ABOUT LAST NIGHT: [The Quad Cities River Bandits beat the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers 17-5 at Neuroscience Group Field at Fox Cities Stadium.](#)

The Bandits had a 4-2 lead after six innings. Then, they scored five runs in the seventh, three runs in the eighth, and five runs in the ninth to pull away from Wisconsin. Quad Cities collected 20 hits in the game. The Rattlers set season highs for runs allowed and hits allowed in a single game last night.

TWO-OUT BLUES: The River Bandits scored ten of their 17 runs with two outs in an inning. They scored three runs in the first and a run in the second with two outs to take a 4-0 lead. Four of their five runs in the seventh inning occurred after two outs. Two of the three runs in the eighth happened on a two-out double by Will Hancock.

LENDING AN ARM: Nick Kahle became the second Timber Rattlers position player to pitch in a game. Kahle entered the game in the top of the ninth and retired all three batters he faced.

ALL GOOD THINGS COME TO AN END: Brady Schanuel allowed an inherited runner to score for the first time this season when he let in a runner in the seventh inning last night. Schanuel has inherited sixteen runners this season and only one has scored.

DILLY, DILLY! Thomas Dillard hit his ninth home run of the season last night. It was a two-run home run in the eighth inning. Dillard is tied for the team lead in homers with Korry Howell. Dillard has 48 RBI this season and is second in the High-A Central League behind Griffin Conine of Beloit, who has 50 RBI. Last night was Dillard's thirteenth multi-RBI game.

MULTI-BALL: Kekai Rios had two hits, a walk, a run scored, and an RBI last night. Rios had his first multi-hit game of the season last night.

ABOUT QUAD CITIES: The River Bandits are the High-A Central League affiliate of the Kansas City Royals. The current version of Davenport Professional Baseball club started in 1960 as the Midwest League affiliate of the Milwaukee Braves. Quad Cities has affiliated with several MLB teams over the years: The California Angels (1962-1978 and 1985-1992), the Chicago Cubs (1979-1984), the Houston Astros (1993-1998 and 2013-2019), the Minnesota Twins (1999-2004), and the St. Louis Cardinals (2005-2012). The team became the Quad City River Bandits in 1992. They changed their name to the Swing of the Quad Cities from 2004 through 2007 before changing to Quad Cities River Bandits in 2008. Quad Cities won Midwest League pennants in 1968, 1971, 1979, 1990, 2011, 2013, and 2017. Notable alumni of Quad Cities: Carlos Correa, Joe Mauer, Josh Hader, Lance Lynn, Carlos Martinez, Billy Wagner, Shawon Dunston, Justin Morneau, and Brett Phillips. Modern Woodmen Park, which opened as Municipal Stadium on May 26, 1931. The stadium was renamed as John O'Donnell Stadium in 1971. The stadium was remodeled after the 2003 season and was renamed Modern Woodmen Park for the 2007.

ABOUT THE ROYALS: The Kansas City Royals return to what used of to be the Midwest League after leaving Kane County at the end of the 2012 season. They had previously been in the Midwest League with Waterloo from 1969-1976. Other Midwest League teams the Royals had as an affiliate: Appleton (1987-1992), Rockford (1993-94), Springfield (1995), Lansing (1996-1998), Burlington (2001-2010), and Kane County (2011-2012). The Royals had worked with Lexington in the South Atlantic League as the Low-A affiliate from 2013-2019. Wilmington had been the High-A affiliate of the Royals from 2007-2019.

PITCHING MATCHUP

WISCONSIN SCHEDULED RELIEVER:

RHP ZACH MORT: Signed with Milwaukee as a Minor League Free Agent on January 14, 2021.

ORIGIN STORY: Mort was drafted by the Chicago Cubs in the 8th round of the 2018 draft out of George Mason University.

PATRIOTIC DUTY: Mort appeared in 57 games – 28 starts – over three seasons at George Mason. He went 12-12 with nine saves and a 3.72 ERA and 205 strikeouts over 227-1/3 innings pitched during his collegiate career.

IN THE CUBS DEN: Mort spent two seasons (2018 and 2019) in the Cubs organization after signing with them. He made ten relief appearances (0-4, 5.79) with the Eugene Emeralds in 2018. In 2019, Mort started the season with the South Bend Cubs in the Midwest League, was sent back to Eugene in the middle of June, and returned to South Bend in early August. Mort was 3-3 with a 3.72 ERA in Eugene and 6-2 with a 3.13 ERA for South Bend.

POSTSEASON: Mort was the winning pitcher in Game One of the Midwest League Championship Series against the [Clinton LumberKings on September 11, 2019](#). Mort went three scoreless innings, allowed one hit and two walks with four strikeouts as a reliever. The South Bend Cubs went on to sweep the best-of-five series from Clinton.

LAST APPEARANCE: Mort pitched in relief [at Beloit on July 2](#). H allowed four runs on two hits with a walk and two strikeouts in two innings and took the loss.

LAST START: Mort made the start in the second game of the doubleheader against the Peoria Chiefs [on June 27 at Neuroscience Group Field](#). He allowed four runs on six hits – including two home runs – with no walks and three strikeouts over 1-2/3 innings. Mort was not involved in the decision. The Timber Rattlers would win the game 6-5.

VS. QUAD CITIES (2021): Mort lost [at Quad Cities on June 19 as the starting pitcher](#). He allowed five runs on eight hits with three walks, three strikeouts, and two homers allowed in 4-1/3 innings.

QUAD CITIES STARTING PITCHER:

RHP CHARLIE NEUWEILER: The Royals selected Neuweiler in the 5th round of the 2017 draft out of Monsignor McClancy Memorial High School in East Elmhurst, New York.

A TREE DOESN'T GROW IN BROOKLYN: Neuweiler signed with the Royals over a commitment to LIU-Brooklyn.

DOWN IN THE DESERT: Neuweiler went 3-3 for the AZL Royals after signing with Kansas City. He appeared in twelve games – five starts – had an ERA of 1.76 and recorded 34 strikeouts over 41 innings pitched.

SPLIT SEASON: Neuweiler made two starts for Burlington in the Appalachian League and eleven starts for Lexington in the South Atlantic League in 2018. He was 2-4 with a 5-70ERA at those two stops in the Royals system.

WE COULD BE LEGENDS: Neuweiler pitched all of 2019 with Lexington and was 7-10 with a 4.36 ERA in 27 starts during the regular season. He allowed three runs in 4-2/3 innings and took the loss in his lone playoff start during the 2019 postseason.

LAST START: Neuweiler pitched four scoreless innings for the [AZL Royals-Blue on June 28, 2021 against the AZL Rangers](#). He allowed three hits, walked none, and struck out five for a no decision.

VS. WISCONSIN: Neuweiler has never faced the Timber Rattlers prior to this evening. He made two appearances – one start – against the AZL Brewers in 2017. He had no record, allowed two unearned runs on two hits with one walk and two strikeouts over six innings.
