INDY BITS

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: Luca Tresh hit a go-ahead solo home run in the third inning of the Indianapolis Indians 5-1 loss to the Omaha Storm Chasers on Saturday night at Werner Park. A two-run third frame proved decisive as Tresh's home run and a sacrifice fly by Nick Loftin gave the Storm Chasers a 3-1 lead that they would not relinquish. Omaha padded the lead with insurance runs in the fourth and seventh inning to pull away with the win. After Omaha took a 1-0 lead in the first inning, the Indians knotted the game, 1-1, when Alika Williams scored on a fielding error by Nick Pratto that was hit off the bat of Tsung-Che Cheng. The Storm Chasers scored four unanswered runs to conclude the contest. Ryan Brady took over in the second inning with the game tied and blanked the Indians across 3.1 innings with two hits, no walks and two strikeouts. Indy starter Carson Fulmer allowed four earned runs across 4.0 innings in the defeat.

BAEWATCH: Ji Hwan Bae extended his on-base streak to 16 games on last night, going 1-for-4 in last night's contest. It is the longest on-base streak by an Indian this season and is tied for the fifth longest active streak in the International League. He is hitting .292 (19-for-65) with five doubles, five RBI, eight walks, 16 runs and five stolen bases in this span. Since making his season debut with Indy on April 8, his 19 runs scored rank second in the International League behind Lehigh Valley's Otto Kemp (21r). He has one-plus hit in seven straight contests, 10 of his past 11 and 13 of the 16 games in his active on-base streak. He has scored one-plus run in 11 of the 16 games and one-plus walk in seven of those games. Bae scored a career-high tying four runs on April 17 vs. Toledo (3x, MR: 9/11/22 at OMA). He tallied a stolen base in four straight games from April 17-22, marking his first time stringing four straight games with a steal since July 8-14, 2021, with Altoona. The four consecutive games with a steal are tied for the longest streak by an International League player this season. He picked up three RBI in Game 1 on April 25, driving in three-plus runs for the first time since Sept. 22, 2024, at St. Paul.

EXIT MUSIC (FOR A BASEBALL): Nick Yorke collected a hit in his third straight contest, going 1-for-4 in last night's contest. In his past three games, Yorke is hitting .429 (6-for-14) with two home runs, four RBI, three runs and two stolen bases. He launched his third home run of the season in the seventh inning on Friday night, going 2-for-5 with a home run, two RBI, two runs and two stolen bases. It marked his first time homering in back-to-back games since June 8 and 9, 2024, with Worcester. Additionally, he posted back-to-back multi-nit games and multi-RBI games for the first time this season. He swiped two-plus bags in that game for the first time since September 13, 2023, with Portland vs. Hartford. Yorke has reached base safely three-plus times in two of his last seven games, two-plus times in four of those and one-plus in six. He swatted his second home run of the season in the first inning on Thursday, going 3-for-5 with two RBI and one run. It marked his second three-hit game of the campaign, last doing so on April 22 at St. Paul.

SOLAK ECLIPSE: Nick Solak is on a scorching run to begin the 2025 seasonranking among International League leaders in batting average (.380, 30-for-79, 2nd), OPS (1.058, 4rd), SLG (.620, 5th) and OBP (.438, 5th). Going 0-for-1 as a pinch hitter last night, his six-game hitting streak came to a close in which he batted .389 (7-for-18) with two doubles, one home run, four RBI, three walks and four runs in that six-game span. He has reached base safely in 21 of his 23 games on the campaign and has one-plus hit in 20 of those, including a team best 13-game hitting streak from April 3-23. Solak hit .400 (20-for-50) with two doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, 11 runs, three stolen bases and a 1.056 OPS in this span. He struck out just seven times across 55 plate appearances during the hitting streak. His .394 average and 1.070 OPS through April were the highest for an Indians hitter through April (min. 75 PA) since Gregory Polanco hit. 400 with a 1.089 OPS through the month in 2014. He tallied a pinch-hit single in the ninth inning on Wednesday after relieving DJ Stewart. With a pinch-hit homer on Sunday in the eighth inning at St. Paul, these marked his first two knocks as a pinch hitter in his minor league career and the latest two since a pinch-hit single off Rick Porcello on Sept. 25, 2019, with Texas vs. Boston

YEAN SHORTS: Eddy Yean tossed 1.1 scoreless innings on Tuesday, escaping a bases-loaded jam in the eighth inning after walking three consecutive batters with one out. He extended his scoreless outing streak to six games, surpassing David Bednar's five straight scoreless outings for the longest run by an Indian this season. In this span, he has thrown 8.1 innings with six hits, five walks and five strikeouts. This, opposed to allowing four runs, five hits and five walks with just one strikeout in his first 2.1 innings this season. It is his longest scoreless outing streak since six consecutive from July 17-Sept. 4, 2024, with Altoona.

TODAY'S MATCHUP: The Indianapolis Indians conclude this week's six-game series against the Omaha Storm Chasers this afternoon at 3:05 PM. With a win, the Indians can secure their second series victory of the season and first since winning five of six games vs. Toledo from April 15-20 at Victory Field. It would be Indy's first road series victory at Omaha since taking two of three contests from July 14-16, 2023. Right-hander Thomas Harrington is set to make his fifth appearance and fourth start of the season. He is coming off the victory in this week's opener on Tuesday, tossing 5.0 innings with five hits, two earned runs, one walk and three strikeouts in the Indians 9-7 win. Harrington's previous start was his only career appearance against the Storm Chasers. Taking the mound for Omaha is right-hander Luinder Avila, who took the loss in Tuesday's opener, allowing five runs across 4.0 innings. Avila has allowed four-plus runs in three consecutive appearances for the first time in his career. Tuesday was his first career apperance against Indianapolis.

ON THIS DATE IN 2009: The Indians set a franchise record with nine stolen bases during a 7-5 loss vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre at Victory Field. The running game was led by right fielder Jeff Salazar, who swiped two bases in the first inning and one in the third. DH Garrett Jones and first baseman Steve Pearce each tacked on a pair of their own, with Jones stealing home to take a 5-4 lead in the fifth inning. Andrew McCutchen and Neil Walker each contributed one stolen base to the nine-swipe
