Saturday: RubberDucks 2-6, SeaWolves 8-0: Alex Call hit a pair of solo home runs for the first multi-homer game by a RubberDuck this season, but Erie grew a 3-2 lead to 8-2 with a five-run fifth inning to win Game 1. **Thomas Ponticelli** (5 IP) and **Aaron Pinto** (2 IP) combined for the team's second shutout of Erie and third overall this season in a 6-0 Game 2 win. **Oscar González** hit his team-high seventh home run, and **Chris Roller** hit his first in Double-A.

Oscar on offense: Outfielder **Oscar González** hit .188 with one home run and nine RBI in his first 29 career Double-A games for the RubberDucks in 2019. But he is leading the 2021 offense with a team-high seven home runs (tied for third in the Double-A Northeast) and a .558 SLG (fifth).

Returners shining: **Alex Call** and **Trenton Brooks** are playing their second seasons with Akron, and have been among the offensive leaders in the Double-A Northeast:

Brooks: .432 OBP (3rd), .947 OPS (5th), 19 BB (4th)
Call: .325 AVG (6th), .550 SLG (7th), .932 OPS (6th), 20 R (T-7th)

Left-handed dominance: RubberDucks left-handed reliever **Francisco Pérez** did not allow a run through six appearances – 15.0 IP, 3 H, 6 BB, 26 K – but allowed two runs in the first of his three relief innings against Erie Tuesday. With 32 strikeouts Pérez is tied for eighth in the Double-A Northeast.

Home cooking: The RubberDucks won their first six home games and are 11-3 at Canal Park. In 2019, the RubberDucks were 30-40 at home – their first losing record at Canal Park since 2014 (32-39).

RubberDucks win rain-soaked series in Binghamton: The RubberDucks took four of six games in Binghamton May 25-30, although only one of the six was a nine-inning game, and games Friday and Sunday were rained out. The RubberDucks won Tuesday's nine-inning opener, 8-7, and Wednesday's seven-inning game, 3-1, weathering a two-hour-plus rain delay that prompted the second half of the doubleheader to be rescheduled for the next night. Binghamton swept Thursday's twin bill, 3-2 in eight innings and 8-7. After a rainout Friday, Akron swept Saturday's double dip, 7-1 and 7-6 in 11 innings. Sunday's finale was cancelled by rain. Akron finished 9-2 against Binghamton this season.

Alternate site 2021: Akron's roster includes four players who were at the Indians' alternate site in Columbus in April 2021: pitcher **Nick Mikolajchak**, catchers **Bo Naylor** and **Mike Rivera**, and infielder **Andruw Monasterio**.

RubberDucks host SeaWolves: The RubberDucks are playing the second of four scheduled series this season with the Erie SeaWolves, with six games at Canal Park this week and June 22-27. Erie won four of six at UPMC Park May 11-16 and will host another six July 27-Aug. 1. In 2019, Erie won 15 of 19 meetings, including six of seven in Akron. According to MLB.com, top prospects in this series include:

Finding his stride: **Tyler Freeman** had his first career five-hit game May 15 and began the season reaching base in 21 straight games, including a pair of nine-game hitting streaks for the team season high. In the Double-A Northeast, he ranks second in hits (32), third in batting average (.360), sixth in OBP (.418) and 10th in OPS (.902).

A winning start: The last unbeaten team in Double-A in 2021, Akron started the season 6-0 for the first time since the franchise moved from Canton to Akron before the 1997 season. The six-game winning streak was the club's longest since a seven-game streak May 2-8, 2018. Akron started 0-6 in 2019.

Who played in 2020? With the 2020 minor league season canceled, **Tyler Freeman** and **Bo Naylor** participated in the alternate site for Cleveland last year. Left-hander **Joey Cantillo** was acquired in Cleveland's trade of **Mike Clevinger** to San Diego on Aug. 31, 2020, and was at the alternate site for the Padres and Indians last season. Outfielder **Will Benson** played for Team Texas in the independent Constellation Energy League in Sugar Land, Texas.

First-rounders: In Naylor (drafted No. 29 overall in 2018) and Benson (No. 14 overall in 2016), the RubberDucks will feature two Indians first-round picks for the first time since 2016, when Clint Frazier (2013) and Bradley Zimmer (2014) teamed up in the outfield during the club's last Eastern League championship season in 2016.

Limited experience: Among the 27 RubberDucks entering Opening Day, only six had played as high as Double-A in their careers. All of those appeared for Akron in 2019. Alex Call (81 games) and Oscar González (29) are returning outfielders. 2019 RubberDuck Andruw Monasterio is the only returning infielder, although Trenton Brooks, a 2019 RubberDucks outfielder, will play first base. Ohio State alumnus **Tanner Tully**, the 2019 Akron innings leader (129.1) will be the most experienced member of a pitching staff that otherwise has a total of 10 Double-A innings, all by left-hander Eli Lingos when he made a start and relief appearance for Akron in 2019.

Through June 4, Hillman ranks sixth in the Double-A Northeast with a 2.73 ERA.

Last appearance: Saturday, May 29, Game 2 at Binghamton (ND in 7-6, 11-inning win)

Hillman yielded four hits and two walks but only a third-inning, two-run single to Jeremy Vasquez that put Binghamton briefly in the lead, 2-1. Hillman departed after five innings with a 4-2 lead. Right-hander Juan Mota allowed the tying runs. Right-hander Kyle Marman twice allowed Binghamton to tie the game in extra innings but got the win. Right-hander Alec Wisely earned his first save by retiring the side in the bottom of the 11th.

- Spent some time with the Indians during Spring training alongside fellow RubberDucks pitchers Justin Garza and Dakody Clemmer.
- Closed against the Diamondbacks in Spring Training.

- Hillman transferred to Olympia (Fla.) High ahead of his sophomore year and became teammates with Twins 2014 first-rounder Nick Gordon. Gordon's father Tom, a former All-Star closer, became his legal guardian at that time, and he's since played an integral role in the young left-hander's development on the mound. Hillman's mother, Jamila Spann-Williams, had asked Gordon to be Juan's godfather after Nick and Juan had been youth baseball teammates, and Tom Gordon had taken to mentoring Juan.
- Originally was committed to Central Florida in 2015 before signing with the Indians.

2021 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (Second Season) – Odor, 53, became the 18th manager in club history when he led the club in 2019. The RubberDucks posted a 61-79 record, good for fifth in the Eastern League Western Division following a 34-35 first half record. Odor has twelve seasons of managerial experience where he has compiled a career record of 422-442 (.488).

When Odor was Akron's hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2021 season is Odor's 34th in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (21st as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. The 2019 season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League (1999-2000), the Burlington Indians (2001-2004), the Mahoning Valley Scrappers (2005-2006), Gulf Coast League Indians (2007-2008). In 2009, Odor began serving as hitting coach for the Kinston Indians (2009-2010), Double-A Akron Aeros (2011-2012), High-A Carolina Mudcats (2013), Double-A Akron RubberDucks (2014), and Triple-A Columbus Clippers (2015-2017).

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#35 Owen Dew, Pitching Coach (1st Season) — Owen Dew, 32, makes his first visit to Akron after serving as the pitching coach for the Lake County Captains in the Class-A Midwest league in 2019. Dew began his baseball journey as a right-handed pitcher for Seminole State College of Florida (2008-2009), before moving to the University of Central Florida in 2010, when he was drafted in the 21st round of the 2010 amateur draft by the Cleveland Indians. That same year, Dew advanced through Mahoning Valley with a strong 2.64 ERA in nine starts for the Scrappers. At Class-A Lake County, Dew was converted to a relief pitcher where he appeared in 15 games over the 2010 and 2011 seasons. In Dew's final season as a player, the right hander appeared in 34 games, accruing 70 innings and posted a 3.86 ERA with 41 strikeouts.

Since his playing career, Dew served as an assistant coach at Seminole State College of Florida while also assisting the Cleveland Indians as an associate scout from 2014-2017. Dew was then appointed as a full-time minor league pitching coach within the organization, making stops with the Mahoning Valley (2017), Arizona League Indians 2 (2018), and Lake County Captains (2019). The 2019 Lake County Captains pitching staff posted a team ERA of 3.73 over 1191 innings, good for eighth in the Midwest League.

#16 Junior Betances, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Betances, 47, hits Akron for the first time in his 21-year coaching career with the Cleveland Indians organization. After posting a .289 batting average over 165 games in 1998-1999 with the Akron Aeros, Betances joined the coaching ranks in various roles for the Cleveland Indians Dominican Summer League team from 2000-2010. Betances then served as Arizona League Indians coach from 2010-2015, and moved to Lake County in 2017 as the Bench coach for Manager Larry Day. The native of La Vega, Dominican Republic, Betances has developed a wealth of experience in various player development roles within the Indians organization.

#28 Mike Mergenthaler, Bench Coach (First Season) — Mergenthaler, 32, moves up the Indians farm system to Akron in 2021, following his 2019 season serving as the Lynchburg Hillcats bench coach for Manager Jim Pankovits. In 2018 and 2019, Mergenthaler worked as a hitting coach for the Cleveland Indians' and Milwaukee Brewers' joint Dominican Super League team. The Thiells, NY, native was drafted as a player in the 32nd round of the 2011 amateur draft by the San Francisco Giants, playing in their system for parts of 2011 and 2012.

Jake Legan, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Legan heads to Akron for the first time in his six-year career with the Cleveland Indians. Legan previously served as the Lynchburg Hillcats' athletic trainer in 2019.

Scott Nealon, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Second Season, not consecutive) — Nealon enters his eighth season in the Cleveland Indians organization, returning to the same position he held in 2016 for the RubberDucks Eastern League Championship Series. Nealon was the Triple-A Columbus strength and conditioning coach the last three seasons (2017-2019), including the Clippers' 2019 Governor's Cup championship season. Previously, Nealon served as strength and conditioning coach for the Carolina Mudcats (2013-2014), Lynchburg Hillcats (2015), before he made his way to Double-A Akron. Nealon earned his master's degree in exercise science from Baldwin Wallace University in Berea, Ohio.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World.**" Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
