LAST ACTION: [The Wisconsin Timber Rattlers beat the Beloit Snappers 15-13 Sunday afternoon at ABC Supply Stadium.](#)

Je'Von Ward had five hits, drove in five runs, scored four runs, and hit for the cycle for the Timber Rattlers. Wisconsin had a 15-5 lead before the Snappers scored eight runs in the bottom of the ninth.

HISTORY CHANNEL: Ward hit for the first cycle in Timber Rattlers history. He tripled in the first, doubled in the second, singled in the fourth, and homered in the fifth to complete the cycle. Ward also added a double in the seventh for five hits and twelve total bases. The last time an Appleton Pro Baseball Player had a cycle was May 10, 1979 (Ed Bahns – Appleton Foxes).

BETTER MAKE IT FIVE: The five-hit game by Ward was the first by a Rattler since Zach Clark (7/9/2018).

GOING FOR A WALK: Wisconsin hitters drew thirteen walks on Sunday. Thomas Dillard drew five walks on Sunday. The last time a Timber Rattlers hitter drew five walks in a game was April 14, 2011 (Nick Shaw).

YOU SAY GOOD-BYE: The Milwaukee Brewers promoted Dillard, Korry Howell, and Jesús Lujano to the Biloxi Shuckers in the Double-A South on Monday.

I SAY HELLO: The Brewers promoted Zavie Warren and Joey Wiemer to Wisconsin from the Carolina Mudcats of the Low-A East. Warren was Milwaukee's third round pick in 2020. Wiemer was the fourth round pick last year.

ABOUT GREAT LAKES: The Great Lakes Loons came into existence in 2007 after the Midwest League team left Battle Creek at the end of the 2006 season. The team in Battle Creek had been known as the Michigan Battle Cats, Battle Creek Yankees, and the Southwest Michigan Devil Rays. The Loons have been affiliated with the Los Angeles Dodgers since 2007. They made the Midwest League playoffs seven times between 2007 and 2019. The Loons won the Midwest League title in 2016. Notable Great Lakes alumni include Clayton Kershaw, Kenley Jansen, Nathan Eovaldi, Joc Peterson, Julio Urias, Walker Buehler, and Gavin Lux.

ABOUT THE DODGERS: The Los Angeles Dodgers were only in the Midwest League for a few seasons prior to affiliating with the Loons. They were in Dubuque in 1967 and in Clinton from 1977 to 1979. Orel Hershiser and Steve Sax were notable Dodgers to play in Clinton.

GREAT LAKES IN 2019: The Loons had the best record in the Midwest League in 2019. They were 81-55 in the regular season but were swept in the Eastern Division Finals by the South Bend Cubs.

GREAT LAKES IN 2021: The Loons are 45-39 and tied with the Cedar Rapids Kernels for the second playoff spot in the High-A Central League. Great Lakes is facing a team from the Western Division for the first time this season by playing the Timber Rattlers. They lead the league in homers (123) and are second in OPS (.790) and average (.254). The Loons pitchers are second in the league in ERA (3.96).

PROSPECTING IN THE SERIES: [MLB Pipeline](#) puts five Rattlers on their list of Brewers Top 30 Prospects: Zavie Warren (#11), Carlos Rodríguez (#14), Hayden Cantrelle (#16), Nick Kahle (#19), and Joe Gray Jr. (#30). [MLB Pipeline](#) has four current Loons on their list of Dodgers prospects: Andy Pages (#6), Clayton Beeter (#10), Leonel Valera (#23), and Hyun-Il Choi (#25). Bobby Miller (#3) and Robinson Ortiz (#20) are currently on the Great Lakes Injured List.

WISCONSIN SCHEDULED STARTING PITCHER (Game 1):

RHP JOEY MATULOVICH: Selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 20th round of the 2018 draft out of the University of California, Berkeley.

A BEAR: Matulovich was 6-5 with a 3.79 ERA in 57 games – nineteen starts – over three seasons at Cal. He had 121 strikeouts over 163-2/3 innings pitched in his collegiate career. Matulovich was teammates with current Wisconsin reliever Arman Sabouri at Cal in 2017 and 2018.

ALL-STATE: Matulovich went 9-1 with 110 strikeouts as a senior at San Ramon Valley High School in Danville, California and was an All-State selection in 2015

I WOULD HAVE LIKE TO HAVE SEEN MONTANA: Matulovich began his professional career with the Helena Brewers in the Pioneer League in 2018. He was 3-2 with a 2.75 ERA in twelve games – two starts – for Helena. He walked fourteen and struck out 49 over 36 innings pitched.

IN 2019: Matulovich split time between the AZL Brewers Gold and the Timber Rattlers in 2019. He was 0-3 in eight games – six starts – in the AZL. Matulovich joined Wisconsin on August 1, 2019 and was 1-2 in nine relief appearances. He compiled a 5.57 ERA and 45 strikeouts over 32-1/3 innings in his two stops in the Brewers system in 2019.

MUDCAT: Matulovich started this season with the Carolina Mudcats in the Low-A East. He was 2-0 with a save in sixteen games – two starts – with 56 strikeouts and 21 walks in 40 innings.

LAST START: Matulovich lost [at Beloit on August 4](#). He allowed three runs on five hits with no walks and seven strikeouts over five innings.

VS. GREAT LAKES: Matulovich has never faced the Loons. He made two relief appearances against the Ogden Raptors, the Pioneer League affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers, in 2018. Matulovich also made a start against the Dodgers [Mota affiliate on July 18, 2019](#) and a relief appearance against the Dodgers [Lasorda affiliate on July 23, 2019](#) in the Arizona League.

WISCONSIN SCHEDULED STARTING PITCHER (Game 2):

RHP ZACH MORT: Signed with Milwaukee as a Minor League Free Agent on January 14, 2021.

ORIGIN STORY: Mort was drafted by the Chicago Cubs in the 8th round of the 2018 draft out of George Mason University.

PATRIOTIC DUTY: Mort appeared in 57 games – 28 starts – over three seasons at George Mason. He went 12-12 with nine saves and a 3.72 ERA and 205 strikeouts over 227-1/3 innings pitched during his collegiate career.

IN THE CUBS DEN: Mort spent two seasons (2018 and 2019) in the Cubs organization after signing with them. He made ten relief appearances (0-4, 5.79) with the Eugene Emeralds in 2018. In 2019, Mort started the season with the South Bend Cubs in the Midwest League, was sent back to Eugene in the middle of June, and returned to South Bend in early August. Mort was 3-3 with a 3.72 ERA in Eugene and 6-2 with a 3.13 ERA for South Bend.

POSTSEASON: Mort was the winning pitcher in Game One of the Midwest League Championship Series against the [Clinton LumberKings on September 11, 2019](#). Mort went three scoreless innings, allowed one hit and two walks with four strikeouts as a reliever. The South Bend Cubs went on to sweep the best-of-five series from Clinton.

LAST START: Mort had a no decision [at Beloit on August 3](#). He allowed five runs on eight hits with two walks and three strikeouts over 4-1/3 innings. Mort left with Wisconsin trailing 5-0, but the Rattlers rallied for a 9-5 win in ten innings.

VS. GREAT LAKES: Mort made one relief appearance against the Loons in 2019 when he was with South Bend. He worked [3-1/3 scoreless innings at Great Lakes on April 8](#) for a no decision. He allowed two hits, walked none, and struck out two.

GREAT LAKES SCHEDULED STARTING PITCHER (Game 1):

RHP CLAYTON BEETER: Beeter was selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in Competitive Balance Round B out of Texas Tech with the 66th overall pick in the 2020 draft.

RED RAIDER: Beeter as the closer for Texas Tech in 2019, was 0-3 with eight saves, and ERA of 3.48, and struck out 40 in 20-2/3 innings pitched. He became a starter in 2020 and was 2-1 with a 2.14 ERA in four starts before the shutdown.

TEAMMATES: Beeter was a teammate of Timber Rattlers reliever Taylor Floyd during the 2019 season.

TOP TEN OR TOP TWENTY: Beeter is rated as the #10 prospect in the Dodgers system by MLB Pipeline. *Baseball America* has Beeter at #20 on their list of Dodgers prospects.

LAST START: Beeter had a no decision [against Fort Wayne on August 5](#). He allowed three hits and struck out four over three scoreless innings.

VS. WISCONSIN: Beeter has never faced Wisconsin. This is also the first time he will face an affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers.

GREAT LAKES SCHEDULED STARTING PITCHER (Game 2):

RHP LOGAN BOYER: Boyer was selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 11th round of the 2019 draft out of San Diego State University.

LOGAN EL AZTECA: Boyer played three seasons at San Diego State. He was 2-1 with a 3.40 ERA in 23 games – eight starts. Boyer had 62 strikeouts over 45 innings pitched in his career with the Aztecs.

ABBREVIATED: Boyer started both his 2018 and 2019 college seasons as the Friday night starter for the Aztecs. However, injuries derailed his season each year and limited him to nine games – four starts – in 2018 and four games – three starts – in 2019.

TIME AWAY: Boyer did not pitch professionally in 2019 or in 2020. He made his return to the diamond on May 8 in a start against the Dayton Dragons as the starting pitcher.

LAST START: Boyer had a no decision in a start [against West Michigan on July 31](#). He pitched two scoreless, hitless innings with no walks and two strikeouts.

LAST APPEARANCE: Boyer had a no decision in a relief outing [against Fort Wayne on August 5](#). He allowed one run on two hits with a walk and two strikeouts over two innings.

VS. WISCONSIN: Boyer has never faced Wisconsin. This is also the first time he will face an affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers.
