**LAST ACTION:** [The Peoria Chiefs beat the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers 13-8 at Dozer Park on Sunday.](#) The Chiefs had an early 7-2 lead before the Timber Rattlers rallied to tie the game in the top of the sixth inning.

However, Osvaldo Tovalin hit a three-run home run in the bottom of the sixth inning to put the Chiefs up 10-7 and the Rattlers never threatened again. Tovalin drove in four runs for the Chiefs on Sunday to give him nineteen RBI in twenty games against the Rattlers in 2023. Wisconsin hit three solo homers in the game.

**THREE DAYS OF ERNESTO:** Wisconsin first baseman Ernesto Martínez Jr hit a home run in the fourth inning on Sunday. He homered in all three games of the series at Peoria. The last Rattler to homer in three straight games was Jackson Chourio during the 2022 season. No Wisconsin hitter has homered more than three consecutive games since Ron Garth set the team record with homers in five straight games during the 2007 season.

**DOUBLE DIGITS:** Joe Gray Jr hit a homer in the top of the seventh inning on Sunday. Gray has ten homers on the season. He leads the Rattlers in homers. Gray also had two RBI in the game and has 46 RBI to lead the team in that category, too. Gray has hit 33 homers as a Rattler.

**ON THE COMEBACK TRAIL:** Peoria scored four times in the bottom of the third inning to take their 7-2 lead. Martínez homered in the fourth and added an RBI single in the fifth. Then, Ben Metzinger followed with a two-run double in the fifth to get the Rattlers to within a run. Je'Von Ward hit a home run to lead off the sixth inning to tie the game.

**MEET THE METZ:** Metzinger has a four-game RBI streak. He has knocked in eight runs during his RBI streak. Martínez, Robert Moore, and Darrien Miller are tied for the longest RBI streak on the team with five straight games.

**LOOK OUT!** Robert Moore was hit by a pitch twice on Sunday. He has been hit by ten pitches this season.

**ABOUT DAYTON:** The Dayton Dragons entered the Midwest League when the Rockford Reds moved to Ohio for the 2000 season. Dayton has been an affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds since 2000. Joey Votto, Johnny Cueto, Adam Dunn, Homer Bailey, Didi Gregorius, Nick Senzel, and Elly De La Cruz are just a few MLB players to play for the Dragons. The Dragons finished the first half 33-33 and missed the playoffs. Bryan LaHair is in his second season as the manager of the Dragons. LaHair appeared in 67 games with the Timber Rattlers during the 2004 season. He hit .279 with 24 doubles, five homers, and 28 RBI.

**ABOUT THE REDS:** The Cincinnati Reds have been the Major League parent club for the Reds since 2000. The Reds had two MWL affiliates in 1999 (Rockford and Clinton) and 2000 (Dayton and Clinton). Cincinnati's first Midwest League affiliate was the Cedar Rapids Red Raiders in 1963 and 1964. The Reds left the Midwest League in 1964 before returning to Cedar Rapids in 1980 where they stayed until the end of the 1992 season. The Reds left the MWL for four seasons before returning to partner with the Burlington Bees in 1997 for two seasons before the partnership with Clinton and Rockford started.

**PROSPECTING IN THE SERIES:** [MLB Pipeline](#) places five active Rattlers on their list of Brewers Top 30 Prospects: Jacob Misiorowski (#4), Robert Moore (#8), Hendry Mendez (#13), Eduardo Garcia (#19), and Matthew Wood (#24). Eric Brown Jr (#6) and Joseph Hernandez (#25) are currently on Wisconsin's IL. [MLB Pipeline](#) has five Dayton players on their list of Top 30 Reds prospects: Edwin Arroyo (#2), Chase Petty (#6), Jay Allen II (#9), Austin Hendrick (#18), and Tyler Callihan (#27).

## WISCONSIN SCHEDULED STARTING PITCHER:

**RHP STIVEN CRUZ:** Signed by Milwaukee as an International Free Agent out of Nicaragua on July 2, 2019.

**DELAYED START:** Cruz began his pro career with the Brewers-1 affiliate in the Dominican Summer League in 2021. He was 3-3 with a 1.37 ERA and 73 strikeouts over 52-2/3 innings pitched in twelve games – eleven starts.

**MUDDY WATERS:** Cruz started the 2022 season with the Carolina Mudcats in the Carolina League. He went 3-5 with a 4.60 ERA in fifteen starts for Carolina. Cruz walked 18 and struck out 89 over 72-1/3 innings pitched.

**ON TO WISCONSIN:** Cruz joined the Timber Rattlers on August 16, 2022. He made four starts with the Rattlers and allowed one run on six hits with six walks and twenty strikeouts over nineteen innings pitched for a 1-1 record with a 0.47ERA.

**IT'S A MAJOR AWARD:** Cruz beat Lansing at home on August 24, 2022. He allowed three runs on six hits with a walk and three strikeouts for his first quality start of the season. Cruz allowed three runs on two homers in the first inning, but nothing else for a win in his second straight start.

**LAST START:** Cruz picked beat the Beloit Sky Carp at home on [July 5](#). He allowed three runs on six hits with a walk and three strikeouts for his first quality start of the season. Cruz allowed three runs on two homers in the first inning, but nothing else for a win in his second straight start.

**VS. DAYTON:** Cruz has never faced the Dragons prior to this evening. Tonight is also the first time he will face an affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds.

## DAYTON SCHEDULED STARTING PITCHER:

**RHP KEVIN ABEL:** The Cincinnati Reds selected Abel in the seventh round of the 2021 draft out of Oregon State.

**DID YOU KNOW?** The San Diego Padres picked Abel in the 35<sup>th</sup> round of the 2017 draft out of James Madison High School in San Diego. Abel chose Oregon State over signing with the Padres.

**BUSY BEAVER:** Abel was 13-6 with a save and an ERA of 3.31 with 242 strikeouts and 116 walks over 179-2/3 innings in 42 games – 26 starts from 2018 through 2021 at Oregon State. Abel did not pitch with the Beavers in 2020. In his final season of college baseball, Abel was 3-5 with a 3.62 ERA, 109 strikeouts, and 61 walks over 82 innings in sixteen starts. He was on the mound for Oregon State to close out a College World Series in Omaha in 2018.

**STARTING OUT:** Abel made three brief starts in the Arizona Complex League in 2021 after signing with the Reds. He began the 2022 season in the ACL and was 1-0 in two games – one start – before a promotion to the Daytona Tortugas in the Florida State League on June 16, 2022. Abel was 1-3 with a 6.97 ERA with 29 walks and 52 strikeouts over 31 innings pitched in eleven games – five starts to finish 2022.

**SUNNY FLORIDA:** Abel started the 2023 season with Daytona. He was 3-2 with a 4.69ERA in twelve games – seven starts. Abel walked 32 and struck out 61 over 40-1/3 innings before his promotion to Dayton on July 14.

**LAST START:** Abel took the loss in a game against Bradenton on [July 6](#) in his final start in the Florida State League. He allowed three runs on five hits with two walks and five strikeouts over 3-2/3 innings.

**VS. WISCONSIN:** Abel has never faced the Timber Rattlers prior to this evening. Abel made his professional debut against the Brewers Blue affiliate in the Arizona Complex League on [September 3, 2021](#). He pitched a scoreless, hitless inning, with no walks and one strikeout as the starting pitcher and had a no decision. Abel also started against the Brewers Blue on [June 6, 2022](#) for a no decision. He allowed a run on a hit with three walks and seven strikeouts over 3-2/3 innings.
