Battenfield pitched seven innings for the first time as a pro, striking out 10 batters to match a career high. **Bryan Lavastida** hit a go-ahead two-run homer in the fourth, and **Jonathan Engelmann** homered leading off the seventh. **George Valera** added a two-run single in a 2-for-4 night. **José Fermín** was 3-for-5 and scored twice. **Nick Mikolajchak** went to scoreless innings as the only reliever. The RubberDucks held the Baysox to one hit.

Championship Chase: Akron is seeking its sixth championship for the Northeast Ohio franchise (1989-present). The Akron Aeros won the Eastern League in 2003, 2005, 2009 and 2012. The Akron RubberDucks won the 2016 championship, sweeping the best-of-five series with the Trenton Thunder (Yankees Double-A). The RubberDucks' last trip to the Eastern League Championship Series was in 2018, when they were swept by New Hampshire (Blue Jays).

New-look RubberDucks: Since July 30, four lineup regulars have joined Akron from High-A Lake County – infielders **Brayan Rocchio** and **Victor Nova** and outfielders **Will Brennan** and **George Valera**. Rocchio has been among the best offensive players in the league (see note above). Nova hit .241 with a .326 on-base percentage in 23 regular season games. Brennan finished the regular season on a 20-game on-base streak and was hitting .280, 2 HR, 20 RBI in 40 games. His 28 doubles overall are third in the system. Since his Double-A debut Aug. 4, Brennan was second in the league in runs (28) and fourth in hits (42). Valera hit .267, 3 HR, 22 RBI in 23 games. Overall, Valera was second in the system in walks (66), tied for second in homers (19) and third in RBI (65). Valera (#2), Rocchio (#7) and Brennan (#29) are all Top-30 Indians prospects (MLB.com).

Shane Bieber Rehab Sunday: The 2020 American League Cy Young Award winner made his second rehab start since being placed on the Injured List on June 14 with a right shoulder sub scapularis strain (also started Sept. 14 with Columbus in Toledo). He lasted 3 1/3 innings (57 pitches) and allowed three earned runs on two homers. Bieber is 7-4 with a 3.28 ERA in 14 MLB starts this season and was named a 2021 American League All-Star. A fourth-round pick in 2016, Bieber made his last nine starts of 2017 with Akron, going 2-1 with a 2.32 ERA. He made his first five starts in 2018 for the RubberDucks, going 3-0 with a 1.16 ERA. In 14 total Double-A starts, he was 5-1 with a 1.90 ERA, 79 strikeouts and only six walks in 85 1/3 innings. Promoted from Double-A Akron to Triple-A Columbus on May 3, 2018, Bieber made his major league debut that May 31. He is 41-18 with a 3.31 ERA in 80 appearances – 78 starts – across four MLB seasons. The MVP of the 2019 MLB All-Star Game at Progressive Field, Bieber has been Cleveland's Opening Day starter in 2020 and 2021.

RubberDucks face Baysox: Akron is facing the Bowie Baysox for their third series of the year. In the regular season, Akron won four of six games in Bowie June 15-20 and four of six games at Canal Park June 29-July 4. After a split with Somerset, Akron has won at least three games in 14 consecutive series since June 15 (8-2-4 in those series, the only two losses being 4-3 in two seven-game homestands), and the series win in Bowie began the run. A home series win over Bowie started a stretch of five straight series wins for Akron over each divisional opponent through Aug. 1. The RubberDucks never had a losing record to an opponent this season (12-12 vs. Erie and 6-6 vs. Bowie). According to MLB.com, top prospects in this series include:

Brayan Rocchio named Player of the Week: **Brayan Rocchio** was the Double-A Northeast MiLB Player of the Week for Sept. 6-12. Rocchio hit safely in all six games in Richmond (10-for-27, 2 doubles, 2 triples, 3 RBI, 5 runs). Finishing the season on a season-long 12-game hitting streak, Rocchio hit .293, 6 HR, 13 doubles, four triples, 30 RBI in 44 games after being promoted to Akron July 30. Since his Double-A debut July 31, Rocchio led the league in hits (54), extra-base hits (23), total bases (93), and runs (34), is tied for the league lead in triples (four), is third in RBI (30) and tied for third in doubles (13). Between High-A Lake County and Double-A Akron, the 20-year-old has scored 79 runs, leading Cleveland's minor league system. He also ranks second in hits (122), extra-base hits (46), and total bases (203). Rocchio's 15 total home runs are tied for seventh, his 63 RBI are fourth, and his 21 stolen bases are second in the system.

Top backstop: **Bo Naylor** leads Double-A Northeast catchers with 629.1 innings (73 games) behind the plate (75.1 more than any other), 766 total chances, 707 putouts and 54 assists. His 21 runners caught stealing (68 attempts) are second. Naylor hit just .138 (13-for-94), 1 HR, 5 RBI through 26 Double-A games. But in 61 games since June 19, Naylor is 46-for-219 (.210) with 10 doubles, nine homers, 39 RBIs, and a .674 OPS. He has reached base on a hit or walk in 25 of his last 34 games, with hits in 17 of those games.

Home cooking: The RubberDucks won their first six home games and are 38-22 at Canal Park. In 2019, the RubberDucks were 30-40 at home – their first losing record at Canal Park since 2014 (32-39).

2021 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (Second Season) – Odor, 53, became the 18th manager in club history when he led the club in 2019. The RubberDucks posted a 61-79 record, good for fifth in the Eastern League Western Division following a 34-35 first half record. Odor has twelve seasons of managerial experience where he has compiled a career record of 422-442 (.488). When Odor was Akron's hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2021 season is Odor's 34th in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (21st as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. The 2019 season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League (1999-2000), the Burlington Indians (2001-2004), the Mahoning Valley Scrappers (2005-2006), Gulf Coast League Indians (2007-2008). In 2009, Odor began serving as hitting coach for the Kinston Indians (2009-2010), Double-A Akron Aeros (2011-2012), High-A Carolina Mudcats (2013), Double-A Akron RubberDucks (2014), and Triple-A Columbus Clippers (2015-2017).

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#35 Owen Dew, Pitching Coach (1st Season) — Owen Dew, 32, makes his first visit to Akron after serving as the pitching coach for the Lake County Captains in the Class-A Midwest league in 2019. Dew began his baseball journey as a right-handed pitcher for Seminole State College of Florida (2008-2009), before moving to the University of Central Florida in 2010, when he was drafted in the 21st round of the 2010 amateur draft by the Cleveland Indians. That same year, Dew advanced through Mahoning Valley with a strong 2.64 ERA in nine starts for the Scrappers. At Class-A Lake County, Dew was converted to a relief pitcher where he appeared in 15 games over the 2010 and 2011 seasons. In Dew's final season as a player, the right hander appeared in 34 games, accruing 70 innings and posted a 3.86 ERA with 41 strikeouts.

Since his playing career, Dew served as an assistant coach at Seminole State College of Florida while also assisting the Cleveland Indians as an associate scout from 2014-2017. Dew was then appointed as a full-time minor league pitching coach within the organization, making stops with the Mahoning Valley (2017), Arizona League Indians 2 (2018), and Lake County Captains (2019). The 2019 Lake County Captains pitching staff posted a team ERA of 3.73 over 1191 innings, good for eighth in the Midwest League.

#16 Junior Betances, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Betances, 47, hits Akron for the first time in his 21-year coaching career with the Cleveland Indians organization. After posting a .289 batting average over 165 games in 1998-1999 with the Akron Aeros, Betances joined the coaching ranks in various roles for the Cleveland Indians Dominican Summer League team from 2000-2010. Betances then served as Arizona League Indians coach from 2010-2015, and moved to Lake County in 2017 as the Bench coach for Manager Larry Day. The native of La Vega, Dominican Republic, Betances has developed a wealth of experience in various player development roles within the Indians organization.

#28 Mike Mergenthaler, Bench Coach (First Season) — Mergenthaler, 32, moves up the Indians farm system to Akron in 2021, following his 2019 season serving as the Lynchburg Hillcats bench coach for Manager Jim Pankovits. In 2018 and 2019, Mergenthaler worked as a hitting coach for the Cleveland Indians' and Milwaukee Brewers' joint Dominican Super League team. The Thiells, NY, native was drafted as a player in the 32nd round of the 2011 amateur draft by the San Francisco Giants, playing in their system for parts of 2011 and 2012.

Jacob Legan, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Legan heads to Akron for the first time in his six-year career with the Cleveland Indians. Legan previously served as the Lynchburg Hillcats' athletic trainer in 2019.

Scott Nealon, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Second Season, not consecutive) — Nealon enters his eighth season in the Cleveland Indians organization, returning to the same position he held in 2016 for the RubberDucks Eastern League Championship season. Nealon was the Triple-A Columbus strength and conditioning coach the last three seasons (2017-2019), including the Clippers' 2019 Governor's Cup championship season. Previously, Nealon served as strength and conditioning coach for the Carolina Mudcats (2013-2014), Lynchburg Hillcats (2015), before he made his way to Double-A Akron. Nealon earned his master's degree in exercise science from Baldwin Wallace University in Berea, Ohio.

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "Rubber Capital of the World." Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "the Ducks" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
