Aviators vs. River Cats: The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, will open a six-game Northern California road trip tonight against the Sacramento River Cats, Triple-A affiliate of the San Francisco Giants, in Triple-A West action at Sutter Health Park (14,014)...Las Vegas was 2-4 on the just completed six-game homestand against Reno...the six-game series against the River Cats will conclude on Tuesday, September 21...following an off day on Wednesday, September 22, the Aviators will return to Las Vegas Ballpark for the final five home games of the season against Oklahoma City (September 23-27).

Reno defeats Las Vegas 8-2 in series finale (Tuesday, September 14): The Aces defeated the Reyes de Plata 8-2 in the finale of the six-game series and homestand before a crowd of 6,734 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 6 hits and stranded four runners on base. Third baseman **Vimael Machín** (1-for-3, HBP) hit a two-run home run in the sixth inning. First baseman **Francisco Peña** was 2-for-4 and shortstop **Nick Allen** was 1-for-3.

Reno offense: The Aces recorded 14 hits and built a 7-0 lead after 5 ½ innings. Five players recorded multiple-hit games: second baseman **Ildemaro Vargas** was 3-for-5, solo home run, three runs scored. Designated hitter **Christian Lopes** was 3-for-5, two doubles, RBI and third baseman **Drew Ellis** was 2-for-4, HBP, double, solo home run, three runs scored.

Las Vegas pitching: Right-hander **Mike Fiers** pitched 1.2 innings in a ML rehab assignment. He allowed 3 hits, 3 runs, walked 1 and struck out 2 on 33 pitches (19 strikes).

Aviators Bullpen: Right-hander **Brian Howard** pitched 4.1 innings and allowed 7 hits, 4 runs, issued no walks and struck out 5. Left-hander **Sam Moll** pitched 1.0 scoreless inning (SO). Reno defeats Las Vegas 11-5 to even the series (Friday, September 10): The Aces defeated the Aviators 11-5 in game two of the six-game series and homestand before a sellout crowd of 9,519 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 9 hits and right fielder **Mickey McDonald** was 3-for-4, stolen base, 2 RBI, run scored. Second baseman **Pete Kozma** recorded his 1,000th career minor league hit with a 2-for-3 performance. **Nate Mondou** hit a pinch-hit, three-run home run in the seventh inning.

Reno offense: The Aces recorded 14 hits and scored six runs in the first inning and built a 10-1 lead after 5 ½ innings. Center fielder **Alek Thomas** was 2-for-4, walk, double, three runs scored. First baseman **Juniel Querecuto** was 2-for-5, triple, 3 RBI, run scored and second baseman **Ildemaro Vargas** was 2-for-5, HR, 3 RBI, two runs scored.

Reno defeats Las Vegas 14-5 to even the series (Sunday, September 12): The Aces defeated the Aviators 14-5 in game four of the six-game series and homestand before a crowd of 6,882 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 10 hits and built a 3-0 lead after two innings. Right fielder **Luis Barrera** was 2-for-5, triple, RBI, run scored. Third baseman **Vimal Machín** was 2-for-4, HBP, RBI, run scored and center fielder **Mickey McDonald** was 2-for-5, 2 RBI.

Reno offense: The Aces recorded 17 hits and rallied from a 3-0 deficit for the victory. Seven players recorded multiple-hit games: first baseman **Cooper Hummel** was 3-for-4, HR, SF, 3 RBI, two runs scored. Reno defeats Las Vegas 6-3 in game five of the series (Monday, September 13): The Aces defeated the Aviators 6-3 in game five of the six-game series and homestand before a crowd of 7,966 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 8 hits and scored three runs in the second inning to take a 3-2 lead. Left fielder **Marty Bechina** (1-for-3) had a two-run single and designated hitter **Aramis Garcia** (1-for-4) hit a solo home run. Right fielder **Luis Barrera** was 3-for-3, run scored and center fielder **Mickey McDonald** was 2-for-4.

Reno offense: The Aces recorded 9 hits and rallied for four runs in the ninth inning for the victory. AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS – Las Vegas will open a Northern California six-game road trip tonight against the Sacramento River Cats, Triple-A affiliate of the San Francisco Giants...the Aviators were 2-4 on the just completed six-game homestand against intrastate rival, the Reno Aces...Las Vegas and Sacramento will play each other a total of 24 times during the season...the series against Sacramento will conclude on Tuesday, September 21 (end of the regular season)...following an off-day on Wednesday, September 22, the Aviators will return to Las Vegas Ballpark for the final homestand of the '21 season...Las Vegas will host the Oklahoma City Dodgers, Triple-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers, in a five-game series, from Thursday-Monday, September 23-27...**16 games overall** remain on the 2021 season (5-home; 11-road)...*the '21 campaign will feature six-game series against opponents from Thursday-Tuesday and off days on Wednesday (except from September 22 – October 3)*...the 2021 season will feature 130 games (65-home; 65-away): 120 regular season games and the **Triple-A Final Stretch**, consisting of an additional 10 games (5-home; 5 away) will be featured from September 23 – October 3.

FRANCHISE RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE HOME RUNS: The Aviators set a franchise record with at least one home run in **21** consecutive games (June 4-27)...the previous record was established in 2019 with **19** consecutive games from July 18 – August 8.

20-20-20: In 2021, three Aviators have hit 20 or more home runs: **Carlos Pérez (28)**, **Francisco Peña (21)**, **Austin Allen (20)**...in 2019, four Aviators hit 20 or more home runs: **Seth Brown (37)**, **Mark Payton (30)**, **Sheldon Neuse (27)**, **Dustin Fowler (25)**...marking the first time in franchise history (1983-2019) that four players have hit 20+ home runs in a single season...in 2018, three Las Vegas players hit 20 or more home runs: **Zach Borenstein (25)**, **Pete Alonso (21)**, **Patrick Kivlehan (20)**.

38 SEASONS IN THE SILVER STATE – The Aviators are playing in their 39th Triple-A professional baseball season (calendar season) in the Silver State (formerly the Pacific Coast League, 1903-2020) and currently as a member of Triple-A West...the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being the longest enduring franchise in the history of professional sports in the state of Nevada...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8).

TRIPLE-A WEST: Formerly the Pacific Coast League (118 years, 1903-2020)...Triple-A West will consist of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **Western Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **Eastern Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Dodgers, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Skeeters.

TRIPLE-A EAST: It will consist of three divisions for a total of 20 teams. **Midwest Division:** Columbus Clippers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. **Northeast Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **Southeast Division:** Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Gwinnett Stripers, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Norfolk Tides.

2020 SEASON – JUNE 30: Major League Baseball™ (MLB™) informed Minor League Baseball™ (MiLB™) that it will not be providing its affiliated Minor League teams with players for the 2020 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic...as a result, the Minor League Baseball season was canceled for the first time in its history...Minor League Baseball, which began as the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues, was founded on Sept. 5, 1901...**the 2021 season marks the 39th “calendar season” of Las Vegas Triple-A professional baseball in the Silver State.**

2019 SEASON – The Aviators compiled the second-best record in the 16-team Pacific Coast League at 83-57 (.593)...Round Rock Express had the best record in the PCL at 84-56 (.600)...Las Vegas tied a franchise record for most road wins in a season with 44 (2002 team was 44-28, .611)...Las Vegas clinched its first PCL Playoff berth since the 2014 season (Triple-A affiliate of the New York Mets)...Las Vegas lost to Sacramento, 3-games-to-2, in the League Championship Series...the River Cats captured the PCL and the Triple-A championships...Las Vegas recorded 250 home runs, breaking the previous mark of 184 (2001, 2004).

LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563)...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY: The Howard Hughes Corporation® (NYSE: HHC) announced on October 10, 2017 its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on Friday, February 23, 2018 before a crowd of several hundred people!

The 8,834-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark will provide a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall.

Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site will be landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites.

The grand opening took place on Tuesday, April 9, 2019 before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION: The Howard Hughes Corporation®, owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of Triple-A West (formerly the Pacific Coast League, PCL), and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on December 8, 2018 the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Oakland Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51s) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and

the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

AVIATORS LOGO DESIGN AND CONCEPT:

The color inspiration: the Las Vegas Sunset; the mountain range featured in the Aviators' sunglasses resemble the mountain range found in the Summerlin logo!

Team colors are navy, orange, tangerine, gold, yellow, gray.

SOUTHERN NEVADA AVIATION HISTORY:

Nevada's High-Flying Aviators (from UNLV News) - Nevada has a rich history in Aviation; with 500 miles between the state's two largest cities (Reno and Las Vegas), aviation was ideal for Nevada.

Aviation History in Las Vegas (from McCarran Airport) - Aviation grew exponentially throughout the 1900s, bringing more and more travelers to our city.

NELLIS AIR FORCE BASE:

Nellis Air Force Base (in Las Vegas) is "Home of the Fighter Pilot" and home to the United States Air Force Warfare Center - the largest and most demanding advanced air combat training mission in the world. Nellis AFB provides training for composite strike forces which include **EVERY type of aircraft in the Air Force inventory**. Crews do not come to learn how to fly, but instead how to be the **best combat aviators in the world!**

Las Vegas Ballpark 100% Capacity began on June 10: The Aviators announced on May 24 that Las Vegas Ballpark will operate at 100% capacity which began with the third homestand of the 2021 season on Thursday, June 10 against intrastate rival, the Reno Aces.

Individual Game Tickets: Aviators individual game tickets for the remainder of the 2021 season are on sale now through Ticketmaster (www.ticketmaster.com).

Hospitality group areas, including suites, party decks and the pool area in right-center field are available by calling the Aviators administrative offices at **(702) 943-7200**.

Aviators on Radio in 2021: Russ Langer will broadcast all 130 games on **Raider Nation Radio 920 AM** and on www.aviatorslv.com. Langer is in his 21st season behind the mike...he is a 10-time recipient of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015) presented by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association...also worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons...in 2006, Langer was hired for additional major league duty by the Baltimore Orioles and broadcast 10 games on a fill-in basis during the course of the season...has also broadcast selected Los Angeles Dodgers Spring Training games in March of 2006 and in Arizona in March of 2008 and with the Toronto Blue Jays in 2009 and 2010 and Chicago White Sox in 2012-20...also broadcast the action for the 2016 Triple-A All-Star Game Radio Network from Charlotte, North Carolina...in 2020, Langer also completed his ninth season as the radio "play-by-play voice" for the UNLV Football team. **NOTE:** The Aviators games on **Sunday, September 19 and Sunday, September 26** will be broadcast on **98.9FM/1340 AM Fox Sports Radio (KKGK)**.

ROBERT J. BLUM BROADCAST BOOTH AT LAS VEGAS BALLPARK:

The "Aviators Home Radio Booth" was renamed the "**Robert J. Blum Broadcast Booth**" prior to the 2013 season at Cashman Field (and currently at Las Vegas Ballpark) to honor the then-51s Special Assistant to the General Manager... "The Blummer" passed away on July 22, 2012 at the age of 91...also served as the play-by-play voice for Stars/51s baseball in selected seasons from 1985-2005 & 2008-10...his company, Robert J. Blum Productions, also produced Las Vegas Triple-A professional baseball games broadcast on radio and television for several seasons.
