Aviators vs. Space Cowboys: The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Athletics and '25 PCL Champions, will face the Sugar Land Space Cowboys, Triple-A affiliate of the Houston Astros, this afternoon in the finale of the six-game series and the 2026 regular season in Pacific Coast League action at Constellation Field (7,500)...Las Vegas is 3-2 in the series...following the off day tomorrow, the Aviators will then host the Oklahoma City Comets, Triple-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers, in the LCS (PCL), best-of-three series beginning on Tuesday, September 22 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Sugar Land defeats Las Vegas 7-0 in game five of series:

The Space Cowboys defeated the Aviators, 7-0, last night in game five of the final regular season road trip (six-game series) before a crowd of 5,102 at Constellation Field.

Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 6 hits and stranded eight runners on base and were shutout for the seventh time this season. Center fielder **Brayan Buevas** was 1-for-3, walk. Right fielder **Devin Taylor** was 1-for-4, double and second baseman **Joshua Kuroda-Grauer** (ML rehab) was 1-for-3.

Sugar Land Offense: The Space Cowboys recorded 10 hits and stranded five runners on base. Center fielder **Lucas Spence** was 2-for-4, stolen base, solo home run. Designated hitter **Jason Schiavone** was 2-for-4, two doubles, RBI, run scored and left fielder **Zach Cole** was 2-for-4, stolen base, RBI run scored.

Aviators Starting Pitcher: Right-hander **Jackson Finley** suffered the loss. He pitched 3.2 innings and allowed 6 hits, 5 runs, walked 4 and struck out 4 on 90 pitches (51 strikes).

Aviators Bullpen: Right-hander **Nathan Dettmer** pitched 2.1 innings and allowed 2 hits, 1 run and struck out 3. Left-hander **Joe Rock** pitched 1.0 inning and allowed 1 hit, 1 run and walked 1. Left-hander **Ben Bowden** pitched 1.0 scoreless inning and allowed 1 hit.

Sugar Land is in their sixth season as the Triple-A affiliate of the Houston Astros.

Las Vegas defeats Sugar Land 5-0 in game two of series (Wednesday, September 16): The Aviators defeated the Space Cowboys, 5-0, in game two of the final regular season road trip (six-game series) before a crowd of 2,345 at Constellation Field.

Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 6 hits and stranded seven runners on base. Catcher **Bryan Lavastida** was 3-for-3, double, walk, run scored. Right fielder **Johnathan Rodríguez** was 2-for-4, double, run scored and center fielder **Brayan Buelvas** was 1-for-5, two-run RBI double in the fourth inning.

Sugar Land Offense: The Space Cowboys recorded 1 hit and stranded six runners on base. Second baseman **Bryce Matthews** (ML rehab, 1-for-4, stolen base) singled in the first inning. Catcher **Jason Schiavone** was 0-for-2, two walks, three stolen bases.

Aviators Starting Pitcher: Right-hander **Kade Morris** recorded his team-leading ninth victory with 6.0 shutout innings. He allowed 1 hit, walked two and struck out 5 on 82 pitches (56 strikes).

Aviators Bullpen: Right-hander **Hunter Bigge** pitched 1.0 scoreless inning, walked 2 and struck out 1. Left-hander **Ben Bowden** pitched 1.0 scoreless inning, walked 1 and struck out 2. Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 7 hits and stranded seven runners on base. Right fielder/3B **Colby Halter** was 2-for-4, RBI, two stolen bases, run scored. First baseman **Bryan Lavastida** was 2-for-4, RBI, run scored and catcher **Cole Conn** (1-for-4, walk, two runs scored) hit a two-run home run in the second inning.

Sugar Land defeats Las Vegas 4-0 in game four of series (Friday, September 18): The Space Cowboys defeated the Aviators, 4-0, in game four of the final regular season road trip (six-game series) before a crowd of 4,816 at Constellation Field.

Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 4 hits and stranded three runners on base and were shutout for the sixth time this season. Right fielder **Johnathan Rodríguez**, third baseman **Luke Mann** and left fielder **Jared Dickey** were each 1-for-3.

Sugar Land Offense: The Space Cowboys recorded 7 hits and stranded 10 runners on base. Right fielder **Zach Cole** was 2-for-4, triple, RBI, stolen base, run scored, Catcher **Jason Schiavone** was 2-for-3, walk, run scored and third baseman **Trevor Austin** was 1-for-3, walk, double, RBI.

AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS – Las Vegas is 3-1 in the series...the final road trip of the '26 regular season (six-game series) against the Sugar Land Space Cowboys, Triple-A affiliate of the Houston Astros, will conclude this afternoon ('26 season finale)...Las Vegas has the second-best overall record in the 10-team PCL (86-61, .585)...the Aviators have the best road record in the PCL (44-28, .611) and have tied a franchise single-season record for most road wins (44-28 in 2002; 44-26 in 2019)...Oklahoma City holds the best overall record in the PCL at 88-60 (.595)...the Rochester Red Wings, Triple-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals (International League), have the best record in Triple-A (89-58, .605)...Sugar Land and Las Vegas will play each other a total of 12 times in 2026...the '26 campaign will now feature 148 games (75-home; 73-away)...150-game campaign has been scheduled for the fifth consecutive season (2022 – present).

AVIATORS CLINCH SPOT IN 2026 PCL PLAYOFFS: Las Vegas, on Saturday, June 20, officially won the first half of the 10-team Pacific Coast League title and clinched a spot in the 2026 playoffs for the second consecutive season...the Aviators will host the Oklahoma City Comets in the PCL best-of-three LCS beginning on **Tuesday, September 22** at Las Vegas Ballpark@...the Memphis Redbirds, Triple-A affiliate of the St. Louis Cardinals, captured the 20-team International League first half and will host the second half winner on **Tuesday, September 22**...the Las Vegas Ballpark will then host the Triple-A National Championship Game (International League vs. Pacific Coast League) for the fifth straight season on **Saturday, September 26** at 7:05 p.m.

2026 PCL PITCHERS OF THE WEEK: Right-hander **Mason Barnett** from April 20-26...defeated Salt Lake on April 25 at Las Vegas Ballpark...5.0 shutout innings, one hit, walked two, seven strikeouts on 72 pitches (44 strikes).

Left-hander **Gage Jump** from May 18-24...no decision vs. Albuquerque on May 20...season-high 7.0 shutout innings, four hits, no walks, nine strikeouts on 88 pitches (61 strikes).

2026 PCL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Outfielder **Henry Bolte** from May 4-10...appeared in six games against St. Paul and batted .556 (15-for-27) with four doubles, one triple, five home runs and 9 RBI, including a franchise record 12 consecutive hits (May 7-8-9) and tied the PCL record.

Outfielder **Cade Marlowe** (May 18-24)...appeared in six games against Albuquerque and batted .538 (14-for-26) with five doubles, triple, two home runs, 13 RBI and nine runs scored, which included five-multiple-hit games.

Infielder **Joey Meneses** (June 15-21)...appeared in five games against Round Rock and batted .550 (11-for-20) with two doubles, one triple, two home runs, 11 RBI and 10 runs scored, which included four multiple-hit games.

Outfielder **Brayan Buelvas** (August 24-30)...appeared in six games against Sugar Land and batted .391 (9-for-23) with three doubles, two home runs, 7 RBI, five walks and seven runs scored, which included two multiple-hit games.

43rd SEASON IN THE SILVER STATE (1983-2026) – The Aviators are playing in their 43rd season (44th calendar season) in the Silver State as a proud member of the Pacific Coast League...**the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being Nevada's longest enduring professional sports franchise**...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8)...catcher **Bruce Bochy** has the distinction of hitting the first Triple-A home run in Cashman Field history for the Las Vegas Stars on April 10, 1983.

PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE: The PCL is in its 123rd season (1903-2020, 2022 -) and consists of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **West Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **East Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Comets, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys. The 10-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A West and returned as the PCL in 2022!

INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE: The IL consists of two divisions for a total of 20 teams. **East Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Norfolk Tides, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **West Division:** Columbus Clippers, Gwinnett Stripers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. The 20-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A East and returned as the IL in 2022.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY IN 2026: The Aviators, for the second straight season, played opponents from the IL. Las Vegas hosted the St. Paul Saints, Triple-A affiliate of the Minnesota Twins, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, May 5-10 at Las Vegas Ballpark. Las Vegas traveled to Omaha, Nebraska and played the Omaha Storm Chasers, Triple-A affiliate of the Kansas City Royals, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, June 9-14.

2025 SEASON – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 83-67 (.553) and finished in second place in the PCL West Division. Las Vegas won the first half with a 49-26 record (.653) and Tacoma won the second half. The Aviators then defeated the Rainiers, 2-games-to-0, in the LCS at Las Vegas Ballpark to capture its third PCL championship in franchise history (1986, 1988, 2025). Las Vegas then lost to the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp (International League champions), Triple-A affiliate of the Miami Marlins, 8-7, in the **Triple-A National Championship Game** on September 27 before the sellout crowd of 10,129 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

2024 SEASON – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 74-75 (.497) and finished in fourth place in the PCL West Division. The Tacoma Rainiers captured the West Division with an overall record of 82-68 (.547). Sugar Land Space Cowboys recorded the best record in the 30-team Triple-A (93-56, .624) and defeated the Reno Aces, 2-games-to-0, to capture the PCL Championship. Sugar Land then defeated the Omaha Storm Chasers, Triple-A affiliate of the Kansas City Royals, 13-6, in the **Triple-A National Championship** game on September 28 before a crowd of 8,007 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season eight times: **86 (86-61, .585 in 2026); 85** (85-59, .590 in 2002); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **83** (2025 PCL Champions with an 83-67, .553); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563)...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014 and again, 2025-26)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY: Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH) then-owner announced on **October 10, 2017** its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on **Friday, February 23, 2018** before a crowd of several hundred people! The 8,196-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark provides a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall. Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site is landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites. The grand opening took place on **Tuesday, April 9, 2019** before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION HISTORY: Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH), then-owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of the Pacific Coast League, and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on **December 8, 2018** the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51st) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

AVIATORS LOGO DESIGN AND CONCEPT:

The color inspiration: the Las Vegas Sunset; the mountain range featured in the Aviators' sunglasses resemble the mountain range found in the Summerlin logo!

Team colors are navy, orange, tangerine, gold, yellow, gray.

SOUTHERN NEVADA AVIATION HISTORY:

Nevada's High-Flying Aviators (from UNLV News) - Nevada has a rich history in Aviation; with 500 miles between the state's two largest cities (Reno and Las Vegas), aviation was ideal for Nevada.

Aviation History in Las Vegas (from Harry Reid Airport) - Aviation grew exponentially throughout the 1900s, bringing more and more travelers to our city.

Nellis Air Force Base (in Las Vegas) is "Home of the Fighter Pilot" and home to the United States Air Force Warfare Center - the largest and most demanding advanced air combat training mission in the world. Crews do not come to learn how to fly, but instead how to be the **best combat aviators in the world**.

SEAPORT ENTERTAINMENT GROUP COMPLETES SEPARATION FROM HOWARD HUGHES HOLDINGS

NEW YORK, NY (AUGUST 1, 2024) – Seaport Entertainment Group Inc. (NYSE American: SEG) (the "Seaport Entertainment Group" or "Company"), a newly formed company positioned at the intersection of entertainment and real estate, announced that it has completed its previously announced separation (the "Separation") from its predecessor **Howard Hughes Holdings Inc.** (NYSE: HHH) ("Howard Hughes") and is now an independent, standalone publicly traded company. The Company began its common stock trading (August 1) on the NYSE American LLC under the ticker symbol SEG.

Seaport Entertainment Group's portfolio is anchored by the historic Seaport neighborhood in Lower Manhattan, which includes 478,000 square feet of primarily retail, restaurant and entertainment offerings, the 3,500-person concert venue on The Rooftop at Pier 17, a mixed-use development site at 250 Water Street, and the Tin Building by Jean-Georges, an immersive culinary marketplace. The Company's portfolio also includes **Las Vegas Ballpark in downtown Summerlin, NV; the Las Vegas Aviators, the Triple-A Minor League Baseball Affiliate of the Athletics;** a 25% ownership interest in Jean-Georges Restaurants; and an interest in and to 80% of the air rights above the Fashion Show mall in Las Vegas.

Aviators on Radio in 2026: Russ Langer will broadcast the 148 games on **Raider Nation Radio 920 AM** (selected games on **Fox Sports 1340 AM** and **98.9 FM**) on www.aviatorslv.com. Langer is in his 26th season broadcasting baseball to the Las Vegas Valley and 39th year overall in the business....over his career, Langer has received numerous awards, including being named 1993 Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues....in 1995 and 2016, he broadcast the Triple-A All-Star game; in 1999, he was named the New Mexico Sportscaster of the Year; and in 2002, he was named Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by Minor League News.com....Langer also is a 12-time recipient (13 overall and seven consecutive years from 2007-13) of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2021, 2023), which is presented by the National Sports Media Association (NSMA)...Langer's inaugural season in Las Vegas was in 2000, the final year the franchise was known as the Stars...prior to arriving in Las Vegas, Langer called Pacific Coast League games for the Albuquerque Dukes (1996-99) and Phoenix Firebirds (1992-95)...began his broadcasting career with Single-A Springfield Cardinals in 1987 and 1989, sandwiched around a year in Vero Beach (1988)...moved up the ranks to Double-A, calling games for the Midland Angels in 1990 and '91 before advancing to Triple-A Phoenix...he realized his longtime goal of broadcasting Major League baseball when he worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons, followed by nine games for the Baltimore Orioles in 2006...has also broadcast selected spring training games for the Los Angeles Dodgers (2006-08), Toronto Blue Jays (2009-10) and Chicago White Sox (2012-20)...in 2023, he broadcast his 3,000th game for Triple-A Las Vegas and completed his 12th season as the radio play-by-play voice for the UNLV football team on the UNLV Sports Properties/Learfield Network (2012-23)...was named the radio play-by-play broadcaster for the New Mexico State University men's basketball team for the 2025-26 season.
