SILENT SUCCESS: Jeisson Rosario has gone hitless in each of his last five games, (0-for-9) his longest stretch without a hit this season. In spite of this, he has a .471 OBP over this period, having been on base eight times (6 BB, 2 HBP) and walking in five straight games. Rosario now ranks 3rd in Eastern League OBP (.378).

MVP CAMPAIGN: With his six total bases in Friday night's game, Anthony Volpe has moved into the top 10 in Eastern League slugging for the first time this year (.474, 8th). In his last at-bat, Volpe smacked his 30th double of the year, now tying him for 1st place in the league. In total this season, Volpe now ranks top-10 in nine stat categories, top-5 in five and top-3 in four: 30 2B (T-1st), 43 SB (2nd), 69 R (2nd), 51 XBH (2nd), 193 TB (4th), 57 BB (5th), .474 SLG (8th), 101 H (T-9th) and 103 H (9th).

STRIKING PACE: Somerset's pitching staff has racked up 13+ strikeouts each of the last three days (13, 20, 16). Their 49 combined strikeouts over this stretch of three games are the most by any team in MiLB over that span. The Patriots pitching staff has struck out 253 batters this month, 3rd-most in MiLB. **BOMBS AWAY:** The Somerset Patriots' next home run will break a franchise record, as they enter today with 175 on the season (in 117 games) matching last year's franchise record mark of 175 home runs, in two fewer games. Including today's game, the Patriots have 20 games left this season to set the new mark. RHP #18 CLAYTON BEETER

CAREER: (0-9, 4.59 ERA, 104.0 IP, 166 K, 1.38 WHIP)

HT-WT: 6'2" | 220 **DOB**: 10/9/98 (23)

PITCH SELECTION: Fastball (93-96), Curveball (mid-80s)

- Beeter identifies himself as a power pitcher, who pitches almost exclusively with his fastball and curveball. His fastball sits 93-95 and tops out at 98 with ride through the top of the strike zone, while his curveball is a high-spin, top-to-bottom offering in the mid 80s that drops below the zone to induce most of his swings and misses. Beeter also very rarely utilizes a low-80s changeup with some sink and fade and used to throw a mid-80s slider that he stopped implementing when he was with the Dodgers.

- Beeter was acquired by the Yankees from the Dodgers hours before the 2022 MLB trade deadline on August 2. At the time of the trade, Beeter was ranked the Dodgers' No. 15 prospect per MLB Pipeline and No. 21 by Baseball America, which credited him with having the Best Curveball in the Dodgers MiLB system. Growing up in Fort Worth, TX, Beeter was a Texas Rangers fan, who grew up watching Joey Gallo. Upon being traded to the Yankees, he was ranked MLB Pipeline's No. 10 Yankees prospect and Baseball America's No. 16 Yankees prospect.

- Beeter made his pro debut in 2021 and posted a 3.44 ERA between High-A Great Lakes and Double-A Tulsa, but he mostly worked as an opener, throwing no more than 3.1 innings in an outing.
- Initially drafted by the Dodgers in Competitive Balance Round-B of the 2020 MLB Draft (pick 66 overall), Beeter signed for an over-slot amount of \$1,196,500. He was drafted out of Texas Tech, where he redshirted his freshman year. In his redshirt freshman year as the Red Raiders' closer in 2019, Beeter led Texas Tech to be 2019 College World Series semifinalists behind 21 appearances with an 0-3 record, 3.48 ERA, 8 saves and 40 K compared to 20 BB in 20.2 IP. During the Covid-shortened 2020 season, his redshirt-sophomore year, Beeter became Texas Tech's Friday night starter. In 4 GS, he went 2-1 with a 2.14 ERA and 33 K compared to 4 BB in 21.0 IP, before the season came to an end.

- Attending Birdville High School in Colleyville, Texas, Beeter had Tommy John surgery in high school during December of 2017, as well as a follow-up arthroscopic elbow procedure seven months later. As a senior in high school, he earned first-team All-District honors with an ERA of 0.81 and 106 strikeouts in 55 innings pitched. At the plate, he had a batting average of .417 with two home runs. A two-sport athlete, Beeter also lettered in football three years during high school.

COACHING STAFF



DAN FIORITO ★ MANAGER

Born and raised in Yonkers, NY, Dan Fiorito enters his sixth season with the Yankees organization and his first as Somerset's manager. Fiorito is also the Yankees' Roving Upper Level IF/OF Instructor. He served as the manager of High-A Hudson Valley in 2021, after making his managerial debut in 2019 with the GCL Yankees East. Fiorito also had been slated to manage the Yankees' former short-season Single-A affiliate, Staten Island in 2020,

before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He served as the defensive coach at the Yankees' former Single-A Charleston affiliate in 2018, after making his professional coaching debut as defensive coach with the Yankees' former Rookie-level Pulaski affiliate in 2017.

His playing career began when he was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent in 2012. Over four seasons as an infielder in the Yankees system, he batted .240 (264-for-1102) with 107 runs, 52 doubles, six triples, seven home runs and 98 RBI in 322 career minor league games. Most notably, Volpe hit his 10th homer of the season on the final day of the first half. In a situation where the winner of the game would win the first half of the season and punch its ticket to the playoffs, Volpe drew a bases loaded HBP to give the Patriots their first lead of the game (1-0 in the 7th inning). After the game went to extras tied at 4-4, Volpe led off the 10th inning with a walkoff two-run home run to give Somerset a 6-5 victory vs. Hartford to clinch the Somerset Patriots' first playoff berth since becoming the Yankees' Double-A affiliate. On 7/16, Volpe represented both the Yankees and Patriots at Dodger Stadium as one of the Yankees' three representatives at the MLB All-Star Futures Game (he went 0-for-2). Volpe was joined on the American League team by former high school teammate, RHP Jack Leiter and 2022 Patriots teammate, LHP Ken Waldichuk.

 The 2021 season was Volpe's second professional season and his first at the full-season level. He worked his way up from Single-A Tampa
- (54 games) to High-A Hudson Valley (55 games), totaling 109 games and combining to slash .294/.423/.604 with 113 R, 86 RBI, 33 SB and 27 HR. He led all minor leaguers in runs (113), ranked second in OPS (1.027) and third in extra-base hits (68). Volpe led all Yankees minor leaguers in 2021 in OPS (1.027), OBP (.423), SLG (.604), R (113), BB (78), XBH (68) and 2B (35). Ranked second in RBI (86) and third in HR (27) and H (121).
- In his pro debut season (2019), mononucleosis limited him to 34 games, hitting .215 for Rookie-level Pulaski.
- Volpe was drafted by the Yankees with the 30th overall pick (first round) of the 2019 MLB Draft out of high school, when he signed for \$2,740,000 after attending the Delbarton School in Morristown, NJ (16 miles from TD Bank Ballpark). Prior to being drafted, Volpe had committed to play college baseball at Vanderbilt with his former Delbarton School teammate, Jack Leiter, who went on to be the 2021 No. 2 overall pick in the draft by the Texas Rangers.
- One of Anthony's long-time baseball mentors is Somerset Patriots legend Travis Anderson (from the Atlantic League era), who hit a Championship Series-clinching walk-off home run in the bottom of the ninth inning of a tie game to win the 2008 APBL Championship Series. Travis was Volpe's coach when he was 12-years-old, playing for the Diamond Jacks Super 12U team.
- Born and raised in Watchung, NJ, which is the eastern-most point of Somerset county, Volpe grew up a Yankees fan, Derek Jeter was his favorite player growing up and his favorite memory growing up was watching the 2009 Yankees World Series team, when he was eight-years-old. He chooses to wear #7 because his grandfather's (also named Anthony Volpe) favorite player is Mickey Mantle. Anthony's family, including parents Michael and Isabelle, are in attendance for every home game at TD Bank Ballpark. Volpe has lived at home with his family for the duration of this season and is hosting fellow teammates Austin Wells, Blake Perkins and Max Burt.

In total, prior to joining the Patriots on 7/6, Wells had played in 37 games, hitting .304/.425/.568/.993 with 8 HR, 22 RBI and 26 R. He was named team captain and Most Valuable Player as a junior and senior. As a junior, Wells was the 2017 Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year. Upon graduating high school, Wells was originally selected by the Yankees in the 35th round of the 2018 MLB Draft. After electing to play college ball at Arizona, the Yankees selected him again in the first round of the draft two years later, 28th overall. Wells is currently living at the Volpe household, alongside teammates Max Burt and Blake Perkins.
