ABOUT LAST NIGHT: [The Wisconsin Timber Rattlers beat the Beloit Snappers 9-5 in ten innings in the first game at ABC Supply Stadium.](#) The Rattlers rallied from a 5-0 deficit with five runs in the sixth inning and four runs in the top of the tenth. Joe Gray Jr. drove in four runs and three relievers pitched 5-2/3 scoreless innings for Wisconsin.

THAT'S A COMEBACK: Beloit starting pitcher Zach King retired the first sixteen Timber Rattlers batters he faced. That streak ended on a walk to Nick Kahle in the sixth inning. Wisconsin had two outs with a runner at first in the sixth inning when Korry Howell broke up the no-hit bid with a single. That started a streak of six straight Wisconsin hitters to reach base. Gray drove in the first two runs with a single. Thomas Dillard's RBI single made it 5-3. LG Castillo's two-run single tied the game.

THE EXTRA MILE: Wisconsin broke the 5-5 tie in the top of the tenth. Antonio Piñero broke the tie with an RBI single. A balk allowed the second run of the inning. Gray drove in the last two runs with a double. Last night was the Rattlers first win of an extra-inning game this year. They are 1-5 in extra innings this season.

COME ON BACK: Wisconsin's largest comeback this season prior to last night was when they rallied from 4-0 down to defeat the Quad Cities River Bandits in the first game of a doubleheader on July 7.

ABOUT БЕЛОИТ: The Beloit Snappers are in their first season as an affiliate of the Miami Marlins. Beloit started as the Beloit Brewers in 1982 as the Midwest League affiliate of Milwaukee. They changed their name to the Beloit Snappers for the 1995 season. The Snappers affiliation with Milwaukee ended after the 2004 season. They were affiliated with the Minnesota Twins (2005-2012) and the Oakland Athletics (2013-2019) over their final seasons in the Midwest League. The Snappers said "Goodbye" to Pohlman Field on July 11 and [moved into ABC Supply Stadium on August 3.](#) Mike Jacobs is in his first season as the manager of the Snappers. Jacobs managed the Clinton LumberKings in 2019, Clinton's last year as an affiliate of the Marlins.

ABOUT THE MARLINS: The Florida/Miami Marlins had a history in the old Midwest League. The Marlins' first Low-A affiliate was the Kane County Cougars from 1993 through 2002. Josh Beckett, Adrian Gonzalez, Dontrelle Willis, Miguel Cabrera, and current Timber Rattlers manager Matt Erickson all played for the Cougars in that timespan. The Marlins returned to the Midwest League in 2019 to affiliate with the Clinton LumberKings and went 78-61 to qualify for the playoffs. They were swept by the South Bend Cubs in the 2019 MWL Championship Series.

PROSPECTING IN THE SERIES: [MLB Pipeline](#) puts five Rattlers on their list of Brewers Top 30 Prospects: Carlos Rodríguez (#14), Hayden Cantrelle (#16), Nick Kahle (#19), Thomas Dillard (#21), and Joe Gray Jr. (#30). [MLB Pipeline](#) has three current Snappers on their list of Miami prospects: Kameron Misner (#13), Connor Scott (#14), and Will Banfield (#25).

WISCONSIN SCHEDULED STARTING PITCHER:

RHP JOEY MATULOVICH: Selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 20th round of the 2018 draft out of the University of California, Berkeley.

A BEAR: Matulovich was 6-5 with a 3.79 ERA in 57 games – nineteen starts – over three seasons at Cal. He had 121 strikeouts over 163-2/3 innings pitched in his collegiate career. Matulovich was teammates with current Wisconsin reliever Arman Sabouri at Cal in 2017 and 2018.

ALL-STATE: Matulovich went 9-1 with 110 strikeouts as a senior at San Ramon Valley High School in Danville, California and was an All-State selection in 2015

I WOULD HAVE LIKE TO HAVE SEEN MONTANA: Matulovich began his professional career with the Helena Brewers in the Pioneer League in 2018. He was 3-2 with a 2.75 ERA in twelve games – two starts – for Helena. He walked fourteen and struck out 49 over 36 innings pitched.

IN 2019: Matulovich split time between the AZL Brewers Gold and the Timber Rattlers in 2019. He was 0-3 in eight games – six starts – in the AZL. Matulovich joined Wisconsin on August 1, 2019 and was 1-2 in nine relief appearances. He compiled a 5.57 ERA and 45 strikeouts over 32-1/3 innings in his two stops in the Brewers system in 2019.

MUDCAT: Matulovich started this season with the Carolina Mudcats in the Low-A East. He was 2-0 with a save in sixteen games – two starts – with 56 strikeouts and 21 walks in 40 innings.

LAST START: Matulovich won his 2021 Timber Rattlers debut on [July 29 in a start against the Cedar Rapids Kernels at home](#). He allowed five hits, walked none, and struck out four over five scoreless innings.

VS. MARLINS: Matulovich has never faced the Snappers. He pitched twice against the Clinton LumberKings in 2019 when they were the Midwest League affiliate of the Miami Marlins. He allowed four unearned runs on four hits – including two homers – with five strikeouts over 3-1/3 innings as he was 0-1 in those two relief appearances.

BELOIT STARTING PITCHER:

LHP ANTONIO VELEZ: Signed with the Miami Marlins as a non-drafted free agent on July 9, 2020.

THE HILLS OF FLORIDA: Velez pitched for Hillsborough Community College before attending Florida State. He was 4-4 with 80 strikeouts in 14 appearances for Hillsborough.

FSU: Velez pitched two seasons with the Seminoles. He was 5-2 with a save and a 4.17 ERA as a junior in 2019. Velez was 1-0 with three walks and 21 strikeouts in 17-1/3 innings pitched during his shortened 2020 season.

AWARD (COLLEGE): Velez was named the Collegiate Baseball National Pitcher of the Week for his performance in a win over Florida on March 10, 2020. Velez allowed one hit, walked two, and struck out seven over six scoreless innings in a 2-0 victory over the #1 Gators. That would be his final game with Florida State.

ON TO PUERTO RICO: Velez made two starts for Mayaguez in Puerto Rico during December, 2020. He was 1-0 with a 6.00 ERA, one walk, and four strikeouts over nine innings in those two starts during winter ball.

AWARD (PRO): Velez was named the High-A Central League Pitcher of the Week on June 28 for his two starts against Quad Cities in the prior week. He was 1-0 as he pitched ten innings, allowed no runs on two hits, walked one and struck out seven. Velez faced one batter over the minimum in those two starts.

LAST START: Velez had a no decision [at Peoria on July 29](#). He allowed one run on four hits with no walks and six strikeouts over eight innings.

VS. WISCONSIN: Velez has made three relief appearances against the Timber Rattlers in 2021. He has allowed seven runs on nine hits with a walk and eight strikeouts over 9-1/3 innings pitched against the Rattlers this season. Velez was the winning pitcher [on May 9 at Wisconsin](#) with no decisions in his other two appearances against them.

THIS DATE IN APPLETON BASEBALL HISTORY

PAPERMAKERS (1940-1952)/BRAVES (1953): On August 4, 1952, the Papermakers beat Oshkosh 6-0 in game one of a doubleheader on the road.
