CIRCLE CITY ROUNDUP

ABOUT SUNDAY: The Indianapolis Indians battled back from an early deficit and traded runs with the Gwinnett Strippers throughout the entire contest but managed to take Sunday afternoon's series finale at Victory Field, 6-5. With the contest knotted at 5-5 in the eighth inning, Brett Sullivan led off the frame with his second double of the day to spark Indy's offense. Alike Williams reached on a bunt single which advanced Sullivan to third, setting him up to score the game-winning run on a groundout from Tsung-Che Cheng. The Indians found themselves in an early 2-0 hole within the first four pitches of the game thanks to back-to-back homers from Jared Kelenic and Luke Waddell. The Strippers kept their foot on the gas, adding another run in the second on a sacrifice fly from Cody Milligan, but the Indians battled back in their half of the frame. Jared Triolo started the second-inning rally with a walk and scored the first Indians run on an Alike Williams single. Cheng also drew a walk to load the bases for Indy and Ronny Simon immediately followed with a 405-foot, two-run double to tie the game. The next batter, Billy Cook, reached on an error, which scored Cheng and granted Indy a 4-3 lead. The two teams traded runs before the game-deciding inning. Gwinnett loaded the bases in the fourth and scored on a wild pitch to knot the game at four. Nick Solak responded with an opposite-field solo home run to retake the lead in the sixth inning before the Strippers strung together a double and a single in the sixth to tie the contest once again. Eddy Yean, one of six Indians arms used in relief of Thomas Harrington, earned the win after tossing a scoreless eighth and Kyle Nicolas earned his second straight save in as many appearances with a clean ninth. José Ruiz took his second loss of the series for Gwinnett after allowing the game-winning run in the eighth.

CARDIAC KIDS: Indianapolis earned their 24th comeback win of the season on Sunday, taking down the Strippers, 6-5. Through July 13th, it marks their most comeback wins since 26 of them to the date in 2014. Additionally, Indy improved to 20-7 in one-run contests in 2025. The Indians earned their eighth walk-off of the season on July 9, their best single-season total since eight of them across all of 2022. It is their most through July 9 since eight of them through May 19 in 2001. July 9 was the first time this season Indianapolis claimed victory when trailing after the 8th inning (1-25).

YOU KNOW WHY THEY CALL IT VICTORY FIELD: Indianapolis improved to 38-13 at Victory Field this season, boasting a home winning percentage of .745, their best start at home since at least 2005. Their 2025 mark is the best home record in Triple-A and second best of full-season minor league teams. The Indians have won 28 of their 35 home games since May 11 and 36 of their last 45 dating back to April 16, which are the most home wins in MiLB in these spans.

SOLAK ECLIPSE: Nick Solak (2-for-3, HR, BB) launched his 10th home run of the season on Sunday, extending his team-best on-base streak to 26 games, which is the third-longest active run in the International League. It is the longest on-base stretch by an Indian since Jake Lamb's season-best 27-game streak from April 18-May 27, 2024. Solak is hitting .333 (33-for-99) with 21 runs, five doubles, three home runs, 13 RBI, 15 walks, two stolen bases and a .902 OPS in this stretch. He has hit safely in 23 of those 26 games, with a team-high tying 14 game hitting streak from June 12 (1)-27. He owns honors as the IL's top hitter with a .360 batting average (81-for-225) for the season. As the Indians lone representative on the league offensive leaderboard, he also ranks among qualifiers in on-base percentage (2nd, .432), OPS (3rd, .988) and slugging percentage (6th, .556). His 20 multi-hit games on the campaign lead the team.

SUPER SAIYAN SIMON: Ronny Simon (1-for-5, 2B, 2 RBI) has reached base safely in 26 of his last 27 games since June 11, including a 20-game on-base run from June 11-July 5, and has hit safely in 21 of those 27. In this 27-game span, he is hitting .283 (30-for-106) with 20 runs, seven doubles, five home runs, 18 RBI, 18 walks, 14 stolen bases and an .877 OPS.

BAEWATCH: Ji Hwan Bae led the Indians offense in last week's series, hitting .421 (8-for-19) with two runs, one double, two triples, six RBI, one walk, four stolen bases and a 1.093 OPS in five games. He has driven in one-plus run in five straight games, tied with teammate Tsung-Che Cheng for the longest active streak in the International League. It is Bae's longest RBI streak since a five-game run with Indy to conclude the 2024 season from Sept. 17-22. He has hit safely in 10 of his past 12 games and has multi-hit performances in four of his last six contests. Since returning from the 7-day injured list on June 27, he is hitting .353 (18-for-51) with 10 runs, one double, two triples, eight RBI, five walks, six stolen bases and an .848 OPS in 13 games.

BUCCO BORUCKI: LHP Ryan Borucki had his rehab assignment transferred from Low-A Bradenton to Indianapolis on Friday last week. He made one rehab appearance with Bradenton on July 8, tossing a scoreless inning with one strikeout before being transferred to Indianapolis. He is one of eight rehabbers assigned to Indy on nine separate stints this season. He was placed on the 15-day injured list on June 21 with low back inflammation after going 1-3 with a 5.26 ERA (15er/25.2ip) in 29 appearances with Pittsburgh. The reliever has made 22 appearances with Indianapolis since joining the Pirates organization, logging a 2.49 ERA (6er/21.2ip) and 28 strikeouts. 19 of his outings with Indy have been scoreless and he has not allowed a hit in 13 of those.

TODAY'S MATCHUP: The Indianapolis Indians open play after the All-Star break with a three-game road series against the Nashville Sounds, Triple-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers. The Indians won four of six games against the Sounds at Victory Field earlier this season, capturing their first series win over the club since the teams resumed play in 2021. RHP Bubba Chandler takes the mound for the Indians, set to make his league-leading 19th start of the season. Chandler has thrown back-to-back starts with 6.0 shutout innings. He has thrown 15.0 consecutive scoreless innings dating back to the first inning of his June 28 start vs. Omaha, the longest scoreless innings streak by an Indian this season. In 12 night games this year, he is 4-0 with a 1.44 ERA (9er/56.1ip) and 70 strikeouts. Chandler tossed 5.0 shutout frames with eight strikeouts against the Sounds on May 30 this season at Victory Field. Tonight marks his third career start against the club. Opposite Chandler is LHP Nestor Cortes, who joins the Sounds on an MLB rehab assignment. It is his second appearance with them this season, tossing 3.0 shutout innings on July 2 vs. Memphis. He has made two career appearances against the Indians, highlighted by a 7.0-inning, one-run complete game on Aug. 15, 2018 (2), with Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

ON THIS DATE IN 2015: Keon Broxton and Willy Garcia went a combined 6-for-10 and drove in five runs in the Indians 12-1 win vs. Toledo. Broxton and Garcia, the No. 2 and 3 hitters, respectively, each went 3-for-5 with two runs scored. Angel Sanchez improved to 4-1 on the season after tossing 6.0 one-run innings, his only run allowed coming via a first-inning home run. Brad Lincoln entered in the seventh inning and earned a save after tossing 3.0 two-hit innings.

TONIGHT'S PITCHER

Bubba Chandler: Right-hander Bubba Chandler is currently rated the No. 5 overall prospect in Minor League Baseball according to MLB Pipeline and is the Pirates No. 1. In 25 career starts with Indianapolis, Chandler is 8-2 with a 2.48 ERA (31er/112.2ip) and 147 strikeouts. He has struck out eight-plus batters in eight of those starts and six-plus in 15.

Last Outing: Chandler earned his fourth win of the season on July 10 vs. Gwinnett, tossing 6.0 shutout frames with five hits, two walks and seven strikeouts. He has tossed 15.0 consecutive scoreless frames dating back to the first inning of his June 28 start vs. Omaha, the longest scoreless innings streak by an Indian this season.

Against the Sounds: Chandler is 1-0 in two career starts against the Sounds and has not allowed a run in 12.0 innings against the club. He has surrendered just six hits and two walks with 14 strikeouts in those two starts. He tossed 5.0 shutout innings in a no-decision against the Sounds on May 30 at Victory Field this season.

IL Pitcher of the Month: Chandler was named the 2025 International League April Pitcher of the Month after he led all minor league pitchers with at least 20.0 innings in fewest hits allowed (7) and batting average against (.106, 7-for-66). He is the first Indianapolis Indians pitcher to win a league monthly award since Zach Duke in May 2005. He went 1-0 with a 1.33 ERA (3er/20.1ip), 27 strikeouts and a 0.64 WHIP across five starts in the month. In addition to his minor league leading marks, he led IL pitchers with at least 20.0 innings in WHIP and finished third in ERA.

IL Pitcher of the Week: Chandler was named the International League Pitcher of the Week for Aug. 5-11, 2024, after tossing 7.0 shutout innings with two hits, one walk and six strikeouts while he secured the win.

Miscellaneous: Selected by Pittsburgh in the third round (72nd overall) of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of North Oconee (Bogart, GA.) High School. He was selected to the 2024 All-Star Futures Game and struck out Royals prospect Gavin Cross.
