TODAY marks game #53 of the 2023 season, the second game of a six-game homestand, and the second game of a six-game series against the against the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers. These two teams played six times during the 2022 regular season, with the Whitecaps going 5-1. The Whitecaps are a Detroit Tigers affiliate in their 29th season in professional baseball, while Wisconsin is in their 15th year of affiliation with the Milwaukee Brewers.

UP NEXT: The 'Caps go on the road for a six-game series against the Lake County Captains (Cleveland Guardians) at Classic Park from June 13-18, their final road series in June as West Michigan hosts Great Lakes and Dayton for 12-straight contests to conclude the month.

STORYLINES AND HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The West Michigan Whitecaps struggled to generate offensive momentum, failing to rally in a 4-2 defeat to the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers in front of 5,183 fans Tuesday night at LMCU Ballpark. Whitecaps hitters couldn't capitalize on several run-scoring opportunities, finishing just 1-for-7 with runners in scoring position while leaving ten runners on base in the defeat. Over their last five games, the 'Caps hold a record of 1-4 and are hitting .167 (10-for-60) with runners on second or third base. Wisconsin struck in the first inning as catcher Matthew Wood roped an RBI single before DH Darrien Miller lifted a sacrifice fly, putting the Timber Rattlers in front 2-0. West Michigan responded in the fourth as Chris Meyers opened the frame with a solo home run, cutting the lead to 2-1. The Whitecaps struck again in the fifth, as Jace Jung delivered an RBI single to level the game at 2-2. The Timber Rattlers were down to their final strike with the bases loaded in the eighth, as Miller cracked a critical two-run single to forge Wisconsin in front 4-2. The Whitecaps loaded the bases with two outs in the ninth inning but couldn't get the crucial swing they needed, as Timber Rattlers reliever Karlos Morales recorded the final out to earn a save and the 4-2 win. The Timber Rattlers improve to 19-32 as the Whitecaps fall to 28-24 and now sit eight games behind the Great Lakes Loons for first place in the Midwest League East division. Timber Rattlers reliever Luis Amaya (1-2) secures his first win, tossing three scoreless innings with a pair of strikeouts as Morales collects his second save. 'Caps reliever Darjo Gardea (0-2) suffers his second loss, allowing two runs through two innings in the defeat. With the loss, the Whitecaps tie their longest losing streak of the season at four-straight games.

THE WEEK IS JUNG: On June 5, Whitecaps infielder and Detroit Tigers No. 1 Prospect Jace Jung was named the Midwest League Player of the Week. The 2022 first-round pick went 13-for-19 with five extra-base hits, two home runs and ten RBI over his last five games of the week at Dayton.

SKUBAL SIGHTING: After suffering an elbow injury in August last year, Tarik Skubal made his first live appearance of 2023 on Saturday in Dayton, going two shutout innings with a strikeout. Skubal finished 7-8 with a 3.52 ERA and 117 strikeouts with the Tigers before requiring season-ending surgery.

JUSTICE BEING SERVED: After going 13-for-20 in a series in Mid-May against the Lansing Lugnuts, Whitecaps OF Justice Bigbie collected his first-ever Midwest league Player of the Week award. Bigbie tallied four doubles, three home runs and nine RBI as the 'Caps took 4 out of 6 games with the 'Nuts from May 9-14 at LMCU Ballpark.

ENTERING ELITE COMPANY: With a 11-10 victory over the Great Lakes Loons on May 16, Whitecaps Manager Brayan Peña collected his 151st victory to pass former West Michigan and one-time Baltimore Orioles manager Phil Regan for 5th place on the all-time 'Caps wins list by a manager.

DIFFERENT STRENGTHS: The Whitecaps have stolen just 12 bases this season, the fewest in MiLB. The next closest team is Triple-A Reno with 22.

BRINGING THE PENA: On May 4, Whitecaps pitcher Carlos Pena was named the Midwest League Pitcher of the Month for April. The 24-year-old pitched to a 0.47 ERA in five starts, covering 19.1 innings in the first month of the season, as he allowed one earned run and held opponents to a .200 average. Pena struck out 26 batters and was unscored upon in his first nine innings and his last nine innings of the month. Pena, 24, was signed by Detroit as an international free agent out of Santiago, DR, on March 6, 2019.

HE HIT THE POLE!: In a game against the Captains on May 23rd, the 'Caps hit home runs off each of the two foul poles – one by Josh Crouch and the other by Luis Garcia – at LMCU Ballpark. It is believed to be the first time in 'Caps history that West Michigan has accomplished the feat in a single game.

PROSPECTS APLENTY: The Whitecaps hold nine of the Top 30 Detroit Tigers prospects. Players include those mentioned near the top right corner of this page.

HEALTH REPORT: The 'Caps IL holds seven players in pitchers Aaron Haase, Jackson Jobe, Tanner Kohlhepp, Tyler Mattison, Cristhian Tortosa & Matt Walker, plus catcher Eduardo Valencia.

Name: Beau Brieske**Born:** April 5, 1998**Resides:** Chandler, AZ**Acquired:** Selected by the Tigers in the 27th Round of the June 2019 MLB Draft from Colorado State University - Pueblo.

Brieske came to Detroit as a bit of a project after posting a mid-5s ERA during his college days but developed into one of the brightest arms in the Tigers system after transitioning into a starting role.

Brieske earned Tigers Minor League Pitcher of the Year in 2021 - posting a 9-4 record with a 3.12 ERA and 116 strikeouts between West Michigan and Erie. Brieske established himself as a critical part of the Tigers rotation in 2022 but has had to fight through several injuries, being placed on the 15-day IL in July due to forearm soreness before returning to the IL (60-day) in February of 2023 with ulnar nerve entrapment.

LAST START: Brieske had his last regular season start against the Kansas City Royals on July 12, 2022, allowing three runs through six innings with four strikeouts before being placed on the 15-day IL on July 21 due to forearm soreness in his right arm - effectively ending his 2022 campaign.

2022: Brieske started just four games for the Toledo Mudhens before being promoted to Detroit and making an immediate impact - becoming the first Tigers pitcher to begin his big league career by throwing five innings or more and allowing three hits or less in his first two starts since Victor Santos in 2001. Brieske also struck out a season-high seven batters on June 4 against the Yankees before earning his first Major League win on June 11 vs. Toronto - going 5.2 scoreless innings with a pair of strikeouts.

2021: Brieske enjoyed his best season in his first full year as a starting pitcher in 2021, posting an impressive 9-4 record with a 3.12 ERA, including a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 116/23 between West Michigan and Erie. Brieske also finished third in the Tigers system in both wins (8) and strikeouts (110) before being named the #18 Detroit Tigers prospect the following season (Baseball America).

2019: Brieske's first professional season saw him placed in the bullpen, where he thrived by going 3-1 with a 3.10 ERA in 11 appearances.

COLLEGE: Brieske pitched 79.2 innings as a starter for CSUP and posted a 5.42 ERA in 14 starts, but showed flashes of talent with a total of 116 strikeouts during that span to just 27 walks.

Also spent time playing for Glendale Community College as a two-way player, where he hit .295 with a .429 OBP as a sophomore.

Selected in the fourth-round of last year's MLB Draft, the 22-year-old makes his high-A debut after posting an impressive 33 strikeouts to just six walks through 26.2 innings in low-A Lakeland with a 3.38 ERA this year. Melton played four seasons with San Diego State, compiling a career 12-8 record with 184 punchouts through 168.1 innings, earning Mountain West Co-Pitcher of the Year honors his Junior season with Aztecs.

LAST GAME: Melton was solid his last time out, allowing just one run through four innings with four strikeouts as part of a narrow 6-5 Whitecaps win over the Dayton Dragons on June 1 at Day Air Ballpark.

2022 (Junior): Earned first-team all-conference distinction despite being injured for a month of the season, finishing 5-2 with a 2.07 ERA and 67 strikeouts to just 15 walks. Melton also enjoyed a career-high 11 strikeouts in seven innings against Air Force on May 6, 2022, marking the highest total by an SDSU pitcher since Bubba Derby (2014).

2021 (RS-Sophomore): Melton struggled with hard contact early but still ranked amongst the best in the conference in strikeouts, posting a 4-5 record with an 6.14 ERA while punching out 83 batters which ranked second in the Mountain West Conference. Melton also officially earned a spot on D1baseball.com's top-100 college draft prospects.

2020 (Sophomore): Earned all-Mountain West honors in a season that was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Posted a 3-1 record with a 3.22 ERA and 26 strikeouts. Melton was top-25 nationally in wins (3) while holding opposing hitters to an average of .196 - ranking fourth in the conference in fewest hits allowed.

MORE: Son of Charles and Tracie Melton. His father played collegiate soccer at the University of Arizona. Lists Mike Trout as his favorite athlete. Recieved his undergraduate degree in marketing. Really good at "minute to win it" NHL edition.
