**TODAY'S GAME:** The Rancho Cucamonga Quakes (Single-A, Los Angeles Angels) aim to keep the good times rolling in game two of their six-game series versus the Lake Elsinore Storm (Single-A, San Diego Padres). The Quakes lineup outscored the Storm 15-1 over the final five innings, punctuated by a seven-run eighth, to win the series opener 16-3. Today, RHP Ubaldo Soto takes the hill for Rancho Cucamonga opposite RHP Jesus Castro for Lake Elsinore as both pitchers make their season debuts.

**ABOUT THE STORM:** The Lake Elsinore Storm, founded in 1994, play their 32nd season of operation in 2026. Originally founded as the Santa Clara Padres, has relocated three times, also going by the Redwood Pioneers and Palm Springs Angels before settling in Lake Elsinore ahead of the 1994 season. Brallan Perez is in his first season managing the ballclub after a three-year run with the AZL Padres, serving as bench coach in 2023 and 2024 before becoming their manager in 2025. In their history, the Storm have won four California League titles, most recently in 2022. This season marks the 26th as a Padres affiliate after holding a previous affiliation in the Angels organization (1981-2000) and playing their first two seasons without a true affiliation (1979-1980).

**MEET (AND BEAT) THE 6ERS:** To begin the new campaign as well as open their second affiliation with the Los Angeles Angels, the Quakes completed an impressive three-game sweep of the Inland Empire 66ers. Starting pitching set the tone throughout the series led by Dylan Jordan and Trey Gregory-Alford, who combined for 10 scoreless innings in games one and two. Additionally, the bats came through for big rallies on all three nights. They put together an inning of at least three runs in every game, highlighted by a seven-run sixth inning in game three that ultimately broke it open. Throughout all 25.5 innings, Rancho Cucamonga never trailed.

**THE NEW-LOOK CALI LEAGUE:** This past offseason, the California League experienced a massive shake-up over the offseason that saw multiple teams re-affiliate and the league re-align ahead of the 2026 campaign. The Mariners long-time affiliate, the Modesto Nuts, lost their spot in the league with the Ontario Tower Buzzers (Single-A, Los Angeles Dodgers) taking their place. With that, the Quakes moved from the Dodgers organization to the Angels, and the 66ers shifted from the Angels to the Mariners to complete the three-team swap. Additionally, the Visalia Rawhide (Single-A, Arizona Diamondbacks), switched from the South Division to the North Division, where they were prior to 2021 when major changes hit Minor League Baseball and saw the California League re-classify from High-A to Single-A. This will most likely be the last time that affiliates change in the league before the Player Development Contracts are up for renewal in 2030.

**THE NEW MAN ON THE TOP STEP:** On January 26th, it was announced that Dave Stapleton would serve as the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes manager for their first season back in the Angels organization. While this is the skipper's first season at Morongo Field, he is no stranger to the Halos. 2026 marks Stapleton's 13th season managing with the Angels, all of which in the lower levels of the organization. From 2014-2016 and in 2018, he led the then-Pioneer League Rookie affiliate Orem Owiz before heading to Arizona to manage the AZL Angels in 2017 and 2019. After serving as the inaugural manager for the ACL Angels in 2021, he spent the last four seasons with the Inland Empire 66ers. At San Manuel Stadium, he helped the 66ers make the playoffs three times and reached last season's California League Championship Series. As a player, Stapleton pitched six seasons in the Milwaukee Brewers organization, appearing 10 times in the Major Leagues in 1987 and 1988.

**THE FUTURE HALOS SHINE TONIGHT:** Beginning their first season back in the Angels organization, the Quakes trot out a talented roster chock full of top prospects. Seven players, Gabriel Davaillo (#5), Trey Gregory-Alford (#9), Dylan Jordan (#10), Hayden Alvarez (#11), Talon Haley (#12), Ubaldo Soto (#25), and Marlon Quintero (#27), feature amongst the organization's top 30 prospects per MLB Pipeline. Six of those players, alongside outfielder Lucas Ramirez, were a part of the Angels Prospects roster in their 2026 Spring Break-out game against the Guardians Prospects.

**QUAKES AT THE CLASSIC:** Last month, a couple of Quakes got their season started early as they participated in the 2026 World Baseball Classic. As a member of Team Brazil, Lucas Ramirez appeared in all four games of Pool B play, launching home runs off of two-time All-Star Logan Webb and Gabe Speier in their opening contest against Team USA. Although he hails from Weston, Fla., Ramirez was eligible to play for Brazil as his mother, Juliana, was born in São Paulo. On the coaching staff, pitching coach Elmer Dessens worked in the same capacity for his home country of Mexico. This was Dessens' third World Baseball Classic, serving as the bullpen coach for their 2023 bronze medal team and captaining their 2009 squad in his playing days. Although he did not participate in the latest edition, left-hander Nicolò Pinazzi represented his native Italy in 2023.

## 22 Dave Stapleton



Dave Stapleton was named the manager of the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes on January 26, 2026 and will lead the team in their first season back in the Los Angeles Angels organization.
