Indy added another run in the third via a sacrifice fly from Malcom Nuñez before Omaha strung together two hits and benefitted from a throwing error to plate two runs in the fourth inning. The Indians responded in the sixth with four hits and three runs of their own, including an RBI triple by catcher Brett Sullivan. Harold Castro cut Omaha's deficit to four with a two-run shot in the sixth inning before Jack Suwinski responded with a solo homer, his second in four grames with Indy, in the seventh frame. Omaha added three more runs in its half of the seventh, all with two outs, thanks to a pair of hit batters and a trio of RBI singles before Eddy Yean came on to get the last out of the inning and put a stop to Omaha's comeback. It was Hall's first grand slam since a walk-off blast on Sept. 22, 2024, with Lehigh Valley vs. Worcester and Indy's first grand slam since Joshua Palacios on Sept. 8, 2024, at Toledo. Hall's four-RBI performance was the best single-game total by an Indian this season. SOLAK ECLIPSE: Nick Solak continued his scorching run this season, going 1-for-4 with one RBI, one walk and one run in yesterday's game. Solak ranks among International League leaders in batting average (.386, 27-for-70, 2nd), OPS (1.058, 6th) and SLG (.629, 6th). He has reached base safely in 18 of his 19 games on the campaign and has one-plus hit in 17 of those, including a team best 13-game hitting streak from April 3-23. Solak hit .400 (20-for-50) with two doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, 11 runs, three stolen bases and a 1.056 OPS in this span. He struck out just seven times across 55 plate appearances during the hitting streak. He matched Nick Solak's 13-game hitting streak for the team's longest on-base run of the season. He is hitting .302 (16-for-53) with four doubles, three RBI, eight walks, 14 runs and five stolen bases in this span. He tallied a stolen base in four straight games during this run from April 17-22, marking his first time stringing four straight games with a steal since July 8-14, 2021, with Altoona. The four consecutive games with a steal are tied for the longest streak by an International League player this season. He has one-plus hit in four straight contests and multiple hits in back-to-back games. He has recorded one-plus hit in seven of his past eight games and 10 of the 13 games in this span. He extended his scoreless outing streak to six games, surpassing David Bednar's five straight scoreless outings for the longest run by an Indian this season. In this span, he has thrown 8.1 innings with six hits, five walks and five strikeouts. This, opposed to allowing four runs, five hits and five walks with just one strikeout in his first 2.1 innings this season. It is his longest scoreless outing streak since six consecutive from July 17-Sept. 4, 2024, with Altoona. Left-hander Nick Dombkowski is set to make his second start of the season after tossing 3.2 innings of one-run ball in his season debut on Game 2 on April 25 at St. Paul. He is 1-1 in two career games (one start) against the Storm Chasers, posting a 7.36 ERA (Ger/7.1ip) with nine hits, six walks and eight strikeouts. Dombkowski allowed four runs and three home runs across 4.1 innings in his last start against Omaha on June 1, 2024, at Victory Field. Opposite Dombkowski is right-hander Chandler Champlain, who is set to make his sixth start of the season. After allowing 15 runs in 12.1 innings across his first three starts, he has allowed just two earned runs in 6.2 innings across his previous two.
