CIRCLE CITY ROUNDUP

ABOUT SUNDAY: The Indianapolis Indians jumped ahead in the first inning with Ronny Simon's lead-off home run and threatened with a bases-loaded rally in the ninth but could not match a six-run third inning from the Columbus Clippers as they fell, 8-6, on Sunday afternoon at Huntington Park. With a 1-0 lead in the third, the game snowballed on Indy. Bubba Chandler allowed a single, a walk and a wild pitch to set up the Clippers to tie the game with a single. They took the lead with an RBI groundout and worked another walk to set up Jhonkensy Noel for a three-run shot. Will Wilson and Kody Huff followed with a single and a double to cap the inning and bring Columbus' lead to 6-1. Columbus tacked on a run to its lead with Milan Tolentino's third home run of the series in the fourth inning and Noel cranked his second homer of the game for their final run in the bottom of the seventh. Simon's lead-off homer, his second in an Indians uniform, was the Indians only run until the seventh inning. Alike Williams led off frame for Indy with a walk, Nick Solak singled and Jack Suwinski brought them around to score with a double. The Indians scratched across another run in the eighth, courtesy of Brett Sullivan doubling and scoring on an RBI ground out. Indy loaded the bases in the ninth inning with a Billy Cook double and a pair of walks and scored two runs on a Nick Yorke single and a walk from Sullivan but could not overcome the deficit.

OUT WITH THE OLD: Indianapolis wrapped up the first half with a 42-32 record (.568 winning percentage), finishing fifth in the International League standings. Indy's first-half record is its best since Triple-A began using the halves format in 2023 and their second-best in a half overall, trailing last year's second-half record of 44-30 (.595). Since the beginning of last year's second half on June 25, Indianapolis has the second-highest winning percentage in Triple-A (.581, 86-62) behind Nashville (.583, 84-60). The Indians record to this point in the season is their best since they went 41-31 (.569) through June 23, 2017.

WINDIANAPOLIS: The Indianapolis Indians return to Victory Field, where they own the best home winning percentage (.750, 27-9) of any Triple-A team and the second-highest of any full-season minor league team, trailing only High-A Brooklyn (.788, 26-7). The Indians home winning percentage is their highest through June 23 since at least 2005, surpassing 2012, when they had a .743 winning percentage (26-9). Indianapolis also has a +34 run differential in home games this season, which ranks fifth among all Triple-A teams. The Indians have won 17 of their last 20 home games since May 11 and 25 of their last 30 dating back to April 16. Since April 16, the Indians are tied with Brooklyn, (.833, 20-4) for the best home-winning percentage in full-season Minor League Baseball. Indy has a +34 run differential in home games this season, which ranks fifth among all Triple-A teams.

ALIKA'S ALL OVER IT: Alike Williams ripped a double in Sunday's contest to extend his hitting streak to 11 games since June 11, which is the longest-active streak on the team and tied for the third-longest active hitting streak in the International League. The streak is the second-longest of his career, trailing only an 18-game hitting streak with Low-A Charleston from July 30-Aug. 22, 2021. Williams is tied for the third-most runs scored (9) and the ninth-highest batting average (.385, 15-for-39) of qualified International League hitters during his run. He's also amassed a trio of doubles, a homer and six RBI while holding a .947 OPS across this span. He recorded an RBI in three straight games from June 17-20 for the first time since June 29-July 1, 2023, and he scored a run in four straight from June 15-20. Dating back to May 28, Williams has racked up five multi-hit games, three three-hit games, and has a .338 batting average (25-for-74) in that stretch.

SOLAK ECLIPSE: Nick Solak went 3-for-3 with a double and two walks on Sunday, marking the first time an Indians hitter has reached base safely five times in a game this season and the first time he has done so since Aug. 14, 2021, with Triple-A Round Rock. The three-hit effort was Solak's seventh of the season, which leads Indians hitters and is tied for the fifth-most by an International League hitter this season. He has reached base safely in 14 of 15 games played and has hit safely in 13 games since returning to Indy on June 5, including an active 10-game hitting streak since June 12 (1) vs. St. Paul. On the season, Solak leads Triple-A hitters with at least 150 plate appearances in batting average (.365, 62-for-170) and ranks seventh in OPS (.992). Solak's batting average is the highest by an Indians hitter (min. 100 PA) through this point in the season since at least 2005, surpassing Steve Pearce's average of .363 (37-for-102) through June 23, 2010.

CAPTAIN JACK: With his two-run double on Sunday, Jack Suwinski has now reached base in 19 of his last 21 games played since May 23 at Toledo, which includes a 16-game streak from May 28-June 17 that stands as the second-longest by an Indian this season. Since May 23, Suwinski has slugged five homers and 11 extra-base hits while tying for sixth among qualified International League hitters in RBI (21) and ranking seventh in slugging percentage (.573) and OPS (.951). His multi-RBI performance on Sunday was his 12th of the season, which leads Indians hitters this season and is tied for the most multi-RBI games in the International League since he made his Triple-A season debut on April 25. Despite his delayed debut, Suwinski leads Indians hitters on the season in home runs (9) and RBI (38) and is tied for the team lead in extra-base hits (18).

SOMEONE COOKED HERE: Billy Cook recorded a hit in Sunday's contest, his first game back with Indy after a short stint with Pittsburgh, to continue his torrid month of June. In the month, Cook has recorded a hit in 12 of 15 games and has picked up multiple hits in eight of those games, which is tied for the fourth-most of any International League hitter in the month. In June, Cook leads International League hitters with a .434 batting average (23-for-53), ranks third with a .508 on-base percentage and has the seventh-most hits. Cook's batting average is currently the second-highest by an Indian in a calendar month since at least 2005 (min. 60 PA), only trailing Rajai Davis' .441 clip (26-for-59) in July 2006.

TONIGHT'S MATCHUP: The Indianapolis Indians kick off the second half of the season at Victory Field against the Omaha Storm Chasers tonight at 7:05 PM. Indy's 42-32 record in the first half was their best since Triple-A moved to the two-halves format in 2023. Indianapolis is looking to avoid its third straight loss to Omaha since May 3, 2025 and its seventh consecutive loss against Omaha at Victory Field since May 29, 2024. Hunter Barco, MiLB's No. 87 prospect and No. 7 left-handed pitching prospect according to MLB Pipeline, is set to make his seventh Triple-A start and first career against Omaha. In four home starts this year, Barco has a 2.84 ERA (4er/12.2ip) with 16 strikeouts and has held opposing hitters to a .159 batting average (7-for-44). He will be facing off against former Indian Thomas Hatch. Hatch made his first start against Indy earlier this year, on May 2 at Omaha, and allowed six hits and four runs while striking out six in 4.2 innings of work.

ON THIS DATE IN 1974: Indians second baseman Junior Kennedy went 6-for-6 with two doubles, three RBI and three runs scored in a 15-7 win at Denver. Kennedy's six hits tied an American Association record. Center fielder Tom Spencer also smacked two home runs and had six RBI, and the Indians totaled 28 hits in the high altitude.

TONIGHT'S PITCHER

Hunter Barco: The southpaw ranks as Pittsburgh's No. 5 prospect and Minor League Baseball's No. 88 overall prospect according to MLB Pipeline.

Historic Zeroes: Barco did not allow a run in his six starts with Double-A Altoona, totaling 25.2 consecutive scoreless innings to begin the season, marking the longest scoreless streak in Curve history.

Last Outing: Barco allowed four hits, four runs, and three walks while striking out six across 3.0 innings on June 18 at Columbus.

Against the Storm Chasers: This will be Barco's first career appearance against Omaha.

EAS Pitcher of the Month: Barco was awarded the 2025 Eastern League April Pitcher of the Month Award after leading the league (min. 20ip) in ERA (0.00, 20.2ip) and batting average against (.132, 9-for-68), while ranking second in WHIP (0.63) and tied for fourth in strikeouts (30).

Mowing Them Down: Barco finished his award-winning April with back-to-back eight-strikeout starts, the last of which came in just 3.0 innings of work on April 27 at Double-A Chesapeake. He became the first Pirates full-season farmhand to strike out eight or more batters in 3.0 innings or less since Osvaldo Bido also struck out eight in 3.0 innings vs. Triple-A Louisville on Aug. 4th, 2022.

Miscellaneous: Barco was selected by the Pirates in the second round (44th overall) of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida (Gainesville).
