collegiate Baseball Second-team All-American and was named to the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year Award watch list (top NCAA catcher). Both of Wells' parents, Greg and Michelle, were graduates and former athletes at the University of Arizona as well.

- During the summer of 2019, Wells played in the Cape Cod League (collegiate summer ball) with the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox, logging time in 42 regular season games, where he was named a Cap Cod League All-Star starter, after hitting .308 with 7 HR, 26 RBI and 23 R. Wells was named a 2019 Cape Cod League Outstanding Pro Prospect.

- Wells spent his preps career at powerhouse Bishop Gorman High School in his hometown of Las Vegas, combining to hit .428 with 87 RBI and 85 during his preps career. He was named team captain and Most Valuable Player as a junior and senior. As a junior, Wells was the 2017 Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year. Upon graduating high school, Wells was originally selected by the Yankees in the 35th round of the 2018 MLB Draft. After electing to play college ball at Arizona, the Yankees selected him again in the first round of the draft two years later, 28th overall. Wells is currently living at the Volpe household, alongside teammates Max Burt and Blake Perkins.
