**Aviators vs. Isotopes:** The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Athletics and '25 PCL Champions, will host the Albuquerque Isotopes, Triple-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies, tonight in game four of the six-game series in Pacific Coast League action at Las Vegas Ballpark (8,196)... Las Vegas is 2-1 in the series... the homestand against Albuquerque will conclude on Sunday afternoon... following the PCL off day on Monday, May 25, the Aviators will then embark on a Pacific Northwest road trip against the Tacoma Rainiers, Triple-A affiliate of the Seattle Mariners, from Tuesday-Sunday, May 26-31 at Cheney Stadium.

**Las Vegas defeats Albuquerque 12-1 in game three of series:** The Aviators defeated the Isotopes, 12-1, last night in game three of the six-game homestand before a crowd of 6,794 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**Las Vegas Offense:** The Aviators recorded 14 hits and stranded six runners on base. Las Vegas had four players record multiple-hit games: Third baseman **Brett Harris** was 4-for-5, 2 RBI, two runs scored. Center fielder **Cade Marlowe** was 3-for-5, two doubles, home run and 6 RBI; second baseman **Joshua Kuroda-Grauer** was 3-for-5, double, triple, RBI, three runs scored and DH **Joey Meneses** was 2-for-4, double, walk, RBI, two runs scored.

**Albuquerque Offense:** The Isotopes recorded 7 hits and stranded eight runners on base. Albuquerque scored its lone run in the ninth inning on a home run by third baseman **Vimal Machín** (2-for-4). Center fielder **Cole Carrigg** was 2-for-4.

**Aviators Starting Pitcher:** Right-hander **Kade Morris** recorded the victory with 6.0 shutout innings. He allowed 2 hits, walked 4 and struck out 6 on 86 pitches (52 strikes).

**Aviators Bullpen:** Left-hander **Matt Krook** pitched 1.0 scoreless inning, allowed 2 hits, struck out 1. RH **Elvis Alvarado** pitched 1.0 scoreless inning, allowed 1 hit, walked 1, struck out 2. RH **Nick Anderson** pitched 1.0 inning, allowed 2 hits, 1 run and struck out 2.

**Albuquerque:** In 2025, the Isotopes compiled a record of 62-87 (.416) and finished in fifth place in the PCL East Division. The Isotopes are in their 11<sup>th</sup> season as the Triple-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies.

### Game Recaps:

**Las Vegas defeats Reno 7-1 in series finale (Sunday, May 17):** The Aviators defeated the Aces, 7-1, in the finale of the Northern Nevada six-game road trip before a crowd of 4,476 at Great Nevada Field.

**Las Vegas Offense:** The Aviators recorded 14 hits and stranded 10 runners on base. Las Vegas, leading 1-0, scored six runs in the fifth inning. Four players recorded multiple-hit games: Center fielder **Brayan Buelvas** was 3-for-4, RBI, run scored. Designated hitter **Chad Wallach** was 2-for-5, double, RBI, run scored; first baseman **Joey Meneses** was 2-for-5, RBI, run scored and third baseman **Tommy White** was 2-for-5, run scored.

**Reno Offense:** The Aces recorded 6 hits and stranded eight runners on base. Second baseman **Luis Urías** was 2-for-3, two doubles, walk, run scored. Shortstop **Anderdson Rojas** was 2-for-4.

**Aviators Starting Pitcher:** Right-hander **Joey Estes** recorded the victory with a season-high 6.1 shutout innings. He allowed 3 hits, walked 2 and struck out 6 on 99 pitches (70 strikes).

**Las Vegas defeats Albuquerque 16-8 in series opener (Tuesday, May 19):** The Reyes de Plata defeated the Mariachis de Nuevo Mexico, 16-8, in the opener of the six-game homestand before a crowd of 5,599 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**Las Vegas Offense:** The Reyes de Plata recorded 17 hits and stranded eight runners on base. Las Vegas, trailing 6-1, scored 15 unanswered runs. Right fielder **Brayan Buelvas** was 3-for-4, 2 RBI, two runs scored. Catcher **Brian Serven** was 3-for-4, HBP, RBI, run scored; first baseman **Joey Meneses** was 2-for-3, HBP, walk, HR, 2 RBI, two runs scored and shortstop **Drew Swift** was 2-for-4, walk, RBI, two stolen bases, three runs scored.

**Albuquerque defeats Las Vegas 6-5 in game two of series (Wednesday, May 20):** The Isotopes defeated the Aviators, 6-5, in game two of the six-game homestand before a crowd of 5,625 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**Las Vegas Offense:** The Aviators recorded 11 hits and stranded nine runners on base. Las Vegas had four players record multiple-hit games: Center fielder **Cade Marlowe** was 2-for-5, double, RBI, run scored. Shortstop **Joshua Kuroda-Grauer** was 2-for-5, double, two runs scored; second baseman **Brett Harris** was 2-for-4, double, walk, run scored and DH **Michael Stefanic** was 2-for-4, run scored.

**Albuquerque Offense:** The Isotopes recorded 10 hits and stranded three runners on base. Albuquerque rallied from a 5-0 deficit and scored six runs in the ninth inning, highlighted by a three-run home run by second baseman **Nic Kent** (2-for-4). Third baseman **Vimael Machín** was 2-for-4, double, RBI, stolen base, run scored and shortstop **Adael Amador** was 2-for-4, double run scored.

**Aviators Starting Pitcher:** Left-hander **Gage Jump** pitched a season-high 7.0 shutout innings in the no decision. He allowed 4 hits, issued no walks and tied his season-high with 9 strikeouts on 88 pitches (61 strikes).

**AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS** – Las Vegas is 2-1 in the series...the six-game homestand against the Albuquerque Isotopes, Triple-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies, will conclude on Sunday afternoon...Albuquerque and Las Vegas will play each other a total of 12 times in '26... following the homestand, the Aviators will then embark to the Pacific Northwest and face the Tacoma Rainiers, Triple-A affiliate of the Seattle Mariners, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, May 26-31... **the first-half of the '26 campaign will conclude on Sunday, June 21 vs. Round Rock**...the 2026 season will feature six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday and off days on Mondays...the '26 campaign will now feature 148 games (75-home; 73-away)...150-game campaign has been scheduled for the fifth consecutive season (2022 – present).

**2026 PCL PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Right-hander **Mason Barnett** from April 20-26...defeated Salt Lake on April 25 at Las Vegas Ballpark...5.0 shutout innings, one hit, walked two, seven strikeouts on 72 pitches (44 strikes).

**2026 PCL PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Outfielder **Henry Bolte** from May 4-10...appeared in six games against St. Paul and batted .556 (15-for-27) with four doubles, one triple, five home runs and 9 RBI, including a franchise record 12 consecutive hits (May 7-8-9) and tied the PCL record.

**43<sup>rd</sup> SEASON IN THE SILVER STATE (1983-2026)** – The Aviators are playing in their 43<sup>rd</sup> season (44<sup>th</sup> calendar season) in the Silver State as a proud member of the Pacific Coast League...**the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being Nevada's longest enduring professional sports franchise**...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8)...catcher **Bruce Bochy** has the distinction of hitting the first Triple-A home run in Cashman Field history for the Las Vegas Stars on April 10, 1983.

**PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE:** The PCL is in its 123<sup>rd</sup> season (1903-2020, 2022 -) and consists of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **West Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **East Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Comets, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys. The 10-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A West and returned as the PCL in 2022!

**INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE:** The IL consists of two divisions for a total of 20 teams. **East Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Norfolk Tides, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **West Division:** Columbus Clippers, Gwinnett Stripers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. The 20-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A East and returned as the IL in 2022.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY IN 2026:** The Aviators, for the second straight season, will play opponents from the IL. Las Vegas will host the St. Paul Saints, Triple-A affiliate of the Minnesota Twins, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, May 5-10 at Las Vegas Ballpark. Las Vegas will then travel to Omaha, Nebraska to face the Omaha Storm Chasers, Triple-A affiliate of the Kansas City Royals, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, June 9-14.

**2025 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 83-67 (.553) and finished in second place in the PCL West Division. Las Vegas won the first half with a 49-26 record (.653) and Tacoma won the second half. The Aviators then defeated the Rainiers, 2-games-to-0, in the LCS at Las Vegas Ballpark to capture its third PCL championship in franchise history (1986, 1988, 2025). Las Vegas then lost to the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp (International League champions), Triple-A affiliate of the Miami Marlins, 8-7, in the **Triple-A National Championship Game** on September 27 before the sellout crowd of 10,129 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**2024 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 74-75 (.497) and finished in fourth place in the PCL West Division. The Tacoma Rainiers captured the West Division with an overall record of 82-68 (.547). Sugar Land Space Cowboys recorded the best record in the 30-team Triple-A (93-56, .624) and defeated the Reno Aces, 2-games-to-0, to capture the PCL Championship. Sugar Land then defeated the Omaha Storm Chasers, Triple-A affiliate of the Kansas

City Royals, 13-6, in the **Triple-A National Championship** game on September 28 before a crowd of 8,007 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS** – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a seven six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **83** (83-67, .553 in 2025); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563)... Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

**LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY:** Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH) then-owner announced on **October 10, 2017** its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on **Friday, February 23, 2018** before a crowd of several hundred people!

The 8,196-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark provides a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall.

Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site is landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites.

The grand opening took place on **Tuesday, April 9, 2019** before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

**LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION HISTORY:** Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH), then-owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of the Pacific Coast League, and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on **December 8, 2018** the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51<sup>st</sup>) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

#### **AVIATORS LOGO DESIGN AND CONCEPT:**

The color inspiration: the Las Vegas Sunset; the mountain range featured in the Aviators' sunglasses resemble the mountain range found in the Summerlin logo!

#### **SOUTHERN NEVADA AVIATION HISTORY:**

**Nevada's High-Flying Aviators (from UNLV News)** - Nevada has a rich history in Aviation; with 500 miles between the state's two largest cities (Reno and Las Vegas), aviation was ideal for Nevada.

**Aviation History in Las Vegas (from Harry Reid Airport)** - Aviation grew exponentially throughout the 1900s, bringing more and more travelers to our city.

Nellis Air Force Base (in Las Vegas) is "Home of the Fighter Pilot" and home to the United States Air Force Warfare Center - the largest and most demanding advanced air combat training mission in the world. Crews do not come to learn how to fly, but instead how to be the **best combat aviators in the world**.

#### **SEAPORT ENTERTAINMENT GROUP COMPLETES SEPARATION FROM HOWARD HUGHES HOLDINGS**

**NEW YORK, NY (AUGUST 1, 2024) – Seaport Entertainment Group Inc.** (NYSE American: SEG) (the “Seaport Entertainment Group” or “Company”), a newly formed company positioned at the intersection of entertainment and real estate, announced that it has completed its previously announced separation (the “Separation”) from its predecessor **Howard Hughes Holdings Inc.** (NYSE: HHH) (“Howard Hughes”) and is now an independent, standalone publicly traded company. The Company began its common stock trading (August 1) on the NYSE American LLC under the ticker symbol SEG.

Seaport Entertainment Group’s portfolio is anchored by the historic Seaport neighborhood in Lower Manhattan, which includes 478,000 square feet of primarily retail, restaurant and entertainment offerings, the 3,500-person concert venue on The Rooftop at Pier 17, a mixed-use development site at 250 Water Street, and the Tin Building by Jean-Georges, an immersive culinary marketplace. The Company’s portfolio also includes **Las Vegas Ballpark in downtown Summerlin, NV; the Las Vegas Aviators, the Triple-A Minor League Baseball Affiliate of the Athletics;** a 25% ownership interest in Jean-Georges Restaurants; and an interest in and to 80% of the air rights above the Fashion Show mall in Las Vegas.

**Aviators on Radio in 2026:** Russ Langer will broadcast the 148 games on **Raider Nation Radio 920 AM** (selected games on **Fox Sports 1340 AM** and **98.9 FM**) on [www.aviatorslv.com](http://www.aviatorslv.com). Langer is in his 26<sup>th</sup> season broadcasting baseball to the Las Vegas Valley and 39<sup>th</sup> year overall in the business....over his career, Langer has received numerous awards, including being named 1993 Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues....in 1995 and 2016, he broadcast the Triple-A All-Star game; in 1999, he was named the New Mexico Sportscaster of the Year; and in 2002, he was named Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by Minor League News.com...Langer also is a 12-time recipient (13 overall and seven consecutive years from 2007-13) of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2021, 2023), which is presented by the National Sports Media Association (NSMA)...Langer's inaugural season in Las Vegas was in 2000, the final year the franchise was known as the Stars...prior to arriving in Las Vegas, Langer called Pacific Coast League games for the Albuquerque Dukes (1996-99) and Phoenix Firebirds (1992-95)...began his broadcasting career with Single-A Springfield Cardinals in 1987 and 1989, sandwiched around a year in Vero Beach (1988)...moved up the ranks to Double-A, calling games for the Midland Angels in 1990 and '91 before advancing to Triple-A Phoenix...he realized his longtime goal of broadcasting Major League baseball when he worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and

2004 seasons, followed by nine games for the Baltimore Orioles in 2006...has also broadcast selected spring training games for the Los Angeles Dodgers (2006-08), Toronto Blue Jays (2009-10) and Chicago White Sox (2012-20)...in 2023, he broadcast his 3,000th game for Triple-A Las Vegas and completed his 12th season as the radio play-by-play voice for the UNLV football team on the UNLV Sports Properties/Learfield Network (2012-23)...was named the radio play-by-play broadcaster for the New Mexico State University men's basketball team for the 2025-26 season.

#### **Aviators Manager Fran Riordan - \*\*2019 & 2023 & 2025 PCL Manager of the Year\*\***

He was named the 25<sup>th</sup> manager (November 8, 2018) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983-2019, 2021-24, 42 seasons). **Career Summary (current):** He has recorded 26 seasons (entering 2026) overall in professional baseball and has been a member of the Athletics organization for 11 seasons (2015-25).

Riordan has compiled an overall managerial regular season record (**current**) over 25 seasons of 1,417-1,359 (.510). He enters the '26 season ranked eighth among active leaders in minor league managerial wins.
